

### **Missionary Health Care**

### What is Missionary Health Care, and why should I give to it?

Missionary Health Care (MHC) is an opportunity to help with the health care costs of Nazarene missionaries. MHC allows missionaries to focus on their work without raising funds to pay for medical care. The money comes from Distinguished Service Awards (DSAs), Memorial Rolls (MRs), Gifts from the Heart, or plate offerings.

### What are the Distinguished Service Award and the Memorial Roll?

The Distinguished Service Award recognizes someone (living) who has served or is serving the church. It may be presented by the church or a group within the church (not individuals). The Memorial Roll is a record of people who have been memorialized by gifts to the Medical Plan. It is kept in the General NMI Office and is a significant way to honor the deceased (members of the local church or not) and may be presented by groups or individuals. Both of these honors are accompanied by attractive certificates stating the recipient and—in the case of a DSA—the reason for presentation.

### Where can I access a history of individuals on the Memorial Roll or individuals who received DSAs?

The Memorial Roll/DSA history is available online. This allows you to:

- Search for (and/or print) a list of individuals from your church/district who received a DSA.
- Search for (and/or print) a list of individuals who were placed on the Memorial Roll.

### Where can I get order forms for Distinguished Service Awards and Memorial Rolls?

DSA and MR order forms are included on the District NMI Convention Resource DVD. They are also available for download on the Missionary Health Care Promotional Ideas page.

### The order form says to mail a check and a remittance form with my order. What is a remittance form?

The remittance form is an accounting form, specific to each church, generated by Global Treasury Services. Your church treasurer should have one, and photocopies of the form are acceptable. If your church treasurer does not have a remittance form, Global Treasury Services (Phone: 913-577-2730) can mail or fax one to you. The remittance form can also be found on the Global Treasury Services Web site as well as on the District NMI Convention Resource DVD.

### Why does it take so long for my church to receive the certificates once they are ordered?

Order MR or DSA online with Visa, MasterCard, Discover, or American Express. (Please allow 3-11 business days for delivery.)

You may still order MR/DSAs by mail. However, if your church chooses to order MR/DSAs by mail, **you should expect 4 to 6 weeks for delivery**. Why? When churches mail orders for DSAs or MRs, the money for each of these orders must be processed first by Global Treasury Services, then by the General NMI Office. Each necessary step takes time, and the General NMI Office processes hundreds of orders each week. For this reason, churches should expect 4 to 6 weeks for delivery.

### Please plan ahead. Order your MR/DSAs early to receive them on time for your presentation.

### To expedite the process when ordering by mail:

- Include the completed remittance form with your order form and check.
- For a DSA, keep the reason for presentation clear and within the space requirements on the order form.
- Verify all information on the order form, especially the spelling of the recipient's name.
- Order early.

### How do I order a Children's Memorial Roll?

Order online: The process for ordering a Children's MR is identical to ordering a regular MR when ordering online. See instructions above.

Order by mail: The process for ordering a Children's MR by mail is similar to ordering a regular MR, except you must indicate somewhere on the order form that you want a Children's MR. See instructions above.

### What is Gifts From the Heart?

Gifts From the Heart is a facet of Medical Plan that allows individuals to give to Missionary Health Care. People may be honored or memorialized with an attractive card noting the monetary gift to Missionary Health Care (the donor chooses the amount). Look for the display in your church. Take a card from the rack and follow the instructions. If you do not see a Gifts From the Heart display at your church, ask your local or district NMI president.

### **Memorial Roll**

The Memorial Roll, established in 1919, is a way to honor deceased friends and loved ones. A certificate is issued in the name of the person memorialized and is often presented to a family member or displayed in the church. Churches or individuals may place as many names on the Memorial Roll as they desire, and those memorialized need not be members of the church.

### Distinguished Service Award

The Distinguished Service Award (DSA) is a tribute to church people who are living and for their service to the church. Although the DSA is given through NMI, it need not be given in the area of missions. A church may wish to honor anyone in the church for their efforts. Note: The DSA may only be given by a church or a group within the church. Individuals may not give this award.

The cost of the DSA remains at \$100 (U.S.). Reprints of a DSA are \$25 each. The DSA certificates are printed in black and gray on fine white paper, with touches of gold foil to enhance the look of the certificate.

### **Pentecostal Waiting**

"Do not leave Jerusalem, but wait for the gift my Father promised, which you have heard me speak about. For John baptized with water, but in a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit. ...you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.'

I don't like waiting. I mean, I don't like waiting for anything. Traffic, food, admission to ball games or concerts, stuff to come in the mail, coffee at Starbucks... Give it to me now! I'm not alone; you probably don't like to wait either. In fact, businesses are counting on it. Service gets faster and faster, express lanes are constructed, and fast food is handed through your car window as quick as you can swipe your credit card. Communication is quicker than ever too. Email and text messages fly through space to my inbox in no time at all. Recent Grammy winners, Arcade Fire, marvel in one of their hit songs that we used to write letters to our loved ones and actually wait for them to arrive.

So what do we do with a recently resurrected Lord who tells his follower not to hurry, but wait. Go, but not yet. First stay and wait. Tarry, he says, the gift is coming. Wait for it.

There's a corrective here for all of our Missional enthusiasm. Jesus, who commanded his followers to "Go into all the world..." first says, "wait" in Jerusalem. Before he says "Get going!" he says "Get waiting!"

And what are they waiting for? A Gift. A Gift promised for centuries by the Father, but promised again by John the Baptist, and by Jesus himself. The Gift is the Holy Spirit, given by the Father, poured out by Jesus, and received by the Church.

Recently, at our District Prayer Summit, sponsored by the Sherman Church, Pastor Corey Jones from Crossroads Tabernacle in Ft. Worth, Texas told of his experience pastoring there. After his first three years, he had exhausted all the church growth strategies he knew, been to all the seminars, and read all the books, yet the church refused to grow. In fact, it continued to decline. He was discouraged and prepared to resign.

At the invitation of a dear friend, he attended a prayer meeting at a church in New York, which was planted by Jim Cymbala's Brooklyn Tabernacle. There, as he sat broken and waiting, the Holy Spirit came to him with "fresh fire" and renewed his calling and mission. He returned to Texas with a very simple strategy which was counterintuitive to all the books and programs. "Pray" and "Wait". This call was not heard by all, as another family left the church even as the new prayer meetings began. Yet, Corey had heard the call of the Lord, to wait, to trust, and to pray. The waiting was not easy (no waiting is), the praying was not pretty (there were tears of repentance), and the answers did not come in a rush. But they did come, and the church began to operate in the power of the Spirit, and lives were, and continue to be, changed by the gospel and the power of God. Today, the Crossroad Tabernacle is thriving. The primary meeting of the church is a Tuesday night prayer meeting where God is eagerly sought and found. They see God at work acting among them regularly in amazing and powerful ways.

Such is the kind of Pentecostal waiting that Christ calls us to. Not a waiting that decreases our effectiveness, or distracts us from our mission, but a waiting that assures our effectiveness, and empowers our mission through Christ. We must go, but we must go in, with, and through him. We must not fall behind, but we dare not run ahead of the Spirit.

Could you join us in a Missional movement across our district? It is a very strange movement indeed, because like the original movement of Christ, it begins by not moving at all. It begins by waiting, being still, knowing who he is, and what he has promised to us who wait. It begins with praying, repenting, hungering, and thirsting for all that God has for us -- the Spirit of God poured out in power to all his people, sons and daughters, young men and old... the promise remains.... Wait for it.
