B. INSTRUCTIONS TO STUDENTS

Eligibility

The board serves only the persons who are properly enrolled. Enrollment is open only to local preachers, deacons-Christian education, deacons-compassionate ministries, deacons-music ministries, and prospective ministers of music who qualify according to the Manual, 410.

Courses

There are seven general courses administered by the Ministerial Studies Board; elders, deacon of administration, deacon of compassionate ministries, deacon of Christian education, deacon of music, deacon of youth, and lay minister (*Handbook of Ministerial Studies*).

Ministers, deacons and deaconesses will not be ordained without having completed their respective courses. An exception to this is provided for all commissioned song evangelists who held this status immediately prior to the 1986 assembly season. Those becoming commissioned song evangelists will complete the deacon track in music ministries. Those interested in commissioned or registered song evangelists' credentials should study carefully all requirements as listed in *Handbook on Ministerial Studies*, 446, "The Song Evangelist."

Modes of Study

The options for the course of study are listed below (by preference) as recommended and approved by the Illinois District Ministerial Studies Board.

1. A Nazarene university or an accredited university, pursuing a degree in a religious field of study.

2. Nazarene Theological Seminary.
3. Nazarene Bible College or NBC Ministry Preparation Program.
4. Northwest Nazarene University Online Module Courses
5. Nazarene Bible College: NBC Track.

The Course of Study is under the immediate supervision of the District Board of Ministerial Studies. Students are advised to pursue preparation or ordination by selecting one of the above-mentioned modes of study. Each student is assigned an advisor to work with in establishing a plan of study.

The courses required of college students are in the Manual, 424.3. The competency statements for ministerial education are listed in Manual, 424.3. All college and university programs must meet these competency statements for course of study.

C. REGULATIONS FOR MINISTERIAL COURSE OF STUDY

1. It is no longer necessary for students to purchase the *Sourcebook for Ministerial Development*. This information and more can now be found on the Clergy Education website (<http://nazarenepastor.org/clergyeducation/>) A Candidate Handbook can be downloaded for free from <http://www.nazarenepastor.org/Clergy/Education/LinkClick.aspx?link=Resources%2fUSAHB.pdf&tabid=74&mid=501>.
2. Each student is encouraged to take four courses each year. The general church requires 2 courses per year to be passed, to allow a student to continue. After the district license is granted to the student, only ten years is allowed to complete the 24 required courses, Manual 427.4. At 2 per year, the student will not succeed. Thus, the Illinois District has chosen to encourage students to complete 4 courses per year. All course work must be completed by the end of the assembly year (April) in order for the student to receive credit for that assembly year. The only exception is for those students enrolled in an institution of higher learning in which the class may not conclude until the board meets in May.
3. A student is placed in a study level based on the number of courses completed regardless of the level of the courses. The only exception is that the course on the Manual of the Church of the Nazarene must be completed before level one is considered complete (unless the student is enrolled in a religion program at a Nazarene institution) and before the student is eligible for a district license.
4. The secretary may not enroll anyone except by written letter from the applicant to include the following information: name (first, middle and last); address; telephone number; e-mail address; course of study desired; church where current membership is held; letter of recommendation from the church pastor where membership is held; copy of local license granted by that church; and official transcripts from colleges or other schools beyond high school. It will be the obligation of the student to see that all the information is sent to the secretary. An application form will be made available for anyone expressing interest in enrolling with the Board of Ministerial Studies.
5. Prior to being issued a graduation certificate, all students must be reviewed by the Ministerial Studies Board. The only exceptions are Nazarene Bible College graduates of the Bible Studies Course who are immediately issued a graduation certificate. No student will be graduated from the course of study without completing an internship program.
6. When a student moves to another district, the secretary of the Ministerial Board should transfer the student's records to the new district by contacting the secretary of that district's Board of Ministerial Studies. Students are strongly advised to keep copies of course record sheets and final grades. The District is not responsible for loss of data when transferring to another district.

7. Candidates should be prepared to appear annually before the Board of Ministerial Studies. These meetings will be scheduled by the district office and notification of the meetings will be sent to you.

8. Files for inactive students will be maintained by the Board of Ministerial Studies for no longer than 10 years.

9. Students are required to keep an active e-mail account while enrolled in the course of study.

College Students

College students are responsible to submit to the board documentary evidence of academic standing in harmony with *Manual*, 427.1, 427.4.

College students are reminded to plan their curriculum in harmony with *Manual*, 424.1 and 424.3. Yearly updates should be submitted to the secretary of the Board of Ministerial Studies. The Board of Ministerial Studies will evaluate the final transcript at graduation, and no requirements stated in the Manual will be waived.

D. CONTINUING EDUCATION

"Once a minister has fulfilled the expectations of the educational foundations for ministry, he or she will continue a pattern of lifelong learning to enhance the ministry of which God has called him or her. A minimum expectation is 20 contact hours each year (2 accredited continuing education units (CEU's) (*Manual* 424.6).

In order to facilitate the fulfillment of this requirement, a number of qualified events will be promoted through the district and by other means. An individual may receive CEU's by participating in a qualified event sponsored by the district, the general church, one of our colleges or universities or other approved method. When CEU's are available for a sponsored event, notification of the same will be made at the event and the participants will have the opportunity to sign up for credits. Credits will be based upon the participant attending the entire event and fulfilling other requirements (if applicable) for the event (such as extra reading or writing when appropriate). In all cases, it is the individual participant's responsibility to qualify him or herself for CEU credits.

The Board of Ministerial Studies appoints a continuing education director who shall be responsible to facilitate CEU qualified events and to resource individuals in obtaining CEU credits for events attended. Individuals may also contact the Department of Clergy Development directly with questions or for qualifying and awarding CEU credits for courses taken. All determination of CEU qualifications shall be made by the Office of Ministry. All records of CEU's obtained shall be retained by the Department of Clergy Development and by the individual himself/herself. Courses taken for degree programs are not eligible for CEU credit.

WEDNESDAY EVENING, JULY 14, 2010

Convention services for the 67th Annual Illinois District Assembly began at First Church of the Nazarene, Springfield, Illinois with singing by the Olivetians from Olivet Nazarene University.

Dr. James Spruce, district superintendent welcomed everyone to the services and he presented a statistical slide shown "Where We Are" on the Illinois District.

Dr. Spruce then introduced guests to the evening crowd: The Olivetians; Dr. John Bowling, ONU President; Dr. Brian Allen, ONU Vice President; Rev. Tony Fightmaster, Director of Church Relations; Dan Bohi, Evangelist; Rev. Greg Sowards and "restored", Song Evangelist; Dr. and Mrs. Allen Dace, former District Superintendent; Mrs. Irene & Sara Spruce, mother and sister of Dr. Spruce; and Rev. Tim and Andrea Young, new church planters for Granite City.

All pastors who had paid anything on their budgets were asked to stand and were applauded for their work this year. Pastors paying all budgets in full were asked to keep standing. Then pastors who had paid their budgets in full for last 10 years, 25 years and longer were asked to keep standing. All were applauded.

Rev. Jim Blue, SDMI Chairman and wife Chris were asked to come to the platform and where Jim was recognized for his 23 years of service. Dr. Spruce presented him with a "Second Mile" award, a trophy and a check as a retirement gift for his work through the years from the Illinois District in Sunday School Ministries.

Rev. Mark Copley was presented the Nazarene Bible College Citation of Merit award.

Dr. and Mrs. Stan Toler, General Superintendent, were introduced to the delegation by Dr. Spruce.

Dr. Spruce also introduced the District Advisory Board: Rev. John Connett, Rev. Mike Curtis, Rev. Allen Ebber, Rev. Jim Frye, Debbi Brandon, Judi Roarick, Christopher Shotts, and Jerome Williams. Rev. Jay Bush, NYI President, Rev. Mark Copley, District Missionary, Mr. Bill Shotts, District Treasurer were introduced. Mr. David & Sheila Bailey, Nazarene Acres Caretakers and Rev. Doug Haynes, District Administrative Associate/District Secretary were introduced.

Rev. Fred Prince and his staff at Springfield First were thanked for their kindness this week in hosting this assembly.

Dr. Spruce updated the delegation on the selling of Nazarene Acres.

Dr. Stan Toler then presented his "Top Ten Things to do at District Assembly" with slides. He called the 67th Annual Illinois District Assembly to order. Rev. Douglas Haynes, district secretary, read the assembly organization information from the assembly handbook and a motion was made and seconded to accept this information.

Dr. Toler talked about his books and the "Books for Pastors Program" and the success this program has had.

The Olivetians came to sing again and Dr. Toler introduced Dr. James Spruce to the delegation for his 7th report to the Illinois District. After an exceptional and encouraging report, the congregation gave him a standing ovation. There was a motion and seconded to accept this report which was received with appreciation.

Rev. Douglas Haynes read from *Manual* paragraph 203.12 regarding the vote of the

district superintendent.

Rev. David Sorensen and a board of tellers were called to distribute a ballot. After a prayer the vote was taken and tellers were dismissed to tally the votes.

Rev. Mark Copley, District Missionary gave a challenging report for the district.

Rev. Kevin Hancock, new pastor at Collinsville Good Samaritan took the offering for Olivet and Pension and Benefits Budgets.

Rev. Haynes read the results of the vote for District Superintendent: 194 votes cast; 173 yes, 19 no, 2 spoiled. Dr. Toler presented the Spruce's to the delegation. Mrs. Spruce was presented a corsage and they both expressed their thanks to the Illinois District. Dr. Spruce accepted this recall vote to serve the Illinois District for an additional four years.

The Ministerial Credentials Final Report was called for. There was a motion to accept this report without reading. The motion carried and the report was adopted as printed.

The Nomination Committee Report – partial report #1 – was read. There was a motion to accept this report. The motion carried and the report was adopted.

Tellers were called to distribute ballots for district officers and trustee to Olivet Nazarene University.

Gifts were distributed to all pastors from the Nazarene Publishing House and a short video was shown.

Dr. Toler presented his books with proceeds going to "Books for Pastor's".

Board of Tellers #2 was called to distribute the ballot for SDMI officers.

Mr. Bill Shotts was presented a book from Dr. Toler for his birthday this day.

A slide with the Constitutional Amendment was shown and the correction highlighted. Discussions were called for and a vote was taken by show of hands. 223 yes, 0 no, to amend this Constitution.

Dr. Spruce introduced new pastors: Rev. Bob & Margie Brewer, Mt. Carmel, and Rev Kevin Hanock,, Collinsville Good Samaritan.

How Do We Get A Vision for Missions At Home?

"What Is the Vision We Share?"

Illinois District Superintendent's Report – 2010

The farmer made his way through our East Texas town two days a week in a buckboard wagon full of fruit and vegetables right off his farm. The wagon rolled on tires with hubcaps and was pulled by a horse with blinders. The sign on the wagon read "Rolling Store to Your Door." The farmer's plan was forthright: he took the farm to the town, a rolling "farmer's market" at its organic best. He thought, "Why not? They won't come to me, so I'll go to them." What if we took the *church* to the town? How *does* the church inject itself into the culture? What would people say or think?

"We had no children in our church at that time and when I suggested doing Vacation Bible School the people said, 'Nobody will come.'" Pastor Darin Workman of Nebo said, "We found a farmer who loaned us a tractor and wagon which we pulled house to house, inviting children and offering rides to VBS. The first night we had 21 children. VBS averages 50 children and about 100 people attend the closing celebration."

They took the *church* to the town. Darin continues, "Following VBS we began a children's church and a family was saved!" Today, five years and several revivals later, Nebo's Sunday morning average attendance has more than tripled to 37 in a town of 300 people. Darin, who is bi-vocational, concluded, "I have personally visited every home in Nebo multiple times. I joined the Volunteer Fire Department and participate with them in community dinners and fundraisers. People know me outside of my pulpit. Pastors, especially in small churches, can become way too insulated and isolated from the community." They took the church to the town.

It is a painful reality in too many churches that the town and church are disconnected. There is no emotional bond. Vagrants who got sandwiches at the parsonage when I was a child did not attend church. They did not "belong." They knew their place – under the viaduct. They knew they were not one of us. The women of the street who used to attend worship at Houston's inner-city First Nazarene Church – would they have been invited to someone's home for dinner? No. What do you say to a prostitute over lunch? Stadler Lewis wrote, "None are less visible than those we decide not to see."

There is relaxed familiarity with our *own* kind of people but an uneasy alliance with Jesus' "other sheep that are not of this fold." We have our in-crowd and they have theirs – on Sunday we eat at potlucks while they eat at Applebee's. Tractors and wagons don't work in your town? So what *does* work where you live? What *is* a vision worth sharing?

FIRST, THE VISION WE SHARE CALLS US TO CARE ABOUT PEOPLE GOING TO HELL

I listened again recently to Lawrence Hicks' mesmerizing sermon "*There Must Be a Heaven Somewhere*." Am I just as persuaded that there *must* be a hell somewhere? Jesus said in Matthew 10:28 to "be afraid of the One who can destroy both soul and body in hell." How *do* we care about people who live as if they don't know the Lord?

While the image of people spending eternity without God *should motivate us*, usually the mention of it will irritate skeptics and scare the daylights out of others. We *know* enough not to use hell as a scare tactic. But do we *care* enough to meet non-churched people at

Starbucks? Would we give them time on their turf? Do they know we even care?

Nazarene elder Darrell MacLearn of the Organic Church movement related the story of two young women. Amanda asked, "Why are you doing this? My parents go to church, but they don't act like you." Noel responded, "You are special and we love you. In fact, God loves you no matter where you are or what you are doing."

Noel and Mary were at the Cabaret, a business that most people avoid and church people condemn. The Cabaret is a strip-joint and packed with guys 24/7. The good news of Jesus Christ shed abroad in a place like *that*? Noel said, "Jesus told me to tell the girls that he loves them and that his kindness leads to repentance."

The irony about a witness is that the good news of love often collides with the bad news of rejection. These young women have the kind of job that creates mutual discomfort between themselves and proper church folk. Nicole the bartender asked one evening, "Who made the bracelets – some *church* group?" "Yes," Mary said. Then the big question, "Did they know *who* they were making them for?" Mary said, "Yes, they did!" And Nicole asked a little quieter, "Really? They made them for *us* knowing who *we* are?" O the certainty of suspicion in this "us – them" world wherein the gospel must take root. Today, a halfway house has been located and a number of women have found a new life in Christ plus shelter from the demeaning and cruel sex industry in Dallas.

SECOND, THE VISION WE SHARE CALLS US TO AVOID MISSIONAL DRIFT

Do you remember a film from the '60s called *The Gospel Blimp*? It was the story of several guys who wanted to spread the gospel in a unique way. They rented a blimp with a billboard message, dropped hard candy wrapped in scripture, shouted scary epitaphs through megaphones and finally got on television wearing military uniforms – and failed miserably to effectively influence the culture they hoped to reach.

Oliver Phillips and Fletcher Tink in *How to Sponsor and Nurture an Ethnic Church without Losing Your Mind* cite Rowan Williams, Archbishop of Canterbury: "It is not the church of God that has a mission, but the God of mission who has a church." Without a God-focus, churches drift within the denomination that *birthed* them and outside the broader secular culture that *needs* them. Our mission is to make Christlike disciples in the nations.

But marginalization is at play if life aboard our sailing vessel, the church, is preferred more than the risk of jumping overboard to rescue the perishing. Missional drift is minimized when the God of mission helps us articulate the following voices in our church:

1) *Kingdom identity.* A Nazarene family is a fellowship like no other in the world yet it is easier to pursue activities *in* the church than it is people *outside* the church. But God *will move us beyond the familiar comforts of our local church to want what he sees for his kingdom* – a holy people who love unholy people. After all, it's not about your church –*it's about your town.* Kingdom identity lifts our vision from preoccupation with "just us" to engagement with those living their empty dream without God.

2) *Keeping balance.* Just as it is difficult to walk a long distance on the single rail of railroad track, so it is hard in today's consumer culture to balance curbside appeal and denominational interests. We may attract people if we offer enough of what they want, or lose them if we tell them who we are, how we spend our money and what we believe. If you have *this* problem you are fortunate; many churches resemble their grandfather's church, giving the "feel" of being out of touch to a generation whose hearts have been captured by iPods and Twitter. The comforts of missional drift begin by relying on what we can offer OR doing church in ways that do not resonate with non-churched people. Despite seismic cultural shifts grace and good sense communicate in this age of denominational

disconnect. The battle is not about curb appeal or rigid adherence to rules. Our properties and programs must be strong, and our covenants, budgets and faith statements well supported. But it will take charitable discourse to engage our U.S. mission field and church in a conversation about who we are that is civil, candid and confessional.

3) *Authentic love.* Our credibility with people is more believable if they know we want to be their friend even if they *never* come to church. Authentic love will do more to reach *this* world than unwarranted preoccupation with growth. A church that loves enough to evangelize and disciple will grow and never be marginalized.

John Wesley knew the Church of England was dying. Paul Chilcote in *Recapturing the Wesleys' Vision* says "It was like a person struggling with hardened arteries, as though there was little life flowing in its veins. During a time of tremendous change the church became distant from and irrelevant to the world it was called to serve. . . (It was) so inflexible and devoid of life that the weight of its institutionalism was quenching the Spirit." So Wesley established "little churches within the larger Church" – societies that offered accountability and thus authentic relationship through small groups.

4) *Inclusive love.* Love is *limited* because I don't carry a picture of your grandkid in my wallet. Love is *inclusive* because God carries a picture of each of us in his heart. Inclusive love, which cannot be legislated, does not come from the top down but from the heart out. God knows how inclusive our love should be. Do *we*? Ogden, Mattoon East Side, Pana, Shelbyville, Beardstown First, Anna, Decatur First, Belleville First and Fairview Heights are not praiseworthy because they are famous or glitzy, but because they have given people, property, money and service hours. Like the Corinthians that helped the Macedonians, they've sacrificed for Urbana Lighthouse that meets in an office basement and for Arcola Spanish that has met for a dozen years in the pastor's garage. And for Vandalia that meets in a remodeled bowling alley and Beardstown Libertad that meets in a remodeled warehouse and for Highland that meets in a living room. We hired Tim Young, Jr. to begin a church in his living room in Granite City because we ache for new places to reach people. Would you carry a picture of him in your heart? Funding the mission of our global church through faithful budget response pays a missionary's salary and a student's tuition at Olivet. Could your love become that inclusive?

5) *Missionary spirit.* A missionary spirit may send you to a neighbor or a total stranger or a new start church. You won't go because the odds are in your favor; they are not. You won't go for recognition or reward; there may be little. You would only go because the Lord of the harvest sends you. And you return forever changed because in being sent you discover or rediscover the focus of your life's mission summed up in one word: others. You remember that the kingdom of God is not all about *you*, and in so remembering you are saved from being a beautiful package all wrapped up in yourself. In this dark world there is no light that shines brighter than the example of an ordinary Christian who is willing to be expendable – used up for Jesus Christ.

THIRD, THE VISION WE SHARE CALLS US TO DISCIPLE OUTSIDERS

"Good morning, Dr. Dace! So good to have you with us!" Actually this has happened quite often since I followed Allen Dace twice in my career. "And good morning to you," I responded. We exchanged pleasantries for a while – as many pleasantries as you can with someone who doesn't even know who you are – and then he looked at me seriously. "Let me ask you a question. Do you ever see that fellow Spruce?" "Yes," I said, "I see him every now and then." I hoped that he was joking around, but by this time we were both pretty far downstream and recovery did not seem practical. Things happen fast in a conversation like this and before I knew it he said with a twinkle in his eye, "Well, do me a favor, would you: the next time you see Spruce tell him he's alright. But between you and me, we sure like you a lot better." We laughed. But outsiders want to be remembered and included! Is there room at your table – at your house?

Joe (name changed) was a handsome man, whose wife and kids came to church faithfully. But he wanted nothing to do with the church and proved it by his lifestyle. He was everything I knew the church was supposed to be about, but the church had nothing in common with him. And so, some forty years ago, I determined to at least be friendly and show interest in what interested him. "You're wasting your time with Joe" was a common remark made by guys in the church who knew him far better than I.

But on Saturday nights I went stock car races to watch Joe. The next week I went to the gas station where he worked and told him I was pulling for him from the bleachers. "You were in the bleachers watching me? I didn't think a guy like you would have time for a place like that." After a year or so, his wife said, "You know, Joe is still Joe, but he can't believe you even notice him. He told the race track official that you are welcome into the pit area on Saturday nights. Just tell them who you are; you'll be let in." And so we got acquainted, were invited over for supper, and rode his snowmobiles together. Amazingly, Joe did come to a few special services and our friendship grew but only by inches. His in-crowd was rough, hard living and gospel hardened. The church's in-crowd was itself. Though I loved Joe, nobody, including me, knew exactly what to do to connect the church world with the pagan culture. So what did I learn that may help you?

First, get permission from Joe to know Joe. Reaching people with little or no church background is very slow and very messy; church is not their interest. But God will open some door somewhere whereby we may develop a friendship based on respect. "Friendship 101" is a class every Christian must attend. Pastors can do a lot, but it takes strong and loving lay people to anchor potential disciples into a community of faith. I learned that Joe was a lot more open to being included than we were to include him!

Second, key lay leaders must disciple Joe. Unless that happens, Joe will not survive life in a local church. His world and ours are too dramatically different. Laypeople heart-deep in all things Nazarene must take new people under their wings and coach them in their spiritual journey. Small groups, prayer cells, one-on-one discipling – whatever works for you must be cultivated. Not everybody is ready to be disciplined. Love them anyway and spend your energy on those ready for accountability. Healthy churches have a simple process for making disciples whether classes, small-groups, or individual contact. Our church guys did not reach out to Joe, so when we moved Joe lost all connection with the church. Their opinion was prophetic for the church: "You're wasting your time with Joe."

Third, Joe had room in his heart for God. About a year ago we passed through town and met Joe's daughter. She remembered us and later wrote, "Looking back...it was a very brief moment in time with a huge impact on both our families. I do believe that Dad had as much respect for Jim as Jim did for Dad. That is the only time in my life that I remember dad interacting with a pastor. You really did touch his life." It is easy to misread Joe and easier still to dismiss him. But is it not better to try and fail than not to try at all? Joe of the hard heart was really Joe of the open heart. So who will be Jesus to him? Who will go to the unsavory place? The women at the Cabaret, harassed by private fear and dread, the rowdy crowd at the race track chasing and being chased by a thousand devils and the helpless children who have no way to church – Jesus is passionate about their souls. She said, "It was a very brief moment in time." He said, "As long as it is day we must do the work of him who sent me. Night is coming when no one can work." That is a vision worth sharing.

2. District Missionary

Members and friends of the District Assembly, it is a joy to present to you my third report as District Missionary. Let me begin by thanking my partners in leadership: thanks to Dr. Spruce and those who have served on the Mission Strategy Team this year: Philip Alvord, Kevin Donoho, Allen Ebbler, Randy Miller, Greg Breeden, Jerry Gravatt, Bruce McEwen, Timothy Mondy, and Bob Turner. You have served so faithfully this year! Thanks also to our NewStart pastors, who serve on the frontline of our mission: Bill Brandon, Highland; Gary Clark, Marion Oasis Community; Wayne Clevenger, Urbana Lighthouse; Jerry Gravatt, and his recent successors, Nick Briggs and Lila Chapman, at Vandalia.

Our District continues to show their support for our mission. The Mission Strategy Team has distributed over \$21,000 in grants this year. With those grants we provided assessments, ministry materials, property improvements, and pastoral support for NewStart pastors. We also funded Church Assessments and Church Health Surveys for several of our Refocusing churches.

We sponsored and enjoyed two District Team Days this year. The first, in February, was held at Decatur First Church, and the second, in March, at Salem Grace. Approximately 220 attended the Decatur event and 100 attended at Salem. That means over 300 pastors and leaders received encouragement, training, and support in these events. Thanks to Pastor Tim Crump and Kevin Donoho and to our host churches for making these venues available. And to all our presenters who provided such excellent workshops. Thanks to Allen Ebbler, our pastor at Pana, and Lara Mondy from Centralia, who did most of the work and planning this year. These events continue to be an annual highlight on our District.

I have personally worked with eleven churches this year making ReFocus presentations and coaching with their pastors. We have worked with New Church Specialties and her representatives to provide training opportunities for our pastors and leaders: the Organic Church workshop last fall with Darrell McLearn and our on-site New Church University with Lonnie Bullock and Tim Gates this past Spring. Each brought challenging information and inspiration to our pastors and leaders. Seeds for church health and discipleship were planted that will no doubt bear fruit in the years to come.

I worked with the PALCON planning committee to put together a day of training for bivocational pastors this year. There we met and heard Dr. Dennis Bickers who we will be hosting here in September (11th) for our own seminar on small church health and bivocational ministry. We also plan to have another training opportunity in the Spring.

The future finds us continuing to work toward a ReStart at Granite City with the hopes of replanting a missional church in that area. We continue to pray about a NewStart in Effingham, where we envision a new congregation launched as a cooperative effort between several surrounding churches. We are seeking a church planter who will help us.

Would you join us in praying for the Lord to send laborers into this harvest field?

New funding is in place this year to support church planters. In order to help us in cultivating church planters among us, we will be working with the Exponential Church Planting Network to provide materials for our pastors and churches in the hopes of awakening those in our congregations whom Christ may be calling.

Our stated goals remain: That every church should take the church health survey, develop a written church action plan, and target new communities for NewStarts. Our pastors also need to be involved in a coaching relationship to provide accountability and encouragement.

Finally, and primarily, I am trusting God to do a new work in our District. That work is nothing that I can accomplish on my own, but indeed is something that must first begin in my own heart and in my own church at Casey. I am leading our own ReFocusing effort there and learning firsthand how God revives a church around a new vision. I am praying for our pastors and churches across our District to do the same.

Each of us has a responsibility, pastors and leaders alike to become Christ focused and mission driven. The one place that we can begin is in our own hearts. Your own renewal is the key to your church's renewal, and your church's renewal is the key to our District's renewal. Let us draw near to God, in the hopes that he will draw near to us, and fulfill His mission through: ***To develop healthy, multiplying, holiness churches and pastors with a new passion, for new people, and a new Illinois!***

3. District NMI President

Delegates, Council Members, Zone Leaders, Dr. Spruce, Martha Bean, Pastors, honored guests and friends. This is my fourth such address to the Illinois District NMI Convention and this comes at a time when we are at a historic crossroads in our world, our country, our communities, in our District, in our Churches, in our ministries and our personal walk with our Lord. Our theme this year is "To make Christlike Disciples in our Judea - in our neighborhood, city and county." Have you been doing this? Has the Illinois District been doing this? I cannot answer for you, but I can answer for myself and I can answer for the Illinois District. Yes! A resounding yes! Everything is changing and we too must change. We have been doing that. This Convention is evidence of that. Last year, we had a great Convention at Nazarene Acres. Our last year there. This is a classic example of the Church building is not the Church. It is the body of believers. Though we are conducting this Convention at a different location, our resolve to make Christlike Disciples has not diminished. Though our location has changed, our spirits are still high.

Have you noticed a lot of things are different? We did not have a Nazarene Publishing House representative to assist us this year with personal service. I was given instructions on how to conduct business without an NPH representative on site, provided excellent video resources and encouraged to march forward. I did not like the idea. I do not like not having the book store available for the latest additional resources. There is always two sides. On the other side, NPH is saving over one million dollars nation wide by not sending the representatives out. Wow! Think about the amount of ministry that can be done with one million dollars. I recall being at a District Assembly in Jimma, Ethiopia in October of 2008. I don't recall an NPH representative there. I do recall observing very appreciative Pastor's receiving books from the "Books for Pastor's" program. In fact, I recall being in an extremely packed room that was very hot. No air conditioning. In fact, it was night time and for most of the service, we did not have any electricity. It did come back on near the end. I saw Dr. Jerry Porter, at this District's first Assembly, divide the District into three Districts because of their growth. We need to use the kind of thinking NPH is using as we continue to minister within a declining economy. Using this kind of thinking, in the coming year, the NMI is going to be trying to cut costs down in many different ways. One is we are intending to conduct more meetings by video and telephone conferences. We have reduced the size of the Council through attrition. Your NMI Council is looking at the way we

conduct Zone Rally's and are considering ways to streamline them with including the possibility of combining more than one Zone for Rally's. Your ideas are welcome.

Speaking of Rally's, our Fall Rally was October 4 through the 15th with Rev. Chuck Lockard who is serving with his wife, Anna Marie, in South Africa. The Rally was well received as Chuck told us of the struggles and victories in that part of the world. One story that sticks in my mind is of a new believer being called to preach. He would not yield to the calling. One day, working on a roof, he was struck by lightning and blown off the roof. While recuperating in the hospital, he told the Lord he would accept his call to preach. Does God need to hit you with lightening to get you to listen to Him?

Our Spring Rally was with Jon & Mary Lou Kroeze April 13 through the 26th. Another great, well received Rally. Jon and Mary Lou told us of going to Rwanda right after the genocide with their family to start attempting to organize churches. They reported they did not encounter anyone who did not lose loved ones in the terrible genocide where several hundred thousand people were killed in just a few days, mostly with hand tools and clubs. When they left, over seventy-five churches were organized and they were able to report witnessing a nation that was making great strides towards healing. They then told us how they "suffered" on the island of Reunion. Reunion is near Madagascar and is considered to be the French Hawaii. Quite a change from their living conditions in Rwanda. Jon spoke to us from Esther 4:12-17. The question is found in verse 14 when Mordecai is asking Esther to approach the King which could cost her life. "For if you remain silent at this time, relief and deliverance for the Jews will arise from another place, but you and your father's family will perish. And who knows but that you have come to a royal position for such a time as this?"(NIV). Is God asking you to do something that is not in your comfort zone or that could "upset your applecart?" Only you can answer that.

This has been a difficult year, but a very good year. Though encountering many difficulties, I am surrounded by a group of people that not only assist me, but hold me up in prayer. My biggest supporter and assistant is my precious wife, Debbie. She not only exemplifies what a Christian woman should be, she has the heart of a missionary. I have shared with you before that I am following in the footsteps of some very capable and better qualified District Presidents than me. I have served on the Council with Sister Whittington, who not only loves the Lord, but lives and breathes missions. She called me just a few days ago to tell me she is praying for me, the Illinois District and this Convention. I told my wife, that phone call alone came at a time when I am trying to get everything pulled together for this Convention (pulling my hair out) and it lifted my spirits, letting me know that the Lord is in control and everything will be alright. Other District President's I have served under are Dr. Barbara Sheets and Rev. Carol Techau. What great examples they have been for me. Sir Isaac Newton, famed 17th century physicist and committed Christian credits his success to other "giants" that went before him. He stated, "If I have seen a little farther, it is by standing on the shoulders of giants." Newton then became a "giant" on whose shoulders later scientists stood on even in the conquest of flight to outer space. We are where we are today by standing on the shoulders of those that came before us. We too, must do the best we can do so that those who come after us can go on to bigger, better and more effective ministry than we have.

The Council I serve with is a great bunch of people that have been very supportive and understanding. Pam Stevens is our Vice President and she is always willing to help. She is going to assume the responsibilities of the Work & Witness Coordinator on the Council besides her other duties. Why do we need a different Work & Witness Coordinator? Our Coordinator for the past several years has been Mary Lou Reeder. Mary Lou is retiring off the Council after forty continuous years of service. We have one Council member that is a High School student and that is Andy Breeden. He has graduated high school and will be starting Olivet this fall. I was not on the Council forty years ago but I am not aware of anyone younger than Andy on the Illinois District Council in the past, but Mary Lou must have been. She had to be in pre-school when she started on the Council. Thank you Mary Lou for your faithful years of service and for the great job you have done as our

W&W Coordinator. Mary Lou is not totally off the hook. She is remaining the Zone Leader for the Olivet Zone. When you have missions in your blood, you can't get it out. Judi Roarick is our faithful secretary and she always does a wonderful job and keeps me in line when I think too far outside the box. Our Treasurer is Bill Shotts. He is assisted by his son Chris and one of them is always available when I need assistance. Norma Shotts is our LINKS coordinator. She always does a fantastic job. This is evident when I have traveled around and met present and former Illinois District LINKS missionaries. When they find out I am from the Illinois District, they are always quick to tell me that the Illinois District is the best in taking care of them. Of course, you the delegation, get credit for that, but it is Norma that keeps the information in front of us. Sandy Stickler has done a great job as our Deputation Coordinator. This is a hard assignment and she does it willingly and without complaint. Our Mission Call Coordinator is Cindy Frye. She loves these young people and has a burden for their souls. Our Children & Youth Coordinator is Abby Heppe. Who loves kids more than Abby? She always puts things out in an interesting way, has a sense of humor and you never know what is going to happen next when Abby is around. Becky Lonberger and Carlette Wankel are two of my "go to" people when I need something done. Innovative ideas and a spirit to help and work. Debbie Turner, Stu Leach, Delores Barker, Jackie Harris and Barbara Marshel are Zone Leaders I have not previously mentioned that always step up to the plate and get the job done. Thank you all for the faithful work you have done and are doing. We are very fortunate to have Dr. Jim Spruce at this time as our District Superintendent. He is a calm hand on the tiller as we try to sail this ship through turbulent waters. He is always available to me when needed. Someone who is instrumental in me getting this job done is the District Administrative Assistant Rev. Douglas Haynes. Thank you all so much for what you do for the Lord and how you have personally helped me be able to function as the Illinois District President. I also receive assistance, when needed from the very competent NMI staff at Headquarters in Lenexa. Our General Council Representative, Martha Bean is always giving words of encouragement and willing to help when needed.

Worldwide, Churches raised 45.9 million for WEF during the 2009 fiscal year. This is a decrease of \$2,723,353 or a -5.60% compared to 2008. How did we do? In 2008-2009 Assembly year, the Illinois District was requested to raise \$672,496. Of that amount, we raised \$605,251.75 which put us at 90%. For the 2009-2010 year, we were requested to raise \$696,830. As of just before Convention, we have raised \$615,600.15. That puts us at 88.34%. We are down 1.66% of hitting 90%, which is what we hit last year. It is my intent to put to the Council that if we do not hit the 90% that we make up the difference from NMI funds. We must hit 90% to be able to send Work & Witness Teams. Think about these figures for a minute. Illinois is one of the hardest hit states in this economic downturn. Our unemployment rate is over 11%. We have raised for WEF \$10,348.40 more than we did last year. WEF is down 5.6% from the previous year, yet we raised more for WEF this year than we did last year. Illinois District! You have your priorities straight. I commend you. WEF is the life blood of the NMI. It allows our Missionaries to be on the field in 156 world areas. The latest being Mali in the Africa Region. Approved Specials, the Illinois District gave \$184,160.32. Total 10% giving was \$799,760.47. Our LINKS assignment was \$900.00. The Illinois district gave \$2,184.35. Thank you Illinois District. Thanks again to the diligent work done by our LINKS coordinator Norma Shotts. She continually provides us with the information we need and the encouragement and guidance for us to stay abreast of our LINKS assignments. The Illinois District gave \$40,990.05 to Alabaster. \$7,058.41 was raised for World Mission Broadcast. \$94,313.33 was raised for Compassionate Ministries. Fourteen Distinguished Service Awards were given on this District. Forty Illinois District Churches received the Mission Priority One award this year and fifty-three churches qualified for the World Evangelism Church of Excellence Award.

I was fortunate to be allowed to attend the District Leadership Conference held in Louisville, KY, January 2010. Great training and inspirational messages. One of the speakers was the Regional Director of the United States/Canada Region Dr. Bob Broadbooks. Bob told us:

Kingdom people don't live it up - they lay it down

Kingdom people don't lay it up - they lay it down

Kingdom people are not in a constant path of seeking pleasures and earthly happiness. We are laying down our lives in sacrificial surrender to the Lord. Non Kingdom people sit back, live it up and die in place.

Kingdom people don't die in place - they press forward

Joshua 1:6 Be strong and courageous, because you will lead these people to inherit the land I swore to their forefathers to give to them. NIV

If the NMI is going to be effective, it needs a fresh vision, continuity, flexibility and change. Vision weaves four essential things in our lives: passion, motivation, direction and purpose.

1 Chronicles 28:20, David said to Solomon his son, "Be strong and courageous, and do the work. Do not be afraid or discouraged for the Lord God, my God, is with you. He will not fail you or forsake you until all the work for the service of the temple of the Lord is finished."

Be proactive, not passive. Remain focused. Focus on your potential, not your limitations. Be bold and uphold high moral standards and integrity.

Greetings in the name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, I am pleased to be sharing my second report with you as District President.

I want to thank our GREAT District NYI Council (**stand**). Thank you all for bearing with me this past year. Thank you for your support, your friendship and your ministry to students.

I want to thank our District Superintendent, Dr. Spruce for his friendship, for his involvement with the District NYI and for his guidance and counsel.

Thank you all of you - who pour yourselves into students all year long – I feel honored to share in this ministry with you.

I do not do well in writing the “typical” President’s report – I have tried each of the past 2 years to write a “typical” report and have failed. If you like “typical” reports I apologize. This will not be one.

While we have had **DCL**, **RCL**, a new ministry event called **Radiate**. We are about to attend our very first camp at Camp **Fun in the Son**. We currently have 190 Students and sponsors registered. A few weeks after that, during District Assembly and Family Week, we will be involved in another new ministry called “**Illuminate**”.

This morning I would rather speak a few words of encouragement. Do any of you like puzzles? I do, I happen to think puzzles are very therapeutic, a great way to relieve stress.

Well this morning I want to use a couple of puzzle pieces as an illustration. The first puzzle piece I have is for you Youth workers (full-time, part-time, no-time, etc.). Youth Ministry can be a thankless task at times. It can be discouraging to see students who you have poured so much into – simply choose to walk away from their faith and from the church. And this morning I want to speak words of encouragement to you. I have a hunch that there are some of you this morning who are on the verge of giving up. You are convinced that what you are doing is NOT making any kind of difference. This morning I want to speak to you.

As I said, I like to do puzzles. My strategy is always to start on the outside (the border) find those pieces and then put them together. Then I will go through the “middle” pieces and try to group them together. Then I start trying to find where they fit with in the “greater picture” of the puzzle.

The problem is – Youth Ministry (other ministries also) are not so concrete, not so tangible. One of the things I like about puzzles is that 1) you can monitor the progress, see it come together and 2) there is a final result. Something that you can look at, touch, see the FINISHED PRODUCT.

Ministry is MUCH different. Ministry is often best illustrated not by the final product but the process – the middle of the puzzle. Make no mistake about it – THIS CAN BE VERY FRUSTRATING.

Often when we look at Youth Ministry – we see the undefined edges of students. We see that while there is definitely something there (colors, part of a greater picture) – it is too abstract, too minute, too garbled to figure it out.

This morning I want to encourage you to stay involved, to stay committed to the students God has entrusted you with.

Phillipians 1:4-6 reads: “In all my prayers for all of you, I always pray with joy because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now, being confident of this, that he who began a good work in you (**your students**) will carry it on to completion until the day of

Christ Jesus."

Youth Worker – YOU ARE MAKING A DIFFERENCE! You are a CHAMPION for Christ. Do not believe for one second that **what** you do is not important. Do not believe the lie that comes straight from hell that says it is not worth it! God sees your passion, God sees your pain and frustration and our savior Jesus Christ intercedes to the father on our behalf. The task before you is difficult – but it is also CRUCIAL. My brother/sister FIGHT THE GOOD FIGHT. When discouragement comes turn to God and His Holy Word – and The Holy Spirit will bring you comfort and encouragement. Be real, Be loving and in the end – YOU WILL SEE the beautiful picture that God is putting together.

The **second** puzzle piece is for you students. Again, you may look at the puzzle piece that is your life and perhaps you are questioning where and how does it fit. Or perhaps you are even questioning if it even belongs in this puzzle.

I want to share a few words with you as well. I want to remind you that even if you cannot see how your life fits in the greater picture of God's kingdom – it does. Jer 29:11 says "**For I know the plans I have for you," declares the LORD, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future."**

God has a purpose for YOUR life. Each and every one of you matter to God. He loves you – regardless of your past, regardless of your failures, regardless of your present. God loves you. And He is there – trying to orchestrate that ABSOLUTE BEST LIFE for YOU. But YOU must allow Him to do that. You must be as soft clay in His hands.

You may not have any idea what God has in store for you, you may not have ANY clue what you are going to do with your life. Perhaps that is YOUR frustration. My challenge to you this morning is to continually be drawn into His presence – IT IS THERE that God will help you make sense of it all.

Perspective: Our pastor told of a time when he went on a Hot-air balloon ride. He said as he rose up the world took on a completely different look. He could see what was happening several blocks away. Instead of just hearing sirens, he could see the fire truck and the fire that it was heading toward. He said "A little perspective makes all the difference".

We may not have the perspective to see how all the pieces fit and how they will come together to make a beautiful picture - BUT God never asks us to, make sense of it all – to figure it out, instead He asks us to TRUST Him – for He is the one with all the perspective! I want to encourage you all – to place your trust in Him.

5. Administrative Associate

It continues to be a blessing to be able to work with Dr. Jim Spruce and learn from him.

The privilege has been mine to work with Rev. Mark Copley, District Missionary, the District Advisory Board, various other district boards and committees along with local churches as the opportunity has been afforded to me.

Nina and I thank you for allowing us to be a part of the administrative team that serves this great district.

This is my sixth report to you as your Administrative Associate, and my 37th year as a minister of which 29 of those have been on the Illinois District.

I preach quite often concerning Martha and the indictment that is made about her in Luke 10:40 that she was distracted. Every time I read that scripture I ask God to examine my life to see if the legitimate things of life are distracting me from doing the most important and keeping first things first. In the day we live in it is easy to become distracted doing legitimate "church" things and lose sight of the most important.

It reminds me of the following story **The Lifesaving Station** by Theodore Wedel.

"On a dangerous seacoast where shipwrecks often occur, there was once a crude little lifesaving station. The building was no more than a hut, and there was only one boat; but the few devoted members kept a constant watch over the sea. With no thought for themselves, they went out day and night, tirelessly searching for the lost. Some of those who were saved, and various others in the surrounding area, wanted to be associated with the station and give their time, money, and effort to support the work. New boats were bought and new crews trained. The little lifesaving station grew.

Some of these new members of the lifesaving station were unhappy that the building was so crude and poorly equipped. They felt that a more comfortable place should be provided as the first refuge of those who were saved from the sea. They replaced the emergency cots with beds and put better furniture in the enlarged building. Now the lifesaving station became a popular gathering place for its members, and they decorated it beautifully and furnished it exquisitely because they used it as sort of a club. Fewer members were not interested in going to sea on lifesaving missions, so they hired lifeboat crews to do this work. The lifesaving motif still prevailed in this club's decoration, and there was a memorial lifeboat in the room where the club initiations were held.

About this time a large ship was wrecked off the coast, and the hired crews brought in boatloads of cold, wet, half-drowned people. They were dirty and sick, and some of them were foreigners. The beautiful new club was in chaos. Immediately, the property committee hired someone to rig up a shower house outside the club, where victims of shipwrecks could be cleaned up before coming inside.

At the next meeting, there was a split in the club membership. Most of the members wanted to stop the club's lifesaving activities because they felt they were unpleasant and a hindrance to the normal social life of the club. A small number of members insisted upon lifesaving as their primary purpose and pointed out that they were still called a lifesaving station. The small group's members were voted down and told that if they wanted to save lives, they could begin their own lifesaving station down the coast.

They did and as the years went by, however, the new station experienced the same changes that had occurred in the old station. It evolved into a club, and yet another lifesaving station was founded. History continued to repeat itself, and if you visit that seacoast today, you will find a number of exclusive clubs along that shore.

Shipwrecks are frequent in those waters, but most of the passengers drown."

As Disciples of Jesus, our primary task is to go and make disciples. **"18** Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. **19** Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, **20** and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."" Matt 28:18-20 (NIV) To put it another way, we are to go and save lives. Unfortunately, we sometimes lose sight of our purpose and get distracted. We need to recover our passion for lifesaving. We need to be doers of the Word and not hearers only. **"22** Do not merely listen to the word, and so deceive yourselves. Do what it says." James 1:22 (NIV)

Let's not become distracted but keep the first things first and our eyes upon Jesus as we go about making disciples.

The board granted retired status to: Elders - Ronald L. Baker and Ruth Carroll Yates.

The board recommended the renewal of the following District Ministers' Licenses:

The board voted to cover the cost of the mortgage, insurance, utilities and maintenance of the facility at Granite City Crossroads.

The board voted to allow Pastor Denis Payne extended time in the parsonage at Granite City Crossroads.

The board voted to assure a prospective pastor at Granite City Crossroads a weekly salary of \$450 for a period of one year (supplemented as needed by the district).

The board voted to cover registration costs for former District Superintendents Hancock and Dace (and spouses) to attend the retired superintendents' retreat.

The board authorized Treasurer Bill Shotts to transfer district checking account funds of \$200,000 to a CD.

The board voted to approve the NYI Council's proposal for a 10% budget incentive.

4. Mission Strategy Team

Members and friends of the assembly, it is my privilege to present to you my third report as chairman of the District Mission Strategy Team. The Mission Strategy Team this year included the following members: Dr. James R. Spruce (chairman, ex-officio); Mark Copley, District Missionary; Philip Alvord, Kevin Donoho, Allen Ebbler, Randy Miller, Greg Breeden, Jerry Gravatt, Bruce McEwen, Timothy Mondy, Bob Turner. We want to especially acknowledge the frontline work of our NewStart pastors and their sponsoring congregations: Jerry Gravatt (Vandalia – sponsored by Pana, and supported by Shelbyville); Wayne Clevenger (Urbana Lighthouse – supported by Ogden); Gary Clark (Marion-Harrisburg Oasis Community); and Bill Brandon (Highland).

The Mission Strategy Team distributed over \$21,000 in grants this year. With those grants we provided assessment, coaching, ministry materials, property improvements, and pastoral support to our NewStart churches. We also funded Church Assessments and

Church Health Surveys. And, we paid for every willing pastor and his leaders to attend New Church University. Nearly thirty did so.

This year, the Mission Strategy Team planned and presented two Team Days. The first, in February, was held at Decatur First Church, and the second, in March, at Salem Grace. Approximately 220 attended the Decatur event and 100 attended at Salem. That means 320 pastors and laypeople received encouragement, training, and support in these two events. Thanks to Pastor Crump and Donoho and to our host churches for making these venues available, and to all our presenters who provided such excellent workshops. Thanks to MST member Allen Ebber, and Laura Mondy, pastor's wife at Centralia who did much of the work of planning this year. We hope that many churches will attend these events again this year.

Our shared vision includes: new church plants, reaching various people groups, stronger zone leadership and cooperation, and using new methods and means to reach new people. These aims are in line with our goals, listed here, which remain unchanged:

- 1. The churches of the Illinois District shall have a written strategic plan for reaching the lost and church growth.**
- 2. The pastors of the Illinois District shall be involved in a coaching movement and maintain coaching relationships.**
- 3. The churches of the Illinois District shall strive for church health using the church health survey and the Natural Church Development process (or the Nazarene Missional Church Survey).**
- 4. The churches of the Illinois District shall have a clearly stated target area and plan for involvement in a NewStart project.**

Our proposed budget reflects this vision with increased funding for church planters, NewStarts and ReFocusing churches.

Much thanks to all of those who have served on the Mission Strategy Team this year. Together, we are stewards of the mission of our district: **To develop healthy, multiplying, holiness churches and pastors.** Our vision for a new passion, for a new people, and a new Illinois remains to be seen. Let's pursue it together in Christ!

DISTRICT MISSION STRATEGY TEAM

C. ASSEMBLY COMMITTEES

1. Finance Committee

We, your Finance Committee, recommend the following:

1. In accordance with the General Church of the Nazarene Global Ministry Center that all budget payments be based on Church Income. Church Income (Qualified Income for Illinois District purposes) is defined as all income eligible under IRS guidelines for a tax deduction, reduced by payments made to the World Evangelism Fund, payments made for approved 10% specials, deductions for rare circumstances, phase in adjustments, and any other deduction allowed by the General Church of the Nazarene Global Ministry Center.
2. That the Illinois District Budget be a unified budget with a single budget payment to include district administration and operations, NMI, NYI, and SDMI. All budget payments to be allocated to each department based on their pro-rata portion of budget receipts. Budget payments should be sent to William E. Shotts unified district treasurer.

3. That the World Evangelism Fund be 5.5 percent of Church Income, Pensions and Benefits Fund be 2 percent, the Olivet Nazarene University Fund be 2.5 percent, and the Unified District Fund be 5.58 percent.
4. That every church endeavor to be 10 percent for world missions as based on an amount equal to or greater than 10% of Church Income, less amount paid for World Evangelism Fund and approved specials (missions giving).
5. That the Unified District Funds be allocated as follows:

Unified District	85.85%
NMI	5.56%
NYI	4.84%
SDMI	3.75%
6. That all Funds (World Evangelism, Unified District, Olivet Nazarene University, and Pensions and Benefits) be calculated and paid weekly beginning in May.
7. That only churches which have paid in full the Unified District Fund, the Olivet Nazarene University Fund, the Pensions and Benefits Fund, and the World Evangelism Fund, be permitted to report all funds paid in full.
8. That no congregation be granted permission to go in debt for any building or improvement program, or the hiring of any staff or assistants, until it has shown the ability to pay all of its obligations, including funds paid in full for two years preceding the request, debt under consideration and/or the additional salary, and that the amount of the indebtedness and terms of payment not jeopardize the spiritual life of the church. Exceptions may be granted by the District Superintendent only with the unanimous approval of the District Advisory Board. (*Manual*, par. 235.4)
9. That every church prepare and adopt an annual operating budget for the church in accordance with (*Manual*, par. 129.6 & 129.7). Should assistance be requested for the preparation of a budget, the district will be happy to provide such assistance to the church.
10. That every church adopt a written "Designated Gift Policy". Should assistance be requested for the preparation of a designated gift policy, the district will be happy to provide such assistance to the church.
11. That **October 3, 2010**, be designated as Nazarene Bible College Sunday in our local churches and that a special offering be received and forwarded to the Bible College immediately.
12. That **December 5, 2010**, be designated as American Bible Society Sunday in our local churches, and that an offering be received and sent to the General Treasurer in Kansas City immediately.
13. That **January 16, 2011**, be designated as Nazarene Theological Seminary Sunday in our local churches, and that an offering be received and sent to the Seminary in Kansas City immediately.

14. That **April 24, 2011**, be designated as Olivet Nazarene University Sunday in our local churches, and that an offering be received and sent to our District Treasurer for Olivet.
15. That the salary of the district superintendent be **\$55,156.50** annually, plus **\$9,000.00** annually be invested for him in a tax-sheltered annuity, and **\$3,000.00** annually for reimbursable expenses and that he be given five weeks vacation with pay at a time convenient for him.
16. That the salary of the Administrative Assistant be **\$37,199.75** annually, plus **\$3,000.00** annually be invested for him in a tax-sheltered annuity, and **\$13,400.30** annually for housing allowance, and **\$3,000.00** annually for reimbursable expenses and that he be given vacation in accordance with *Ministerial Staff Support* guidelines for the pastor with pay at a time convenient for him.
17. That the District advisory Board be authorized to provide a district-owned vehicle, plus travel and expenses, for the district superintendent.
18. That the District advisory Board be authorized to provide travel and expenses, for the administrative assistant.
19. That the district boards' committees', and councils' travel reimbursement be at the current IRS rate and that **actual meals and lodging expenses** away from home be **reimbursed**. These expenses to be paid from appropriate operating fund.
20. That the honorarium for the district secretary be **\$3,893.40** per year, and that expenses for clerical help be allowed.
21. That the professional fees to be paid for accounting and bookkeeping services for the district including the medical fund be **\$35,000.00** per year.
22. That a recommended rate of \$8.25 per hour be paid for temporary secretarial services provided for district departments such as Board of Ministerial Studies, School of Ministry and any other services required during the year.
23. That the local churches pay the health insurance plan for pastors and dependents, and for associate pastors and dependents; and that the district pay \$2,000 per year for the cost of the health plan premium for full-time commissioned evangelists and their families, and that the local church (where evangelist holds membership) pay the balance of the premium.
24. That our people be encouraged in the stewardship of possessions as related to wills, annuities, and the life loans for the local church, district home missions, world missions, our colleges and seminary. That the Department of Stewardship regional representative, Rev. Larry Hindmand, 9625 Mason, Oak Lawn, IL 60453 (708-857-4770) be contracted by local churches for counseling service in life income wills and bequests.

25. That the local church boards strictly adhere to the provisions of the Manual, Pars. 129.21, 129.22, 129.23, concerning the counting and the accounting for all monies received and disbursed, and an annual audit of the financial records.
26. That each local church treasurer use printed forms for reporting all monies received and disbursed each month, and that the pastor and church board be provided a copy or copies of the monthly treasurer's report (Manual, par. 135.4).
27. WHERE TO SEND MONIES:

7. Christian Cultural Engagement

A. WHEREAS, in times when our culture desperately needs the Church to be a living example of Christ-like holiness and love, we strongly urge:

1. All our sisters and brothers in Christ to remember that we are called to be the Body of Christ in our world being empowered by the Holy Spirit to the glory of God the Father. As a result, we urge our brothers and sisters to remember the importance of corporate Christian worship and the practice of spiritual disciplines within the family and individually, believing that these are important ways by which the Holy Spirit shapes us into a holy people.
2. That pastors, evangelists, and leaders live and teach the scriptural doctrines of the new birth and entire sanctification, believing that the Holy Spirit bears witness to both works of grace through the infilling of His Spirit, and that the one biblical evidence of the latter is the cleansing of the heart by faith from original sin manifested by the fruit of the Spirit in Christian service: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control (Gal 5:22-24).
3. That the church manual be made available to all in the church who desire it and the Articles of Faith (Manual, Part II, para 1-22, pgs. 28-37) and the Covenant of Christian Character (Manual, Part II, Articles 27-27.3, pgs. 38-40) be read, or printed, and distributed to the church body at least once a year admonishing each Nazarene to diligently pursue a lifestyle that honors God, the church and one another.
4. That new converts be lovingly nourished and instructed in the way of holiness.
5. That all of our people, "in putting off the old to put on the new and holy way of life as well as the mind of Christ" (Eph 4:17-24), take to heart The Covenant of Christian Conduct of our church which gives guidance in areas of Christian Ethics, Entertainment, Marriage & Divorce, Abortion, Human Sexuality, Christian Stewardship, etc. (Manual, Part III, para 33-41, pgs 46-60).

B. WHEREAS, ethics and values are constantly being questioned and changed by our society, the church must strengthen itself in its commitment and conduct. Therefore,

this committee felt it vitally important to not only reaffirm our belief in Scripture and our Wesleyan guidelines, but to also provide useful information in this document to resource both laity and clergy to make the church both a beacon of hope and a model of holiness to our families, community and world. (Matthew 5:10-17; Ephesians 5:1-2,8-14; 1 Peter 1:13-17).

We encourage our people to work with and in public institutions as a means of Christ-like engagement with our culture on the local, State, National, and Global levels.

1. Each local church should strive to provide educational and equipping opportunities such as:
 - a) Special Christian Speakers & professionals,
 - b) In-service topical seminars and open forum discussions, and
 - c) Consider initiating special ministries that reach out to the needy in the congregation and community.

Our pastors, youth workers and parents should maintain an awareness of the activities and promotions of organizations within the local school system and unite in an effort to oppose activities that do not comply with New Testament moral standards. Examples of civic organizations to offer aid and service to:
 - a) Pregnancy Resource Centers
 - b) Homeless Shelters
 - c) Habitat for Humanity
 - d) Credible Christian Counseling Centers
 - e) Food & Clothing Pantries
 - f) Nursing Homes; Senior Adult Organizations
 - g) Appropriate Parent/Teacher Organizations

We urge church leaders to make available the names and addresses of government officials and stress the importance of voting in local, state and national elections to ensure that issues pertaining to the biblical ideals of faith, family, and social justice are addressed. We encourage the above while being simultaneously mindful that our commitment to Christ our Lord must always be far greater than our commitment to any political party, agenda, or association.

8. Church Growth

We, your Committee on Church Growth, make the following recommendations to the district assembly for consideration:

Commission

We recommend that every church emphasize the Great Commission (Matthew 28:16-20) in every facet of their ministry. We are reminded that the Bible should always be our main source and that the Great Commission remains as our primary motivation for church growth.

Prayer

Remember that prayer should be the foundation for all church growth, and that without prayer, little of lasting value will be accomplished. We also recommend that the church provide opportunities for concentrated prayer and fasting during the church year.

Mission/Vision/Purpose

We encourage every church to develop a mission statement, a vision statement, and a clear statement of purpose. These three key elements will ensure that we stay focused on God's plan for the local church. There are numerous books and other resources available to assist the church with this task. Any church needing assistance should contact the district superintendent and/or the district missionary.

Responsibility List

That every church maintain an accurate, up-to-date list that includes the name, current address, and telephone number for every person on their responsibility list. This will allow for better, more consistent follow-up and accountability.

Calling

That absentees be contacted through a regular, systematic approach. This is not solely the responsibility of the pastor, but should be a shared ministry within the church among the laity.

Discipleship

Emphasis should be given not only to evangelism, but also the discipleship. The new Christian should be encouraged to seek the experience of Heart Holiness which leads to a growing and productive Christian as a way to fulfill the Great Commission (Matthew 28:20).

Lay Ministry

We encourage our churches to develop a partnership between the pastor and the laity, which provides for every member to be involved in church ministry (discipleship/ evangelism).

Education

That pastors and laymen take full advantage of educational and CEU opportunities, including seminars, workshops, videos, books, and especially the quality CLT programs that our denomination offers.

Evangelism

That new and innovative methods of outreach and evangelism be explored. Consider how the resources of the local church, human and financial, can be utilized most effectively to see souls saved.

New-Start / Restart

We believe every church on the Illinois District can and should become involved in prayer, creating or supporting new church starts. Churches can provide funding and or personal involvement of the local church body in calling, canvassing, etc.

Refocus

That churches be encouraged to be involved in determining their church life cycle and whether or not they need to enter into a refocusing process such as the New Church Specialties. Contact the district missionary for more information.

Personal Evangelism

It is the privilege and duty of every Christian to share their faith with others. We encourage all churches to provide specialized training for various types of personal evangelism. Personal responsibility for evangelism should be emphasized.

Revivals

We encourage our churches to give top priority to annual revival campaigns. We strongly urge the use of full-time evangelists in the Church of the Nazarene. We also encourage the use of all media possibilities (TV, radio, etc.) to potentially reach as many as possible with the gospel.

Servant Evangelism

That methods of servant evangelism be employed in churches of all sizes and in all areas. Jesus Himself came to serve and to give, not to be served or become successful. Let us willingly choose to follow Christ's example as we minister to others. Such acts of kindness can serve to bridge the gap between the church and the world.

Finances

Set aside a portion of the annual church budget for purposes of outreach and evangelism. The Bible says, "Where your treasure is, there your heart will be also."

Evangelism Committee

We encourage each church to review and implement the guidelines for a local Evangelism Committee as stated in the 2005-2009 *Manual*, pages 70-71, and section 110-110.8.

Global Church Growth Award

It should be the goal of every church to introduce each new convert into the membership of the Church of the Nazarene.

We challenge every church to establish minimum goals according to the following guidelines.

Category	Morning Worship Attendance	Number of New Nazarenes
Category 1	0-49	6 new Nazarenes
Category 2	50-79	9 new Nazarenes
Category 3	80-99	12 new Nazarenes
Category 4	100-399	The lesser of 12 percent of previous year's worship attendance or 43 new Nazarenes
Category 5	400-899	11 percent of previous years worship attendance
Category 6	900 and up	100 new Nazarenes

Churches will be grouped according to size to compensate for variation in ability. Morning worship attendance will be used to determine the size categories.

This award will be based on achievement in three areas:

1. New Nazarenes
2. Significant involvement in sponsoring a new church,
3. Payment of all budgets (including district and educational).

9. Ministerial Staff Support

We, your Committee on Ministerial Staff Support, submit the following in order to care for the welfare of our spiritual leaders and encourage their commitment to our spiritual guidance.

The district office and the Pastoral Support Committee want to assist pastors and church boards in understanding their roles in providing adequate compensation for its pastors and staffs. Support of the pastor by the church is an expression of the belief in the call of God on the life of the pastor rather than a job where monies are paid for services rendered. Adequate compensation enables a pastor to fulfill his or her calling.

Pastoral support extends beyond the compensation and benefits for the pastor and staff and includes those expenses incurred by pastoral staff which is necessary to conduct the business of the church. Each church pays a sum to a pastor's ministry, which is divided into several categories: compensation, benefits and expenses. The sum of these categories is considered the cost of ministry to the local church, not all of which is to be considered the income of the pastor.

The district Pastoral Support Committee has developed guidelines for local pastoral support committees to evaluate their commitment to the ministry of the pastor. Anyone

wanting further assistance in assessing or planning adequate compensation may contact the district office. In addition to consideration for the local pastors, churches should also establish a remuneration policy for pulpit supply, including travel expenses.

Senior Pastor

The senior pastor is the leader of the church and a leader in the local community.

Bi-vocational Pastor

A bi-vocational pastor supplements income by means other than church compensation. Churches should view the circumstances that cause the pastor to supplement income as a temporary situation to be resolved as soon as possible. The goal is to remove as many worldly concerns from the pastor as possible, so that the pastor may attend more intently on his or her life's calling. Recognizing that small and young churches may have difficulty in providing adequately for their pastor and family, we urge such churches to use what they are able to provide to the best advantage of their pastor and to strive toward the goal of full support.

Associate Pastor and Staff

An associate pastor is defined as a partner in ministry, on staff, whether receiving compensation or not. The church is to work toward a similar benefit package for the full-time associate as for the senior pastor (guideline to the church: an amount equal to 70 to 80 percent of the senior pastor's compensation package). Associate pastor and staff salaries should be negotiated in accordance with the recommendations of the senior pastor.

Retired Pastor

A retired pastor is a minister with retirement status. We recommend that retired pastors be employed for pulpit supply as frequently as possible. Retired pastors usually live on meager retirement benefits and may welcome the opportunity to provide for pulpit supply. Retired pastors are a source of experience and expertise that is available to the local church.

Evangelist

Often, the evangelist's only source of income is from meetings held at various local churches. We recommend that a full-time evangelist's minimum remuneration for such a meeting be an amount equal to twice the local senior pastor's weekly cash salary for each full Sunday in the special meeting (as recommended by the Evangelism Ministries of the Division of Local Church Growth). The local senior pastor's weekly cash salary and prorated insurance and

Social Security benefits should all be included in the compensation. Additional compensation for housing and travel-related expenses should be paid in a separate check, allowing for maximum tax benefit for the evangelist.

I. For the Pastor

A. Concerning Salary:

1. That for all full-time pastors, every church provides a minimum of \$450 per week salary. By definition, salary should not be deemed to include reimbursements and cost of ministry expenses listed below in Section B, Paragraph 1. The Advisory Board is to make the distinction between full-time and bi-vocational pastors. That churches which are legitimately unable to provide for such remuneration recognize that their pastor is bi-vocational and, therefore, able and obligated to supplement his or her income. We recommend that the district superintendent or designated personnel monitor the suggested minimum weekly salary on the basis of the materials provided by the general church's worksheet and, when necessary, give strong counsel to church boards to provide the above-stated minimum salary and benefits.

2. That the church place, as an employee benefit, an amount equal to 10 percent of the ministerial staff's monthly salary in a tax-sheltered annuity each

month for his/her retirement. This is the third leg of the retirement tier recommended by the Pensions and Benefits office of the general Church of the Nazarene.

3. That the church review the ministerial staff salary at least annually and that increases reflect at least cost-of-living increases. That a letter be sent once a year from the district superintendent to the local church board secretary reminding the board of its responsibility in this area, and that a written summation of the board's action shall be returned to the district superintendent within 30 days of the local board meeting.

4. That any significant increase in the annual amount raised for all purposes by the church during a pastor's tenure be taken into consideration at the time salary and benefits are reviewed.

B. Concerning Reimbursements:

1. That the church pays reimbursements for all church-related expenses, and that among these are standard mileage reimbursement at the recommended IRS rate for personally-owned automobiles. To avoid additional financial burden on the pastor and staff during these days of rapidly increasing gasoline prices, the church board is strongly encouraged to monitor and comply with any increases the IRS may possibly make on its recommended mileage rate during the calendar year. Entertainment expenses, office supplies, continuing education expenses (books, tuition, conferences, etc.), gifts and all other reimbursable expenses deemed appropriate by the IRS should also be included.

2. Church-related expenses of pastoral staff should be qualified on the basis of material from General Headquarters, as well as the Internal Revenue Service. Every church should provide adequately to prevent financial strain to the parsonage family, and that every church provides 100 percent Social Security and full family hospitalization. That churches be allowed to maintain their present insurance program, and if churches propose a change, the change should be approved by the district superintendent and the District Advisory Board.

3. That the church provides the ministerial staff expense to all church-related functions, including the district and general assemblies. Lodging, meals and transportation shall be a part of this expense.

4. That the churches encourage and financially support its ministerial staff its ministerial staff to the general assembly.

C. Concerning Housing:

1. That the church provides housing and utilities and/or adequate housing allowance.

2. That the church equips the parsonage with a stove, refrigerator, air conditioning, washer, dryer, draperies, curtains and carpeting.

3. That a minister could request the church board to adjust his/her compensation for any year in which it is anticipated that the minister will purchase major appliances and/or furniture.

4. That the fair-rental value and the designated additional parsonage allowance should be entered into church board records at the beginning of each calendar year. When a housing allowance is established in lieu of a parsonage, a review of the allowance should be made annually regarding payment, taxes, utilities and repairs.

5. That the Board of Trustees of the local church inspect the parsonage once each year in order to continue to provide for quality living conditions. No parsonage family should be expected to live in substandard housing. This inspection should be scheduled with the pastor and spouse and be done in their presence. Any necessary changes seen at this inspection should be completed as soon as possible.

6. That the local church board makes all necessary arrangements for the ministerial staff's moving expenses.

D. Concerning the Ministerial Staff's General Emotional and Spiritual Welfare:

1. That the church continually lifts the parsonage families in prayer.

2. That the church remembers the ministerial staff's family with suitable gifts at appropriate times during the year and consider a gift of no less than one week's salary at Christmas.

3. That the church provide for vacation and time off according to the following scale (this schedule refers to total years in ministry):

- a. One year in the ministry: two weeks vacation
- b. Two to ten years in the ministry: three weeks vacation
- c. Ten to twenty years in the ministry: four weeks vacation
- d. Twenty or more years in the ministry: five weeks vacation
(District Assembly, Family Camp, ministerial retreats and seminars, and working in Teen or Children's Camps are not to be considered as part of this vacation time allowance.)

4. In order to benefit the church and the health of the pastor, the church should encourage the pastoral staff to take a minimum of one day per week for family time.

5. That the church allow the senior pastor the privilege of holding a full week revival or speaking engagement of one or more days, not to exceed seven days per year, with the church to be responsible for pulpit supply without loss of salary to the pastor.

6. That the local church offer the pastor/staff two mental health days each month to be taken at the pastor's discretion, to be used at a time when workload or individual stress is overwhelming.

7. That the local church make available to its pastor a one month sabbatical at the end of each five years of uninterrupted ministry to that same church.

II. For All Full-time Evangelists (Song and Otherwise)

A. Concerning Salary:

1. That evangelists be paid at least an amount equal to twice the pastor's salary or a minimum of \$500 for each Sunday of the meeting.

2. That, in addition, Social Security on the amount of salary be summarily paid.

3. That evangelists be notified in writing at the time the meeting is scheduled of the minimum remuneration they can expect to receive from the local church.

4. That local churches avoid canceling previously scheduled revivals.

5. That a local church canceling a revival without notifying the evangelist at least 30 days in advance be obligated to pay the minimum remuneration in full, unless the evangelist is able to reschedule the same date.

B. Concerning Reimbursements and Housing

1. That churches provide for all travel expenses, lodging and food during the meeting.

2. That local churches having full-time evangelists as members pay one-half the cost of the district hospitalization insurance.

3. That local churches having full-time evangelists as members provide for their expenses to general and district gatherings.

C. Concerning the Evangelist's General Emotional and Spiritual Welfare:

1. That finances for revivals be raised in advance of the scheduled meeting.

2. That the local church sends a Christmas gift to all evangelists who have served the church during that calendar year.

3. That local churches having full-time evangelists as members provide encouragement and support for their ministry through prayer and such tangible ways as love offerings and remembering them on their birthdays and anniversaries.

III. For Retired Ministerial Staff

A. Concerning Reimbursements:

1. That local churches having retired ministers as members provide for their expenses to general and district gatherings they wish to attend.

B. Concerning Their General Emotional and Spiritual Welfare

1. That local churches having retired ministers as members remember them often, such as at birthdays, anniversaries and Christmas, with gifts of gratitude for their years of faithful service in the Kingdom.

2. That the Illinois District gives a one-time love gift to all elders upon their retirement. We recommend a minimum of \$1,000.

We ask that each local church board secretary and pastor receive a copy of this report from the district superintendent and that the same shall be read or distributed by the church board secretary to the church board as a reminder of their responsibilities. The church board secretary shall notify the district superintendent in writing concerning the fulfillment of this policy.

District Superintendent Dr. James Spruce presented Bill Brandon for re-election as District President on a yes/no ballot for a term of two years. The ballot was received and tellers excused.

Cindy Frye shared Mission Call information, noting her personal joy in watching our young people grow up to serve the Lord.

Our Treasurer Par Excellence Bill Shotts shared his joy in God's answer to prayer for his dad, Rev. Bill Shotts, during the Sunday night service! He then efficiently presented the Financial Report. He noted a balance of \$60,302.35, (thanks to God).

The treasurer led in prayer and Suzanne Curry played "To God Be the Glory" as the offering was received.

A motion was made and seconded to accept the treasurer's report. The motion carried.

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INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Board of Directors
Illinois District Church of the Nazarene

We have audited the accompanying statement of assets, liabilities and net assets – modified cash basis of the Administration, Home Mission, Camp Ground, District Reserve, Olivet Nazarene University, Medical, Nazarene Missions International, Church New Start, Camp Meeting, Sunday School and Discipleship Ministries International and Nazarene Youth International funds of the Illinois District Church of the Nazarene as of April 30, 2010, and the related statements of support, revenue and expenses and cash flows – modified cash basis for the fiscal year then ended. These financial statements are the responsibility of the District's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

Except as explained in the following paragraphs, we conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall financial statement presentation. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.

As described in Note 1, these financial statements were prepared on a modified cash basis, which is a comprehensive basis of accounting other than generally accepted accounting principles.

As more fully described in Note 1 to the financial statements, the modified cash basis of accounting requires fixed assets be stated at cost, net of accumulated depreciation. Management has informed us that the District has stated its properties at estimated costs and appraised values versus historical costs as required by the modified cash basis of accounting. In addition, no depreciation expense has been recorded in the financial statements. The effect of this departure on the financial statements has not been determined.

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above (except for the effects of valuing fixed assets at estimated costs and appraised values) present fairly, in all material respects, the assets, liabilities, and net assets of the Administration, Home Mission, Camp Ground, District Reserve, Olivet Nazarene University, Medical, Nazarene Missions International, Church New Start, Camp Meeting, Sunday School and Discipleship Ministries International and Nazarene Youth International funds of the Illinois District Church of the Nazarene as of April 30, 2010, and its support, revenue and expenses and cash flows for the year then ended, on the basis of accounting described in Note 1.

Our audit was made for the purpose of forming an opinion on the statement of assets, liabilities and net assets – modified cash basis and the related statements of support, revenue and expenses and cash flows – modified cash basis. The accompanying supplementary information contained on pages 11 through 26 is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements. Such information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements referred to above and, in our opinion, the information is fairly presented in all material respects in relation to the financial statements taken as a whole.

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NOTE 1 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Organization

Illinois District Church of the Nazarene is a not-for-profit corporation organized under the laws of the State of Illinois. Its purpose is to provide administrative and financial assistance to the local Nazarene churches in the District. The organization is supported primarily through budget receipts from the local churches.

Description of Programs

Illinois District Church of the Nazarene offers the following programs:

- Home Missions – This program was established to assist churches in need.
- Camp Ground – This program was established to minister to various individuals and groups by providing a place for recreational activity, as well as providing a place to minister to the attendees / users.
- Olivet Nazarene University – This program was established to provide Olivet Nazarene University with assistance in the collection of budgeted funds from local churches.
- School of Ministry – This program was established to facilitate in the training of ministers.
- Medical – This program was established for the purpose of facilitating the receipt and payment of health and life insurance premiums for ministers, and to make partial reimbursements to retired ministers for their medical expenses.
- Nazarene Missions International – This program was established to provide support for Missionaries approved by the General Church of the Nazarene and to support local churches in NMI programs.
- Church New Start – This program was established to provide assistance to new church start-ups.
- Camp Meeting – This program was established to collect revenues and pay expenses for District week held annually at Nazarene Acres.
- Sunday School and Discipleship Ministries International – This program provides spiritual, recreational activities, and camps for youth participation (elementary level) and to support local churches with their Sunday School programs.
- Nazarene Youth International – This program provides spiritual, recreational activities, and trips for youth participation (junior high and senior high level) and to support local churches in their NYI programs.

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements are presented using a modified cash basis of accounting. This basis of accounting recognizes assets, liabilities, net assets, revenues, and expenses when they result from cash transactions. This basis is a comprehensive basis of accounting

other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

As a result of the use of this modified cash basis of accounting, certain assets and their related revenues (such as accounts receivable) and certain liabilities and their related expenses (such as accounts payable) *are not recorded* in these financial statements.

NOTE 1 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)

Basis of Presentation

Financial statement presentation follows the requirements of the Financial Accounting Standards Board in its Statement of Financial Accounting Standards (SFAS) No. 117, Financial Statements of Not-For-Profit Organizations. Under SFAS No. 117, the District is required to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets: unrestricted net assets, temporarily restricted net assets, and permanently restricted net assets. The District has no restricted net assets.

Property and Equipment

The District has recorded its property and equipment at appraised and estimated values, which is not in conformity with the modified cash basis of accounting. Depreciation has not been computed on fixed assets.

Income Taxes

The District is exempt from Federal income taxes under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. In addition, the District has been determined by the Internal Revenue Service not to be a private foundation within the meaning of Section 509(a) of the code.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

The District considers all highly liquid investment instruments with maturities of three months or less to be cash equivalents.

Investments

The District has adopted SFAS No. 124, "Accounting for Certain Investments Held by Not-for-Profit Associations." Under SFAS No. 124, investments in mutual funds with readily determinable fair values are reported at their fair values in the Statement of Assets, Liabilities and Net Assets – Modified Cash Basis. The District carries investments in marketable securities with readily determinable fair values in the Statement of Assets, Liabilities and Net Assets – Modified Cash Basis. Unrealized gains and losses are included in the change in net assets in the accompanying Statement of Support, Revenues and Expenses – Modified Cash Basis.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of the financial statements requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Loans Receivable and Payable and Transfers between Program Accounts

Loans between programs have a zero net effect on the Statement of Assets, Liabilities and Net Assets – Modified Cash Basis and have been eliminated. In addition, transfers between programs have a zero net effect on the Statement of Support, Revenue and Expenses – Modified Cash Basis and have been eliminated.

NOTE 2 – CONCENTRATION OF CREDIT RISK

The District maintains a material amount of its cash and cash equivalents at one financial institution. Accounts at this institution are insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC). The total cash at this institution exceeds FDIC limits. There was no excess of the FDIC limit as of April 30, 2010.

NOTE 3 – INVESTMENTS

Investments are stated at fair value and consist of mutual funds. Fair values as of April 30, 2010 are summarized as follows:

NOTE 5 – ALLOCATION OF EXPENSES BETWEEN PROGRAMS

The District has not performed a study of allocable expenses between programs. The District does not believe that a study would result in a material reallocation of the program and support services expenses as reported in the Statement of Support, Revenue and Expenses – Modified Cash Basis.

NOTE 6 – TEMPORARILY AND PERMANENTLY RESTRICTED NET ASSETS

As of April 30, 2010 the District had no temporarily or permanently restricted net assets.
