

B. INSTRUCTIONS TO STUDENTS

Eligibility

The board serves only the persons who are properly enrolled. Enrollment is open only to local preachers, deacons-Christian education, deacons-compassionate ministries, deacons-music ministries, and prospective ministers of music who qualify according to the Manual, 231.1; 529.4.

Courses

There are seven general courses administered by the Ministerial Studies Board; elders, deacon of administration, deacon of compassionate ministries, deacon of Christian education, deacon of music, deacon of youth, and lay minister (Handbook of Ministerial Studies).

Ministers, deacons and deaconesses will not be ordained without having completed their respective courses. An exception to this is provided for all commissioned song evangelists who held this status immediately prior to the 1986 assembly season. Those becoming commissioned song evangelists will complete the deacon track in music ministries. Those interested in commissioned or registered song evangelists' credentials should study carefully all requirements as listed in Sourcebook on Ordination, Manual 525.1.

Modes of Study

The options for the course of study are listed below (by preference) as recommended and approved by the Illinois District Ministerial Studies Board.

1. A Nazarene university pursuing a degree in a religious major approved/ validated by Nazarene Clergy Services.

2. Nazarene Theological Seminary.

3. Nazarene Bible College: Pursuing a degree in a religious major approved/validated by Nazarene Clergy Services.

4. Northwest Nazarene University: Online COS – Course of Study Module

5. Nazarene Bible College: NBC Track, MPP Track.

6. A Nazarene District School of Ministry: Module Course

7. A Nazarene university or an accredited university, pursuing a degree in a religious field of study (Subject to evaluation).

The Course of Study is under the immediate supervision of the District Board of Ministerial Studies. Students are advised to pursue preparation or ordination by selecting one of the above-mentioned modes of study. Each student is assigned an advisor to work with in establishing a plan of study.

The competency statements for ministerial education are listed in Manual; 527.3-527.5. All college and university programs must meet these competency statements for course of study.

C. REGULATIONS FOR MINISTERIAL COURSE OF STUDY

1. It is no longer necessary for students to purchase the Sourcebook for Ministerial Development. This information and more can now be found on the Clergy Education website (http://nazarenepastor.org/clergyeducation/) A Candidate Handbook can be downloaded for free from (http://usacanadaregion.org/clergy-education).

2. Each student is encouraged to take four courses each year. The general church requires 2 courses per year to be passed to allow a student to continue. However, "To qualify for ordination, candidates must achieve graduation from a validated course of study within 10 years from the granting of the first district license..." Manual 530.4. At 2 per year, the student will not succeed. Thus, the Illinois District has chosen to encourage students to complete 4 courses per year. All course work must be completed by the end of the assembly year (April) in order for the student to receive credit for that assembly year. The only exception is for those students enrolled in an institution of higher learning in which the class may not conclude until the board meets in May.

3. A student is placed in a study level based on the number of courses completed regardless of the level of the courses. The only exception is that the course on the Manual of the Church of the Nazarene must be completed before level one is considered complete (unless the student is enrolled in a religion program at a Nazarene institution) and before the student is eligible for a district license.

4. The secretary may not enroll anyone except by written letter from the applicant to include the following information: name (first, middle and last); address; telephone number; e-mail address: course of study desired: church where current membership is held: letter of recommendation from the church pastor where membership is held; copy of local license granted by that church; and official transcripts from colleges or other schools beyond high school. It will be the obligation of the student to see that all the information is sent to the secretary. Complete enrollment information and all necessary forms for enrollment in the of Studies course studv with the Board mav be found at: http://ministerialstudies.illinoisnaz.org/.

5. Prior to being issued a graduation certificate, all students must be reviewed by the Ministerial Studies Board. The only exceptions are Nazarene Bible College graduates of the Bible Studies Course who are immediately issued a graduation certificate.

6. No student will be graduated from the course of study without completing an internship program.

7. When a student moves to another district, the secretary of the Ministerial Board should transfer the student's records to the new district by contacting the secretary of that district's Board of Ministerial Studies. Students are strongly advised to keep copies of course record sheets and final grades. The District is not responsible for loss of data when transferring to another district.

8. Candidates should be prepared to appear annually before the Board of Ministerial Studies. These meetings will be scheduled by the district office and notification of the meetings will be sent to you.

9. Files for inactive students will be maintained by the Board of Ministerial Studies for no longer than 10 years.

10. Students are required to keep an active e-mail account while enrolled in the course of study.

College Students

College students are responsible to submit to the board documentary evidence of academic standing in harmony with Manual, 527.3, 527.5.

College students are reminded to plan their curriculum in harmony with Manual, 527.3; 527.5. Yearly updates should be submitted to the secretary of the Board of Ministerial Studies. The Board of Ministerial Studies will evaluate the final transcript at graduation, and no requirements stated in the Manual will be waived.

D. CONTINUING EDUCATION

"Once a minister has fulfilled the expectations of the educational foundations for ministry, he or she will continue a pattern of lifelong learning to enhance the ministry of which God has called him or her. A minimum expectation is 20 contact hours each year (2 accredited continuing education units (CEU's)" (Manual 527.6).

In order to facilitate the fulfillment of this requirement, a number of qualified events will be promoted through the district and by other means. An individual may receive CEU's by participating in a qualified event sponsored by the district, the general church, one of our colleges or universities or other approved method. When CEU's are available for a sponsored event, notification of the same will be made at the event and the participants will have the opportunity to sign up for credits. Credits will be based upon the participant attending the entire event and fulfilling other requirements (if applicable) for the event (such as extra reading or writing when appropriate). In all cases, it is the individual participant's responsibility to qualify him/herself for CEU credits.

The Board of Ministerial Studies appoints a continuing education director who shall be responsible to facilitate CEU qualified events and to resource individuals in obtaining CEU credits for events attended. Individuals may also contact the Department of Clergy Development directly with questions or for qualifying and awarding CEU credits for courses taken. All determination of CEU qualifications shall be made by the Office of Ministry. All records of CEU's obtained shall be retained by the Department of Clergy Development and by the individual himself/herself. Courses taken for degree programs are not eligible for CEU credit.

IV. Daily Proceedings

SPECIAL ASSEMBLY SERVICE Thursday Evening, July 17, 2014

The evening service began with the Olivetians from Olivet Nazarene University singing.

Dr. James Spruce, District Superintendent opened the 71st Annual District Assembly of the Illinois District welcoming everyone to Decatur, Illinois and thanking the District Advisory Board and Mr. William Shotts, District Treasurer for their work for the district. He then thanks Rev. Brian Powell and the staff at Decatur First for their help during this Family Week.

Dr. Spruce introduced special guests to the assembly – Dr. Jerry Porter, General Superintendent, Dr. John Bowling, Olivet Nazarene University President, Dr. Carla Sunberg, Nazarene Theological Seminary President, Dr. and Mrs. Bill Wiesman, Director, Evangelism and New Church Development, Tony Fightmaster and Dr. Brian Allen from Olivet, the Olivetians from ONU, and Dr. Laurel Mattson, NBC Vice President.

Dr. Laurel Mattson then presented the NBC award to Rev. James Craig, pastor at Beardstown, IL.

Dr. Jerry Porter presented the General Superintendents Growth Award to Rev. Russell Brewer and the Belleville Emmanuel Church.

Dr. Spruce recognized those pastors and churches that had paid anything on their budget this past year; those who had paid 95%; those paying 100% or more on WEF for the last 10 years; and those paying 110% or more this year.

Dr. Spruce presented a plaque and check to Rev. Douglas Haynes on behalf of the Illinois District for twenty-six consecutive years of service as District Secretary. The Haynes's were invited to the platform where Rev. Haynes thanked the district.

The Olivetians led the assembly in singing "Blessed Assurance".

Dr. Porter reminded us that we attend District Assembly to be encouraged, to report and to hear from God. He then presented Dr. James Spruce to the assembly to give his 11th and final report to the Illinois District Church of the Nazarene.

Dr. Spruce shared statistics and encouraged the delegation for the New Year.

Following the dismissal prayer there was a reception in the foyer consisting of cake, punch, cheeses, crackers, fruit, a chocolate fountain and a jazz band. Everyone enjoyed the fellowship wishing the Spruce's well in their retirement.

Friday Morning, July 18, 2014

The Olivetians began the morning session with singing inspiring songs.

Dr. John Bowling was introduced to the delegates and encouraged the delegation with the morning devotions with a promise for today from Philippians 4:19. He had everyone pick a number, encouraged us to claim the promise, make God #1 in your life. Choose a number and start adding "0's".

The Olivetians sang again while the ONU video was played. Dr. Bowling continued his report with stories from Olivet and thanked everyone for their prayers and financial support.

Dr. Brian Allen, highlighted a brochure with statistics and updates on ONU and gave all pastors a shirt from ONU.

Dr. Spruce was presented a chair from ONU for his years of serving on the Board of Trustees. The Olivetians closed out this presentation with singing "Jesus Never Fails."

The District Advisory Board Report was called for. There was a motion to adopt this report, seconded and this report was adopted.

The Ministerial Credential Report was highlighted and corrected. There was a motion to adopt this report, seconded and this report was adopted as corrected.

The Ministerial Studies Report was looked at. There was a motion to adopt this report, seconded and this report was adopted by a raise of hands.

The Nominations Report was adopted as printed.

The Christian Cultural Engagement report was adopted as printed by a raise of hands.

The Church Growth Report was looked at and adopted by raise of hands.

The Ministerial Staff Report was looked at and changes were highlighted. This report was adopted as corrected.

The Auditing Report was adopted as printed.

Copies of the Manual Constitution Amendments changes by the 2013 General Assembly were in each delegate packet. These amendments were individually looked at by the delegation and highlighted by Dr. Porter. All changes were approved unanimously.

There was a NYI video regarding NYC next summer and delegates were encouraged to pray for this upcoming event.

Ballot results for District Superintendent were read by the district secretary: 276 valid ballots, 184 needed to elect. 202 Jim Kraemer, 53 Douglas Haynes, 8 Tim Gates, 2

Mark Quanstrom, 2 Larry Lacher, 1 Michael McCarty, 1 Riley Powell, 1 Cory Jones, 1 Walter Sheets, 2 Steve Cecil, 1 Jay Shoff, 1 Mark Copley, 1 Jim Hicks.

While Dr. Porter dismissed himself to go call Dr. Kraemer, the Pastor from the Champaign Zone were asked to come to the front and the reports for each church were read by Jon Garlock: Champaign First, Mansfield, Mahomet, Champaign New Day, Urbana Lighthouse, Rantoul, Monticello, and Ogden.

All pastors from the Decatur Zone were called for and Brian Powell compiled their reports in a poem from the following churches: Decatur First, Decatur Oak Grove, Decatur Parkway, Decatur Trinity, Decatur West Side, Lincoln First, and Shelbyville.

Jon Kroeze read reports from the pastors on the Illinois River Zone: Beardstown, Beardstown Hispanic, Bethel, Barry, Mt. Sterling, Nebo, Pittsfield, Quincy Emmanuel,

The pastors from the Mattoon Zone came forward as Allen Ebbler highlighted each church -- Arcola First, Arcola Spanish, Casey, Effingham, Marshall, Mattoon East Side, Mattoon Real Life, and West Union.

Metro East Zone pastors came forward and Russ Brewer highlighted these churches – Belleville First, Dupo Bluffview, Fairview Heights Parkview, Edgemont Grace, Belleville Korean, East St. Louis Rush Memorial, Collinsville Good Samaritan, State Park Place, and Belleville Emmanuel.

Mississippi Valley Zone pastors came to the front and Rick Unger highlighted these church reports – Godfrey, Jerseyville, Roxana, and Glenview.

Mount Vernon Zone pastors were asked to come forward and the reports from their churches were read by Rev. Mike Kraemer: Benton, Sparta, Mt. Vernon Faith, Centralia, Du Quoin, The Hope House, and Salem Grace.

Murphysboro Zone pastors came forward and Jim Frye highlighted each church: Anna First, Carbondale New Beginnings, Harrisburg Oasis Community, Marion First, Murphysboro First, and Royalton First.

Olivet Zone pastors came forward and Gary Williamson gave reports from churches on this zone: Chrisman, Georgetown, Oakwood, Olivet, and Paris First.

Dr. Porter reported that he had spoken to the Kramer's and they are praying regarding the election of district superintendent.

The Olney Zone Pastors were called forward and Kevin Pittman reported for each church: Carmi, Fairfield, Flora, Mt. Carmel, The Master's Hand in Olney and Effingham, Mt. Erie and Olney.

Dr. Bill Wiesman, Director, Evangelism and New Church Development for USA/Canada Region brought a report to the delegation.

The Church Multiplication Movement was encouraged by Dr. Porter – highlighting the core values of the church: Christian, Holiness, and Missional. "What if you had to choose: plant a church this year or lose your soul forever?"

All pastors were handed a piece of paper and asked to write their names and churches on them and where they would start a church. They then handed these papers to their zone facilitator. The delegates were asked to stand as Dr. Weisman prayed a closing prayer. These papers were passed to Dr. Spruce to be recorded.

Announcements were made and the delegates were dismissed for lunch.

Friday afternoon July 18, 2014

After returning from lunch, Rev. Daniel Rogers led the delegates in worship songs.

A Board of Tellers were called to distribute the ballot for district officers.

Mr. William Shotts district treasurer was introduced and he highlighted the treasurers report that was printed in the delegate handbook.

The report was interrupted with a skype connection with Dr. James Kraemer. Dr. Porter chatted with him and asked for his response. With a humble spirit he accepted the position as the new district superintendent for the Illinois District. The delegation responded with a standing ovation.

Dr. James Spruce prayed for Dr. Kraemer in this new position. In turn Dr. Kraemer prayed for the Spruce's and the Illinois District. Rev. Michael Kraemer welcomed his dad to the district via skype. Dr. Spruce will continue as district superintendent till the last day of August, 2014 and Dr. Kraemer will begin September 1, 2014.

Mr. Shotts continued with the District Treasurer's report. He introduced his staff Angie Merryman and Chris Shotts. There was a motion to receive this report with a raise of hands. The report was received.

The Auditors Report was received.

Mr. William Shotts highlighted the Finance Report as printed in the delegate handbook. Finance Committee members were recognized and there was a motion to adopt this report. There were no questions and the report was adopted as printed.

A video presentation from "Funding the Mission" was viewed by the delegation.

The Springfield Zone pastors were called to the front and Will Haworth reported for these churches: Auburn, Carlinville, Jacksonville New Start, Pana First, Sherman, Springfield First, Springfield Trinity, Taylorville, and Virden.

A Video Presentation on the "M15 conference" was shown. Dr. Porter also told about the upcoming PALCON in 2015.

1. District Superintendent

Illinois District Superintendent's Report – 2014 "The Other Towns"

Quiz time. Raise your hand if you know these persons: John Bowling, Sandy Stickler, Jerry Porter. People we know and trust long enough count our money, watch our kids, and preach in our pulpits. Quite naturally I am in debt to people like this – to our Zone Facilitators, District Advisory Boards, Judi Roarick our recording secretary, faithful co-workers Douglas Haynes, Mark Copley, David Samayoa, and my friend Bill Shotts. Dr. Jerry Porter and Dr. John Bowling are treasured friends I hold in the highest regard.

But some people are at the margin of our personal world. People like Bobby X. Churches have drop-in people that Jesus loves, even if strangers to the church. I remember the prostitutes who dropped in at Houston First, the house-to-house beggars in Texarkana, the race-track guys in Cadillac, the upscale professionals in Flint. All of them came. Few of them stayed. As one of them said, "This church is too church and I am too me to really belong here."

But what kind of a church would a church be if it were made up mainly of the in-crowd or of people we know and for whom we vote? What does the established church, the church-on-the-go, make of the church-on-the-fringe? Is it within our DNA to respond to those unlike us? What if Bobby X lived in Litchfield where we have no church? Does Jesus know that Bobby lives there?

This was the dilemma of people in Jesus' day. People wanted him in town so he might heal their sick and raise their dead. But Luke recorded Jesus' words, his primary calling: "I must preach the good news of the Kingdom of God to the other towns also, because that is why I was sent" (4:43). Jesus' mission was to people who did not know his Father in towns that did not know him. So if our Lord was sent by his Father to other towns also, what does Jesus think *our* mission is?

Quiz time. Raise your hand if you know any of *these* people: Guadalupe Perez, Gustavo Hernandez, Gonzalo Ortiz. You may not know them but you know somebody who does! They have shown interest in a Bible study that David Samayoa, our Hispanic coordinator, teaches in State Park near Collinsville where he and Sonia are starting a new church.

At last district assembly you made an investment in David's ministry. We hoped to raise \$50,000 in pledges at last assembly, and in one evening you pledged just over \$40,000. Within a month of our last assembly we exceeded our goal with a total of \$51,000. To date we have received \$40,221, over four-fifths of the amount pledged. That's pretty good! So David started his work in Collinsville, has been in a number of churches and has already started a Bible study in Effingham. *Thus you are helping to reach people in other towns that you don't even know*!

David meets his accountability partner Pastor Kevin Hancock every Monday morning at 10:30. David writes, "The greatest responsibility as a church planter is to visit the homes of Hispanics, knocking on doors for personal evangelism, delivering evangelistic tracts, explaining the gospel and praying for needs." During a two month period David and his helpers contacted more than fifty homes in person and spoke to about 400 people. This unassuming, gracious Hispanic pastor volunteers at the Mexican Consulate at Southern Illinois University, delivers clothes and school supplies at Fairmont City and State Park and has kicked off a soccer ministry.

Here is David's ministry plan and vision for the next ten years: ten Hispanic churches, 1,000 new Nazarenes, fifteen students enrolled in Christian ministry and ten new Hispanic pastors. Today David has 28 enrolled in a Bible study with 16 in attendance and 21 in Sunday worship in our Collinsville Church. On children's day 75 of the more than 100 attending were Hispanic. We currently have so many Hispanics that for the first time we provided

interpretation at Team Day and this district assembly. And this is our newest church, just one year old.

By proxy he is your representative, and by pledging tonight and giving through your local church you will have opportunity to reach anyone David reaches. In a moment, Bill Shotts will explain how the pledge works followed by David who will ask for your participation.

District Church Planting and Training Goals

Here are the goals I set for us last year:

1st, to train every fulltime pastor within one year in the CPC track

2nd, to train every fulltime pastor within two years in both the CPE and CPC tracks

3rd, to train 20 fulltime pastors as Certified Trainers within two years

4th, to have a district worship attendance of 10,000 by 2020: (a gain of about 500 per

year). Our 2014 district worship attendance was 5,984

How will the Illinois District help you? We pay registration and motel for those who attend a DCPI seminar. We match local church contributions to new starts dollar for dollar through March, 2015 with MST approval of local church new start vision plans. Everybody can do something: 30 of our churches are <u>able to start new works and 50 are able to assist</u>.

Here's Our Progress Report for This Year

DCPI seminars have been hosted at Sherman, Salem Grace and Decatur First, with our next DCPI to be held at Belleville First September 22 - 26. In the spring of 2013 I set a goal of getting all 80 of our churches represented in attendance at both the *Church Planting Essentials* and *Churches Planting Churches* seminars within two years. Here's what happened:

- 48 of 80 pastors attended both seminars,
- 7 of 80 pastors achieved Certified Trainer status and 3 attained provisional status,

2 of 80 pastors, Mark Copley, Will Haworth and I, completed Master Trainer status.
 I especially congratulate the seven pastors who have completed Certified Trainer status:
 Willed Anderson, Dita Pringe, Mark Capley, James Crain, Will Haworth, Kavin Dittmen and

Willard Anderson, Rita Briggs, Mark Copley, James Craig, Will Haworth, Kevin Pittman and David Samayoa. But we must move from the seminar stage to the action stage of

- starting a Bible study in someone's home,
- partnering with another church to plant a church and
- > giving permission for strong families and their tithes to leave your church.

Giving birth to another church makes no more sense than any other sacrifice, such as the sacrifice someone made to start the church you now attend.

A summary of churches started and closed during my 11 years helps us learn from history:

- 1. <u>New works recently started</u>: Jacksonville, Effingham
- 2. <u>New works established and growing</u>: Harrisburg Oasis, Urbana Lighthouse, State Park
- 3. <u>New works declared inactive</u>: Vandalia, Granite City, Highland.
- <u>Churches closed</u>: Charleston, Columbia, Home Gardens, Laclede, Lawrenceville, Metropolis, Omaha, Ridge Farm, Robinson, Springfield Abundant Life, Stonington, Summit Grove, Tilden and West Frankfort.
- 5. <u>New things God is doing</u>: Agape house churches are emerging at Casey, Greenup and Charleston as Allen Ebbler and Mark Copley are following Jesus to other towns. Mark and Michael Kraemer started Hope House last year, a Celebrate-Recovery Parent-Affiliated Church out of Salem Grace. Compassionate Ministry Centers at Olney with Kevin Pittman and Willard Anderson, and Washington Park with Kevin Hancock, plus Bible studies at Effingham with Clinton Smallwood and Deland with John Barker are creating a great problem for us it is getting hard to stay up with all God is doing!
- 6. <u>Churches Planting Churches</u>: Mike Kraemer at Salem Grace and Tim Mondy at Centralia

are in the planning stages of starting a new work in Centralia.

So what can we do today that will make a difference tomorrow?

1. <u>We must invest in children and youth</u>. The sale of Nazarene Acres three years ago created a way for the district to continue its support of children and youth camps without the enormous costs of managing and funding an aging camp facility. With the sale of the last parcel of land at Nazarene Acres just last month, we have a total net profit of \$470,896 or nearly a half million. The district assembly determined that one-fourth of the net proceeds of the sale of our campground be set apart for support of our camping program, and the District Advisory Board specified that ten percent of that amount be distributed on an annual basis to the children's and youth camps. Many parents and others continue to sacrifice to send kids to camp.

2. <u>We must ask someone to mentor us even as we mentor others</u>. The Discipling Tour with Hal and Debbie Perkins a year ago was catalytic and soul changing. Jesus taught Simon Peter that *being* discipled is as important as discipling. Shortly before the crucifixion Jesus said, "Simon, Simon, Satan has asked to sift you as wheat. But I have prayed for you, Simon, that your faith may not fail. And when you have turned back, strengthen your brothers." The Lord trusts that we, despite our failures and fears, will come to our senses and care enough to disciple others. Is any so strong as to have no need of an accountability partner? Just as you need someone, someone needs you. The mid-Century "Crusade for Souls" over sixty years ago was a compelling evangelistic appeal which brought us to the zenith of our explosive growth in the United States. Our current mission statement "To make Christlike disciples in the nations" helps us ask the question "Who is discipling me and who am I discipling?" I have a mentor and serve as a mentor to four.

3. <u>We must pray.</u> Our Prayer Encounters continued for the third consecutive year this week with Corey Jones. Prayer is work, whether for your own devotional life or corporately. But if Jesus got alone with his father, can we do less? I was in a prayer service that began at 4:30 a.m. and had to dismiss at 6:30 a.m. so 500 teens could get to school. When God is glorified by the corporate prayer of Nazarenes he probably thinks, "There they go again – those hopeful, passionate, zealous Nazarenes. I must answer some of their prayers because they just won't quit!"

4. <u>We must ask for beyond-our-walls passion</u>. Like an optometrist who turns the little dials to help us see the big picture with the small print (T T O T A) we can ask God to sharpen our vision and tell us what it means. And he will say, "It means To the Other Towns Also." "But come on, Jesus," the people begged. "Why are you going there? There's plenty to do right here in our own town and synagogue." And so Jesus said, "I am compelled to preach the good news of the Kingdom of God to the other towns also, *because that is why I was sent*. I'm being obedient to my Father as an example to you. If you want to follow me, this is where I am going. The good news of the Kingdom is just too good to be kept here in Capernaum and Galilee."

We rejoice that five of the eight new works we started in eleven years have survived. But fourteen closures plus three new works that were declared inactive means that we have closed two times the number we have started. Of 528 conversions this year, 248 joined by profession of faith – a tremendous discipling opportunity. 49% of our churches, less than half, reported profession of faith gains this year. Here is our district membership and attendance summary since 1944. Since 1970 we have shown declines in worship and Sunday school attendance nearly every year. The one thing that will change this picture is an *urgency* to change this picture. All of us have to look at this picture and personally own it for what it teaches us.

When I was five years old, mom left my sis and me with dad as the baby sitter. On that bright summer day dad let us play outside but inside the fenced-in back yard with stern cautions not to climb the fence. If you suspect that, like Adam and Eve before me, I couldn't obey you are correct. Once over the fence, I followed the paper boy a block or so, soon lost interest in him and was in my own carefree world. I had no sense of fear or thought of being lost. Presently dad pulled up beside me, opened the door and I climbed in the front seat.

Can you imagine the anguish and fear my parents had back home knowing their son had been missing for several hours? Could they have been content to let the neighbors and police search for me while they went about their routine, ordinary chores? The reality of a lost little boy in Kansas City with sunset approaching made them urgent, even desperate to find me. Mother went from door to door while dad drove the streets of that old neighborhood. Everything stopped: supper to fix, sermons to write, phone calls to make. Like the shepherd in Jesus' parable of the lost sheep, they left the house in search of the one that was missing. They were compelled, driven by a sense of urgency to leave the house. Staying busy at home was not acceptable.

Busyness within the walls of the church is like an anesthetic that slowly but successfully numbs our resolve to reach those who are lost outside the church. But you are about to enter a new day, an irresistible calling from a new superintendent that will galvanize you into action and positive change. You will be challenged by someone who will tell you that even your church can have some involvement in church planting, discipling and corporate prayer. It is your turn to disciple the drive-by people, the Bobby X types, who see our buildings more often than they see us.

Bobby X is a friend of mine, but not here tonight. He's an infidel, a 21st century copy of John Bunyan in his pre-conversion state – self-centered, profane—and as such he represents the mission of Jesus Christ in its purest form. By extension Bobby is an adult or a child without religious memory, church affiliation or Christian friends. To the extent that churches find, love, and disciple Bobby, to that extent alone do churches justify keeping their doors open. Think of it: for three brief hours I was once a lost little kid in an urban neighborhood wandering away from home. Had it not been for parents who urgently sought me and Nazarenes who faithfully nurtured me, how far away from home might I have gone? We must ask God for a beyond-our-walls passion that will upset our routines, lift our vision and make fresh our resolve so that we will determine to spend one on one time with Bobby to become his personal friend, alien to grace that he is.

The Nazarenes did that for my extended family. Some of us came in our mother's wombs; others came as beggars seeking redemptive refuge. The Nazarenes took us all in. I was shown the living portrait of the prodigal's Father through my dad and a layman, Ned Thompson. My debt to you and your forebears is a debt I am unable to repay.

It was mother's voice on the phone just three days before she died. "Well, Jim, the people of your district surely love you." "Yes, mom" I said, "they do, far more than I deserve." It is you the unpretentious, Godly people of Illinois that Karen and I thank for eleven years of prayer and generosity beyond measure. Your gift last year celebrating our 50th anniversary made possible a two-day family reunion in the mountains of Idaho last month. Thank you.

So until we meet again may God's favor and blessing rest upon you.

2. Mission Strategy Director

District Mission Strategy Director Report to the District Assembly 2013-2014

Members and friends of the assembly, it is my privilege to present to you my seventh report as District Mission Strategy Director. I want to begin by expressing my gratitude to our District leadership: Thank you Dr. Spruce and Doug Haynes for your faithfulness, partnership, and friendship. The Mission Strategy Team this year included the following members: Philip Alvord, Mike Kraemer, Allen Ebbler, Kevin Hancock, Rita Briggs, Wayne Clevenger, Craig Dillman, James Craig, Timothy Mondy, Will Haworth, and David Samayoa. We also want to acknowledge our church planters and new works that are active on our District: Willard Anderson at The Master's Hands (Compassionate Ministries Center) in Olney, David Samayoa at Buen Samaritano in Collinsville, Rita Briggs in Jacksonville, and Clinton Smallwood, at Effingham. Towards the fulfillment of our mission, the Mission Strategy Team has distributed over \$8,500 in grants this year.

We again enjoyed successful Team Days again this year in both Decatur and Salem. Pastors Brian Powell and Mike Kraemer both challenged us with their preaching and teaching to believe that a NEW DAY is dawning for Christ's work here in Illinois. Special thanks to Randy Dodd, pastor and ONU professor for teaching workshops. To Decatur First, and Salem Grace for hosting us. And to Lara Mondy and her volunteers who planned and worked hard to organize these important events. It was also notable that over 25 members of our Hispanic congregations were there for these events and we offered our first Spanish speaking track of workshops under their pastor's leadership. It is a NEW DAY indeed!

Just last year, we reported to you God's plan for launching our mission into the Hispanic communities of our District through the work of our new Hispanic Ministries Coordinator, David Samayoa. Pastor Kevin Hancock bore this vision in his heart and shared it with his congregation in Collinsville, who wholeheartedly agreed to welcome the Samayoas and their ministry into their church family. I'm happy to report to you that in February, Dr. Spruce and I were there to witness the launch of the new Buen Samaritano Iglesia del Nazareno with the Collinsville congregation. It was a joyous bilingual celebration of praise, attended and supported by members of the Arcola and Beardstown Spanish congregations. Pastors Waldo Perez, and Enrique Riofrio were there to sing and translate, along with many members of their congregations. It was a Spirit blessed time as the Arcos family became charter members of the new church, and as a man came forward after David's preaching to surrender his life to Christ. Please understand that David's ministry is not that of a singular church planter, but as a missionary, and so he has already begun seeking to begin new Hispanic congregations in Effingham and the Champaign areas. Please continue to pray and support the Samayoas as they continue their work this year.

Also last year, Dr. Spruce challenged all of our churches to attend a DCPI Church Planting seminar within two years. In the last year, 35 of our churches, almost one-half, and 48 of our pastors, have have attended one or more training seminars. Five of our pastors are classified as Certified Trainers, who can reteach this material to others: Willard Anderson, James Craig, David Samayoa, Rita Briggs, and Kevin Pittman. Three of our pastors have qualified as Master Trainers, who can certify new trainers: Mike Kraemer, Will Haworth, and I. Dr. Spruce has also completed his certification as a Master Trainer. Though we realize that this is only the classroom part of church planting, we believe we are laying the groundwork for a church planting movement on our District. The fact that both our Hispanic work in Collinsville, and our latest work in Effingham were envisioned during these training events, testifies to that fact.

We already have our next training event planned for September 22-26 at Belleville First. If you are a pastor, and have not attended one of these events, please plan on doing so, and if you have someone on your staff or in your congregation who may be called to be a church planter, bring them with you. The District has again made these events affordable to all by paying all registration fees, and reimbursing lodging expenses for all participants from our District. We continue to see a Church Planting Movement on the horizon of our District's future. To be part of this, we must first multiply disciples, as Christ called us to do. Then, we must discern those disciples who are gifted and called to leadership, and provide training for their multiplication as well. Ultimately, the planning of new churches will be the result of disciples, and leaders set apart and sent by the Spirit to begin new churches among the lost.

Through the work of Bill Wiesman, and his Prayer Task Force, this movement has already begun. We don't want to allow what God is doing to pass us by here in Illinois. So pastors and leaders, here's what you can do: Pray, support, or send your people in the effort to start new churches. If you share in the labor, you'll share in the joy of the harvest! It's a new day ... let's meet it with a new passion, for a new people, and a new Illinois!

This was a real treat for us as we heard Melody give her testimony. As they traveled the zones we learned that God is also in Uganda. PRAISE GOD! Thank you to Wayne Laforce, our deputation coordinator and to all the zone leaders for making the rallies possible. Thank you to those host churches and to all who supported the services by attendance and finances.

Our LINKS missionaries this year were Tim and Lydia Kim and their 3 sons, David, John and Daniel who are serving as missionaries to the Philippines and also Frances Vine, retired missionary living in Pasadena, Ca. Thank you for taking care of these special individuals. You are receiving a new LINKS missionary today in your President packets. Write them, encourage them and love them as Jesus would.

We held workshops at both the North and South Team Day including one taught by Becky where we learned to find mission resources on-line. In one of the workshops we did hands on mission work as we prepared 12 crisis care kits and sent a love package to both our LINKS missionaries. We learn new ideas as we share together. NMI is Missions International. This includes churches around the world as well as each of our towns. Our year-end report indicates many of us have been educating about missions to our churches and communities. PRAISE GOD FOR WHAT IS ACCOMPLISHED as we are obedient.

Our last objective is giving. Just as the earliest Christians "pooled their resources so that each person's need was met" believers today eagerly share what they have to bring new members into God's family.

One simple and essential way to express mission passion is financial support. NMI has designed a bunch of opportunities to support mission workers and meet human needs around the world through sharing.

And no one wants to be left out: a Zimbabwean woman brings the family's only chicken to the altar during a mission offering; a United States teenager picks up a part-time job so he can give to the same offering; a Brazilian student donates her new computer to the church, a Korean business man gives some of his profit to World Evangelism Fund.

Nazarenes around the world generously share their resources to expand Christ's kingdom on earth!

The big offering, of course, is the World Evangelism Fund. This keeps our missionaries on the field. As a district we gave a total of \$ 433,766.10. Thank you! Thank you! Praise God! The goal for each church for World Evangelism is 5.5% of your reported income. Thank you to all who were able to do this. For those who gave 5.7% or above of the reported income earned the designation as World Evangelism Church of Excellence. If you were wondering about those who have the pretty necklaces—these are the Church of Excellence Presidents. Would you stand and show your necklaces? Praise God! You have gone above. Thank you for your generous giving. We are also a District World Evangelism Church of Excellence! Thank you to each one. Praise God!!!!

Many of you also participated in the Alabaster offering. This helps purchase land and build buildings for churches, hospitals, schools and pastor homes. Our district gathered \$ 35,186.83 in this sacrificial offering. Thank you, Praise God for what He can accomplish with these funds.

This is one objective with our economy that is harder for some of our churches to meet, but God owns the cattle on a thousand hills and I don't think the economy has affected Him and He will provide if we are faithful to Him.

I would like to move into our memorial roll at this time. If Wayne LaForce, Thad Haynes, and James Craig will come forward.

We are saddened by the passing of these loved ones but also in celebration for them as they are now with Jesus with no pain, sadness or hurts. That is what we are working for here on earth. If Dr. Spruce will come forward we would like to now make a presentation. (Distinguished Service Award to Bill Brandon family).

I cannot do this job alone. I would like to have you meet your council at this time. They are a big help to me. If all the council including zone leaders would come forward.

The board accepted the "Proposal for Transitional Leadership Organization" requested by the Mattoon Real Life Church, to be reviewed yearly.

The DAB voted to present a Resolution to the District Assembly to appoint the Finance Committee as a Budget preparation subcommittee, and that the Full Finance Committee also include the pastor and one layman from each church who attend.

The board approved the District Budget.

The board voted to affirm Bill Shotts as Treasurer and Chairman of the Finance Committee.

The board appointed Larry Lacher as Secretary of the DAB. The board appointed Jay Shoff as temporary Chair, in the absence of the District Superintendent.

The DAB voted to terminate salary for Tim Young, Jr. at the anniversary date of his hiring. The board voted to allow the Tim Young family to remain in the parsonage at Granite City, cost-fee until Oct. 1, 2013. The board later voted to allow the Youngs to remain in the parsonage until Jan. 1, 2014, but that they be responsible for all utilities beginning Nov. 1, 2013.

The board voted to order a market analysis of the Granite City parsonage and to retain a rental manager to manage the property. The board authorized the D.S. and Associate to prepare the Granite City property for rental, including authorizing any repairs needed.

The board voted to return checks to people who could not attend the Christmas party due to the weather.

The board voted to modify the Christmas Banquet to conserve funds.

The board voted to appoint Jon Kroeze to fill the vacancy by Larry Lacher's resignation from the DAB.

The board appointed Fred Prince to replace Larry Lacher as ONU trustee.

The DAB voted to pull the Effingham properties from the market for a period of one year, to allow The Smallwoods to use the parsonage (through Jan. 1, 2014) to begin a New Start - to be reviewed within the year. Doug Haynes was authorized to work with the contract and realtor to compensate him fairly for his efforts on our behalf.

The board approved the sale of the Taylorville parsonage.

The board approved the sale of the associate's parsonage at Decatur West Side church.

The board established as DAB Policy that: a minimum of 25% of the proceeds from the sale of any parsonage be retained in a restricted account to be used for future pastoral housing.

The board approved the nominating committee for 2014.

The DAB voted to host a reception for the Spruces at their retirement - and to present them a check for \$11,000, in acknowledgement of their eleven years of service to the IL District. 4. Mission Strategy Team Report

Members and friends of the assembly, it is my privilege to present to you my seventh report as chairman of the District Mission Strategy Team. The Mission Strategy Team this year included the following members: Dr. James R. Spruce, chairman (ex-officio); Mark Copley, Mission Strategy Director; Philip Alvord, Mike Kraemer, Allen Ebbler, Kevin Hancock, Rita Briggs, Wayne Clevenger, Craig Dillman, James Craig, Timothy Mondy, Will Haworth, and David Samayoa. We also want to acknowledge our church planters and new works that are active on our District: Willard Anderson at The Master's Hands (Compassionate Ministries Center) in Olney, David Samayoa at Buen Samaritano in Collinsville, Rita Briggs in Jacksonsville, and Clinton Smallwood, at Effingham. Towards the fulfillment of our mission, Mission Strategy Team has distributed over \$8,500 in grants this year.

In 2013, Dr. Spruce challenged all of our churches to attend a DCPI Church Planting seminar within two years. In the last year, 35 of our churches, almost one-half, and 48 of our pastors, have have attended one or more training seminars. Five of our pastors are classified as Certified Trainers, who can reteach this material to others: Willard Anderson, James Craig, David Samayoa, Rita Briggs, and Kevin Pittman. Three of our pastors have gualified as Master Trainers, who can certify new trainers: Mark Copley, Mike Kraemer, and Will Haworth. Dr. Spruce has also completed his certification as a Master Trainer. Though we realize that this is only the classroom part of church planting, we believe we are laying the groundwork for a church planting movement on our District. The fact that both our Hispanic work in Collinsville, and our latest work in Effingham were envisioned out of these events, testifies to that fact. We already have our next training event planned for September 22-26 at Belleville First. If you are a pastor, and have not attended one of these events, please plan on doing so, and if you have someone on your staff or in your congregation is a potential church planter, bring them with you. The District has again made these events affordable to all by paying all registration fees, and reimbursing lodging expenses for all participants from our District.

Last year, we reported to you God's plan for launching our mission into the Hispanic communities of our District through the work of our new Hispanic Ministries Coordinator, David Samayoa. Pastor Kevin Hancock bore this vision in his heart and shared it with his congregation in Collinsville, who wholeheartedly agreed to welcome the Samayoas and their ministry into their church family. I'm happy to report to you that in February, Dr. Spruce and I were there to witness the launch of the new Buen Samaritano Iglesia del Nazareno with the Collinsville church. It was a joyous bilingual celebration of praise, attended and supported by members of the Arcola and Beardstown Spanish congregations. Pastors Waldo Perez, and Enrique Riofrio were there to sing and translate. It was a Spirit blessed time as the Arcos family became charter members of the new church, and as a man came forward after David's preaching to surrender his life to Christ. Understand that David's ministry is not that of a singular church planter, but as a missionary, and so he has already begun seeking to begin new Hispanic congregations in Effingham and the Champaign areas.

We again enjoyed successful Team Days again this year in both Decatur and Salem. Pastors Brian Powell and Mike Kraemer both challenged us with their preaching and teaching to believe that a NEW DAY is dawning for Christ's work here in Illinois. Special thanks to Randy Dodd, pastor and ONU professor for teaching workshops. To Decatur First, and Salem Grace for hosting us. And to Lara Mondy and her volunteers who planned and worked hard to organize these important events. It was notable that over 25 members of our

Hispanic congregations were there for these events and we offered our first Spanish speaking track of workshops under their pastor's leadership. It is a NEW DAY indeed!

The Mission Strategy Team reemphasizes the following goals:

- Each church developing opportunities for weekly corporate prayer seeking to honor God's presence and seek His will for their community and the district.
- Each church developing a written strategic plan for reaching the lost and church growth.
- Each pastor involved in a coaching movement and intentionally connecting with other pastors.
- Each church striving for "Church Health" using the Church Health Survey and the Natural Church Development process.
- Each church embracing a clearly stated target area and plan for involvement in church multiplication.

We believe that the events of this year have moved us closer to these goals, and that the vision for "a new passion, for a new people, and a new Illinois" is coming into view. We continue to pray and seek the fulfillment of our mission, *"To become healthy, missional churches and pastors in order to make Christlike disciples in Illinois."*

Christ is calling us to join him in making Christlike disciples in the nations. As a District, we must follow Him into the new day that he is creating for his Church in Illinois.

1. Finance Committee

We, your Finance Committee, recommend the following:

- In accordance with the General Church of the Nazarene Global Ministry Center that all budget payments be based on Church Income. Church Income (Qualified Income for Illinois District purposes) is defined as all income eligible under IRS guidelines for a tax deduction, reduced by payments made to the World Evangelism Fund, payments made for approved 10% specials, deductions for rare circumstances, phase in adjustments, and any other deduction allowed by the General Church of the Nazarene Global Ministry Center.
- That the Illinois District Budget be a unified budget with a single budget payment to include district administration and operations, NMI, NYI, and SDMI. All budget payments to be allocated to each department based on their pro-rata portion of budget receipts. Budget payments should be sent to William E. Shotts unified district treasurer.
- 3. That the World Evangelism Fund be 5.5 percent of Church Income, Pensions and Benefits Fund be 2.25 percent, the Olivet Nazarene University Fund be 2.25 percent, and the Unified District Fund be 5.85 percent.

- 4. That every church endeavor to be 10 percent for world missions as based on an amount equal to or greater than 10% of Church Income, less amount paid for World Evangelism Fund and approved specials (missions giving).
- 5. That the Unified District Funds be allocated as follows:

Unified District	88.61%
NMI	2.24%
NYI	6.27%
SDMI	2.88%

- 6. That all Funds (World Evangelism, Unified District, Olivet Nazarene University, and Pensions and Benefits) be calculated and paid weekly beginning in May.
- That only churches which have paid in full the Unified District Fund, the Olivet Nazarene University Fund, the Pensions and Benefits Fund, and the World Evangelism Fund, be permitted to report all funds paid in full.
- 8. That no congregation be granted permission to go in debt for any building or improvement program, or the hiring of any staff or assistants, until it has shown the ability to pay all of its obligations, including funds paid in full for two years preceding the request, debt under consideration and/or the additional salary, and that the amount of the indebtedness and terms of payment not jeopardize the spiritual life of the church. Exceptions may be granted by the District Superintendent only with the unanimous approval of the District Advisory Board. (Manual, par. 235.4).
- 9. That every church prepare and adopt an annual operating budget for the church in accordance with (Manual, par. 129.6 & 129.7). Should assistance be requested for the preparation of a budget, the district will be happy to provide such assistance to the church.
- 10. That every church adopt a written "Designated Gift Policy". Should assistance be requested for the preparation of a designated gift policy, the district will be happy to provide such assistance to the church.
- 11. That October 5, 2014, be designated as Nazarene Bible College Sunday in our local churches and that a special offering be received and forwarded to the Bible College immediately.
- 12. That December 7, 2014, be designated as American Bible Society Sunday in our local churches, and that an offering be received and sent to the General Treasurer in Kansas City immediately.
- That January 11, 2015, be designated as Nazarene Theological Seminary Sunday in our local churches, and that an offering be received and sent to the Seminary in Kansas City immediately.
- 14. That April 19, 2015, be designated as Olivet Nazarene University Sunday in our local churches, and that an offering be received and sent to our District Treasurer for Olivet.

- 15. That the salary of the district superintendent be \$73,500.00 annually, plus \$10,075.00 annually be invested for him in a tax-sheltered annuity, SE payments of \$14,843.00 and \$1,050.00 annually for reimbursable expenses and that he be given five weeks' vacation with pay at a time convenient for him.
- 16. That the salary of the Administrative Assistant be \$45,265.00 annually, plus \$3,294.00 annually be invested for him in a tax-sheltered annuity, Housing allowance of \$13,800.00, SE payments of \$9,556.16 and that he be given vacation in accordance with manual guidelines with pay at a time convenient for him.
- 17. That the salary of the District Missionary be \$23,303.00 and SE payments of \$3,762.22 annually.
- That the salary of the Hispanic Coordinator be \$26,300.00 annually, \$1,200.00 in a tax-sheltered annuity, housing allowance of \$10,000.00, and SE payments of \$5,129.03 as established by contractual agreement.
- 19. That the District advisory Board be authorized to provide a district-owned vehicle, plus travel and expenses, for the district superintendent.
- 20. That the District advisory Board be authorized to provide a district owned vehicle, plus travel and expenses, for the travel and expenses, for the administrative assistant.
- 21. That the District Advisory Board be authorized to provide a district-owned vehicle, plus travel and expenses, for the District Missionary.
- 22. That the District Advisory Board be authorized to provide a district-owned vehicle, plus travel and expenses, for the Hispanic Coordinator.
- 23. That the district boards' committees', and councils' travel reimbursement be at the current IRS rate and that actual meals and lodging expenses away from home be reimbursed. These expenses to be paid from appropriate operating fund.
- 24. That the honorarium for the district secretary be \$4,010.20 per year, and that expenses for clerical help be allowed.
- 25. That the professional fees to be paid for accounting and bookkeeping services for the district including the medical fund, NMI, NMI, and SDMI be \$51,912.00 per year.
- 26. That a recommended rate of \$8.25 per hour be paid for temporary secretarial services provided for district departments such as Board of Ministerial Studies, School of Ministry and any other services required during the year.
- 27. That the local churches pay the health insurance plan for pastors and dependents, and for associate pastors and dependents; and that the district pay \$2,000 per year for the cost of the health plan premium for full-time commissioned evangelists and their families, and that the local church (where evangelist holds membership) pay the balance of the premium.
- 28. That our people be encouraged in the stewardship of possessions as related to wills, annuities, and the life loans for the local church, district home missions, world missions, our colleges and seminary. That the Department of Stewardship regional representative, Rev. Larry Hindmand, 9625 Mason, Oak Lawn, IL 60453 (708-857-4770) be contracted by local churches for counseling service in life income wills and bequests. That our churches be encouraged to utilize the Church of the Nazarene Foundation for planned and deferred gifts from their members to any Nazarene

ministry, including gifts to the local church, and to use the Foundation to manage investment accounts, endowments, or charitable trusts. Visit <u>www.NazareneFoundation.org</u> or call 866-273-4721 for additional information.

- 29. That the local church boards strictly adhere to the provisions of the <u>Manual</u>, Pars. 129.21, 129.22, 129.23, concerning the counting and the accounting for all monies received and disbursed, and an annual audit of the financial records.
- 30. That each local church treasurer use printed forms for reporting all monies received and disbursed each month, and that the pastor and church board be provided a copy or copies of the monthly treasurer's report (<u>Manual</u>, par. 135.4).

7. Christian Cultural Engagement

A. WHEREAS, in times when our culture desperately needs the Church to be a living example of Christ-like holiness and love, we strongly urge:

1. All our sisters and brothers in Christ to remember that we are called to be the Body of Christ in our world being empowered by the Holy Spirit to the glory of God the Father. As a result, we urge our brothers and sisters to remember the importance of corporate Christian worship, the receiving of the Sacraments and the practice of spiritual disciplines within the family and individually, believing that these are primary Means of Grace by which the Holy Spirit shapes us into a holy people.

2. That pastors, evangelists, and leaders live and teach the scriptural doctrines of the new birth and entire sanctification, believing that the Holy Spirit bears witness to both works of grace through the infilling of His Spirit, and that the one biblical evidence of the latter is the cleansing of the heart by faith from original sin manifested by the fruit of the Spirit in Christian service: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self- control (Gal 5:22-24).

3. That the church manual be made available to all in the church who desire it and the Articles of Faith (Manual, Part II, para 1-22, pgs. 28-37) and the Covenant of Christian Character (Manual, Part II, Articles 27-27.3, pgs. 38- 40) be read, or printed, and distributed to the church body at least once a year admonishing each Nazarene to diligently pursue a lifestyle that honors God, the church and one another.

4. That new converts be lovingly nourished and instructed in the way of holiness.

5. That all of our people, "in putting off the old to put on the new and holy way of life as well as the mind of Christ" (Eph 4:17-24), take to heart The Covenant of Christian Conduct of our church which gives guidance in areas of Christian Ethics, Entertainment, Marriage & Divorce, Abortion, Human Sexuality, Christian Stewardship, etc. (Manual, Part III, para 33-41, pgs 46-60).

B. WHEREAS, ethics and values are constantly being questioned and changed by our society, the church must strengthen itself in its commitment and conduct. Therefore, this committee felt it vitally important to not only reaffirm our belief in Scripture and our Wesleyan guidelines, but to also provide useful information in this document to resource both laity and clergy to make the church both a beacon of hope and a model of holiness to our families, community and world. (Matthew 5:10-17; Ephesians 5:1-2,8-14; I Peter 1:13-17).

Believing that ministry in the life of a Christian is based upon who we are in Christ, not merely the activities that we engage in, we encourage our people to see their world through the eyes of Jesus, to seek out opportunities for love and service at home and at work, within their local church as well as in the larger community. We also encourage our

people to work with and in public institutions as a means of Christ-like engagement with our culture on the local, State, National, and Global levels.

1. Each local church should strive to provide opportunities for Christ-like service such as:

a) Ministries to the vulnerable, marginalized, and hurting within one's own congregation, believing that Christian love demonstrated toward those within our own fellowship is one way that Christ's love is made evident to the culture around us.

b) Consider initiating special ministries that reach out to the needy in the community.

2. Along with engaging in acts of love and service through the local church, we must encourage our people to bring the same acts of kindness into their workplaces and homes. In understanding that Christ has called not only pastors, but in fact all Christians to be salt and light in the world, we must encourage our people to not look at their homes and workplaces as mundane and trivial, but as places to which they have been called to bring the love and hope of Jesus. We must understand that being a missional church is not something we do only corporately, but something we do individually, everyday as we live our lives as salt and light in this dark and broken world.

3. Our people should show Christian stewardship by becoming involved in civic, community and school functions and cooperating with other churches and civic agencies who share our ministry objectives. Our pastors, youth workers and parents should maintain an awareness of the activities and promotions of organizations within the local school system and unite in an effort to oppose activities that do not comply with New Testament moral standards. Examples of civic organizations to offer aid and service to:

- a) Pregnancy Resource Centers
- b) Homeless Shelters
- c) Habitat for Humanity
- d) Credible Christian Counseling Centers
- Food & Clothing Pantries such as Hopeful Hearts Ministries in Decatur, the Good Samaritan Ministries Center in the

Metro-East and The Master's Hand in Olney and Newton along with multiple food pantries in local churches throughout the district.

- f) Nursing Homes; Senior Adult Organizations
- g) Appropriate Parent/Teacher Organizations (Resources: Nazarene Compassionate Ministries; Focus on the Family; Salvation Army; Nazarene Ethnic Ministries; Illinois Family Institute, 799 Roosevelt Road, Building 3, Suite 208, Glen Ellyn, IL; Toll free: (800- FAMILY-1); Fax:(630) 790-8390; Email: info@illinoisfamily.org).

4. We should actively monitor our State and Federal Legislature on issues which pertain to, and affect our church and community and express appreciation to individuals/organizations that promote legislature and programs which edify. We encourage the above while being simultaneously mindful that our commitment to

Christ our Lord must always be far greater than our commitment to any political party, agenda, or association. Therefore, we urge church leaders to make available the names and addresses of government officials and stress the importance of prayer for all elected officials. We also call our people to thoughtful participation in local, state and national politics, especially pertaining to the biblical ideals of faith, family, and social justice while also wholeheartedly acknowledging that the politics of this world are not the politics of the kingdom of God.

8. Church Growth

We, your Committee on Church Growth, make the following recommendations to the district assembly for consideration:

Commission

We recommend that every church emphasize the Great Commission (Matthew 28:16-20) in every facet of their ministry. Scripture is very clear that our primary motivation in church growth is seeing souls saved and discipled in Christ Jesus.

Prayer

Prayer is the foundation for all church growth. Without prayer; little of lasting value will be accomplished. We also recommend that the church provide opportunities for concentrated prayer and fasting during the church year. We recommend that each local church do their best to support the District sponsored Prayer Summits and Encounters.

Mission/Vision/Purpose

We encourage every church to develop a mission statement, a vision statement, and a clear statement of purpose. We recommend that these three key elements be presented to the local congregation on a regular basis to ensure continued focus on God's plan, mission and vision for the local church.

Responsibility List

That every church maintain an accurate and detailed responsibility list. We also encourage each congregation to actively and regularly contact, nurture, and disciple those that they have claimed responsibility for.

Calling

That absentees be contacted through a regular, systematic approach. This is not solely the responsibility of the pastor, but should be a shared ministry within the church among the laity.

Discipleship

Emphasis should be given not only to evangelism, but also the discipleship. The new Christian should be encouraged to seek the experience of entire sanctification which leads to continued spiritual growth, productive service, inspirational witness in the Christian life

Lay Ministry

We encourage each local church to seek creative ways to provide for and promote Christian service and ministry opportunities within the church and community.

Education

That pastors and laymen take full advantage of educational and CEU opportunities, including seminars, workshops, videos, books, and especially the quality CLT programs that our denomination offers.

Evangelism

That each local congregation seek to evangelize their community with the vision of seeing souls saved and lives changed by the grace and glory of God. That innovative and creative methods of outreach and evangelism be explored and implemented.

New Church Starts

We believe every church on the Illinois District can and should be prayerfully involved in creating or supporting new church starts. That each pastor promote and attend the Church Planting Essentials and Churches Planting Churches DCPI training. That prayer, funding, and personal involvement in new church plants be part of the local church mission statement and vision.

Personal Evangelism

It is the privilege and duty of every Christian to share their faith with others. We encourage all churches to provide specialized training for various types of personal evangelism as well as develop a mentoring support plan for the discipleship of new converts.

Revivals

We encourage our churches to plan for and facilitate annual revival campaigns. We strongly urge the use of full-time evangelists in the Church of the Nazarene.

Servant Evangelism

That methods of servant evangelism be employed in churches of all sizes and in all areas. That the local church look for creative and helpful ways to be a blessing to the community it ministers to.

Finances

Set aside a portion of the annual church budget for purposes of outreach and evangelism. The Bible says, "Where your treasure is, there your heart will be also."

Evangelism Committee

We encourage each church to review and implement the guidelines for a local Evangelism and Church Membership Committee as stated in the 2009-2013 *Manual,* page 71, and section 110-110.8.

Global Church Growth Award

It should be the goal of every church to introduce each new convert into the membership of the Church of the Nazarene.

The purpose of the General Superintendents' Growth Award (GSGA) is to give prominence to those practices that are central to the local and worldwide advancement of the church; specifically, new Nazarenes, significant involvement in sponsoring a new church, and 100% participation in fund allocations.

- Churches that win people to Christ are healthy.
- Starting new churches is the most effective means of evangelism known to the church.
- Fund allocations are essential to the cooperative ministries of the Church of the Nazarene.
- I. New Nazarenes requirements are based on 10% of attendance for the current year.
- II. The meaning of "significant involvement in sponsoring a new church" is very specific and is spelled out in the Sponsorship Criteria Worksheet. This worksheet is available online.
- III. Full participation in fund allocations includes district assignment, educational support, pensions (applicable to US only), and World Evangelism Fund.
 - The requirements for receiving this award are intentionally high—it is special recognition by the Board of General Superintendents.
 - It is not based on attendance or membership.
 - This award is not intended to replace all awards.

This award is given in recognition of outstanding accomplishment in essential practices of the expansion of the kingdom of God through the Church of the Nazarene. The presentation of this award is intended to say "Thank You" to the receiving pastor and church, and to elevate in the consciousness of our people the compelling importance of winning people to Christ, starting new churches, and supporting the organizational structures that make possible evangelism around the world.

9. Ministerial Staff Support

We, your Committee on Ministerial Staff Support, submit the following in order to care for the welfare of our spiritual leaders and encourage their commitment to our spiritual guidance.

The district office and the Pastoral Support Committee want to assist pastors and church boards in understanding their roles in providing adequate compensation for its pastors and staffs. Support of the pastor by the church is an expression of the belief in the call of

God on the life of the pastor rather than a job where monies are paid for services rendered. Adequate compensation enables a pastor to fulfill his or her calling.

Pastoral support extends beyond the compensation and benefits for the pastor and staff and includes those expenses incurred by pastoral staff which is necessary to conduct the business of the church. Each church pays a sum to a pastor's ministry, which is divided into several categories: compensation, benefits and expenses. The sum of these categories is considered the cost of ministry to the local church, not all of which is to be considered the income of the pastor.

The district Pastoral Support Committee has developed guidelines for local pastoral support committees to evaluate their commitment to the ministry of the pastor. Anyone wanting further assistance in assessing or planning adequate compensation may contact the district office. In addition to consideration for the local pastors, churches should also establish a remuneration policy for pulpit supply, including travel expenses.

Senior Pastor

The senior pastor is the leader of the church and a leader in the local community.

Bi-vocational Pastor

A bi-vocational pastor supplements income by means other than church compensation. Churches should view the circumstances that cause the pastor to supplement income as a temporary situation to be resolved as soon as possible. The goal is to remove as many worldly concerns from the pastor as possible, so that the pastor may attend more intently on his or her life's calling. Recognizing that small and young churches may have difficulty in providing adequately for their pastor and family, we urge such churches to use what they are able to provide to the best advantage of their pastor and to strive toward the goal of full support.

Associate Pastor and Staff

An associate pastor is defined as a partner in ministry, on staff, whether receiving compensation or not. The church is to work toward a similar benefit package for the full-time associate as for the senior pastor (guideline to the church: an amount equal to 70 to 80 percent of the senior pastor's compensation package). Associate pastor and staff salaries should be negotiated in accordance with the recommendations of the senior pastor.

Retired Pastor

A retired pastor is a minister with retirement status. We recommend that retired pastors be employed for pulpit supply as frequently as possible. Retired pastors usually live on meager retirement benefits and may welcome the opportunity to provide for pulpit supply. Retired pastors are a source of experience and expertise that is available to the local church.

Evangelist

Often, the evangelist's only source of income is from meetings held at various local churches. We recommend that a full-time evangelist's minimum remuneration for such a meeting be an amount equal to twice the local senior pastor's weekly cash salary for each full Sunday in the special meeting (as recommended by the Evangelism Ministries of the Division of Local Church Growth). The local senior pastor's weekly cash salary and prorated insurance and

Social Security benefits should all be included in the compensation. Additional compensation for housing and travel-related expenses should be paid in a separate check, allowing for maximum tax benefit for the evangelist.

I. For the Pastor

A. Concerning Salary:

 That for all full-time pastors, every church provides a minimum of \$ 475 per week salary. By definition, salary should not be deemed to include reimbursements and cost of ministry expenses listed below in Section B, Paragraph 1. The Advisory Board is to make the distinction between full-time and bi-vocational pastors. That churches which are legitimately unable to provide for such remuneration recognize that their pastor is bi-vocational and, therefore, able and obligated to supplement his or her income. We recommend that the district superintendent or designated personnel monitor the suggested minimum weekly salary on the basis of the materials provided by the general church's worksheet and, when necessary, give strong counsel to church boards to provide the above-stated minimum salary and benefits.

- 2. That the church place, as an employee benefit, an amount equal to 10 percent of the ministerial staff's monthly salary in a tax-sheltered annuity each month for his/her retirement. This is the third leg of the retirement tier recommended by the Pensions and Benefits office of the general Church of the Nazarene.
- 3. That the church review the ministerial staff salary at least annually and that increases reflect at least cost-of-living increases. That a letter be sent once a year from the district superintendent to the local church board secretary reminding the board of its responsibility in this area, and that a written summation of the board's action shall be returned to the district superintendent within 30 days of the local board meeting.
- That any significant increase in the annual amount raised for all purposes by the church during a pastor's tenure be taken into consideration at the time salary and benefits are reviewed.
- B. Concerning Reimbursements:
 - 1. That the church pays reimbursements for all church-related expenses, and that among these are standard mileage reimbursement at the recommended IRS rate for personally-owned automobiles. To avoid additional financial burden on the pastor and staff during these days of rapidly increasing gasoline prices, the church board is strongly encouraged to monitor and comply with any increases the IRS may possibly make on its recommended mileage rate during the calendar year. Entertainment expenses, office supplies, continuing education expenses (books, tuition, conferences, etc.), gifts and all other reimbursable expenses deemed appropriate by the IRS should also be included.
 - 2. Church-related expenses of pastoral staff should be qualified on the basis of material from General Headquarters, as well as the Internal Revenue Service. Every church should provide adequately to prevent financial strain to the parsonage family, and that every church provides 100 percent Social Security and full family hospitalization. That churches be allowed to maintain their present insurance program, and if churches propose a change, the change should be approved by the district superintendent and the District Advisory Board.
 - 3. That the church provides the ministerial staff expense to all church-related functions, including the district and general assemblies. Lodging, meals and transportation shall be a part of this expense.
 - 4. That the churches encourage and financially support its ministerial staff to continuing education through school, seminars and conferences.
 - 5. That each local church board provides funds for the purpose of sending its ministerial staff to the general assembly.
- C. Concerning Housing:
 - 1. That the church provides housing and utilities and/or adequate housing allowance. Utilities shall include heat, water, sewer, electric, gas, internet, and trash pickup at a minimum.

- 2. That the church equips the parsonage with a stove, refrigerator, air conditioning, washer, dryer, draperies, curtains and carpeting.
- That a minister could request the church board to adjust his/her compensation for any year in which it is anticipated that the minister will purchase major appliances and/or furniture.
- 4. That the fair-rental value and the designated additional parsonage allowance should be entered into church board records at the beginning of each calendar year. When a housing allowance is established in lieu of a parsonage, a review of the allowance should be made annually regarding payment, taxes, utilities and repairs.
- 5. That the Board of Trustees or Church Board of the local church inspect the parsonage once each year in order to continue to provide for quality living conditions. No parsonage family should be expected to live in substandard housing. This inspection should be scheduled with the pastor and spouse and be done in their presence. Any necessary changes seen at this inspection should be completed as soon as possible.
- 6. That the local church board makes all necessary arrangements for the ministerial staff's moving expenses.
- D. Concerning the Ministerial Staff's General Emotional and Spiritual Welfare:
 - 1. That the church continually lifts the parsonage families in prayer.
 - That the church remembers the ministerial staff's family with suitable gifts at appropriate times during the year and consider a gift of no less than one week's salary at Christmas.
 - 3. That the church provide for vacation and time off according to the following scale (this schedule refers to total years in ministry):
 - a. One year in the ministry: two weeks vacation
 - b. Two to ten years in the ministry: three weeks vacation
 - c. Ten to twenty years in the ministry: four weeks vacation
 - d. Twenty or more years in the ministry: five weeks vacation
 - (District Assembly, Family Camp, ministerial retreats and seminars, and working in Teen or Children's Camps are not to be considered as part of this vacation time allowance.)
 - 4. In order to benefit the church and the health of the pastor, the church should encourage the pastoral staff to take a minimum of one day per week for family time.
 - 5. That the church allow the senior pastor the privilege of holding a full week revival or speaking engagement of one or more days, not to exceed seven days per year, with the church to be responsible for pulpit supply without loss of salary to the pastor.
 - That the local church offer the pastor/staff two mental health days each month to be taken at the pastor's discretion, to be used at a time when workload or individual stress is overwhelming.
 - That the local church make available to its pastor a one month sabbatical at the end of each five years of uninterrupted ministry to that same church.
 II. For All Full-time Evangelists (Song and Otherwise)

- A. Concerning Salary:
 - 1. That evangelists be paid at least an amount equal to twice the pastor's salary or a minimum of \$500 for each Sunday of the meeting.
 - 2. That, in addition, Social Security on the amount of salary be summarily paid.
 - 3. That evangelists be notified in writing at the time the meeting is scheduled of the minimum remuneration they can expect to receive from the local church.
 - 4. That local churches avoid canceling previously scheduled revivals.
 - 5. That a local church canceling a revival without notifying the evangelist at least 30 days in advance be obligated to pay the minimum remuneration in full, unless the evangelist is able to reschedule the same date.
- B. Concerning Reimbursements and Housing
 - 1. That churches provide for all travel expenses, lodging and food during the meeting.
 - 2. That local churches having full-time evangelists as members pay one-half the cost of the district hospitalization insurance.
 - 3. That local churches having full-time evangelists as members provide for their expenses to general and district gatherings.
- C. Concerning the Evangelist's General Emotional and Spiritual Welfare:
 - 1. That finances for revivals be raised in advance of the scheduled meeting.
 - 2. That the local church sends a Christmas gift to all evangelists who have served the church during that calendar year.
 - That local churches having full-time evangelists as members provide encouragement and support for their ministry through prayer and such tangible ways as love offerings and remembering them on their birthdays and anniversaries.

III. For Retired Ministerial Staff

- A. Concerning Reimbursements:
 - 1. That local churches having retired ministers as members provide for their expenses to general and district gatherings they wish to attend.
- B. Concerning Their General Emotional and Spiritual Welfare
 - 1. That local churches having retired ministers as members remember them often, such as at birthdays, anniversaries and Christmas, with gifts of gratitude for their years of faithful service in the Kingdom.
 - 2. That the Illinois District gives a one-time love gift to all elders upon their retirement. We recommend a minimum of \$1,000.

We ask that each local church board secretary and pastor receive a copy of this report from the district superintendent and that the same shall be read or distributed by the church board secretary to the church board as a reminder of their responsibilities. The church board secretary shall notify the district superintendent in writing concerning the fulfillment of this policy.

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Board of Directors Illinois District Church of the Nazarene

We have audited the accompanying statement of assets, liabilities and net assets – modified cash basis of the Administration, Home Mission, Camp Ground, District Reserve, Olivet Nazarene University, Medical, Nazarene Missions International, Church New Start, Sunday School and Discipleship Ministries International and Nazarene Youth International funds of the Illinois District Church of the Nazarene as of April 30, 2014, and the related statements of support, revenue and expenses and cash flows – modified cash basis for the fiscal year then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting described in Note 1; this includes determining that the modified cash basis of accounting is an acceptable basis for preparation of the financial statements in the circumstances. Management is also responsible for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. Accordingly, we express no such opinion. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our qualified audit opinion.

Basis for Qualified Opinion

As explained in Note 1 to the financial statements, the modified cash basis of accounting requires fixed assets be stated at cost, net of accumulated depreciation. Management has informed us that the District has stated its properties at estimated costs and appraised values versus historical costs as required by the modified cash basis of accounting. In addition, no depreciation expense has been recorded in the financial statements. The effect of this departure on the financial statements has not been determined.

Qualified Opinion

In our opinion, except for the possible effects of the matter described in the Basis for Qualified Opinion paragraph, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the assets, liabilities, and net assets of the Administration, Home Mission, Camp Ground, District Reserve, Olivet

Nazarene University, Medical, Nazarene Missions International, Church New Start, Sunday School and Discipleship Ministries International and Nazarene Youth International funds of the Illinois District Church of the Nazarene as of April 30, 2014, and its support, revenue and expenses and cash flows for the year then ended, on the basis of accounting described in Note 1.

Basis of Accounting

We draw attention to Note 1 of the financial statements, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial statements are prepared on a modified cash basis of accounting, which is a comprehensive basis of accounting other than generally accepted accounting principles. Our opinion is not modified with respect to this matter.

Other Matters

Our audit was conducted for the purpose of forming an opinion on the statement of assets, liabilities and net assets – modified cash basis and the related statements of support, revenue and expenses and cash flows – modified cash basis. The accompanying supplementary information contained on pages 11 through 27 is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain other procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. In our opinion, the information is fairly stated in all material respects in relation to the financial statements taken as a whole.

NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Nature of Activities

Illinois District Church of the Nazarene is a not-for-profit corporation organized under the laws of the State of Illinois. Its purpose is to provide administrative and financial assistance to the local Nazarene churches in the District. The organization is supported primarily through budget receipts from the local churches.

Description of Programs

Illinois District Church of the Nazarene offers the following programs:

Home Mission - This program was established to assist churches in need.

Camp Ground – This program was established to minister to various individuals and groups by providing a place for recreational activity, as well as providing a place to minister to the attendees / users.

Olivet Nazarene University – This program was established to provide Olivet Nazarene University with assistance in the collection of budgeted funds from local churches.

Medical – This program was established for the purpose of facilitating the receipt and payment of health and life insurance premiums for ministers, and to make partial reimbursements to retired ministers for their medical expenses.

Nazarene Missions International – This program was established to provide support for Missionaries approved by the General Church of the Nazarene and to support local churches in NMI programs.

Church New Start - This program was established to provide assistance to new church start-ups.

Sunday School and Discipleship Ministries International – This program provides spiritual, recreational activities, and camps for youth participation (elementary level) and to support local churches with their Sunday School programs.

Nazarene Youth International – This program provides spiritual, recreational activities, and trips for youth participation (junior high and senior high level) and to support local churches in their NYI programs.

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements are presented using a modified cash basis of accounting. This basis of accounting recognizes assets, liabilities, net assets, revenues, and expenses when they result from cash transactions. This basis is a comprehensive basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

As a result of the use of this modified cash basis of accounting, certain assets and their related revenues (such as accounts receivable) and certain liabilities and their related expenses (such as accounts payable) *are not recorded* in these financial statements.

NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)

Cash and Cash Equivalents

The District considers all highly liquid investment instruments available for current use with an initial maturity of three months or less to be cash equivalents.

Investments

Investments in mutual funds with readily determinable fair values are reported at their fair values in the Statement of Assets, Liabilities and Net Assets – Modified Cash Basis. The District carries investments in marketable securities with readily determinable fair values in the Statement of Assets, Liabilities and Net Assets – Modified Cash Basis. Unrealized gains and losses are included in the change in net assets in the accompanying Statement of Support, Revenues and Expenses – Modified Cash Basis.

Property and Equipment

The District has recorded its property and equipment at appraised and estimated values, which is not in conformity with the modified cash basis of accounting. Depreciation has not been computed on fixed assets.

Income Taxes

The District is exempt from Federal income taxes under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. In addition, the District has been determined by the Internal Revenue Service not to be a private foundation within the meaning of Section 509(a) of the code.

Estimates

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with the modified cash basis of accounting requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Loans Receivable and Payable and Transfers between Program Accounts

Loans between programs have a zero net effect on the Statement of Assets, Liabilities and Net Assets – Modified Cash Basis and have been eliminated. In addition, transfers between programs have a zero net effect on the Statement of Support, Revenue and Expenses – Modified Cash Basis and have been eliminated.

NOTE 2 - CONCENTRATION OF CREDIT RISK

The District maintains multiple accounts at various financial institutions. Accounts at these institutions are insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC). There was no excess of the FDIC limit as of April 30, 2014.

NOTE 3 – INVESTMENTS

Investments are stated at fair value and consist of mutual funds. Fair values as of April 30, 2014 are summarized as follows:

Interest and dividends on investments are recorded as a component of interest income in the Statement of Support, Revenue and Expenses – Modified Cash Basis.

NOTE 4 – LOANS RECEIVABLE

The District occasionally loans individual churches that are struggling financially monies to pay operating expenses (utility bills, insurance, repairs and salaries). These interest free loans are repaid by the individual churches as funds become available (recovery or selling of assets). NOTE 6 – TEMPORARILY AND PERMANENTLY RESTRICTED NET ASSETS

As of April 30, 2014 the District had no temporarily or permanently restricted net assets.

NOTE 7 – EVALUATION OF SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

The District has evaluated subsequent events through June 11, 2014, the date which the financial statements were available to be issued.
