Following nearly 38 years of pastoral ministry, J. K. Warrick was elected to the Board of General Superintendents by the 26th General Assembly held in Indianapolis, Indiana, in 2005. He pastored churches in Oklahoma, Texas, Florida, Ohio, Indiana, and Kansas. Prior to his election, he served for nearly 12 years as pastor of College Church of the Nazarene in Olathe, Kansas.



A pastor at heart, he considers his role as general superintendent an opportunity to join his colleagues in shepherding the global church. He has a heart for church planting, evangelism, world missions, discipleship, and compassionate ministries. Central to his ministry is the encouragement of the people of God to find a place of service and ministry in the church and community. He is passionate about equipping pastors and laypersons to be missional leaders.

After attending Southern Nazarene University (formerly Bethany Nazarene College) he later graduated from Trinity College. He is an alumnus of Wesley Biblical Seminary. In 1994 his alma mater, Southern Nazarene University (Bethany Nazarene College), honored him with a doctorate of divinity in recognition of his service to Christ and the Church of the Nazarene. He has served on the Boards of Trustees at Mount Vernon Nazarene University and MidAmerica Nazarene University and also has served on district boards and committees in the church.

Dr. Warrick has been married to Patty (Delores J. Ouzts) since 1967. They have two adult children, Brad and Jill, and six grandchildren.


Dr. James R. Spruce




Jim Spruce has been superintendent of the Illinois District since September 2003, following seven years of service as the Nebraska District Superintendent. 

I am pleased to bring my eighth report as pastor of Belleville First Church of the Nazarene. Our focus as a congregation is to make Christ-like disciples by:

- 1) Introducing people to a life transforming relationship with Jesus.
- 2) Enfolding people into the Body of Christ through significant relationship.
- 3) Empowering people to serve in the work God's Kingdom.
- 4) Growing people mature in Christ (holiness of heart and life).

Belleville First is a healthy congregation, evident in our fellowship, outreach to our community, and by the manner in which the congregation cares for one another.

We are diligently praying and working to recover from the loss in attendance and finances over the past few years. We have started two prayer meetings and have implemented three additional emphases on corporate prayer. We are evaluating our ministries, prioritizing areas of focus, and setting goals in key areas. Some of these goals include: 1) How to grow as a prayer-centered congregation. 2) An emphasis on connecting with un-churched family and friends. 3) A focus on enfolding people into our church family by making specific invitations to our worship services, church events, and small groups. 4) An expansion of our small group ministry.

We continue to see growth and opportunities in the Young Leaders Academy that we lead at our area school; Whiteside Middle School. We minister to 28 students and have 8 trained mentors who facilitate this program. Our summer lunch program (in partnership with 4 other churches) delivers almost 200 lunches, five day each week over ten weeks. This ministry provides lunches to children (and their families) who receive free lunches during the school year. A growing number of these children have participated in our VBS and Champions Sports Camp program. These activities are helping us build relationships with families in our community as well as with community leaders.

Transition is a constant factor in the life of our congregation. We have sent some of our church families (mostly military families) to places such as, Tennessee, Louisiana, Massachusetts, Guam, Qatar, and Afghanistan. We also said good-bye to our youth pastor and his wife; Matt and Stephanie Soulia left BFCN in order to start an urban ministry in Matt's hometown of Flint, Michigan. This past August, we welcomed our new youth pastor and his wife, Kyle and Morgan Fellows. They both have been a blessing to our church family and we look forward to many years of ministry together.

I am grateful for the daily ministry partnership of my wife, Lynne. She serves as our Administrative Assistant and works tirelessly caring for people in our congregation.

Carbondale New Beginnings Community

To: Dr. J. K. Warrick, Dr. Jim Spruce, and my Brothers and Sisters of the Illinois District

This past year marks the ninth year from when Randy Wright and I planted New Beginnings Community Church in Carbondale; and many things look different today than they did then. From the original core group that began the church, there are only six adults and four children that remain. Ten out of a group of 30 that came to Carbondale to begin this Church; and four of the six adults are myself and Randy and our wives.

Last year I wrote a bleak and fearful report that spoke of lack of money, lack of people and a not so spiritual future, but this year I am more optimistic. When I attended seminary, in my Spiritual Formation class, Drs. Dee Freeborn and Morris Weigelt taught on the radical optimism of grace. I have preached on this subject several times in the last twelve years, but this year it has truly become a part of who I am.

I have discovered as a pastor that if I let go and let God have the situation, then it will turn out much better than if I stress about it. I have truly understood that radical optimism that only comes from the grace of our God. There are four areas that I would like to address:


- 1. Our Sunday average for 2010-2011 was 42 and for 2011-2012 it is 43. Although it is smaller than were we were five years ago, I have set back and think God for all the new people that he has brought to New Beginnings. Many core members have gone and they have been replaced by a whole new church, people from Carbondale and the surrounding area.
- 2. This new group of people that makes up New Beginnings at this time have their own identity and with it we needed to refocus the church and that is why we began the refocus process with the District Missionary Mark Copley this past fall. This is going to take dedication of those who will be a part of the Refocus Team, but with it will come a new direction for our church.
- 3. We are still a small church and we are serving a poverty stricken area and people. There are still weeks that we are down to our last few dollars, but I am not worrying about it. In fact we have been able to pay our budgets in full, and pay extra; and at the end of the day we still do not have any money in the bank, but the Lord continues to bless us with what we need to get through this horrible economic times.
- 4. Last but not least has been New Beginnings' spiritual health. I challenged everyone last year and the response was tremendous and there is a new spirit in our church. We are moving forward by the grace of God looking to all the Lord has in store for us in the next year. I have seen people grow spiritually over the last year and with this they have discipled others. I have officiated nineteen funerals this past year, preached and sang at eighty six services outside the regular preaching and singing in the church and held eleven Board meetings.



Centralia

Dr. Warrick, Dr. Spruce, and the Illinois District Assembly,

It is my honor to report once again from Centralia. As in past years, Centralia has had ups and downs as most churches typically do. However, we have tried to do a few things we considered to be radically different this past year. Those are the ideas I wish to share.

Instead of doing a traditional VBS last year, we developed a program we dubbed, "Interactive Families". Instead of a one-week intensive ministry to children, we decided to proceed with a summer long program where we unified the morning worship service theme with a Sunday evening time for reinforcing the theme. The sermons were based on the parables of Jesus, and evening activities included songs, crafts, games, etc. to help drive home the lesson of the parable. Key to this ministry was an evening meal where adults were encouraged to attend with their children, and while the children had their lessons, the adults had lessons based on "The Five Love Languages" by Dr. Gary Chapman. The idea was to help the adults learn to build better relationships between the adults based on better communication in sharing our love for one another. The program was such a success, we ended up extending it an additional three months and the adults covered the book "Personality Plus" to better understand why we are the way we are and that being different can be a strength rather than a constant source of conflict.

As a result of this ministry, family units have grown stronger, and relationships seem to be improving. This summer rather than proceed in that same format, we are going to attempt to develop outreach activities such as all-church trips to the zoo to build unity among the congregation, their families, and hopefully offer opportunities to attract people who do not attend to become involved. Our desire is to reach beyond the walls of the church building and help build better families, which we believe will have dramatic impact on the community as well as the Kingdom.

Prayer has been the foundation upon which we have made these decisions. And to that end, we have begun utilizing Wednesday evening simply as a time of praying the Scriptures. God's word is replete with promises, for the lost, for our families, for our spiritual growth, and the list continues. We have found resources whereby the authors have taken the promises of Scripture and written prayers based on these promises. Our time on Wednesday evening is one of unity in praying these prayers, believing that God is calling us to a prayer ministry. Results are happening, and as we are praying, God continues to move in ways we might have previously though improbable.

God is moving in Centralia. We do not know exactly where we are headed, but we know who is leading us and we willingly are following.



His mom worked long hours and weekends at a local fast food restaurant. We soon learned that Shantrez had to spend many Sunday mornings sitting at the restaurant while his mom worked. When he learned that the tutors were from "the church across the street", he asked if he might be able to catch a ride and come to church on Sunday. Several of our church's middle school students from the church have befriended Shantrez, enfolding him into our church family. Today, both Shantrez and his mom considers the Good Samaritan Church their home.



Beyond that and more importantly, 44 became new members, we baptized 9 people, 62 received Christ as Lord and Savior in our worship services, and several hundred were reached through special outreach ministries.

Pastoral Staff: Pastor Jeremiah McClure accepted the call as Youth Pastor and moved from Charlotte, NC one month after our family arrived. This year the church also celebrated the retirement of Associate Pastor, Ed Abla and Financial Manager, Gene Ray. They have served the church faithfully over the years and we are thankful for all they have contributed. Pastor Tim Lourash transitioned from Youth Pastor to Associate Pastor and Danaka Bulthuis was promoted to position of Finance Manager (from the daycare).

Ministries: Helping Hands increased outreach to families across Macon County as we now supply food to hundreds of people each month. Celebrate Recovery grew in attendance to over 35 per week; CR also sponsored the movie Home Run, which ended up staying in Decatur for three weekends. Upwards Basketball and Cheerleading increased from 140 last year to 190 this year; through this program we reach hundreds of families in the Decatur/Forsyth community. PASSION 2013 celebrated its 5th anniversary, through this drama presentation we reached upward of 2000 people over the course of five nights and more than 100 made decisions for Christ. Treasures Adoptions Ministry is growing and many families in our church are adopting special needs children from abroad; D1Naz has over 40 adopted children as part of our church family. Creative Kid's Daycare increased their enrollment once again and now have over 150 kids attending. Our Daycare Director, Dianne Cox also wrote a grant and received it in the amount of \$11,000. We praise God for the many victories celebrated this year.

Other Highlights: Kids Wednesday Night "Boot Camp" last summer, Family Fun Fest, VBS, and Crosswalk are a few ministries that made an impact in our community. Our new website is www.D1Naz.com and we are in the process of casting a new vision in Decatur and the surrounding area. Decatur First is a great church with a promising future. I believe God is leading us into an exciting future filled with promise and hope. I am thankful for the opportunity so serve on the Illinois District and look forward to the years ahead.


These past years the field of evangelism has been open to us and several have found Jesus as their Savior.

I continue to enjoy my ministry to the Parkview congregation and in the Metro East area of St. Louis. The people continue to be wonderfully supportive of their church and their pastor.



There is a smorgasbord of fear – fear of heights, fear of flying, fear of the dentist, fear of the dark, and on and on it goes. But in the church, probably the greatest fear is the fear of change. Over this past year, the church in Flora confronted this fear, asking ourselves, "How do we need to change to better accomplish our mission?" Change hasn't been easy. In fact, this has been the hardest year of my twenty-three years of ministry, and one of the hardest years for the church in recent history.

Relational issues that had been holding the church back were painfully confronted. Sensing the need for greater unity in fellowship, we went back to one morning service after having two morning services for over fifteen years. Recognizing how we as a congregation had become mere spectators in worship, we made some noticeable changes that encourage participation: worship leaders gave way to worship teams, pastors reading Scripture to congregational readers, revising our greeter and usher ministries, etc. Though the changes weren't easy, the response has been tremendous: 17 people involved in four worship teams, 12 people participating in instrumental ensembles, 20 people volunteering to read Scripture, 25 serving on a greeter rotation, etc.

My prayer for the Flora Church for this new year is that we will keep asking the question, "How do we need to change to better accomplish our mission," and that we will bravely follow where the Lord Jesus leads.



Lincoln First

A few years ago we used to jokingly refer to Lincoln First as, "The Church on the Move." That unofficial motto was a jab at the number of people in our congregation that had moved around town over the course of a couple of years. Back then, a moving van could have been our official church vehicle.

I think I'm ready for a new motto.

With 4 households moving away in the last year, I'd love to shoot the tires from under the moving truck. None of these folks have gone away mad, and that's good. And even though I might deny it if you ask me publicly, I'm glad that they are stretching out in new directions, embracing new situations and in at least a small way taking a part of us with them. I'm glad for them. Not so much for the rest of us.

The numbers tell a troublesome tale. Worship and Sunday School attendance are down for the year. Our membership has been lowered by losses of another kind as we have said goodbye to some we dearly love who have made their last – and best – move. Others have decided that they needed a different church setting in which to grow and still others have quietly drifted away altogether to be members in name only. This is the reality that we are living in and it makes us worry about the future. Will we make it? Will there be enough money to pay the bills and the budgets and the preacher? Will there be enough people to teach and serve and lead? To fight these fears I've offered my church these three humble advices:

- 1) Lighten up. The numbers don't lie, but they don't tell the whole truth either. Some really good things happened this year. We conducted a successful VBS, we left the comfort of "come to us here" and went out to the Logan County Fair to offer cold water in Jesus' name. We invited weary parents to entrust their children to us while they shopped or rested from shopping last Christmas. We organized our first 24-hour prayer vigil in the fall. We saw the Lord supply what we needed to purchase the materials to construct a wheelchair ramp and install new front doors. He also provided for us to pay all the bills, meet our ministry obligations to the district, the general church, ONU, and even had enough left over to bless area ministries like local Christian radio and our pregnancy resources center with end-of-the-year gifts. God did what God always does. He made little into much. I believe He will keep it up in days to come.
- 2) <u>Tighten up</u>. When I say "tighten up" I'm promoting two goals. The first is for every member of our church family to be more intentional about their relationships with others in the church. There is a memorable scene from the original Toy Story movie in which Sheriff Woody reminds his fellow toys that their family would be moving soon and that each toy needs to partner up with a moving buddy so that no toy is left behind. That's the ticket. I see hints of that kind of loving care that sweet Christ-like love, now and again when someone goes to someone's bedside or drops off a meal or gets together for no reason except just to be together. That's what we need, just more and more and more of it.

We also need to "tighten up" our purpose. A big hairy goal for the board this year is to pray, seek and implement a plan to minister to our community in a way that no other church is doing. We need to tighten our focus and throw our energy into what makes us distinct. Notice I did not say superior. We are only a part of the puzzle when it comes to the kingdom of God in Lincoln, but we are a piece and I believe an important one.

3) <u>Heighten up</u>. Specifically, we need to go vertical together on our knees. We need to pray. We need to be people of prayer. We need to be constant in prayer and moved to fervent prayer. If we are going to survive it will be because we are moved to seek God like never before. Instead of throwing up our hands in frustration, we will, in our weakness, seek the power of God to make us strong and healthy in Him. As Paul wrote:

"We were under great pressure, far beyond our ability to endure, so that we despaired even of life. Indeed, in our hearts we felt the sentence of death. But this happened that we might not rely on ourselves, but on God, who raises the dead. He has delivered us from such a deadly peril, and He will deliver us. On Him we have set our hope..." – 2 Corinthians 1:8-9

We provided printed reusable grocery bags for each child participating. They were printed with the name of our church and with our purpose, "Our Church Can Be Your Home." We also printed tracks about the meaning of Easter that were in every bag we gave out. I appreciate our church board's focus and commitment to ministry, especially Compassionate Ministries. Thirty-two boxes filled with all the necessities for a bountiful Christmas dinner were distributed to needy families the week before Christmas and even more food was distributed this year through our food pantry.



Witnessing an on the spot healing.



It is my honor as an ordained elder, to present to this 70th Illinois District Assembly, my 20th report for the Olivet Church of the Nazarene. Olivet Church celebrated our 100th Centennial Year of proclaiming the Gospel of Christ to the community and surrounding area of Georgetown. Dr. David Felter, Holiness Today Editor at our Global Center, was our guest speaker, along with Dr. Brian Allen, from ONU, providing uplifting music for the day. Pastor James Walker, member of Olivet Church, provided a beautiful connecting link between the old Olivet College (which started in Olivet) and the Olivet Church of the Nazarene which started in 1912 on the campus of old Olivet College. Pastor James Blue presented two Holiness Heritage Centennial plaques to two members of the congregation: Betty Steelman, oldest living member; and to Don Smith, longest attending member. Pastor Blue was presented with the Holiness Heritage Centennial plague from the Global Center of the Church of the Nazarene and also a Centennial plaques from Olivet Nazarene University. Former pastors Keith Kelly, William Burton, and William Renner also attended the centennial anniversary, speaking in the afternoon service.

Olivet has once again PAID ALL BUDGETS-IN-FULL using the new Global Center formula. This is the 20th year we have accomplished FULL PAYMENT OF ALL BUDGETS. We overpaid the World Evangelism fund by 35%. The \$45,000 remodeling loan we secured in February of 2011 is nearly paid off through faithful pledges and cash gifts received.

The church took a major step of faith in November by hiring a part-time youth minister, Stephen Rippee. Stephen was involved with Table Rock Camp/Fun In The Sun. He has Sunday night and Wednesday night activities for our youth. Several community youth are now attending. A recent Super Bowl party was attended by 25 youth. The youth Sunday School class has shown growth under Stephen's leadership.


We continually see new families visiting our church and many have connected on a regular basis. Two Odle families, the Metheney family, Betty Duprey, Heather Pierson, Connie Ingram, the Martin family, the Carter family are all regular attendees now. As pastor, this is an exciting part of the ministry. It has been a thrill to have 4 join the church of Profession of Faith.







But more importantly, the past few months I am seeing more people putting this understanding into practice.

In spite of a lower average attendance this year we have seen God's hand at work in several different ways. We participated in the Engage the Word emphasis individually and in small groups. It was great to see the power of the Word in the lives of those who participated. We also saw great progress in the lives of many believers with a Discipleship Encounter. This was made possible by Rev. Lloyd and Kim Brock and the staff of Pekin First Church of the Nazarene.

Other highlights from the year include sending three different young people on extended mission trips, having several who participated in the District Prayer Encounter, distributing food to those in need both in our church and in the community and recognizing two individuals with their first Local Minister's License.

It was my personal privilege to go with a group of pastors to Cali, Columbia and to see what God is doing there as well as attending the Prayer Encounter at Crossroads Tabernacle in Fort Worth, TX.

But most importantly we have seen God changing lives. Like Greg and Tracy Lewis. Their girls first came into contact with our church through the foster care of Jason and Jodi. When Greg and Tracy got their girls back they decided to try the church their girls had been attending. They enjoyed their visit and began to come on a regular basis. During the Engage the Word emphasis they were invited to Doug and Tonya's house for their small group where they still attend. Though they still face many struggles Tracy recently testified to God's grace. She said she noticed a difference after a particularly difficult time realizing that just a couple of years ago the same kind of situation would have caused her to go on a drug binge and now she is depending on God. Recently Tracy brought a friend to the small group and to church. As she is being discipled she is beginning to disciple others.

I praise the Lord that He is at work around us preparing the way ahead of us whether we can see what He is doing or not. As we focus on our responsibility of making disciples He will take care of His responsibility of building the Church.



This past year has been a year of tempering the steel. For the first time in the short history of our new start organization we as a body had to face tragedy and loss. On May 16, 2012 we lost one of our nursery boys through the events of a tragic shooting mishap. The witness of the Spirit spread through our community and soon we would be hosting a summer program for neighborhood teens. As we partnered with another organization called Lead4Life, we set out on a mission to make leaders of those others had disposed of. Our mission was called "Forty Days of Change". We had full support from the local city authority, the police and fire agencies, and God was working in this ministry. My partner and leader of the ministry Javae' Wright, started with just three students. We prayed vigilantly, and the Lord provided. The mission grew and we closed the forty days with over thirty teen leaders. (enrollment capacity was to be 22) These newly developed leaders were challenged to show the public and the city officials their new found abilities, and did so with a successful appreciation gathering for all city and state officials drawing over two hundred people. God is blessing us through it all.

Our Upward ministry continues to thrive and in the face of adversity, God revealed it is to continue as He provided all necessary means and measures enabling us to reach over two hundred fifty people. The annual Community Christmas Dinner was once again provided for and we were able to feed over two hundred thirty people, as well as the local women's shelter this past Christmas. Our adult Bible studies have flourished as discipling has become a love of the people. With the help of a neighboring church we baptized six more people to start the New Year. Prayer encounters are a regularity at Urbana Lighthouse, and we embrace them. Lives are being changed in Urbana, and people are learning the walk with Christ is a life-long commitment. Recently we were blessed with the presence of the Olivet group All Things New. God moved through the music and the people as we gave witness to a young man's lifelong struggles being laid at the foot of the cross. The day brought us a record attendance as well of 113. Our mission field is ripe for the harvest, the workers are grooming, and God is moving through it all. We are blessed.

Two new developments this past year included: 1. Community Reach – reaching out into the community through the Flea Market to develop relationships with people in the area. The primary purpose is to introduce people to Christ. This will begin May 31. 2. Pre-School Initiative: We have focused on 6 kids ages 3-4 who are not currently enrolled in preschool. The purpose is to teach them to trust and obey those who genuinely care for them and to introduce them to Jesus. The 6 kids have been very consistent in coming and as an added bonus, their parents have been behind it by having them ready on time each time.

Several goals for the coming year include: 1. Housing Initiative – Work closely with the appropriate people in St. Clair County to acquire 1-2 derelict houses. Ask a church to adopt a house, fix it up and then hand it over to an establish Board of volunteers who will closely with a single mom to take ownership of the house. 2. Volunteer Development – Promote the ministry at all times in order to broaden our volunteer base and then train the volunteers in an organized manner. 3. Evangelism Outreach – Work with like-minded Christians who are interested in inner-city outreach to share the message of Christ. 4. Donor development – Initiate one new fundraiser and improve the current Banquet in order to help keep a steady stream of income for the ministry (not there yet).

The Master's Hands, Inc. NFP

To The Illinois District Family,

In August we started our second year at the Mission Center by becoming a 501c3 Not for Profit Corporation with a 9 member board from 6 different churches. God has opened Heaven windows and has flooded us with His grace and love. He has allowed us to reach out in His name to the lost, hurting people that need the love of Jesus more than the food we offer them. In September God called a Beverly Ziegler to resign her full time job and become the Assisted Director of The Master's Hands. In March The Master's Hands became an approved Nazarene Compassioned Ministers.

We have seen people coming to know Jesus as their Lord and Savior. For the first time, we have seen people repent of their sins and come back to the Lord. There are 4 Bible studies each week, 1 worship/preaching service, and 2 recover type meetings. Between all the outreaches, the Bible studies, and the worship services we are allowed to share Jesus with about 3,500 people each month. A visitation ministry was started where our people visit home bound people. Many of these people report that their churches have forgotten about them over the years and no one comes to see then. Others do not Christ as their Savior. In January we took over the School weekend back pack program for East Richland Schools and expanded it to also include all the schools of Richland County.

When there was a need for a 15 passenger van, God sent a local business man and his wife to us. He said "just to see what you are all about". After I gave them a tour of the place and we set and talked over coffee he asked, "Do you need a van?" When I told him we did, he dropped a set of keys in front of me, pulled out the title and signed it over to us. Then he told me it was sitting just outside the back door. Every Sunday it picks up un-churched people and drops them off at the Church of their choice.

I was asked to preach at an Independent Holiness Church just outside of Olney, and after the service a couple give us a BMW Motorcycle that is worth about \$6,000.00 to sell and use it on a Woman Homeless Shelter. They also gave Sally and me a 2002 Buick auto. God knew that we needed a car. God gave us a house at 420 West Chestnut in April that we just got the deed to the property last week, that will be the new Woman Shelter that should be open about June of 2014.

The vision God gave us for souls in the Mission Field and The Master's Hands is catching, as our son Mark and his wife Sherry came along side of us purchased a building, remodeled and equipped it for a coffee shop and food pantry. The doors were opened in April to The Master' Hands of Jasper County that is located in downtown on the square in Newton, IL. Sometime this fall we will start a worship/preaching service along with Bible studies at this Newton location.

Some of our people got the vision to minister through a Community Garden, thus was born Rooted in Christ Community Garden that opened the first of April. God gave us the land to use in the right location and the supplies we needed. It also brought new people to us that we can share Jesus with.

We are seeking the Lord's leading for a building that will house the clothing and

household items that we now have in storage and give from as needed. We have a director for that ministry that has said yes to the Lord when He called her.

In the month of April, just from the Olney location we were allowed to give about 69,000 lbs. of food away, with the help of 74 volunteers, working 2,341 hours. Plus we gave food to food pantries in 7 different counties, two senior centers, 1 children home, the Salvation Army, 1 woman shelter and two food banks in two states.

There are now 958 household on the roll in Olney to receive food each month. Represented in these 958 household is 2,742 souls, of which 168 are babies, 573 are under 13 years of age, 1,124 are women and about 70% do not go to Church.

When people ask us, "Where did you get all this food" after we unloaded 16 pallets of mushrooms, we just point them to our only source, that is Jesus our Lord and Savior. We give Him all the praise. We are thankful that He has allowed us to be a servant in His Kingdom work.

Our needs are many; from a 16ft. cargo trailer, to some type of Refrigeration trailer or truck, too much needed addition to our current building, general operating funds, and workers for the women shelter. The list goes on and on.

God has opened the door for us to share Jesus to groups and Churches in Richland County and He has sent us churches that want to be a part in building His Kingdom. Thank your Lord.

We are now working with some people in Effingham IL and we are looking forward to what God has for us in the next 12 months. We are looking forward to peaching His Word and pointing people to Jesus. We know whom we follow and we are looking forward to preaching and sharing Jesus with people. So little time, so many lost, so few workers, Lord send us workers!

Illinois District Superintendent's Report – 2013 "Questions at the Crossroads"

George Harper and I were up at 12:30 a.m., dressed for the bitter cold and stepped outside the hut at Camp Muir. We wore headlamps and carried only extra wool clothes, ample water and protein bars. Roped to one another, we crossed Mt. Rainier's Ingram Glacier at 11,000 ft.

Our route followed the base of the Cathedral Rocks, which led to the Nisqually Glacier and to the 14,410 ft. summit of Rainier. But before us was Disappointment Cleaver so named because it is surrounded by a series of crevasses – large cracks in glaciers up to blocks long and deep enough to make rescue impossible. A glacier is like a mousetrap: any place you step too near a crevasse may be a snow-bridge, solid footing in mere disguise, unable to support your weight.

Ice towers the size of boxcars shift with time and gravity. What was familiar the summer before is now foreign. Just 1,200 vertical feet above us, twice the height of the St. Louis Arch, and four hours away was the shadowy outline of Rainier's rounded summit. There are always critical questions at crossroads. On a mountain, as in life, wrong route equals wrong destination. And we lost too much time and so turned back. Churches and districts live at crossroads where we can easily get off track and lose time. But tonight we will hear the inspiring testimony of how God spoke at critical crossroads in the life of a little boy who grew to be a very old man.

A year ago today we paid tribute to our district's oldest native son, Rev. George H.D. Reader. To put his age in perspective, Rev. Reader is older than John Bowling and any two Olivetians all combined. And in a scant 13 years he will be the same age as Moses when he died. Rev. Reader, an Olivet grad, is the oldest Nazarene preacher in the world. The following video clip reveals questions from God at critical times in his life. Question #1 - "Will You Glorify Me?"

It was asked outright, straight from the Holy Spirit to the five year old heart of George Reader. Charles Wesley wrote, "A charge to keep I have, a God to glorify." "Will you glorify me?" was embedded in the question, "Can I have you?" It was Question #1 for Rev. Reader.

I once asked my Eastern Michigan DS what the district game-plan was for starting new churches. He said, "You and Flint Central are the game-plan. The district can help, but unless pastors have a vision new starts will not happen."

I told our board, "Fenton has no holiness voice and seven of our families live there. Why should we keep them and their income here when we could release them to a new work in Fenton?" The board was silent except for a wealthy man who said, "You do that and you will lose significant income." I asked the board to pray hard about a vision that we did not have.

In time, God worked in the hearts of good people who did not see eye to eye.

Today Fenton has a strong Church of the Nazarene of some 200 people. Not every church can plant but every church can ask the Lord of the harvest how they may help. The church of 650 that I left runs about 1,700 today; the "law of replenishment" works. The key was a shared conviction that it would not kill us to give up a little of what we thought was ours.

In March of this year the Board of General Superintendents clarified the definition of a church: "Any group that meets regularly for spiritual nurture, worship and instruction at a communicated time and place, with an identified leader, and aligned with the message and mission of the Church of the Nazarene, with the purpose of becoming an organized local church may be recognized as a church and reported as such."

At a recent Churches Planting Churches seminar Mark Copley was certified as a Master Trainer and Michael Kraemer, the new pastor at Salem and already a Master Trainer, was present. Rita Briggs and I became Certified Trainers. This event destroyed myths about new works and convinced us that everybody can do something to contribute to the birth of new churches. Here are the goals I have set for us:

1. Training for CPE, CPC AND CT events:

- 1. To train every fulltime pastor within one year in the CPC track
- To train every fulltime pastor within two years in both the CPE and CPC tracks
- To train 20 fulltime pastors as Certified Trainers within two year
- 2. District Worship Attendance for 2020: (a gain of about 500 per year) 10.000

Our 2013 district worship attendance was

6.100

Churches represented at the CPC seminar last March: Belleville First, Casey, Carlinville, Collinsville, Fairview Heights, Godfrey, Granite City, Jacksonville, Mattoon Real Life, Monticello, Olney, Pittsfield, Roxana, Salem Grace, Sherman

- 3. Our underserved mission fields: farmers, university students (six major campuses). Hispanics. African Americans, and Koreans.
- How will the Illinois District help you?
 - 1. Registration and motel paid for those who attend a CPE, CPC or CT seminar.
 - 2. Match local church contributions to new starts dollar for dollar for two years (through March, 2015 with MST approval of local church new start vision plans)

5. Everybody can do something:

2. Churches able to start new works w/in 18 months

This is an eye test: O P W R G K; T X M Z N; E F T H. Can you read the small letters?

E F T H -- EYES FOR THE HARVEST.

- Local church vision is what WE can see.
- Kingdom vision is what GOD can see.
- Do we see through the eyes of Jesus?

Bro. Reader said, "God spoke to me when I was just a lad of five: 'May I have you?' I knew it was personal, and that this was the voice of God. I didn't understand it all. And then God asked me another question: 'George, what about your violin? May I have that, too?'"

He had just received the violin, and it meant the world to him. But he said, "Yes, Lord, I give the violin to you." What if we, more mature than a five-year old, said, "Yes, Lord, I give you the church I serve, and I release my grip on its success and my future in it." What would God say then? Bro. Reader, we thank God for your deep piety and fervent obedience to God.

Question #2 - "Will You Answer to Me?"

George Harper, my climbing partner, frequently asked that night on Rainier "Is your hand through the wrist loop of your ice axe?" When he learned of my interest in climbing with him he said, "I expect you to run five days a week, attend the self-arrest seminar offered at Rainier and be willing to follow my instructions while on the mountain. You are accountable to me. The wrist loop on your ice axe will assure that if dropped it will still be fixed to your arm. The self-arrest seminar will teach you how to use the axe to prevent sliding on ice should you fall." Thus the third question from God to our elder statesman emerged over time: "Will you answer to me?" Or, "Will you learn from me, follow me and take instruction from me?" It is an accountability question, politely confrontational, yet potentially life or ministry saving. Wesley wrote, "Arm me with jealous care as in thy sight to live; and O thy servant, Lord, prepare a *strict account* to give."

Dr. Jerry Porter said while at Cali, "People back home will be eager to learn about prayer. But if you want to implement accountability as it is practiced here in Cali you will likely lose your audience. The U.S. culture is independent and not as desperate for help as those who live here." Immediately I reflected on my training from George and thought that it would be a telling and tragic irony if *Christians* are less eager to be discipled and have disciples than *climbers* are to be taught how to avoid a crevasse. Jesus commissioned us to make disciples – which is more than getting people saved.

At a youth rally in a soccer stadium full of 26,000 people, some 2,000 new converts stood to acknowledge Christ at the end of a sermon. Within seconds a teen prayed with each convert, gathered vital contact information and assigned them to a cell group leader from their neighborhood. Within 24 hours the new converts were called by phone. Within 48 hours someone from the church was at their door. The next Sunday they were expected to be in church, come forward for prayer and meet for follow-up. In a classroom I saw new converts my age being prayed for by young teens. Where do you find that many teenagers to make the initial contact in a stadium or a class on Sunday? Simple: thousands of younger teens are in accountability groups led by older teens or adults who mentor them. Everybody has a disciple, and everybody is a disciple. Jesus looked at Simon Peter with all his immaturity and said, "Stick with me. I intend to build my church on people just like you. You don't have to be perfect to follow me; a lot of imperfect people follow me. I will perfect your motive at Pentecost; perfection of practice will come as you mature. You only need to be humble and teachable to follow me."

Jesus' pattern of disciping was built on relationship. Discipling is a way of life between a mentor and the person being discipled. Members of the Board of Ministerial Credentials personally disciple all those seeking ordination. The twice annual classes are excellent learning opportunities, but the strength of this ministry, now starting its third year, is the relationship of trust and accountability that is fostered. We experienced a seismic shift this year by hosting the Discipling Tour with Hal and Debbi Perkins. For the 30 pastors and dozens of laypersons who attended any of the eight locations, the result will be life-changing. Hal and Debbie invested thirty-five years discipling their primary mission field – their four children with great results.

Yes, being a careful disciple deals with the "strict account" as Wesley wrote that we owe our Lord. But Reader and Wesley were on to even more.

Question #3 - "Will You Rely Totally On Me?"

Early in his ministry Rev. Reader rose at 2:00 a.m. to pray, and decided to pray an hour a day (or night). He prayed regularly for decades for preachers and general superintendents. You heard him pray, "Save us from deadness and inactivity. Help us to have the fire burn within us." Wesley wrote, "Help me to watch and pray, and on thyself rely, assured, if I my trust betray I shall forever die."

Our next Prayer Encounter with Maria Durso and Corey Jones will be July 31 – August 2. Corporate prayer has made a difference in a number of our churches. Thirty years ago God called an alcoholic to the ministry who got saved and quit drinking so he could answer the call to preach. He moved to Cali, got a job and started a storefront church. Prayer and accountability had saved his life so he thought it would save his church. It nearly killed the church for a few years but the rest is history. Today the former alcoholic pastor has six Sunday services and about 14,000 in attendance at the International House of Prayer Church of the Nazarene in Cali.

At 4:00 a.m. we attended a two hour prayer meeting. 250 or so teens and adults were present. Some knelt with their faces on the floor, most walked. What motivates people to get up at 3:00 a.m. and meet God for two hours before the school or work day begins? God loves for his children to take time to honor him in corporate prayer as well as personal prayer. While corporate prayer is tragically neglected in most North America churches, God is showing up anywhere Christians come together just to call out to Him.

Question #4 - "Will You Serve Me?"

This meant to feed his sheep. God asked Bro. Reader, "Will you accept my call to preach the Word?" He said yes at fourteen. Wesley wrote, "To serve the *present* age, my calling to fulfill; oh, may it all my powers engage to do my Master's will." The call to service always has a steep learning-curve.

During the CPC seminar Kevin Hancock expressed a burden for a work in State Park near his church where there is a high concentration of young Hispanic families. David Samayoa was at that event because he has planted three churches on the Kentucky District. Our district leaders believed David could help us create a

church planting movement among Hispanics.

We strongly believed it was better to ask all churches to partner with the district, and asked pastors to present our letter with its graduated scale of financial giving to their boards. The scale went as high as \$3,000 for larger churches, and as reasonable as \$250 for smaller churches. Did you know that if 80 churches gave \$250 in one year that would equal \$20,000 and with matching district support it would be \$40,000?

In response to our letter a month prior to assembly we had over \$19,000 in local church commitments. Here's an email I received: "Bro. Spruce, our church will have a financial part in this Kingdom investment and we will also offer our prayer support. Does all of the \$3,000 need to be paid at once or can it be divided up? I am hoping we can join in partnership with the district at this amount." Faith such as this makes no human sense to me whatsoever because this is a very small church that has serious financial struggles. But the pastor is a man of great faith and the people respond to him. It is a great illustration that money follows vision.

I told the pastors, "Everybody can do something; everybody can care. No church is too small to participate; no gift is too small to make a difference." I'd like to see us reach \$40,000 as a minimum, but I am far more interested in 100% participation. Everybody can do something; everybody can care. So David started in Collinsville and will eventually make his way first to cities where the concentration of Hispanics is high, Springfield, Decatur, Champaign-Urbana, etc.

This is a hard sell, the hardest possible mission because it may not seem to benefit you or your church. I am asking you to care about planting a church and loving a culture other than your own.

Someone tried this before me. Jesus said the Gospel is to go to the uttermost part of the earth. State Park is not your town but it is on your state map. I've asked our pastors to come prepared to make the pledge their board has approved. You don't need to break the bank but please allow your heart to be broken over our Hispanic brothers and sisters who need Jesus.

Ushers please come to distribute faith-promise pledge cards to all pastors at this time. Our participation is a reflection of a vision beyond the walls of our church. Everybody can care. No gift is too small to make a difference. Bill Shotts will receive your cards in a prayer and offering for David's ministry. I want to introduce David right now and his vision will conclude my report. Please give a generous welcome to Rev. David Samayoa.

District Mission Strategy Director Report to the District Assembly 2012-2013

Members and friends of the assembly, it is my privilege to present to you my sixth report as District Mission Strategy Director. I want to begin by expressing my gratitude to our District leadership: Thank you Dr. Spruce and Doug Haynes for

your faithfulness, partnership, and friendship. The Mission Strategy Team this year included the following members: Philip Alvord, Kevin Donoho, Allen Ebbler, Les Wilhelm; Rita Briggs, Wayne Clevenger, Craig Dillman, Tim Mondy; James Craig; Will Haworth; and Tim Young, Jr.. These have become a team of visionaries, who are helping us see a new day on our District. I also want to acknowledge our church planters and new works that are active on our District: Wayne Clevenger at Urbana Lighthouse; Tim Young, Jr. at Granite City (Church Type Mission); Willard Anderson at The Master's Hands (Compassionate Ministries Center) in Olney, and Rita Briggs and her efforts toward a new church in Jacksonville. Last summer's Prayer Summit in Springfield got our year off to a great start. God moved many people -- our leaders, and churches to recommit themselves to prayer, and no doubt God is hearing and answering those prayers. This has led us into a most fruitful year, full of new possibilities. We are already anticipating the Prayer Summit in August.

We again enjoyed successful Team Days this year in both Decatur and Salem. Pastor Mark Bane challenged us with his preaching and teaching to allow Christ to TRANSFORM both us and our churches for the work of his mission. ONU professors, Dr. Frank Moore, and Dr. Mark Quanstrom, taught popular workshops, along with many of you here today who offered your expertise as well. Special thanks go to Lara Mondy and her volunteers who planned and worked hard to organize these important events.

The Mission Strategy Team distributed over \$16,500 in grants this year. These were used to provide new chairs for our growing Urbana congregation, to provide coaching for Tim Young, Jr. our organic church planter in Granite City, and to provide refrigeration units for The Master's Hands Compassionate Ministries Center in Olney.

Willard Anderson's work at The Master's Hands continues to amaze us with God's faithfulness in caring for those with needs in the Olney area. Over 700 people are being ministered to monthly there. And this year, The Master's Hands multiplied their influence by helping to launch a new Compassionate Ministries Center in Newton. Willard also has a vision for a food ministry outreach in Effingham, and we are praying with him for that vision. Along with the ongoing work of the Good Samaritan Center in Washington Park, and the Hopeful Heart ministries of Decatur, not to mention the many compassionate ministries that are simply offered through our congregations, we are showing the love of Jesus in practical ways to the poor within our district.

As for Church Planting, this year, the District generously provided funding for 23 people (pastors and representatives) from 15 churches to attend DCPI (Dynamic Church Planting International) Training in Sherman. This event proved to be a catalyst for the mission of our District. There, pastors presented a vision to begin a church planting movement on our District that could plant 135 in the next ten years. Many of these involve churches working together to plant new works on their Zones. For example, the Mississippi Valley Zone presented a goal of planting six new churches in the next ten years, with the first to be launched in the fall of 2014. Several pastors committed to plant new churches from their congregation as well. The District has offered to match resources spent by local churches to start new churches, dollar for dollar.

We have also scheduled two more training opportunities this year: September 17-19 at Salem, and January 7-9 in Decatur. These training sessions will include both Church Planting Essentials for potential church planters and Churches Planting Churches for pastors and leaders from potential mother churches. During our training last year, we learned that the average size of Nazarene congregations that plant new churches is only 53. This belies the idea that many churches are too small to mother a new church. The fact remains that planting new churches is the most effective means of reaching unchurched people. Please, attend one of these trainings, and pray for the Spirit to lead you. Many who did so in Sherman came not expecting, but in listening they saw a new vision for church planting with their congregation.

In one of the most notable presentations, Pastor Kevin Hancock from the Collinsville Good Samaritan Church presented a vision to plant a new Hispanic congregation in the State Park/Fairmont City area. This neighborhood has the highest percentage concentration of Hispanic residents in the St. Louis metro area (72%). Following up on this, the Mission Strategy Team recommended to the District Advisory Board the calling of David Samayoa as Hispanic Mission Coordinator to lead, not only the church planting effort in Collinsville, but also to begin a Church Planting Movement among Hispanic communities on our District. With the Advisory Board's approval, and with an appeal to churches for District wide support, David (with his wife Sonia) will be moving to the Collinsville area in July to begin their work here. Thanks to Dr. Spruce, the Advisory Board, Pastor Waldo Perez, and Pastor Kevin Hancock for their part in making this historic decision for our District.

There are 102 counties in Illinois and 101 of them registered growth in the Latino population between 2000 and 2010. This growth in Hispanic population is not limited to Chicago and its suburbs, but it's here, within the bounds of our District. While counties like Macon (which includes Decatur) saw their overall population decrease, they saw strong Hispanic growth (85%) in the same ten year span. And the State Park Place area near Collinsville saw their Hispanic population increase by 318%, due to a migration of Hispanic families from the city to the area. There is no place better on our District to start a new Hispanic work and God has brought it to pass. Please pray for David and Sonia as they begin their mission here.

Pastors, I encourage you to allow the Holy Spirit of the Christ who sends us to create a vision in you for making disciples in new places, and in new ways. I've never witnessed a time when there were so many options, so many ripe harvest fields, and so many options for ministry. Ask God, the one who created all things, to create in you a vision to reach others for Him. Don't ask what you can afford; ask instead what God wants to do. Ask what breaks His heart, and what He wants to do about it. Once you have His vision, watch as He provides everything you need to accomplish it. Personally, I have witnessed this truth this year: resources always follow vision. In Salem, where I serve, we launched a Parent Affiliated Congregation in a place called The Hope House. It's a little country church building that was graciously donated to Grace Church after we had a vision for recovery ministries. Volunteers and donors worked to restore it. Now Christ uses that humble place to do his ongoing work of restoring broken lives. Pray until you see what He sees, and then pray until He brings it to pass. Then together, we'll rejoice

next year as we tell our stories together, glorifying Jesus, for that which only he could accomplish.

I truly believe this coming year will be one of the most exciting years ever on our District. Pray that it will be so.

Nina and I thank you for allowing us to be a part of the administrative team that serves this great district.


I also want to say thanks to Nina for being my bride of almost 40 years, for being a great Mom, and for always being a model of what a close walk with Jesus is all about.

B. INSTRUCTIONS TO STUDENTS

Eligibility

The board serves only the persons who are properly enrolled. Enrollment is open only to local preachers, deacons-Christian education, deacons-compassionate ministries, deacons-music ministries, and prospective ministers of music who qualify according to the Manual, 410.

Courses

There are seven general courses administered by the Ministerial Studies Board; elders, deacon of administration, deacon of compassionate ministries, deacon of Christian education, deacon of music, deacon of youth, and lay minister (Handbook of Ministerial Studies).

Ministers, deacons and deaconesses will not be ordained without having completed their respective courses. An exception to this is provided for all commissioned song evangelists who held this status immediately prior to the 1986 assembly season. Those becoming commissioned song evangelists will complete the deacon track in music ministries. Those interested in commissioned or registered song evangelists' credentials should study carefully all requirements as listed in Handbook on Ministerial Studies, 446, "The Song Evangelist."

Modes of Study

The options for the course of study are listed below (by preference) as recommended and approved by the Illinois District Ministerial Studies Board.

- 1. A Nazarene university pursuing a degree in a religious major approved/ validated by Nazarene Clergy Services.
- 2. Nazarene Theological Seminary.
- 3. Nazarene Bible College: Pursuing a degree in a religious major approved/validated by Nazarene Clergy Services.
- 4. Northwest Nazarene University: Online COS Course of Study Module
- 5. Nazarene Bible College: NBC Track, MPP Track.
- 6. A Nazarene District School of Ministry: Module Course
- 7. A Nazarene university or an accredited university, pursuing a degree in a religious field of study (Subject to evaluation).

The Course of Study is under the immediate supervision of the District Board of Ministerial Studies. Students are advised to pursue preparation or ordination by selecting one of the above-mentioned modes of study. Each student is assigned an advisor to work with in establishing a plan of study.

The courses required of college students are in the Manual, 424.3. The competency statements for ministerial education are listed in Manual, 424.3. All college and university programs must meet these competency statements for course of study.

C. REGULATIONS FOR MINISTERIAL COURSE OF STUDY

- 1. It is no longer necessary for students to purchase the Sourcebook for Ministerial Development. This information and more can now be found on the Clergy Education website (http://nazarenepastor.org/clergyeducation/) A Candidate Handbook can be downloaded for free from http://www.nazarenepastor.org/ClergyEducation/LinkClick.aspx?link=Resources%2 fUSAHB.pdf&tabid=74&mid=501.
- 2. Each student is encouraged to take four courses each year. The general church requires 2 courses per year to **be passed to** allow a student to continue. **After the district license is granted to the student, ten years is allowed to complete** the 24 required courses, Manual 427.4. At 2 per year, the student will not succeed. Thus, the Illinois District has chosen to encourage students to complete 4 courses per year. All course work must be completed by the end of the assembly year (April) in order for the student to receive credit for that assembly year. The only exception is for those students enrolled in an institution of higher learning in which the class may not conclude until the board meets in May.
- 3. A student is placed in a study level based on the number of courses completed regardless of the level of the courses. The only exception is that the course on the Manual of the Church of the Nazarene must be completed before level one is considered complete (unless the student is enrolled in a religion program at a Nazarene institution) and before the student is eligible for a district license.
- 4. The secretary may not enroll anyone except by written letter from the applicant to include the following information: name (first, middle and last); address; telephone number; e-mail address; course of study desired; church where current membership is held; letter of recommendation from the church pastor where membership is held; copy of local license granted by that church; and official transcripts from colleges or other schools beyond high school. It will be the obligation of the student to see that all the information is sent to the secretary. An application form will be made available for anyone expressing interest in enrolling with the Board of Ministerial Studies.
- 5. Prior to being issued a graduation certificate, all students must be reviewed by the Ministerial Studies Board. The only exceptions are Nazarene Bible College graduates of the Bible Studies Course who are immediately issued a graduation certificate.

6. No student will be graduated from the course of study without completing an internship program.

7. When a student moves to another district, the secretary of the Ministerial Board should transfer the student's records to the new district by contacting the secretary of that district's Board of Ministerial Studies. Students are strongly advised to keep copies of course record sheets and final grades. The District is not responsible for loss of data when transferring to another district.

- **8.** Candidates should be prepared to appear annually before the Board of Ministerial Studies. These meetings will be scheduled by the district office and notification of the meetings will be sent to you.
- **9.** Files for inactive students will be maintained by the Board of Ministerial Studies for no longer than 10 years.
- **10.** Students are required to keep an active e-mail account while enrolled in the course of study.

College Students

College students are responsible to submit to the board documentary evidence of academic standing in harmony with Manual, 427.1, 427.4.

College students are reminded to plan their curriculum in harmony with Manual, 424.1 and 424.3. Yearly updates should be submitted to the secretary of the Board of Ministerial Studies. The Board of Ministerial Studies will evaluate the final transcript at graduation, and no requirements stated in the Manual will be waived.

D. CONTINUING EDUCATION

"Once a minister has fulfilled the expectations of the educational foundations for ministry, he or she will continue a pattern of lifelong learning to enhance the ministry of which God has called him or her. A minimum expectation is 20 contact hours each year (2 accredited continuing education units (CEU's) (Manual 424.6). In order to facilitate the fulfillment of this requirement, a number of qualified events will be promoted through the district and by other means. An individual may receive CEU's by participating in a qualified event sponsored by the district, the general church, one of our colleges or universities or other approved method. When CEU's are available for a sponsored event, notification of the same will be made at the event and the participants will have the opportunity to sign up for credits. Credits will be based upon the participant attending the entire event and fulfilling other requirements (if applicable) for the event (such as extra reading or writing when appropriate). In all cases, it is the individual participant's responsibility to qualify him/herself for CEU credits.

The Board of Ministerial Studies appoints a continuing education director who shall be responsible to facilitate CEU qualified events and to resource individuals in obtaining CEU credits for events attended. Individuals may also contact the Department of Clergy Development directly with questions or for qualifying and awarding CEU credits for courses taken. All determination of CEU qualifications shall be made by the Office of Ministry. All records of CEU's obtained shall be retained by the Department of Clergy Development and by the individual himself/herself. Courses taken for degree programs are not eligible for CEU credit.

Mission Strategy Team Report to the District Assembly 2012-2013

Members and friends of the assembly, it is my privilege to present to you my sixth report as chairman of the District Mission Strategy Team. The Mission Strategy Team this year included the following members: Dr. James R. Spruce (chairman, ex-officio); Mark Copley, District Mission Strategy Director; Philip Alvord, Kevin Donoho, Allen Ebbler, Les Wilhelm; Rita Briggs, Wayne Clevenger, Craig Dillman, Tim Mondy; James Craig; Will Haworth; Tim Young, Jr.. We also want to acknowledge our church planters and new works that are active on our District: Wayne Clevenger at Urbana Lighthouse; Tim Young, Jr. at Granite City (Church Type Mission); and Willard Anderson at The Master's Hands (Compassionate Ministries Center) in Olney. Last summer's Prayer Summit in Springfield moved many people -- our leaders, and churches to recommit themselves to prayer, and no doubt God is hearing and answering our prayers. This has led us into a most fruitful year full of new possibilities.

The Mission Strategy Team distributed over \$16,500 in grants this year. These were used to provide new chairs for our growing Urbana congregation, to provide coaching for Tim Young, Jr. our church planter in Granite City, and to provide refrigeration units for The Master's Hands Compassionate Ministries Center in Olney.

We also provided funding for 23 people (pastors and representatives) from 15 churches to attend DCPI (Dynamic Church Planting International) Training in Sherman this year. This event is most notable for the mission of our District. There, pastors presented a vision to begin a church planting movement on our District that could plant 135 in the next ten years. Many of these involve churches working together to plant new works on their Zone. For example, the Mississippi Valley Zone presented a goal of planting six new churches in the next ten years, with the first to be launched in the Fall of 2014. Several pastors committed to plant new churches from their congregation's resources as well.

Out of these presentations, the Collinsville Good Samaritan Church presented a plan to plant a new Hispanic congregation in the State Park/Fairmont City area. This neighborhood has the highest percentage concentration of Hispanic residents in the St. Louis metro area (72%). Following up on this, the Mission Strategy Team recommended to the District Advisory Board the calling of David Samayoa as Hispanic Mission Coordinator to lead, not only the church planting effort in Collinsville, but also to begin a Church Planting Movement among Hispanic communities on our District. With the Advisory Board's approval, and with an appeal to churches for District wide support, this move was approved and David (with his wife Sonia) will be moving to the Collinsville area in July to begin their work here. Thanks to Dr. Spruce, the Advisory Board, Pastor Waldo Perez, and Pastor Kevin Hancock for their part in making this historic decision for our District.

We again enjoyed successful Team Days this year in both Decatur and Salem. Pastor Mark Bane challenged us with his preaching and teaching to allow Christ to TRANSFORM both us and our churches for the work of his mission. Special thanks to Dr. Frank Moore, and Dr. Mark Quanstrom, our ONU professors for teaching workshops. To Decatur First, and Salem Grace for hosting us. And to Laura Mondy and her volunteers who planned and worked hard to organize these important events.

The Mission Strategy Team reemphasizes the following goals:

- Each church developing a written strategic plan for reaching the lost and church growth.
- Each pastor involved in a coaching movement and intentionally connecting with other pastors.
- Each church striving for "Church Health" using the Church Health Survey and the Natural Church Development process.
- Each church embracing a clearly stated target area and plan for involvement in church planting and multiplication.

We believe that the events of this year have moved us closer to these goals, and that the vision for "a new passion, for a new people, and a new Illinois" is coming into view. We continue to pray and seek the fulfillment of our mission, "To develop healthy, multiplying, holiness churches and pastors." Christ is calling us to make Christlike disciples in the nations. As a District, we must follow Him into the new day that he is creating for his Church in Illinois.

Finance Committee

We, your Finance Committee, recommend the following:

 In accordance with the General Church of the Nazarene Global Ministry Center that all budget payments be based on Church Income. Church Income (Qualified Income for Illinois District purposes) is defined as all income eligible under IRS guidelines for a tax deduction, reduced by payments made to the World Evangelism Fund, payments made for approved 10% specials, deductions for rare circumstances, phase in

- adjustments, and any other deduction allowed by the General Church of the Nazarene Global Ministry Center.
- That the Illinois District Budget be a unified budget with a single budget payment to include district administration and operations, NMI, NYI, and SDMI. All budget payments to be allocated to each department based on their pro-rata portion of budget receipts. Budget payments should be sent to William E. Shotts unified district treasurer.
- 3. That the World Evangelism Fund be 5.5 percent of Church Income, Pensions and Benefits Fund be 2.25 percent, the Olivet Nazarene University Fund be 2.25 percent, and the Unified District Fund be **5.85** percent.
- 4. That every church endeavor to be 10 percent for world missions as based on an amount equal to or greater than 10% of Church Income, less amount paid for World Evangelism Fund and approved specials (missions giving).
- 5. That the Unified District Funds be allocated as follows:

Unified District	80.23 %
NMI	4.49 %
NYI	6.05 %
SDMI	6.73 %
ONU	2.50 %

- That all Funds (World Evangelism, Unified District, Olivet Nazarene University, and Pensions and Benefits) be calculated and paid weekly beginning in May.
- That only churches which have paid in full the Unified District Fund, the Olivet Nazarene University Fund, the Pensions and Benefits Fund, and the World Evangelism Fund, be permitted to report all funds paid in full.
- 8. That no congregation be granted permission to go in debt for any building or improvement program, or the hiring of any staff or assistants, until it has shown the ability to pay all of its obligations, including funds paid in full for two years preceding the request, debt under consideration and/or the additional salary, and that the amount of the indebtedness and terms of payment not jeopardize the spiritual life of the church. Exceptions may be granted by the District Superintendent only with the unanimous approval of the District Advisory Board. (Manual, par. 235.4).
- That every church prepares and adopts an annual operating budget for the church in accordance with (Manual, par. 129.6 & 129.7). Should assistance be requested for the preparation of a budget, the district will be happy to provide such assistance to the church.
- 10. That every church adopts a written "Designated Gift Policy". Should assistance be requested for the preparation of a designated gift policy, the district will be happy to provide such assistance to the church.

- That October 6, 2013, be designated as Nazarene Bible College Sunday in our local churches and that a special offering be received and forwarded to the Bible College immediately.
- That December 1, 2013, be designated as American Bible Society Sunday in our local churches, and that an offering be received and sent to the General Treasurer in Kansas City immediately.
- That January 12, 2014, be designated as Nazarene Theological Seminary Sunday in our local churches, and that an offering be received and sent to the Seminary in Kansas City immediately.
- That April 20, 2014, be designated as Olivet Nazarene University Sunday in our local churches, and that an offering be received and sent to our District Treasurer for Olivet.
- 15. That the salary of the district superintendent be \$60,000.00 annually, plus \$9,594.45 annually be invested for him in a tax-sheltered annuity, SE payments of \$11,576.37 and \$3,000.00 annually for reimbursable expenses and that he be given five weeks vacation with pay at a time convenient for him.
- 16. That the salary of the Administrative Assistant be \$40,446.39 annually, plus \$3,198.15 annually be invested for him in a tax-sheltered annuity, Housing allowance of \$13,400.30, SE payments of \$8,157.47,and \$3,500.00 annually for reimbursable expenses and that he be given vacation in accordance with manual guidelines with pay at a time convenient for him.
- 17. That the salary of the Mission Strategy Director be \$21,754.10 and SE payments of \$3,323.59 annually.
- 18. That the District Advisory Board be authorized to provide a district-owned vehicle, plus travel and expenses, for the district superintendent.
- That the District Advisory Board be authorized to provide a district owned vehicle, plus travel and expenses, for the travel and expenses, for the administrative assistant.
- 20. That the District Advisory Board be authorized to provide a district-owned vehicle, plus travel and expenses, for the Mission Strategy Director.
- 21. That the district boards' committees', and councils' travel reimbursement be at the current IRS rate and that actual meals and lodging expenses away from home be reimbursed. These expenses to be paid from appropriate operating fund.
- 22. That the honorarium for the district secretary be **\$4,010.20** per year, and that expenses for clerical help be allowed.
- 23. That the professional fees to be paid for accounting and bookkeeping services for the district including the medical fund be \$40,761.00 per year.

- 24. That a recommended rate of \$8.25 per hour be paid for temporary secretarial services provided for district departments such as Board of Ministerial Studies, School of Ministry and any other services required during the year.
- 25. That the local churches pay the health insurance plan for pastors and dependents, and for associate pastors and dependents; and that the district pay \$2,000 per year for the cost of the health plan premium for full-time commissioned evangelists and their families, and that the local church (where evangelist holds membership) pay the balance of the premium.
- 26. That our people be encouraged in the stewardship of possessions as related to wills, annuities, and the life loans for the local church, district home missions, world missions, our colleges and seminary. That the Department of Stewardship regional representative, Rev. Larry Hindmand, 9625 Mason, Oak Lawn, IL 60453 (708-857-4770) be contracted by local churches for counseling service in life income wills and bequests. That our churches be encouraged to utilize the Church of the Nazarene Foundation for planned and deferred gifts from their members to any Nazarene ministry, including gifts to the local church, and to use the Foundation to manage investments accounts, endowments, or charitable trusts. Visit www.NazareneFoundation.org or call 866-273-4721 for additional information.
- 27. That the local church boards strictly adhere to the provisions of the Manual, Pars. 129.21, 129.22, 129.23, concerning the counting and the accounting for all monies received and disbursed, and an annual audit of the financial records.
- 28. That each local church treasurer use printed forms for reporting all monies received and disbursed each month, and that the pastor and church board be provided a copy or copies of the monthly treasurer's report (Manual, par. 135.4).

Christian Cultural Engagement

- A. WHEREAS, in times when our culture desperately needs the Church to be a living example of Christ-like holiness and love, we strongly urge:
 - 1. All our sisters and brothers in Christ to remember that we are called to be the Body of Christ in our world being empowered by the Holy Spirit to the glory of God the Father. As a result, we urge our brothers and sisters to remember the importance of corporate Christian worship, the receiving of the Sacraments and the practice of spiritual disciplines within the family and individually, believing that these are primary Means of Grace by which the Holy Spirit shapes us into a holy people.
 - 2. That pastors, evangelists, and leaders live and teach the scriptural doctrines of the new birth and entire sanctification, believing that the Holy Spirit bears witness to both works of grace through the infilling of His Spirit, and that the one biblical evidence of the latter is the cleansing of the heart by faith from original sin manifested by the fruit of the Spirit in Christian service: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self- control (Gal 5:22-24).
 - 3. That the church manual be made available to all in the church who desire it and the Articles of Faith (Manual, Part II, para 1-22, pgs. 28-37) and the Covenant of Christian Character (Manual, Part II, Articles 27-27.3, pgs. 38-40) be read, or printed, and distributed to the church body at least once a year admonishing each Nazarene to diligently pursue a lifestyle that honors God, the church and one another.
 - 4. That new converts be lovingly nourished and instructed in the way of holiness.
 - 5. That all of our people, "in putting off the old to put on the new and holy way of life as well as the mind of Christ" (Eph 4:17-24), take to heart The Covenant of Christian Conduct of our church which gives guidance in areas of Christian Ethics, Entertainment, Marriage & Divorce, Abortion, Human Sexuality, Christian Stewardship, etc. (Manual, Part III, para 33-41, pgs 46-60).
- B. WHEREAS, ethics and values are constantly being questioned and changed by our society, the church must strengthen itself in its commitment and conduct. Therefore, this committee felt it vitally important to not only reaffirm our belief in Scripture and our Wesleyan guidelines, but to also provide useful information in this

document to resource both laity and clergy to make the church both a beacon of hope and a model of holiness to our families, community and world. (Matthew 5:10-17; Ephesians 5:1-2,8-14; I Peter 1:13-17).

Believing that ministry in the life of a Christian is based upon who we are in Christ, not merely the activities that we engage in, we encourage our people to see their world through the eyes of Jesus, to seek out opportunities for love and service at home and at work, within their local church as well as in the larger community. We also encourage our people to work with and in public institutions as a means of Christ-like engagement with our culture on the local, State, National, and Global levels.

- 1. Each local church should strive to provide opportunities for Christ-like service such as:
- a) Ministries to the vulnerable, marginalized, and hurting within one's own congregation, believing that Christian love demonstrated toward those within our own fellowship is one way that Christ's love is made evident to the culture around us.
- b) Consider initiating special ministries that reach out to the needy in the community.

- 2. Along with engaging in acts of love and service through the local church, we must encourage our people to bring the same acts of kindness into their workplaces and homes. In understanding that Christ has called not only pastors, but in fact all Christians to be salt and light in the world, we must encourage our people to not look at their homes and workplaces as mundane and trivial, but as places to which they have been called to bring the love and hope of Jesus. We must understand that being a missional church is not something we do only corporately, but something we do individually, everyday as we live our lives as salt and light in this dark and broken world.
- 3. Our people should show Christian stewardship by becoming involved in civic, community and school functions and cooperating with other churches and civic agencies who share our ministry objectives. Our pastors, youth workers and parents should maintain an awareness of the activities and promotions of organizations within the local school system and unite in an effort to oppose activities that do not comply with New Testament moral standards. Examples of civic organizations to offer aid and service to:
 - a) Pregnancy Resource Centers
 - b) Homeless Shelters
 - c) Habitat for Humanity
 - d) Credible Christian Counseling Centers
 - e) Food & Clothing Pantries such as Hopeful Hearts

in Decatur, the Good Samaritan Ministries Center in the Metro-East and The Master's Hand in Olney and Newton along with multiple food pantries in local churches throughout the district.

- f) Nursing Homes; Senior Adult Organizations
- g) Appropriate Parent/Teacher Organizations (Resources: Nazarene Compassionate Ministries; Focus on the Family; Salvation Army; Nazarene Ethnic Ministries; Illinois Family Institute, 799 Roosevelt Road, Building 3, Suite 208, Glen Ellyn, IL; Toll free: (800- FAMILY-1); Fax: (630) 790-8390; Email: info@illinoisfamily.org).
- 4. We should actively monitor our State and Federal Legislature on issues which pertain to, and affect our church and community and express appreciation to individuals/organizations that promote legislature and programs which edify. We encourage the above while being simultaneously mindful that our commitment to Christ our Lord must always be far greater than our commitment to any political party, agenda, or association. Therefore, we urge church leaders to make available the names and addresses of government officials and stress the importance of prayer for all elected officials. We also call our people to thoughtful participation in local. state and national politics, especially pertaining to the biblical ideals of faith, family, and social justice while also wholeheartedly acknowledging that the politics of this world are not the politics of the kingdom of God. Church Growth

We, your Committee on Church Growth, make the following recommendations to the district assembly for consideration:

Commission

We recommend that every church emphasize the Great Commission (Matthew 28:16-20) in every facet of their ministry. We are reminded that the Bible should always be our main source of instruction and that the Great Commission remains as our primary motivation for church growth. Scripture is very clear that our primary motivation in church growth is seeing souls saved and discipled in Christ Jesus.

Prayer

Remember that prayer should be **Prayer is** the foundation for all church growth. and that Without prayer; little of lasting value will be accomplished. We also recommend that the church provide opportunities for concentrated prayer and fasting during the church year. We encourage recommend that each local church do their best to the support of the District sponsored Prayer Summits and Encounters.

Mission/Vision/Purpose

We encourage every church to develop a mission statement, a vision statement, and a clear statement of purpose. We recommend that these three key elements be presented to the local congregation on a regular basis to will ensure that we stay continued focused on God's plan, mission and vision for the local church. There are numerous books and other resources available to assist the church with this task. Any church needing assistance should contact the district superintendent and/or the district missionary.

Responsibility List

That every church maintain an accurate, up-to-date list that includes the name, current address, and telephone number for every person on their and detailed responsibility list. This will allow for better, more consistent follow-up and accountability. We also encourage each congregation to actively and regularly contact, nurture, and disciple those that they have claimed responsibility for.

Calling

That absentees be contacted through a regular, systematic approach. This is not solely the responsibility of the pastor, but should be a shared ministry within the church among the laity.

Discipleship

Emphasis should be given not only to evangelism, but also the discipleship. The new Christian should be encouraged to seek the experience of Heart Holiness entire sanctification which leads to continued spiritual growth, a growing and productive service, inspirational witness in the Christian life. Christian as a way to fulfill the Great Commission (Matthew 28:20).

Lay Ministry

We encourage our each local churches to seek creative ways to provide for and promote Christian service and ministry opportunities within the church and community. develop a partnership between the paster and the laity, which provides for every member to be involved in church ministry (discipleship/ evangelism).

Education

That pastors and laymen take full advantage of educational and CEU opportunities, including seminars, workshops, videos, books, and especially the quality CLT programs that our denomination offers.

Evangelism

That each local congregation seek to evangelize their community with the vision of seeing souls saved and lives changed by the grace and glory of God. That new and innovative and creative methods of outreach and evangelism be explored and implemented. Consider how the resources of the local church, human and financial, can be utilized most effectively to see souls saved.

New Church Starts

We believe every church on the Illinois District can and should become be prayerfully involved in prayer, creating or supporting new church starts. Churches can provide funding and or personal involvement of the local church body in calling, canvassing, etc. That each pastor promote and attend the Church Planting Essentials and Churches Planting Churches DCPI training. That prayer, funding, and personal involvement in new church plants be part of the local church mission statement and vision.

Personal Evangelism

It is the privilege and duty of every Christian to share their faith with others. We encourage all churches to provide specialized training for various types of personal evangelism as well as develop a mentoring support plan for the discipleship of new converts. Personal responsibility for evangelism should be emphasized.

Revivals

We encourage our churches to give top priority to annual revival campaigns. We encourage our churches to plan for and facilitate annual revival campaigns. We strongly urge the use of full-time evangelists in the Church of the Nazarene. We also encourage the use of all media possibilities (TV, radio, etc.) to potentially reach as many as possible with the gospel.

Servant Evangelism

That methods of servant evangelism be employed in churches of all sizes and in all areas. That the local church look for creative and helpful ways to be a blessing to the community it ministers to. Jesus Himself came to serve and to give, not to be served or become successful. Let us willingly choose to follow Christ's example as we minister to others. Such acts of kindness can serve to bridge the gap between the church and the world.

Finances

Set aside a portion of the annual church budget for purposes of outreach and evangelism. The Bible says, "Where your treasure is, there your heart will be also."

Evangelism Committee

We encourage each church to review and implement the guidelines for a local Evangelism and Church Membership Committee as stated in the 2009-2013 *Manual*, page 71, and section 110-110.8.

Global Church Growth Award

It should be the goal of every church to introduce each new convert into the membership of the Church of the Nazarene.

The purpose of the General Superintendents' Growth Award (GSGA) is to give prominence to those practices that are central to the local and worldwide advancement of the church; specifically, new Nazarenes, significant involvement in sponsoring a new church, and 100% participation in fund allocations.

- Churches that win people to Christ are healthy.
- Starting new churches is the most effective means of evangelism known to the church.
- Fund allocations are essential to the cooperative ministries of the Church of the Nazarene.
- New Nazarenes requirements are based on 10% of attendance for the current year.
- II. The meaning of "significant involvement in sponsoring a new church" is very specific and is spelled out in the Sponsorship Criteria Worksheet. This worksheet is available online.
- III. Full participation in fund allocations includes district assignment, educational support, pensions (applicable to US only), and World Evangelism Fund.
 - The requirements for receiving this award are intentionally

high—it is special recognition by the Board of General Superintendents.

- It is not based on attendance or membership.
- This award is not intended to replace all awards.

This award is given in recognition of outstanding accomplishment in essential practices of the expansion of the kingdom of God through the Church of the Nazarene. The presentation of this award is intended to say "Thank You" to the receiving pastor and church, and to elevate in the consciousness of our people the compelling importance of winning people to Christ, starting new churches, and supporting the organizational structures that make possible evangelism around the world.

Ministerial Staff Support

We, your Committee on Ministerial Staff Support, submit the following in order to care for the welfare of our spiritual leaders and encourage their commitment to our spiritual guidance.

The district office and the Pastoral Support Committee want to assist pastors and church boards in understanding their roles in providing adequate compensation for its pastors and staffs. Support of the pastor by the church is an expression of the belief in the call of God on the life of the pastor rather than a job where monies are paid for services rendered. Adequate compensation enables a pastor to fulfill his or her calling.

Pastoral support extends beyond the compensation and benefits for the pastor and staff and includes those expenses incurred by pastoral staff which is necessary to conduct the business of the church. Each church pays a sum to a pastor's ministry, which is divided into several categories: compensation, benefits and expenses. The sum of these categories is considered the cost of ministry to the local church, not all of which is to be considered the income of the pastor.

The district Pastoral Support Committee has developed guidelines for local pastoral support committees to evaluate their commitment to the ministry of the pastor. Anyone wanting further assistance in assessing or planning adequate compensation may contact the district office. In addition to consideration for the local pastors, churches should also establish a remuneration policy for pulpit supply, including travel expenses.

Senior Pastor

The senior pastor is the leader of the church and a leader in the local community.

Bi-vocational Pastor

A bi-vocational pastor supplements income by means other than church

compensation. Churches should view the circumstances that cause the pastor to supplement income as a temporary situation to be resolved as soon as possible. The goal is to remove as many worldly concerns from the pastor as possible, so that the pastor may attend more intently on his or her life's calling. Recognizing that small and young churches may have difficulty in providing adequately for their pastor and family, we urge such churches to use what they are able to provide to the best advantage of their pastor and to strive toward the goal of full support.

Associate Pastor and Staff

An associate pastor is defined as a partner in ministry, on staff, whether receiving compensation or not. The church is to work toward a similar benefit package for the full-time associate as for the senior pastor (guideline to the church: an amount equal to 70 to 80 percent of the senior pastor's compensation package). Associate pastor and staff salaries should be negotiated in accordance with the recommendations of the senior pastor.

Retired Pastor

A retired pastor is a minister with retirement status. We recommend that retired pastors be employed for pulpit supply as frequently as possible. Retired pastors usually live on meager retirement benefits and may welcome the opportunity to provide for pulpit supply. Retired pastors are a source of experience and expertise that is available to the local church.

Evangelist

Often, the evangelist's only source of income is from meetings held at various local churches. We recommend that a full-time evangelist's minimum remuneration for such a meeting be an amount equal to twice the local senior pastor's weekly cash salary for each full Sunday in the special meeting (as recommended by the Evangelism Ministries of the Division of Local Church Growth). The local senior pastor's weekly cash salary and prorated insurance and Social Security benefits should all be included in the compensation. Additional compensation for housing and travel-related expenses should be paid in a separate check, allowing for maximum tax benefit for the evangelist.

I. For the Pastor

A. Concerning Salary:

- 1. That for all full-time pastors, every church provides a minimum of \$450 per week salary. By definition, salary should not be deemed to include reimbursements and cost of ministry expenses listed below in Section B, Paragraph 1. The Advisory Board is to make the distinction between full-time and bi-vocational pastors. That churches which are legitimately unable to provide for such remuneration recognize that their pastor is bi-vocational and, therefore, able and obligated to supplement his or her income. We recommend that the district superintendent or designated personnel monitor the suggested minimum weekly salary on the basis of the materials provided by the general church's worksheet and, when necessary, give strong counsel to church boards to provide the above-stated minimum salary and benefits.
- That the church place, as an employee benefit, an amount equal to 10 percent of the ministerial staff's monthly salary in a tax-sheltered annuity

each month for his/her retirement. This is the third leg of the retirement tier recommended by the Pensions and Benefits office of the general Church of the Nazarene.

- 3. That the church review the ministerial staff salary at least annually and that increases reflect at least cost-of-living increases. That a letter be sent once a year from the district superintendent to the local church board secretary reminding the board of its responsibility in this area, and that a written summation of the board's action shall be returned to the district superintendent within 30 days of the local board meeting.
- 4. That any significant increase in the annual amount raised for all purposes by the church during a pastor's tenure be taken into consideration at the time salary and benefits are reviewed.

B. Concerning Reimbursements:

- 1. That the church pays reimbursements for all church-related expenses, and that among these are standard mileage reimbursement at the recommended IRS rate for personally-owned automobiles. To avoid additional financial burden on the pastor and staff during these days of rapidly increasing gasoline prices, the church board is strongly encouraged to monitor and comply with any increases the IRS may possibly make on its recommended mileage rate during the calendar year. Entertainment expenses, office supplies, continuing education expenses (books, tuition, conferences, etc.), gifts and all other reimbursable expenses deemed appropriate by the IRS should also be included.
- 2. Church-related expenses of pastoral staff should be qualified on the basis of material from General Headquarters, as well as the Internal Revenue Service. Every church should provide adequately to prevent financial strain to the parsonage family, and that every church provides 100 percent Social Security and full family hospitalization. That churches be allowed to maintain their present insurance program, and if churches propose a change, the change should be approved by the district superintendent and the District Advisory Board.
- That the church provides the ministerial staff expense to all church-related functions, including the district and general assemblies. Lodging, meals and transportation shall be a part of this expense.
- 4. That the churches encourage and financially support its ministerial staff to continuing education through school, seminars and conferences.
- That each local church board provides funds for the purpose of sending its ministerial staff to the general assembly.

C. Concerning Housing:

- That the church provides housing and utilities and/or adequate housing allowance.
- 2. That the church equips the parsonage with a stove, refrigerator, air

- conditioning, washer, dryer, draperies, curtains and carpeting.
- That a minister could request the church board to adjust his/her compensation for any year in which it is anticipated that the minister will purchase major appliances and/or furniture.
- 4. That the fair-rental value and the designated additional parsonage allowance should be entered into church board records at the beginning of each calendar year. When a housing allowance is established in lieu of a parsonage, a review of the allowance should be made annually regarding payment, taxes, utilities and repairs.
- 5. That the Board of Trustees of the local church inspect the parsonage once each year in order to continue to provide for quality living conditions. No parsonage family should be expected to live in substandard housing. This inspection should be scheduled with the pastor and spouse and be done in their presence. Any necessary changes seen at this inspection should be completed as soon as possible.
- 6. That the local church board makes all necessary arrangements for the ministerial staff's moving expenses.
- D. Concerning the Ministerial Staff's General Emotional and Spiritual Welfare:
 - 1. That the church continually lifts the parsonage families in prayer.
 - That the church remembers the ministerial staff's family with suitable gifts at appropriate times during the year and consider a gift of no less than one week's salary at Christmas.
 - 3. That the church provide for vacation and time off according to the following scale (this schedule refers to total years in ministry):
 - a. One year in the ministry: two weeks vacation
 - b. Two to ten years in the ministry: three weeks vacation
 - c. Ten to twenty years in the ministry: four weeks vacation
 - d. Twenty or more years in the ministry: five weeks vacation
 - (District Assembly, Family Camp, ministerial retreats and seminars, and working in Teen or Children's Camps are not to be considered as part of this vacation time allowance.)
 - 4. In order to benefit the church and the health of the pastor, the church should encourage the pastoral staff to take a minimum of one day per week for family time.
 - 5. That the church allow the senior pastor the privilege of holding a full week revival or speaking engagement of one or more days, not to exceed seven days per year, with the church to be responsible for pulpit supply without loss of salary to the pastor.
 - 6. That the local church offer the pastor/staff two mental health days each month to be taken at the pastor's discretion, to be used at a time when

workload or individual stress is overwhelming.

7. That the local church make available to its pastor a one month sabbatical at the end of each five years of uninterrupted ministry to that same church.

II. For All Full-time Evangelists (Song and Otherwise)

A. Concerning Salary:

- 1. That evangelists be paid at least an amount equal to twice the pastor's salary or a minimum of \$500 for each Sunday of the meeting.
- 2. That, in addition, Social Security on the amount of salary be summarily paid.
- That evangelists be notified in writing at the time the meeting is scheduled of the minimum remuneration they can expect to receive from the local church.
- 4. That local churches avoid canceling previously scheduled revivals.
- 5. That a local church canceling a revival without notifying the evangelist at least 30 days in advance be obligated to pay the minimum remuneration in full, unless the evangelist is able to reschedule the same date.

B. Concerning Reimbursements and Housing

- That churches provide for all travel expenses, lodging and food during the meeting.
- 2. That local churches having full-time evangelists as members pay one-half the cost of the district hospitalization insurance.
- 3. That local churches having full-time evangelists as members provide for their expenses to general and district gatherings.

C. Concerning the Evangelist's General Emotional and Spiritual Welfare:

- 1. That finances for revivals be raised in advance of the scheduled meeting.
- 2. That the local church sends a Christmas gift to all evangelists who have served the church during that calendar year.
- That local churches having full-time evangelists as members provide encouragement and support for their ministry through prayer and such tangible ways as love offerings and remembering them on their birthdays and anniversaries.

III. For Retired Ministerial Staff

A. Concerning Reimbursements:

1. That local churches having retired ministers as members provide for their expenses to general and district gatherings they wish to attend.

- B. Concerning Their General Emotional and Spiritual Welfare
 - That local churches having retired ministers as members remember them often, such as at birthdays, anniversaries and Christmas, with gifts of gratitude for their years of faithful service in the Kingdom.
 - 2. That the Illinois District gives a one-time love gift to all elders upon their retirement. We recommend a minimum of \$1.000.

We ask that each local church board secretary and pastor receive a copy of this report from the district superintendent and that the same shall be read or distributed by the church board secretary to the church board as a reminder of their responsibilities. The church board secretary shall notify the district superintendent in writing concerning the fulfillment of this policy.

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Board of Directors
Illinois District Church of the Nazarene

We have audited the accompanying statement of assets, liabilities and net assets – modified cash basis of the Administration, Home Mission, Camp Ground, District Reserve, Medical, Nazarene Missions International, Church New Start, Sunday School and Discipleship Ministries International and Nazarene Youth International funds of the Illinois District Church of the Nazarene as of April 30, 2013, and the related statements of support, revenue and expenses and cash flows – modified cash basis for the fiscal year then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting described in Note 1; this includes the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. Accordingly, we express no such opinion. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our qualified audit opinion.

Basis for Qualified Opinion

As explained in Note 1 to the financial statements, the modified cash basis of accounting requires fixed assets be stated at cost, net of accumulated depreciation. Management has informed us that the District has stated its properties at estimated costs and appraised values versus historical costs as required by the modified cash basis of accounting. In addition, no depreciation expense has been recorded in the financial statements. The effect of this departure on the financial statements has not been determined.

Qualified Opinion

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above (except for the effects of valuing fixed assets at estimated costs and appraised values described in the Basis for Qualified Opinion paragraph) present fairly, in all material respects, the assets, liabilities, and net assets of the Administration, Home Mission, Camp Ground, District Reserve, Medical, Nazarene Missions International, Church New Start, Sunday School and Discipleship Ministries International and Nazarene Youth International funds of the Illinois District Church of the Nazarene as of April 30, 2013, and its support, revenue and expenses and cash flows for the year then ended, on the basis of accounting described in Note 1.

Basis of Accounting

As explained in Note 1, these financial statements were prepared on a modified cash basis, which is a comprehensive basis of accounting other than generally accepted accounting principles.

Other Matters

Our audit was made for the purpose of forming an opinion on the statement of assets, liabilities and net assets – modified cash basis and the related statements of support, revenue and expenses and cash flows – modified cash basis. The accompanying supplementary information contained on pages 11 through 27 is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain other procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. In our opinion, the information is fairly stated in all material respects in relation to the financial statements taken as a whole.

NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Nature of Activities

Illinois District Church of the Nazarene is a not-for-profit corporation organized under the laws of the State of Illinois. Its purpose is to provide administrative and financial assistance to the local Nazarene churches in the District. The organization is supported primarily through budget receipts from the local churches.

Description of Programs

Illinois District Church of the Nazarene offers the following programs:

- Home Mission This program was established to assist churches in need.
- Camp Ground This program was established to minister to various individuals and groups by providing a place for recreational activity, as well as providing a place to minister to the attendees / users.
- Medical This program was established for the purpose of facilitating the receipt and payment of health and life insurance premiums for ministers, and to make partial reimbursements to retired ministers for their medical expenses.
- Nazarene Missions International This program was established to provide support for Missionaries approved by the General Church of the Nazarene and to support local churches in NMI programs.
- Church New Start This program was established to provide assistance to new church start-uos.
- Sunday School and Discipleship Ministries International This program provides spiritual, recreational activities, and camps for youth participation (elementary level) and to support local churches with their Sunday School programs.
- Nazarene Youth International This program provides spiritual, recreational activities, and trips for youth participation (junior high and senior high level) and to support local churches in their NYI programs.

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements are presented using a modified cash basis of accounting. This basis of accounting recognizes assets, liabilities, net assets, revenues, and expenses when they result from cash transactions. This basis is a comprehensive basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

As a result of the use of this modified cash basis of accounting, certain assets and their related revenues (such as accounts receivable) and certain liabilities and their related expenses (such as accounts payable)

are not recorded in these financial statements.

NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)

Cash and Cash Equivalents

The District considers all highly liquid investment instruments available for current use with an initial maturity of three months or less to be cash equivalents.

Investments

Investments in mutual funds with readily determinable fair values are reported at their fair values in the Statement of Assets, Liabilities and Net Assets – Modified Cash Basis. The District carries investments in marketable securities with readily determinable fair values in the Statement of Assets, Liabilities and Net Assets – Modified Cash Basis. Unrealized gains and losses are included in the change in net assets in the accompanying Statement of Support, Revenues and Expenses – Modified Cash Basis.

Property and Equipment

The District has recorded its property and equipment at appraised and estimated values, which is not in conformity with the modified cash basis of accounting. Depreciation has not been computed on fixed assets.

Income Taxes

The District is exempt from Federal income taxes under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. In addition, the District has been determined by the Internal Revenue Service not to be a private foundation within the meaning of Section 509(a) of the code.

Estimates

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with the modified cash basis of accounting requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Loans Receivable and Payable and Transfers between Program Accounts

Loans between programs have a zero net effect on the Statement of Assets, Liabilities and Net Assets – Modified Cash Basis and have been eliminated. In addition, transfers between programs have a zero net effect on the Statement of Support, Revenue and Expenses – Modified Cash Basis and have been eliminated.

NOTE 2 - CONCENTRATION OF CREDIT RISK

The District maintains multiple accounts at various financial institutions. Accounts at these institutions are insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC). As of April 30, 2013, total cash at one institution exceeded FDIC limits in the amount of \$3,664.37.

NOTE 3 - INVESTMENTS

Investments are stated at fair value and consist of mutual funds. Fair values as of April 30, 2013 are summarized as follows:
