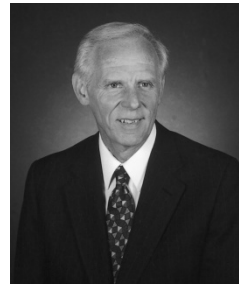

#### B. INSTRUCTIONS TO STUDENTS

##### Eligibility

The board serves only the persons who are properly enrolled. Enrollment is open only to local preachers, deacons-Christian education, deacons-compassionate ministries, deacons-music ministries, and prospective ministers of music who qualify according to the Manual, 410.

##### Courses

There are seven general courses administered by the Ministerial Studies Board; elders, deacon of administration, deacon of compassionate ministries, deacon of Christian education, deacon of music, deacon of youth, and lay minister (*Handbook of Ministerial Studies*).

Ministers, deacons and deaconesses will not be ordained without having completed their respective courses. An exception to this is provided for all commissioned song evangelists who held this status immediately prior to the 1986 assembly season. Those becoming commissioned song evangelists will complete the deacon track in music ministries. Those interested in commissioned or registered song evangelists' credentials should study carefully all requirements as listed in *Handbook on Ministerial Studies*, 446, "The Song Evangelist."

##### Modes of Study

The options for the course of study are listed below (by preference) as recommended and approved by the Illinois District Ministerial Studies Board.

1. A Nazarene university or an accredited university, pursuing a degree in a religious field of study.
2. Nazarene Theological Seminary.
3. Nazarene Bible College or NBC Ministry Preparation Program.

4. Northwest Nazarene University Online Module Courses

5. Nazarene Bible College: NBC Track.

The Course of Study is under the immediate supervision of the District Board of Ministerial Studies. Students are advised to pursue preparation or ordination by selecting one of the above-mentioned modes of study. Each student is assigned an advisor to work with in establishing a plan of study.

The courses required of college students are in the Manual, 424.3. The competency statements for ministerial education are listed in Manual, 424.3. All college and university programs must meet these competency statements for course of study.

## **C. REGULATIONS FOR MINISTERIAL COURSE OF STUDY**

1. It is no longer necessary for students to purchase the *Sourcebook for Ministerial Development*. This information and more can now be found on the Clergy Education website (<http://nazarenepastor.org/clergyeducation/>) A Candidate Handbook can be downloaded for free from [http://www.nazarenepastor.org/Clergy Education/LinkClick.aspx?link=Resources%2fUSAHB.pdf&tabid=74&mid=501](http://www.nazarenepastor.org/ClergyEducation/LinkClick.aspx?link=Resources%2fUSAHB.pdf&tabid=74&mid=501).

2. Each student is encouraged to take four courses each year. The general church requires 2 courses per year to be passed, to allow a student to continue. After the district license is granted to the student, only ten years is allowed to complete the 24 required courses, Manual 427.4. At 2 per year, the student will not succeed. Thus, the Illinois District has chosen to encourage students to complete 4 courses per year. All course work must be completed by the end of the assembly year (April) in order for the student to receive credit for that assembly year. The only exception is for those students enrolled in an institution of higher learning in which the class may not conclude until the board meets in May.

3. A student is placed in a study level based on the number of courses completed regardless of the level of the courses. The only exception is that the course on the Manual of the Church of the Nazarene must be completed before level one is considered complete (unless the student is enrolled in a religion program at a Nazarene institution) and before the student is eligible for a district license.

4. The secretary may not enroll anyone except by written letter from the applicant to include the following information: name (first, middle and last); address; telephone number; e-mail address; course of study desired; church where current membership is held; letter of recommendation from the church pastor where membership is held; copy of local license granted by that church; and official transcripts from colleges or other schools beyond high school. It will be the obligation of the student to see that all the information is sent to the secretary. An application form will be made available for anyone expressing interest in enrolling with the Board of Ministerial Studies.

5. Prior to being issued a graduation certificate, all students must be reviewed by the Ministerial Studies Board. The only exceptions are Nazarene Bible College graduates of the Bible Studies Course who are immediately issued a graduation certificate. No student will be graduated from the course of study without completing an internship program.

6. When a student moves to another district, the secretary of the Ministerial Board should transfer the student's records to the new district by contacting the secretary of that district's Board of Ministerial Studies. Students are strongly advised to keep copies of course record sheets and final grades. The District is not responsible for loss of data when transferring to another district.

7. Candidates should be prepared to appear annually before the Board of Ministerial Studies. These meetings will be scheduled by the district office and notification of the meetings will be sent to you.



8. Files for inactive students will be maintained by the Board of Ministerial Studies for no longer than 10 years.

9. Students are required to keep an active e-mail account while enrolled in the course of study.

### **College Students**

College students are responsible to submit to the board documentary evidence of academic standing in harmony with *Manual*, 427.1, 427.4.

College students are reminded to plan their curriculum in harmony with *Manual*, 424.1 and 424.3. Yearly updates should be submitted to the secretary of the Board of Ministerial Studies. The Board of Ministerial Studies will evaluate the final transcript at graduation, and no requirements stated in the Manual will be waived.

## **D. CONTINUING EDUCATION**

“Once a minister has fulfilled the expectations of the educational foundations for ministry, he or she will continue a pattern of lifelong learning to enhance the ministry of which God has called him or her. A minimum expectation is 20 contact hours each year (2 accredited continuing education units (CEU’s) (*Manual* 424.6).

In order to facilitate the fulfillment of this requirement, a number of qualified events will be promoted through the district and by other means. An individual may receive CEU’s by participating in a qualified event sponsored by the district, the general church, one of our colleges or universities or other approved method. When CEU’s are available for a sponsored event, notification of the same will be made at the event and the participants will have the opportunity to sign up for credits. Credits will be based upon the participant attending the entire event and fulfilling other requirements (if applicable) for the event (such as extra reading or writing when appropriate). In all cases, it is the individual participant’s responsibility to qualify him or herself for CEU credits.

The Board of Ministerial Studies appoints a continuing education director who shall be responsible to facilitate CEU qualified events and to resource individuals in obtaining CEU credits for events attended. Individuals may also contact the Department of Clergy Development directly with questions or for qualifying and awarding CEU credits for courses taken. All determination of CEU qualifications shall be made by the Office of Ministry. All records of CEU’s obtained shall be retained by the Department of Clergy Development and by the individual himself/herself. Courses taken for degree programs are not eligible for CEU credit.

## **IV. Daily Proceedings**

### **SPECIAL ASSEMBLY SERVICE Wednesday Evening, July 13, 2011**

The 68<sup>th</sup> Annual Assembly of the Illinois District Church of the Nazarene opened on Wednesday evening July 13, 2011 at First Church of the Nazarene in Decatur, Illinois.

The Olivetians from Olivet Nazarene University opened the evening session singing and Dr. James Spruce, District Superintendent, welcomed everyone to the opening service of the 68<sup>th</sup> Annual District Assembly.

Dr. Spruce introduced Dr. Stan Toler, General Superintendent to the congregation. He then had every pastor present who had paid anything on budgets this past year to stand. Applause was given to those standing. Those who had paid budgets for the past number of years were asked to continue to stand and were also acknowledged.

Dr. Bill Chenault was called to the platform by Dr. Spruce and Dr. Toler presented the Laclède Church and Dr. Chenault the General Superintendents Growth Award. Dr. Toler gave appreciation from the General Church for their work this past year in achieving this award. He commented that this award is the highest award given and is purposely difficult to attain.

Rev. Jonathan Maloney and Rev. Steven Foster were introduced to the congregation. Rev. Maloney, pastor of Taylorville First Church has recently resigned to become a chaplain in the United States Navy. Rev. Steven Foster, who is currently a chaplain thanked him for his enlistment and Dr. Toler presented Rev. Maloney the Ecclesiastical Endorsement Award for Chaplaincy from the General Church. The congregation gave him a standing ovation of prayerful support and appreciation.

The Olivetians brought several more songs while the offering was being taken.

Mrs. Virginia Dace was introduced and brought greetings and thanks for the prayers and support in the recent death of her husband, Dr. Allen Dace, former Illinois District Superintendent.

Miss Sarah Spruce, Dr. Spruce's sister, Dr. Brian Allen and Tony Fightmaster from Olivet were also introduced to the evening congregation.

Dr. James Spruce brought his 9<sup>th</sup> annual report to the district assembly, "How Do We Get A Vision for Missions At Home?"

Rev. Dave Sorensen and youth pastor Tim Sorensen and a teenager from their church, Shawn brought an exciting report from the Royalton Church.

Rev. Tim Young, new church planter at Granite City brought an encouraging report for this new start.

Rev. Enrique Riofrio pastor from the Beardstown Hispanic Church told of his conversion in Equator which was translated by Rev. Waldo Perez. Rev. Riofrio closed the evening session with prayer.

### **Thursday Morning, July 14, 2011**

The morning session of the assembly opened with the Olivetians from Olivet Nazarene University singing.

Dr. Spruce welcomed everyone to the morning session and introduced Dr. Stan Toler, Jurisdictional General Superintendent to the 2011 Illinois District Assembly.

Dr. Toler brought the morning message - Life Principles from Philippians 4:9. 1) No problem is too big for God; 2) A smile on your face tells everyone your heart is home; 3) God gave us two hands; one with which to receive and the other to give; 4) Life is like a ladder; every step we take is up or down; 5) An act of kindness no matter how small is never wasted; 6) Death holds no darkness for the child of God; 7) Stand on the tip of your toes when you sing.

Dr. Toler also gave a global review of Nazarenes around the world and then reconvened the 68<sup>th</sup> Annual District Assembly of the Illinois District.

Rev. Douglas Haynes, District Secretary, presented the District Assembly Organization and Recommendations as printed in the delegate handbook. The District Secretary moved for the adoption of the report. There was a second and the report was adopted.

Dr. Spruce's annual district superintendent's report was approved. Mr. William Shotts, district treasurer presented the Spruce's with a check from district and Mrs. Karen Spruce received a corsage while the delegates gave them a standing ovation.

A motion was made and passed to seat the alternate delegates as verified and validated at the registration table during registration

A motion was made and passed to send special greetings to Dr. and Mrs. John Hancock, Mrs. L.S. Oliver, and Mrs. Stan Toler.

Dr. James Spruce introduced new pastors that were present – Bethel - Bud and Sandy Hance, Casey First - Allen and Vickie Ebber, Monticello - John and Cindy Barker, Pana First - Walter and Barbara Sheets, Pittsfield - Jon and Mary Lou Kroeze, Granite City CTM - Tim Young, Collinsville - Kevin Hancock, Decatur Oak Grove - Tim Mezera, and Mount Carmel - Bobby and Margie Brewer.

The District Ministerial Credentials Report, Partial Report # 2 was read by Rev. Jay Shoff. This report was adopted unanimously for Sean Asbeck, Larry Leon Barnhart, Timothy Cox, Janice Kay Forgach, and Todd Perrine Holman to be elected to elder's orders and be ordained in this District Assembly. Also recommended that Ruth Ann Bensyl to be elected to Deacon's orders and be ordained in this district assembly.

The District Ministerial Credentials Report, Partial Report #1 and the Final Report was adopted as written.

The Nominations Committee Report, Partial Report # 1 was read and adopted.

The Nominations Committee Report, Partial Report #2 was adopted as printed.

The Official Ballot for district officers was distributed to delegates by the tellers and the vote was taken.

The "Books on Purpose" program and how this charity program has helped around the world with Dr. Toler's book distribution was explained by Dr. Toler.

The Board of Ministerial Studies Report was presented as printed in the delegate handbook. A motion carried to accept this report.

The following pastors were invited to the front of the sanctuary for a report from their

churches: Rev. Richard Keeley, Anna First; Rev. Gary Clark, Harrisburg Oasis; Rev. Will Haworth, and new convert Roger brought an encouraging report from Sherman; Rev. Wayne Clevenger, Urbana Lighthouse. Dr. Spruce led the congregation in a prayer for the Clevenger's and this new start church in Urbana.

Major/Rev. Steven Foster reported for the military as a chaplain.

After a 20 minute break the Olivetians brought the delegation back together with great inspirational singing.

A video for the Nazarene Foundation was shown. Dr. Toler encouraged us to share our financial assets and miracles that are happening throughout the denomination.

Ballot results were read from the Official Ballot by the district secretary – District Advisory Board (Two ordained ministers and one layperson to be elected for three year terms) Ministers: Vote for two – Jay Shoff, Fairview Heights Parkview, 115; Rita Briggs, Decatur Oak Grove 96; Lawrence Lacher, Roxana 114; Timothy Crump, Decatur First 145. Laypersons: Vote for one – Herman Wallace, Marshall, 66; Judi Roarick, Auburn 172. Trustee to Olivet Nazarene University: (One Lead Pastor to be elected for three year term) Vote for one – Timothy Crump, Decatur First 124; Jim Frye, Murphysboro 113.

The chair declared elected: Jay Shoff, Timothy Crump and Judi Roarick for District Advisory Board and Timothy Crump for Trustee to Olivet Nazarene University.

The District Treasurer's report was presented by Mr. William Shotts. He reviewed the financial audit report from the 2010-2011 assembly year. He also reviewed the financial activity of the Illinois District for this past year. There was a motion and second to receive the 2010-2011 Illinois District Treasurer's report. The motion carried.

District Missionary, Rev. Mark Copley gave a challenging report for the district highlighting new starts on the district and he also challenged all pastors / churches to participate.

Evangelist Rev. Larry and Tamla Leckrone were introduced to the congregation. Rev. Larry Leckrone brought greetings and a testimony to how God is blessing their ministry.

The District Advisory Board report was called to be looked at in the delegate handbook. There was a motion made and the report was adopted as printed.

The Christian Cultural Engagement Report with highlights was noted. There was a motion made and the report was adopted as printed.

The Church Growth Report was called for and highlights noted. There was a motion made and the report was adopted as printed.

The Ministerial Staff Report was called for. There was a motion made and the report was adopted as printed.

Rev. David Young reported for the Nazarene Theological Seminary and highlighted new programs and degrees. A prayer was offered for the seminary in their search for a new president.

Announcements were made – and the morning session was dismissed after the Memoirs Report/Service. Rev. Gary Clark, daughter Andrea and Chuck Jackson led the congregation in singing "Great is Thy Faithfulness" and Rev. David Young read scripture and prayed the closing prayer.

**Afternoon, July 14, 2011**

The afternoon session began with singing by the Olivetians from Olivet Nazarene University. Rev. Tim Crump, host pastor welcomed everyone to Decatur and acknowledged his staff for their help this week.

Dr. Brian Allen, brought a exciting report and video from Olivet Nazarene University along with Tony Fightmaster.

Dr. Spruce challenged Dr. Toler that if he could name all the Olivetians, that an offering would be taken for the PR group. Dr. Toler named the entire group and an offering was taken.

Pastor's reports continued with Rev. Dallas Robinson, Carmi; and Dr. Bill Chenault, Laclade, gave his last pastoral report. This report was received with a standing ovation. Rev. Jon Kroeze, reported for the Pittsfield Church. Dr. Larry Lacher, from Roxana and Rev. Fred Prince, from Springfield First.

All pastors present were asked to stand and were given a standing ovation for their devotion and dedication.

A video presentation from the Nazarene Publishing House was shown. The new Beacon Bible Commentary on Philippians were passed to all pastors present.

The Daily Journal Report was read by the district secretary and adopted.

Editing and Publishing the Minutes Report was read and a motion carried to accept this report.

Rev. Douglas Haynes, district secretary thanked individuals who had assisted in the preparations of the 2011 District Assembly.

A gift was presented to Rev. Tim Crump from the Nazarene Publishing House by Dr. Spruce for hosting this district assembly.

Offering total of \$804.06 was presented to the Olivetians. Dr. Toler and Dr. Spruce split the difference to make the offering \$1,000 for the group.

Several announcements were made and a motion was made to adjourn the 68<sup>th</sup> Annual District Assembly of the Illinois District at the end of the Ordination Service this evening. This motion passed and the afternoon session was dismissed in prayer by Dr. James Spruce, district superintendent.

### **Thursday Evening, Ordination Service July 14, 2011**

Pre-service music was provided by Mr. Randy Miller on the piano. Rev. Jon Kroeze welcomed everyone to the evening service, gave announcements and offered the prayer for the offering.

Rev. Cathy Woolaway and the Praise Team from Decatur First led the congregation in singing the hymn "Called Unto Holiness" while Dr. Stan Toler and Dr. James Spruce led the elders and participants for the evening into the sanctuary.

Dr. Stan Toler explained the purpose of the evening service. Rev. Waldo Perez read from Ephesians 4:1-16 and Rev. Cathy Woolaway led the congregation in the hymn "The Church's One Foundation." Dr. James Spruce led "The Apostle's Creed" in responsive

reading.

Dr. Toler and Dr. Spruce presented the retiring elders: Rev. & Mrs. Ronald Ingram and Rev. & Mrs. John Francis. They were presented a plaque and a check from the Illinois district.

Dr. Spruce introduced the newly licensed ministers to the congregation: Rev. Dwayne Anderson and Rev. Glenn Goodrich. Their mentors Dr. Larry Lacher and Rev. David Sorensen were also recognized. Dr. Spruce read a challenge to these new ministers to maintain their studies and continue to be committed to lifetime involvement in the ministry of the local church as they embark on a new adventure.

Rev. Douglas Haynes, District Secretary presented to Dr. Toler the 2011 Ordination Class. After reading bios for each ordinand, Rev. Haynes presented the following persons for ordination as elders: Rev. Sean Asbeck, Rev. Larry Leon Barnhart, Rev. Timothy A. Cox, Rev. Janice Kay Forgach, Rev. Todd Perrine Holman and Rev. Ruth Ann Bensyl as a deacon.

Dr. Toler received the ordinands. After a series of remarks and questions, he challenged the congregation to support these ministers with prayer, encouragement and cooperation.

Rev. Cathy Woolaway led the Elder Choir in singing "And Can It Be". Rev. Penny Brown read from the *Manual*, pertaining to ordination of persons for ministry and Mrs. Cynthia Barker sang "I Will Not Forget Thee".

Dr. Toler preached on the theme of a Consecrated Life from Hebrews 11 regarding a Character for Ministry, Contentment in Ministry and Commitment to Ministry.

#### **How Do We Get A Vision for Missions At Home?**

*"Do We Still Have Passion for God's Mission?"*

Illinois District Superintendent's Report – 2011

I am honored to present my 8<sup>th</sup> report to the Illinois District. We warmly welcome Dr. Stan Toler, Dr. Brian Allen, the Olivetians and my sister, Sara. We sincerely miss our beloved former district superintendent, Dr. Allen Dace, now with the Lord. And mom, who loved district assemblies, is finally at home with the general assembly of the firstborn.

I'd like you to celebrate with me several wonderful, unpredictable and unfinished journeys of grace that have occurred this year in the creative tension between the already and the not yet – the already visible but the not yet fully realized.

#### **FIRST, PASSION IS VISIBLE**

One of our pastors embraced the still small voice of God and vowed to forsake all to follow him. Who but this pastor, so little-famed by the world, would leave the settled comforts of church and home for an unknown future? Rita Briggs would. She left Decatur Oak Grove to see what God might do in Jacksonville. Rita's heart is stirred for mission.

"My vision begins with partnership and prayer," she wrote, "calling people to join a prayer team. Second, it continues with passion and purpose. God will lay mission-specific passions upon the hearts of his people. Third, my vision includes intentional relationships by discipling and establishing believers. I cannot predict what the Jacksonville church will look like. It is our duty to faithfully pursue the Great Commission and allow God the freedom to build his church as he sees fit."

Will Haworth and our Sherman Church have a deep passion for prayer. Several joined a prayer revival recently at Sherman, and Prayer Summits with Corey Jones are planned for next April in Decatur and Metro East. Please plan to be present. Only God knows where this is going, but wherever it is going revival happens.

You should see Harrisburg's remodeled-for-worship gymnasium where Gary Clark serves, or ninety-nine year old Olivet where Jim Blue is pastor or the new multi-purpose building at Shelbyville under Greg Breeden's leadership. Wayne Clevenger at Urbana Lighthouse uses Upward Bound basketball to reach teens. Casey, Pana, Laclede and Ogden sponsored new works this year! Family cares about family, right?

Our Board of Ministerial Credentials led by Larry Lacher began a mentoring ministry this summer for all those preparing for ordination. Ministers-in-training will receive coaching as a requirement for ordination. In tomorrow's ordination service mentors will be introduced with their ministers-in-training. Veteran pastors care about emerging pastors.

District leaders have a passion for new ideas. Jay Bush, Bill Brandon and Tim Crump envisioned combining all conventions into one day, saving considerable fuel and time and creating intergenerational relationship. Another first was that convention ballots with shorts bios were emailed to churches a month early. The Advisory Board graciously gave a sabbatical to Karen and me, and also approved a 15 day "grace period" for district budget payment after the *official* April 30 deadline to allow for *unusual* circumstances. But there will be no grace in Illinois for payment received after May 15<sup>th</sup>.



Nearly 100% of our churches have hosted someone from Olivet Nazarene University within the last two years. About half of our churches agreed to host an Olivet presence on one of two Sundays in March. Brian Allen and Tony Fightmaster deserve our thanks for helping with logistics. As a result, our ONU budget response jumped to 90.2% payment, the highest in a dozen years. 44 churches, just over half, paid all budgets in full: Unified District, 89.3%; World Evangelism Fund, 103.5%; Pension and Benefit, 93%. Percentages have improved markedly, reflecting the best in my tenure. Our total income was \$9,161,656 for all purposes, but that amount is roughly a half million less than the year before. Thus *percentages* paid were higher but the *actual* money raised was less.

Yes the times are hard. But why did Jesus have more to say about money than any other single subject? Was he being particular or was he reflecting the heart of his Father? Jesus advocated paying taxes to Cesar *and* tithes to God. Imagine what it would do for the economy if all Christians just paid their tithe. Survivability depends upon tithe-ability.

Attendances are – worship: 6,298; Sunday School: 4,936; membership: 8,413; S.S. enrollment: 10,337. NMI Award of Excellence Churches: \_\_\_; Stewardship Honor Roll, 14; Ten Percent churches, 21; Exceptional SDMI 1(Sparta); GS Growth Award: 1 (Laclede). 63% of our churches reported at least one new Nazarene gained for a total of 304.

Nick Briggs at Vandalia and Tim Young at Granite City are pouring their lives into people not buildings. House churches meet in cafeterias, universities, coffee shops, bars and wherever the Lord opens doors to lead the lost into relationship with Christ. They are informal, relational and mobile. With a little freedom, congregations can sponsor house churches – who knows how and where you will find the non-churched and de-churched? A number of pastors rise early and meet people for coffee at McDonald's and Wal-Mart. Two of our churches have created specific relationships with nearby public schools. Ed Sprinkle plays in a country band. As Dr. Seuss said, "O, the places you'll go."

Please hear about the teen revival going on with Dave and Tim Sorenson at Royalton.

For some the picture is not as bright – the future we prefer is different from the reality we experience. One pastor wrote, "This last year has been rocky. We lost several people to other churches and others have just quit going to church. We are not growing numerically and may soon lack the financial resources to keep the doors open. After we paid our budgets we were completely broke; if the trend continues we may not survive."

He continued, "So I challenged every person, member or not, to bring one person into this church over the next year and to disciple them on what it means to be a Christian through prayer, Bible study, Christian service and giving. God calls each of us to go out into the world and bring in the lost sheep and to give sacrificially. If we live by these ideals and pass them on to our children and to someone we are discipling for Jesus, then by this time next year we will not have enough seats to hold the people."

This pastor understands, and wants his church to understand, that it is by fervent passion for the mission of Christ that the church is saved and the lost are redeemed!

## **SECOND, PASSION IS COSTLY**

Two college guys believed that God had called them to missions so they and their families finally set off for the wild blue yonder. They captured the heart of a world surprised by their heroic effort to reach so unreachable a people, and die so tragically in the effort. Nate Saint, Jim Elliot and three other young men suffered the fate of all martyrs – in their case, at the hands of the very Auca Indians they tried to evangelize in Ecuador's steamy jungle. Elizabeth Elliot's *Through Gates of Splendor* is the classic story of passion's costly sacrifice paid for by the blood of her husband and four other missionaries. Even now we still repeat Jim Elliot's immortal line, "He is no fool who gives what he cannot keep to gain what he cannot lose."

“Pastor Yadeta has planted 20 preaching points in Ethiopia. Every week he goes to open-air markets. He is ridiculed, persecuted, beaten, driven out, and/or jailed for his faith in Jesus. Every week he is welcomed by those desperate for the only God who redeems and transforms. He introduces some to eternal life.” Franklin Cook in *Vistas: the Changing Face of Nazarene Missions* continues, “Another pastor recounted that he preaches on Sunday and faces arrest on Monday. He is jailed for 24 hours, persecuted, released with severe warnings, and then arrested for incessantly telling others about Jesus. One pastor told us he is thrown into jail 40 weeks each year for his faith.” Increasing numbers of national pastors and Christians are dying for their faith. Not all pay with their lives, but all passion has a price today just as it did for first century Christians.

What drives people like this? What makes them passionate enough about the Great Commission/Great Commandment that they will face hardship, even persecution? They believe God can make a difference *through them* in the lives of others. How could God make a difference through us? Mark Copley and the Mission Strategy team offer four simple goals for each pastor: 1) partner with other pastors for prayer, mentoring, encouragement and fellowship; 2) take or retake the Church Health Survey to discover strengths and weaknesses; 3) write out how you will fulfill your mission over the next three to five years; and 4) identify a target area for involvement in church multiplication. Since we have not yet given our blood, do you think we could give our time and energy?

### **THIRD, PASSION IS TRANSFORMATIONAL**

The laser passion of Jesus for *his* mission alerts us to the transformational passion necessary for *our* mission: “You cannot hide behind locked doors. Forgive the Roman soldiers, the Pharisees who conspired with Pilate and every snarly legalist you ever meet. Extend grace to prostitutes and homosexuals and welcome immigrants to your table. Be gracious toward people who don’t share your skin color, religion and gender. I commissioned you to go and commanded you to love, because as the Father has sent me, I am sending you. Since my kingdom is not of this world, I will soon evaporate into thin air and return home. And before I come back, I promise to send my Spirit to enable you.”

My relationship with Joe the racecar driver was limited to the track pit area and his gas station. He came to church when his kids were in a program. The *attractional* model works when we draw people, but in our small church we couldn’t do enough. Everything depended upon my *relationship* with him as a guy. He wanted to know that I cared about him. This is the *missional* model: “As the Father has sent me to *you*, Jim, so I send you to *Joe*.” Discipleship means everybody is accountable to somebody. As Lucy told Charlie Brown, the line worker answers to the line foreman who answers to the plant manager who answers to the CEO who answers to the Board of Directors – who are married.

I grew up in the Sunday School contest era when we cut off neckties or broke records over the losing captain’s head. It was novel, entertaining and drew a crowd. It kept us focused on how many attended but it did not transform anyone. But this isn’t the 1960s and the bar has been raised: fellowship and discipleship transform people and are far more environmentally prudent than swallowing goldfish. The old scorecards of ‘how many’ and ‘how often’ are important but are not the end goal. The end goal is relationship.

Remember George Hunter’s barriers people have to cross to become Christians: 1) the image barrier, whether church is imposing or boring; 2) the stained-glass barrier, or music and sermons that don’t resonate; 3) the total commitment barrier, or standards they do not share, and 4) the gospel barrier, or the biblically authentic matters of repentance and regeneration. A new friend recently said, “I pray to God daily, and I hope he hears me because I don’t go to church and I am not a Christian. I don’t get church and none of my friends go there.” He is the mission field. He lives in one of your towns. How can we re-see church in order to truly see him? Tim Young has a God-story from Granite City.

#### **FOURTH, PASSION IS HEART-DEEP**

*Through Gates of Splendor* is clearly reminiscent of the missionary sacrifice of the apostolic age. Within months of the massacre of the five missionary men on January 8, 1956, four of the wives returned to the mission station near Auca territory not far from Quito, Ecuador and continued the work begun with the Jivaros and Quichuas. Within two years Elizabeth Elliot and Rachel Saint, sister to Nate, began work with the Aucas. Can you imagine going back to the same jungle, and the very tribe that murdered your husband or brother? Through their efforts the tribal murder rate dropped by more than 90%. Elizabeth Elliot quotes from the diaries of several of the missionaries who died.

From the diary of Pete Fleming: "I am longing now to reach the Aucas if God gives me the honor of proclaiming the Name among them. I would gladly give my life for that tribe if only to see an assembly of them gathering around a table to honor the Son."

From the diary of Jim Elliot: "Am I ignitable? God deliver me from the dread asbestos of 'other things.' Saturate me with the oil of the Spirit that I may be a flame."

From the diary of Nate Saint: "Does it seem right that we should hazard our lives for just a few savages? Yes, because there shall be some from every tribe in his presence in the last day and we feel we must make an opening into the Auca prison for Christ."

Elizabeth Elliot wrote, "Was it the thrill of adventure that drew our husbands on? No. Their letters and journals make it abundantly clear that these men did not go out as some men go out to shoot a lion or climb a mountain. Their compulsion was from a different source. Each had made a personal transaction with God."

Many pictures were salvaged from Roger's camera after the massacre. There is one in Elliot's book of Pete Fleming standing in the Curaray River with arms raised, appealing to the Aucas he knew were hiding just yards away in the jungle. The missionaries memorized some of the Auca language with help from another tribe's linguist. "We come in love and peace and are friends, not enemies. We come in the name of Jesus Christ who loves you and died to forgive your killing and take away all your fears."

The Aucas had learned to hate white men who ravaged their land for material profit and killed tribal members who objected. One of the Aucas said years later, "It was strange to us why these missionaries who were armed did not defend themselves when we attacked them. But our hearts were black and their hearts were full of love."

In a bittersweet twist of irony, Steve Saint, just a lad of five on that tragic day in 1956, was later to be baptized in the Curaray River by Mincayani, the very man who killed his father in the same river. So what about us? We also must face our culture and say, "We come in Jesus' name and as friends, not enemies. Christ loves you and died to forgive your sins and take away all your fears."

Please receive a testimony and benediction from Rev. Enrique Riofrio, pastor of our Beardstown Libertad Church. He and his family moved here two years ago from Quito, Ecuador. Rev. Waldo Perez will serve as interpreter.

## 2. District Missionary

Members and friends of the District Assembly, it is a joy to present to you my fourth report as District Missionary. Personally, this has been a year of great transition for me. I have left the pastorate, and I have worked several jobs in the last year. Leaving a great congregation like the one at Casey was difficult, but it had been the direction of my heart for quite awhile. These days, I find myself in the humbling position of no longer trying to grow a great church, but simply to be a follower of Jesus—a good neighbor, and friend--all in the hopes of making disciples for him. Someday, in the Lord's time, I hope to be part of the planting the church myself in one of our needy communities. For now, I am so delighted that the District Advisory Board chose to expand my role to 150 days a year as your Mission Strategy Director.

Let me begin by thanking my partners in leadership: thanks to Dr. Spruce, Doug Haynes, and those who have served on the Mission Strategy Team this year: Philip Alvord, Rita Briggs, James Craig, Kevin Donoho, Allen Ebbler, Will Haworth, Timothy Mondy, and Bob Turner. You have all served so faithfully this year!

Thanks also to our church planters, who serve on the frontline of our mission: Bill Brandon at Highland; Nick Briggs at Vandalia; Gary Clark at Harrisburg Oasis Community; Wayne Clevenger at Urbana Lighthouse; Tim Young, Jr. at Granite City; and Rita Briggs, who's just getting started at Jacksonville.

In the last year, the Mission Strategy Team has approved \$19,650 in grants for our new church plants. In addition, we are investing in our church planters with training, parsonage and salary assistance. With this money we have provided churches with assessment and vision planning, coaching, sports ministry costs, Sunday School materials, sound systems, and air conditioning. These investments in the harvest are producing results as well. Let me share with you some examples:

In Harrisburg, Gary and Peggy Clark have taken a core group they've nurtured from their church plant in neighboring Marion and successfully moved them to the facility of the former Harrisburg Church to form Oasis Community Church. An amazing renovation is happening as the gym is being transformed into a spacious sanctuary, new carpet and furnishing are being provided, and the people are alive with enthusiasm. The altars are filled weekly with seekers. And Gary reports several beautiful stories of people coming to or returning to Christ. It is a new day in Harrisburg!

Urbana Lighthouse, where Wayne and Karen Clevenger serve so faithfully is enjoying a

season of growth that is filling their tiny downstairs rented space with people and joyful praise. Much of this is the result of their sports-based outreach ministry to their community. On my visit one Sunday morning there, I was so blessed to see the enthusiasm of the people. It is a church that is ethnically diverse and reflects the community right around the church.

Steve Shotts and the Godfrey Church are in the midst of envisioning their congregation around the mission of Christ. They have a committed Team and are seeking God's vision for renewal. They have started a Facebook group page where they can discuss what the Spirit is saying to them online. They are also using their website and podcasts to share their message with the web community.

Vandalia, a church plant that began by the faith of the Pana congregation, and is now being sponsored by the Casey church, made a bold move this year when they moved from their rented facilities and began to meet in the homes of Pastor Nick and Melissa Briggs and the Englebrecksons. Attendance has doubled and a young man has come to Christ since doing so. They share a meal each Sunday as well as the Word, and are well on the way to being not one, but two house churches in the Vandalia area.

Last year, our district welcomed Tim Young, Jr. and his wife Andrea to our church plant at Granite City. The district made the difficult, but wise decision to forego the expensive mortgage of the building there and to allow Tim and Andrea to build the church in their home as well. Tim's messages at each of our Team Days were inspiring and challenging. God has given us a real champion in Tim and as he continues to build relationships in the Granite City community. We're certain Christ is going to produce a harvest from the seeds planted there. Recently, they baptized their first new disciple, Anna, whom they met at the local skate park. Pray for Tim and Andrea as they disciple her and reach others. They are committed to planting the church among lost people.

We are also excited to see compassionate ministry centers meeting the needs of many in hurting communities: Washington Park, Decatur, and soon, in Olney. This is the Lord's work and we are thankful for these special ministries.

Sherman, under the leadership of Will Haworth is enjoying a renewal born of passionate prayer and faith. Pastor Cory Jones from Ft. Worth, Texas came to meet with us in April to share in a prayer encounter that reminded us where our hope lies. If our churches will cry out to God, he will hear us, forgive us, heal us, and ignite the fire of the Holy Spirit again in our hearts that will burn bright to illuminate our dark communities with light. To encourage the spirit of prayer across our district, we are having two prayer encounters this year, April 13-14, with Cory's leadership. Will Haworth has also taken upon himself the burden of connecting our district network in prayer. Please join us as we seek God together. Our mission cannot succeed without him.

We are pleased to see an organic approach to church planting taking hold in our district. I believe there is potential in this method for a true church multiplication movement to arise. It is a "back to the basics" movement that defines church so simply that everyone can participate in the mission of Christ. Churches can be planted anywhere, with almost anyone who is a committed disciple of Christ. Could the Church of the Nazarene be planted in your community, in your home, in your neighborhood coffee shop, or even in your workplace? I can envision many of our established churches becoming hubs, each launching several of these missional communities into the unreached areas of their cities, or neighboring towns. Pastors, would you be willing to train and release your people to do so? We have provided information for you should you sense God's leadership in this direction. If you're interested please talk to your pastor, and to us.

Though this is one of our newest strategies for church planting, it should be stated that it is not our only means. We still need conventional churches to plant churches that meet in buildings on Sunday mornings. Churches of every size need to reproduce themselves by becoming involved in church multiplication, no matter what it looks like: multiple services,

multi-sites, or mothering new churches. All of these are acceptable ways to do that. How will your church multiply this year?

Please know that I am at your service as a partner in Christ's mission. This year, we hope to streamline what was once called ReFocus under NCS's leadership. In its place we hope to form a re-visioning process that will not take as long but will seek renewal based in prayer, and God-given guidance. This process need not be only for declining congregations, but for any church that lacks an answer to the question: "Where is the Lord leading us in the next 3-5 years?" If your church cannot answer that question with unity and clarity, let's work together toward that purpose. Because without a vision the people cast off restraint, they stumble and fall, without a vision, people perish. "But when they attend to what God reveals, they are most blessed."

### **3. District NMI President**

Delegates, Council Members, Zone Leaders, Dr. Spruce, Martha Bean, Pastors, honored guests and friends. Greetings in the precious name of our Lord & Savior, Jesus Christ! Exactly one year ago today on July 13, 2010, I stood before you to give you the previous year's report. This is my fifth such report to the Illinois District NMI Convention - and what a change from last year. This is our first ever combined Convention with NYI and SDMI and is quite a break from tradition. Everything changes. We grow older. Our children grow up and leave home. Our parents and grandparents move on to be with our Lord. We move from not having a care in the world to being responsible for everything. The day then comes when we step aside, and the next thing we know, we are not responsible for much of anything. Or so, at least, it seems. When that day comes, we turn into mentors and prayer warriors. I know, if it were not for the prayers, sometimes constant, of prayer warriors that took me under their wings, I would not be standing before you today...breathing. They have taught me by their examples to "never give up, never surrender." As this world around us changes, one thing we know that will never change is our Lord and Savior and the path to Him. He never changes. He also understands, as He has walked the same path. He had to deal with hard-to-get-along-with people. He had family members that did not understand Him. He had people with Him in ministry that let Him down and abandoned Him in His darkest hours. He had to confront Satan one on one. With what He has gone through, how can we do anything less than follow Him and do everything we can do to fulfill the Great Commission? He understands what we are facing. Our NMI Quadrennial Theme this year is "To Christlike Disciples in our Samaria" (cross-culturally, state and nation). The question is, Are we doing that?" The answer to that on the Illinois District, from where I sit, is, "Yes," and I trust you will see that, if you did not already know, by the time this report is concluded.

Are we impacting others for the Lord? Do we make a difference? A lot of the time we do not know and will not know on this side of life. It is a small world in the Nazarene Church. I am constantly meeting people in denominational work in different parts of this country and the world that have been impacted by people that have impacted me. Are you impacting others for Christ? One person that impacted me as a young adult, married and with two children at a time I had just come back to the Lord after years of drifting, was Nazarene Missionary Earl Mosteller. I would sit in one of the front rows of Missionary Services during family camp at Nazarene Acres listening as he related his experiences to us on the Mission Field. After services there were times he would come to our camper, sit around the fire and talk to me for hours. He really helped me in my path of seeking a deeper relationship with the Lord and how to better serve Him. This past spring, our Deputation speaker was Rev. Gerson Cardoso, who is the sub field director for the Amazon in Brazil. Besides this, he is the pastor of a church that was running eight to ten people when he became the pastor. It is now running about twelve hundred people. I listened to him through our very able

interpreter, a former missionary to Brazil and now pastoring our Sherman Church. He told about how, as a little boy, he was impacted for the Lord by...Earl Mosteller. Brother Cardoso grew up in a different culture than I did, speaks a totally different language thousands of miles from where I live, and yet we are impacted for the Lord by the same person. Rev. Cardoso now pastors a church of over twelve hundred people and is doing outreach missionary ministry in places it takes him days to get to. Besides my District work, my wife and I are involved in our local church and we are also pastoring an organic new start church. In the new start church we recently helped a homeless man find the Lord, provided him shelter and helped him for several months. Now he has found employment and housing, and seems to be on the road to a productive life serving the Lord and impacting others for the Kingdom. Both Rev. Cardoso and I are serving the Lord in our parts of the world impacted by the same person, Earl Mosteller. Of course, this is through the Lord, but the Lord used the World Evangelism Fund to do this. Without your (and those that came before us) great support, Earl Mosteller would not have been at Nazarene Acres to influence me, and he would not have been in the area of the Amazon to impact Rev. Cardoso. If the church was not developed that Rev. Cardoso pastors, how many souls would not have had the opportunity to hear the gospel? In Luke 10:2 Jesus says, "The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field." (NIV) In our present age and in the Nazarene Church, the best way for us to do that is through the World Evangelism Fund. Not only is the harvest field needing to be harvested, what about those that are coming after us? Our World Evangelism Fund will see that future people like Rev. Cardoso will be impacted for the Lord as long as people like you and me continue to support it. In this time of economic downturn, the WEF has been so impacted that the Church is being forced to bring some missionaries home and not sending others. How many people are NOT going to be impacted for the Lord because of the cut back in funding? Presently, the Church of the Nazarene is in one hundred fifty-six world areas with the latest being Mali in the Africa Region. Unless we keep the WEF funding level up, sadly, next year, my report may indicate a smaller number.

Another big change is "Funding the Mission." That has changed how we record and report in many areas. In the area of WEF, we do not start out with a goal in the old way with a dollar amount. Instead, we are supposed to give 5.5% of our collected general funds revenue to WEF. I am excited to report that the Illinois District overpaid WEF under the new system - as our percentage as of this report is not the 5.5 %, but we gave at the level of 5.7%. The Illinois District gave \$480,803. The amount needed at 5.5% was 458,070. That means we overpaid WEF \$22,733. Under the old system, that is 105%. That sounds really great until you see what we gave last year. Under the old system last year, we gave to WEF \$615,600 which was 88.34% of the \$696,830 we were requested to raise. That is \$134,997 less that we raised the previous year. Last year we did not meet our goal, but this year, under the new system, we exceeded our goal. We are just one District so you can see, worldwide, this leads to a serious shortfall. One of the ideas implemented to get the funding up to the previous level was WEF Plus. The Illinois District stepped up to the plate and raised \$18,264 for WEF Plus. The total amount raised for mission specials is \$224,897 and the total given by the Illinois District for Global Missions is \$716,056 Good job Illinois District!

Thirty-three churches qualified for the Mission Priority One Award. That number could go up as a glitch in the reporting system may have led to a few falling between the cracks. Forty-two churches qualified for the World Evangelism Church of Excellence Award.

I am surrounded by a host of people that help me function as the Illinois District NMI president. First is my wife, Debbie, who not only loves, lives and breathes missions, has to put up with me. I appreciate the wise council and help from our District Superintendent Dr. Jim Spruce. He always seems to have time to work me in. Our District Administrative Assistant Rev. Doug Haynes is always ready to lend a hand with work, advice, support and prayer. Our District Treasurer Bill Shotts, Chris Shotts and their staff are always ready to serve. Our secretary Judi Roarick is always keeping me on the straight path and my feet

out of the fire. Pam Stevens has been our Vice President and Work & Witness Coordinator. She is giving up the W&W slot as she is taking over LINKS on the retirement of Norma Shotts. What a great job Norma has done for many years. Present and past Illinois district LINKS missionaries are always telling me how well the Illinois District does in fulfilling our LINKS responsibilities. We are going to miss Norma on our Council. Her willingness to work, readiness to do the hard jobs, great attitude and smiling personality has been a blessing to us all. Abby Heppe is another one that is retiring after decades of service. Abby has been our Children & Youth Coordinator. Abby's sense of humor, spirit and hard work will be greatly missed. One of the hardest jobs on the Illinois District Council is that of Deputation Coordinator. That job is thanklessly done by Sandy Stickler. She has always worked hard and diligently. Her husband, Allen, does so much for us we feel he is on the Council too. Cindy Frye has another one of those hard but very fulfilling jobs, and that is as the District Mission Call Coordinator. Council member at large, Andy Breeden is also a full-time student at Olivet Nazarene University. Try carrying that load and be a NMI council member too. Becky Lonberger and Carlette Wankel are always ready to help when the need goes out. Our other Zone Coordinators are Debbie Turner, Stu Leach, Deloris Barker, Laura Mondy, Jackie Harris, Mary Lou Reader, and Barb Marshal. They really pull together and get the job done. Another person that is always there when I need help is our General Council Representative Martha Bean. Besides those duties, she also is a NMI District President. The great staff at NMI Headquarters headed by Dr. Daniel Ketchum always is ready to assist no matter what the problem is.

I was fortunate to be allowed to attend M11 this year in Louisville, KY. What a blessing that was. I went there overworked, stressed and feeling like I was about to burn out. One of the speakers was evangelist Danny Bohi. When someone asked Danny if he thought he was going to burn out, he said, "It's not my fire!" Another speaker, Bob Broadbooks, Director of the United States/Canada Region, reminded us - when Elisha was surrounded by an army and his servant was afraid, Elisha prayed in 2 Kings 6:17, "O Lord, open his eyes so he may see." Bob pointed out that "It is not our battle." Both of these men's reflections were the balm I needed at just that time. Isn't God good! Danny let me know He who is providing the fire will also provide the strength. Bob's insight let me know I am just being used in the battle, and I just need to remain faithful as the One that can calm the storm can certainly handle my problems. I just need to remain faithful and to "never give up, never surrender."

As I conclude my fifth report as NMI Illinois District President, I must tell you I still consider this an honor and a privilege to function in this capacity. In these tumultuous times it is surely interesting to serve as your DP. The Illinois District is a great people who love the Lord and are willing to sacrifice and serve Him. We have a very difficult and interesting new year before us. I know the Illinois district is up to the task! Thank you so much for all that you do for the Kingdom and for each other. May God continue to bless and keep you. We serve a great God.

#### **4. District SDMI Chairman**

Dr. Stan Toler, General Superintendent, Dr. James Spruce, District Superintendent, Pastors, SDMI chairpersons, teachers, delegates and friends, I bring to you my first report as the SDMI chairperson for the great Illinois District.

It has been my privilege to serve these past nine months as the SDMI chairperson for the Illinois District. What I have found is that we have an excellent SDMI council who graciously has provided direction, encouragement, and energy as we have sought to make Christlike disciples in the nations. This has been a year of learning, transition, and change. I have had a lot to learn. The transition came as Jim Blue, having served our district as



Chairman for a number of years, decided it was time for someone else to step up and the change came as we sought to re-examine our mission and purpose.

Sunday School has always been a part of the mission and work of the Church of the Nazarene. I have attended a Nazarene Church for 50 years. My wife and I have had the privilege of serving five great congregations over 25 years. I have preached scores of sermons and have conducted numerous funerals and weddings. I love the Church of the Nazarene, and in saying that I am declaring to you I love you, because the church is the people called of God who gather in His name and obey Him. I understand we are living in a day that does not value denominations and that independence seems to have greater value than interdependence. But it seems to me that being part of something larger than one's self is of benefit and a need of every human being and that far more is accomplished when we work together than when we seek to go it alone!

I believe Sunday School has been and still is an effective tool for discipleship, Christian education and evangelism within the local church for those who are willing to use it. But sadly, many people have concluded that the days of Sunday School being effective are over. Some believe it is simply a program or structure and thus they believe it can't be effective. But it seems to me that what is missing is not the structure, the program, or the teaching materials. It is something much more serious than that! Having been a part of this district for over 8 years, I have been asking myself the question: "Where's The Fire?"

Where is the fire for people who do not know Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior? Where is the fire to know and live out the truth of God's Word? Where are the Christlike believers growing and serving within the local church?

The Greeks had a race in their Olympic games that was quite unique. The winner of the race was not the runner who finished first, but it was the one who finished with his torch still lit . . . with the fire still ablaze. (J. Stowell, Fan The Flame)

In other words, *it was the continued possession of the fire that determined victory and success.* The Apostle Paul declares in 2 Timothy 2:3-9a:

*I thank God, whom I serve, as my forefathers did, with a clear conscience, as night and day I constantly remember you in my prayers. Recalling your tears, I long to see you, so that I may be filled with joy. I have been reminded of your sincere faith, which first lived in your grandmother Lois and in your mother Eunice and, I am persuaded, now lives in you also. For this reason I remind you to fan into flame the gift of God, which is in you through the laying on of my hands. For God did not give us a spirit of timidity, but a spirit of power, of love and of self-discipline. So do not be ashamed to testify about our Lord, or ashamed of me his prisoner. But join with me in suffering for the gospel, by the power of God, who has saved us and called us to a holy life—not because of anything we have done but because of his own purpose and grace.*  
2 Timothy 1:3-9a

**The Apostle Paul is coming to the end of his life and writes with a great sense of urgency to Timothy. He is looking for the fire of God in His people!**

**I remember times when the fire of God came among His people.**

As a teenager, I use to spend a large portion of my summer at Manville Camp near Streator, Illinois. The camp was known for one thing during my day- it was the rotten egg smelling water, but every summer I would go to camp. Each year I paid \$15 for the opportunity to scrub pots and pans for two meals a day even though the cooks always seemed to burn everything. During this time, I attended the Youth service, played softball in the afternoon, sang in the choir in the evening service, and listened to the great holiness preachers of that day! I did this year after year. I remember Jim & Rosemary Green, Nazarene song evangelists leading us in the song - - "Pentecostal Fire is Falling" - - Let it

fall on me! I remember when the fire came!

As I think about the churches I have pastored, the people I have met, and the work of the Holy Spirit, it amazes me of all the times the fire of God did its work in us.

But it seems to me that something has happened to us Nazarenes during the last 25 years. It seems like the fire that once burned so brightly has grown dim. The Apostle Paul was in prison as he wrote these words . . . as he realized his ministry was coming to an end. So he said to Timothy:

“Fan into flame the gift of God!”

The verse literally means: “To kindle anew the flames of the fire.” I love how Clarence Jordan translates this verse:

“I’m reminding you to shake the ashes off the God-given fire that’s in you!  
I can remember the times when the fire of God burned fully in His people.”

**There is a faith that must be handed down to future generations. (vs. 4-5)**

**Timothy was a 3rd generation Christian.**

His faith had been handed down from his grandmother, Lois, and his mother, Eunice.

Similarly, my father was the Sunday School Superintendent in the church we attended when I was young.

- I remember going to church with him on Saturdays so everything was ready for the teachers come Sunday morning.
- I remember arriving at church on Sunday morning often before the pastor.
- I remember my father making calls on absentees week after week.
- I even remember the old Sunday School picnic.

What I didn’t realize then but do now is that my father was passing down the faith to future generations. But what does the next generation need? A program? An activity? A structure by which to fulfill its purpose?

I wonder what Timothy’s faith looked like? Was it the same as his mother’s? Or his grandmother’s? I seriously doubt it! As our faith is being passed from one generation to the next, things do change. **The question is what is it that we are trying to pass on to future generations?**

You see, what we need to pass onto the next generation is not the torch that we have used, but the fire of God which must continue to burn brightly in the hearts and lives of young men and women. Torches come in many different shapes and sizes, but it is not the torch that is important - nor is it the torch we need to pass on. It is the fire of God!

Listen to the first piece of nazarene literature ever printed. It was a flyer advertising the meetings at red men's hall in Los Angeles, California. It reads:

The Church of the Nazarene is a simple, primitive church, a church of the people and for the people. It has no new doctrines, only the old, old, bible truths. It seeks to discard all superfluous forms and ecclesiasticism and go back to the plain simple words of Christ. It is not a mission, but a church with a mission. It is a banding together of hearts that have found the peace of God, and which now in their gladness, go out to carry the message of the unsearchable riches of the gospel of Christ to other suffering, discouraged, sin-sick souls. Its mission is to everyone upon whom the battle of life has been sore, and to every heart that hungers for cleansing from sin.

There is a faith that must be passed on and it will only be passed on effectively if it is the fire, and not the torches, we desire to give future generations.

With that said . . . General William Booth once declared:

*“The tendency of fire is to go out; watch the fire on the altar of your heart.”*

### **There is a faith that must be stirred. (v. 6)**

Generally, we like things to remain constant, predictable and for the most part the same. We don't want things stirred up. I remember as a child going on a family vacation to a Yogi Bear Campground in South Dakota. We had a pop-up camper at the time and I remember one night we built a fire. I had found a large stick and was enjoying playing in the fire. During the midst of that, my mother yelled at me: “Tim, will you leave the fire alone!” I can still hear those words – “Will you leave the fire alone!” “Tim, leave the fire alone!”

For what seemed like a couple of hours I sat there quietly and watched the fire slowing die down. It no longer was able to provide warmth or even the bright light it once had. The wood had been consumed. My big stick just sat there . . . Oh, how I wanted to see the fire do its work! But my big stick just sat there!

Then my Dad took my stick and began to stir up what remained, and I was amazed that in such a short time the sparks became a roaring flame once again.

**The fire that will motivate and move a church, a Sunday School class, a small group will die unless it is stirred.**

#### **How is the Fire in Your Life?**

Have you known better days – where your soul once burned hot?  
You use to care about the spiritual condition of a friend or neighbor.

You use to pray every day.

You use to make sure you were in a Sunday School class or a small group.

You use to share your faith with others.

Could it be that you were like I was . . . stoking the fire but something happened and you now look at what remains and long again to see the fire stirred?

The fire will die unless it is stirred.

### **There is a faith that must be lived. (v. 9)**

Paul says . . . “who saved us and called us to a holy life.” We are called to a life of holiness. One of power- not derived from position or wealth, but from the Holy Spirit. This power, Paul says, is expressed by a loving spirit and is marked with a life of self-discipline. John Wesley said it this way:

*There is nothing higher in religion; there is in effect, nothing else; if you look for anything but more love, you are looking wide of the mark, you are getting out of the royal way. And when you are asking others, ‘Have you received this or that blessings?’ If you mean anything but more love, you mean wrong; you are leading them out of the way, and putting them on a false scent. Settle it then in your heart, that from the moment God has saved*

*you from all sin, you are to aim at nothing more, but more of that love described in the 13th chapter of Corinthians.*

I love how Richard Cardinal Cushing says we could start a spiritual revolution:

- If all the sleeping folks would wake up*
- And all the lukewarm folks would fire up*
- And all the dishonest folks would confess up*
- And all the disgruntled folks would sweeten up*
- And all the discouraged folks would cheer up*
- And all the depressed folks would look up*
- And all the estranged folks would make up*
- And all the gossipers would shut up*
- And all the dry bones would shake up*
- And all the true soldiers would stand up*
- And all the true church members would pray up*
- Then the Savior for all would be lifted up*
- Then we could experience the world's greatest renewal.*

There is a faith to be lived.

**There is a faith we must share. (vs. 8-9)**

Elton Trueblood once said . . .

"Fire cannot continue to burn unless it penetrates the surrounding combustible material."

In other words, you can't remain a passionate believer in Jesus Christ and keep your mouth shut. You can't! There is a faith that is shared not merely by your life, but with your words. It is not enough to simply fan your flames - - -the fire must spread. It has to spread to your families and friends, and co-workers. Have you noticed the fire is in need of being stirred?

God says Tim give me a heart ready to mold, and I'll give you a mission, a message so bold that a fire will be stirred when there only was death, and your heart will be flamed by my life and my breath!

So start a new Sunday School class!  
Train some new teachers!  
Have a Vacation Bible School!

Begin small groups anywhere and everywhere as you open up the Word of God. Let the fire of God be stirred in you and may we in the Illinois District have a renewed passion for discipleship and Sunday School.

The District Advisory Board met five times during the year and conducted business five times via video conference and e-mail voting. Following is a synopsis of the business conducted by the Advisory Board during the 2010 – 2011 year.

(Bud) Hance from Joplin; Licensed Ministers – Aaron Timothy Horton from Northeast Oklahoma, Timothy P. Young from South Texas.

The following credentials were transferred out: Elders – Joseph Bell to Kansas City, Chad Garinger to Central Ohio, Denis Payne to Missouri.

The board recommended the following for District Ministers' Licenses:

The board voted to grant a Local Minister's License to Tim Mezera.

The board granted retired assigned status to: Elders - John Francis and Ronald E. Ingram.

The board voted to declare inactive and disorganize the following churches: Omaha and Granite City Crossroads.

The board appointed a Board of Directors for the Little Lambs Daycare School at Oakwood.

The board approved the sale of the following properties: parsonage at Tilden, parsonage at Metropolis, Home Gardens church, Granite City Crossroads Community church, Omaha parsonage and church, and a house owned by the Olney church.

The board deeded the 1999 Dodge van to the Nebo Church and authorized Doug Haynes to dispose of the 1994 van.

The board voted to sell the Yamaha grand piano at Granite City. They also voted to give the Roland keyboard to the Decatur Parkway church, or advertise it to pastors.

The board voted to purchase two new furnaces for the Granite City church property and repair the others.

The board approved the contract with New Church University for coaching by Darrell McLearn for Tim Young at a total cost of \$2400.

The board voted to pay the \$1500 deposit to Lake Williamson Christian Center for Children's Camp.

The board voted to subsidize \$50 per camper and adult worker attending District camps.

The board voted to approve a loan by the Mt. Sterling church - \$12,400 to repair the roof.

The board approved the renewal of the mortgage of the Springfield Trinity church.

The board approved the refinancing of the indebtedness of the Sherman church.

The board approved a \$30,000 loan by the Bethel church for repairs at the parsonage.

The board approved the mortgage of the parsonage at Olivet to fund their building project.

The board voted to approve the following churches for budget payment via the Phase-in plan (for the next four years): Mt. Carmel and Godfrey.

The board voted to insure the properties at Omaha for actual cash value.

The board approved the dismissal of the director of the Little Lambs Daycare School at Oakwood.

The board voted to cover the expenses of the District Missionary's cell phone through December, 2010.

The board appointed Bill Shotts as treasurer of the Granite City church (and authorized him to open a bank account for the church).

The board voted to extend a loan of \$3,500 to the Little Lambs Daycare School in Oakwood.

The board authorized the treasurer to move \$400,000 from the checking account to the Nazarene Foundation.

The board approved a contract with Mark Copley to serve as District Missionary at a cost of \$30,000 – and permission to use the parsonage at Effingham (& cover utilities) as long as it is available.

The board voted to purchase a new vehicle for the District Superintendent and to give his old car to Mark Copley.

The board authorized payment of a credit card debt owed by the Omaha church in the amount of \$5,372.91 – that the account be closed, and that the church repay the District via monthly payments.

The board voted to give \$20,000 to Shotts/Merryman Co. for their extensive work on the District Website.

The board voted to support the Evangelists' Gathering with a gift of \$200.

The board voted to approve the contract with New Church University for Mark Copley's District Missionary assignment @ \$8,500.

The board voted to repair the furnaces at the Effingham church.

The board approved Mark Copley to begin a Doctor of Ministry program.

The board approved a \$40,000 remodeling project at the Salem church.

The board approved the purchase of a secure server for \$2500.

The board approved Dr. Lawrence Lacher as District Director of Mentoring, to accept his license agreement, and to cover his expenses.

The board approved the purchase of Webinar service through Mega Meeting for \$495 initially and \$129 per month.

The board approved the re-hiring of District staff members: Douglas Haynes, Mark Copley, and David Bailey.

The board approved the appointment of the Nominating Committee for 2011.

The board voted to approve registration payment for the Retired Ministers' retreat in Branson, MO, for the Hancocks and Daces @ \$250 per person.

The board granted chaplain status to Rev. Carol Techau and returned her credentials.

The board voted to make repairs at the Effingham church: cover damaged wood on windows with aluminum and replace the sliding glass door.

The board approved the building of a ramp at the Virden church.

The board approved a grant of \$2,000 to the Harrisburg NewStart church towards a sound system.



The board approved pastoral appointments made by the District Superintendent.

The board approved Dr. Spruce's appointments of Zone Coordinators and Mission Area Pastors.

#### 4. Mission Strategy Team

Members and friends of the assembly, it is my privilege to present to you my fourth report as chairman of the District Mission Strategy Team. The Mission Strategy Team this year included the following members: Dr. James R. Spruce (chairman, ex-officio); Mark Copley, District Mission Strategy Director; Philip Alvord, Rita Briggs, James Craig, Kevin Donoho, Allen Ebber, Will Haworth, Timothy Mondy, and Bob Turner. We want to especially acknowledge the frontline work of our NewStart pastors and their sponsoring congregations: Bill Brandon at Highland; Nick Briggs at Vandalia (planted by Pana, and supported now by Casey); Gary Clark at Harrisburg Oasis Community; Wayne Clevenger at Urbana Lighthouse (supported by Ogden); Tim Young, Jr. at Granite City; and Rita Briggs, who's just getting started at Jacksonville.

The Mission Strategy Team distributed just under \$20,000 in grants this year. With those grants we provided assessment, coaching, ministry materials, property improvements, and pastoral support to our new churches and church planters.

This year, the Mission Strategy Team planned and presented two Team Days. The first, in February, was held at Decatur First Church, and the second, in March, at Salem Grace. Approximately 150 attended the Decatur event and 100 attended at Salem. That means 250 pastors and laypeople received encouragement, training, and support in these two events. Thanks to Pastors Crump and Donoho and to our host churches for making these venues available. And to all our presenters who provided such excellent workshops. Special thanks to Dr. Carl Leth, and Dr. Frank Moore. Thanks to Pastor Tim Crump and Lara Mondy who did much of the work of planning this year. We hope that many churches will attend these events again this year.

Our shared vision includes: new church plants (organic and conventional), reaching various people groups, stronger networking to support cooperation and prayer, and using new methods and means to reach new people. Our proposed budget reflects this vision. These aims are in line with our goals, which we have restated here:

1. ***Each church will develop a written vision statement describing the fulfillment of their mission over the next 3-5 years.***
2. ***Each pastor will seek to partner with other pastors for the purpose of prayer, mentoring, encouragement, and fellowship.***
3. ***Each church will strive for "Church Health" using the Church Health Survey as a tool for evaluation.***
4. ***Each church will embrace a clearly stated target area and plan for involvement in church multiplication.***

For the past decade, we have worked closely with New Church Specialties. Although we still value NCS, we are also now seeking new resources for training and support.

Much thanks to all of those who have served on the Mission Strategy Team this year. Together, we are stewards of the mission of our district: ***To develop healthy, multiplying, holiness churches and pastors.*** Our vision for a new passion, for a new people, and a new Illinois remains to be seen. Let's pursue it together in Christ!

## C. ASSEMBLY COMMITTEES

### 1. Finance Committee

We, your Finance Committee, recommend the following:

1. In accordance with the General Church of the Nazarene Global Ministry Center that all budget payments be based on Church Income. Church Income (Qualified Income for Illinois District purposes) is defined as all income eligible under IRS guidelines for a tax deduction, reduced by payments made to the World Evangelism Fund, payments made for approved 10% specials, deductions for rare circumstances, phase in adjustments, and any other deduction allowed by the General Church of the Nazarene Global Ministry Center.
2. That the Illinois District Budget be a unified budget with a single budget payment to include district administration and operations, NMI, NYI, and SDMI. All budget payments to be allocated to each department based on their pro-rata portion of budget receipts. Budget payments should be sent to William E. Shotts unified district treasurer.
3. That the World Evangelism Fund be 5.5 percent of Church Income, Pensions and Benefits Fund be 2 percent, the Olivet Nazarene University Fund be 2.5 percent, and the Unified District Fund be 5.65 percent.
4. That every church endeavor to be 10 percent for world missions as based on an amount equal to or greater than 10% of Church Income, less amount paid for World Evangelism Fund and approved specials (missions giving).
5. That the Unified District Funds be allocated as follows:

Unified District	<b>83.86%</b>
NMI	<b>7.47%</b>
NYI	<b>4.88%</b>
SDMI	<b>3.79%</b>
6. That all Funds (World Evangelism, Unified District, Olivet Nazarene University, and Pensions and Benefits) be calculated and paid weekly beginning in May.
7. That only churches which have paid in full the Unified District Fund, the Olivet Nazarene University Fund, the Pensions and Benefits Fund, and the World Evangelism Fund, be permitted to report all funds paid in full.
8. That no congregation be granted permission to go in debt for any building or improvement program, or the hiring of any staff or assistants, until it has shown the ability to pay all of its obligations, including funds paid in full for two years preceding the request, debt under consideration and/or the additional salary, and that the amount of the indebtedness and terms of payment not jeopardize the spiritual life of the church. Exceptions may be granted by the District Superintendent only with the unanimous approval of the District Advisory Board. (Manual, par. 235.4).
9. That every church prepare and adopt an annual operating budget for the church in accordance with (Manual, par. 129.6 & 129.7). Should assistance be requested for the preparation of a budget, the district will be happy to provide such assistance to the church.
10. That every church adopt a written "Designated Gift Policy". Should assistance be requested for the preparation of a designated gift policy, the district will be happy to provide such assistance to the church.

11. That **October 2, 2011**, be designated as Nazarene Bible College Sunday in our local churches and that a special offering be received and forwarded to the Bible College immediately.
12. That **December 4, 2011**, be designated as American Bible Society Sunday in our local churches, and that an offering be received and sent to the General Treasurer in Kansas City immediately.
13. That **January 15, 2012**, be designated as Nazarene Theological Seminary Sunday in our local churches, and that an offering be received and sent to the Seminary in Kansas City immediately.
14. That **April 22, 2012**, be designated as Olivet Nazarene University Sunday in our local churches, and that an offering be received and sent to our District Treasurer for Olivet.
15. That the salary of the district superintendent be **\$56,811.20** annually, plus **\$9,270.00** annually be invested for him in a tax-sheltered annuity, and **\$3,000.00** annually for reimbursable expenses and that he be given five weeks vacation with pay at a time convenient for him.
16. That the salary of the Administrative Associate be **\$38,315.74** annually, plus **\$3,090.00** annually be invested for him in a tax-sheltered annuity, and **\$13,400.30** annually for housing allowance, and **\$3,500.00** annually for reimbursable expenses and that he be given vacation in accordance with manual guidelines with pay at a time convenient for him.
17. That the salary of the District Missionary be \$30,900.00 annually.
18. That the District advisory Board be authorized to provide a district-owned vehicle, plus travel and expenses, for the district superintendent.
19. That the District advisory Board be authorized to provide a district owned vehicle, plus travel and expenses, for the travel and expenses, for the administrative associate.
20. That the District Advisory Board be authorized to provide a district-owned vehicle, plus travel and expenses, for the District Missionary.
21. That the district boards' committees', and councils' travel reimbursement be at the current IRS rate and that **actual meals and lodging expenses** away from home be **reimbursed**. These expenses to be paid from appropriate operating fund.
19. That the honorarium for the district secretary be **\$4,010.20** per year, and that expenses for clerical help be allowed.
20. That the professional fees to be paid for accounting and bookkeeping services for the district including the medical fund be **\$36,750.00** per year.
21. That a recommended rate of \$8.25 per hour be paid for temporary secretarial services provided for district departments such as Board of Ministerial Studies, School of Ministry and any other services required during the year.
22. That the local churches pay the health insurance plan for pastors and dependents, and for associate pastors and dependents; and that the district pay \$2,000 per year for the cost of the health plan premium for full-time commissioned

evangelists and their families, and that the local church (where evangelist holds membership) pay the balance of the premium.

23. That our people be encouraged in the stewardship of possessions as related to wills, annuities, and the life loans for the local church, district home missions, world missions, our colleges and seminary. That the Department of Stewardship regional representative, Rev. Larry Hindmand, 9625 Mason, Oak Lawn, IL 60453 (708-857-4770) be contracted by local churches for counseling service in life income wills and bequests.
24. That the local church boards strictly adhere to the provisions of the Manual, Pars. 129.21, 129.22, 129.23, concerning the counting and the accounting for all monies received and disbursed, and an annual audit of the financial records.
25. That each local church treasurer use printed forms for reporting all monies received and disbursed each month, and that the pastor and church board be provided a copy or copies of the monthly treasurer's report (Manual, par. 135.4).

## 7. Christian Cultural Engagement

A. WHEREAS, in times when our culture desperately needs the Church to be a living example of Christ-like holiness and love, we strongly urge:

1. All our sisters and brothers in Christ to remember that we are called to be the Body of Christ in our world being empowered by the Holy Spirit to the glory of God the Father. As a result, we urge our brothers and sisters to remember the importance of corporate Christian worship and the practice of spiritual disciplines within the family and individually, believing that these are **primary means** by which the Holy Spirit shapes us into a holy people.
2. That pastors, evangelists, and leaders live and teach the scriptural doctrines of the new birth and entire sanctification, believing that the Holy Spirit bears witness to both works of grace through the infilling of His Spirit, and that the one biblical evidence of the latter is the cleansing of the heart by faith from original sin manifested by the fruit of the Spirit in Christian service: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control (Gal 5:22-24).
3. That the church manual be made available to all in the church who desire it and the Articles of Faith (Manual, Part II, para 1-22, pgs. 28-37) and the Covenant of Christian Character (Manual, Part II, Articles 27-27.3, pgs. 38-40) be read, or printed, and distributed to the church body at least once a year admonishing each Nazarene to diligently pursue a lifestyle that honors God, the church and one another.
4. That new converts be lovingly nourished and instructed in the way of holiness.
5. That all of our people, "in putting off the old to put on the new and holy way of life as well as the mind of Christ" (Eph 4:17-24), take to heart The Covenant of Christian Conduct of our church which gives guidance in areas of Christian Ethics, Entertainment, Marriage & Divorce, Abortion, Human Sexuality, Christian Stewardship, etc. (Manual, Part III, para 33-41, pgs 46-60).

B. WHEREAS, ethics and values are constantly being questioned and changed by our society, the church must strengthen itself in its commitment and conduct. Therefore, this committee felt it vitally important to not only reaffirm our belief in Scripture and our Wesleyan guidelines, but to also provide useful information in this document to resource both laity and clergy to make the church both a beacon of hope and a model of holiness to our families, community and world. (Matthew 5:10-17; Ephesians 5:1-2,8-14; 1 Peter 1:13-17).

We encourage our people to work with and in public institutions as a means of Christ-like engagement with our culture on the local, State, National, and Global levels.

1. Each local church should strive to provide educational and equipping opportunities such as:
  - a) Special Christian Speakers & professionals,
  - b) In-service topical seminars and open forum discussions, and
  - c) Consider initiating special ministries that reach out to the needy in the congregation and community.

  - f) Nursing Homes; Senior Adult Organizations

3. We should actively monitor our State and Federal Legislature on issues which pertain to, and affect our church and community and express appreciation to individuals/organizations that promote legislature and programs which edify. We urge church leaders to make available the names and addresses of government officials and stress the importance of voting in local, state and national elections to ensure that issues pertaining to the biblical ideals of faith, family, and social justice are addressed. We encourage the above while being simultaneously mindful that our commitment to Christ our Lord must always be far greater than our commitment to any political party, agenda, or association.

### *Commission*

We recommend that every church emphasize the Great Commission (Matthew 28:16-20) in every facet of their ministry. We are reminded that the Bible should always be our main source and that the Great Commission remains as our primary motivation for church growth.

### *Prayer*

Remember that prayer should be the foundation for all church growth, and that without prayer, little of lasting value will be accomplished. We also recommend that the church provide opportunities for concentrated prayer and fasting during the church year.

### *Mission/Vision/Purpose*

We encourage every church to develop a mission statement, a vision statement, and a clear statement of purpose. These three key elements will ensure that we stay focused on God's plan for the local church. There are numerous books and other resources available to assist the church with this task. Any church needing assistance should contact the district superintendent and/or the district missionary.

### *Responsibility List*

That every church maintain an accurate, up-to-date list that includes the name, current address, and telephone number for every person on their responsibility list. This will allow for better, more consistent follow-up and accountability.

### *Calling*

That absentees be contacted through a regular, systematic approach. This is not solely the responsibility of the pastor, but should be a shared ministry within the church among the laity.

### *Discipleship*

Emphasis should be given not only to evangelism, but also the discipleship. The new Christian should be encouraged to seek the experience of Heart Holiness which leads to a growing and productive Christian as a way to fulfill the Great Commission (Matthew 28:20).

### *Lay Ministry*

We encourage our churches to develop a partnership between the pastor and the laity, which provides for every member to be involved in church ministry (discipleship/ evangelism).

### *Education*

That pastors and laymen take full advantage of educational and CEU opportunities, including seminars, workshops, videos, books, and especially the quality CLT programs that our denomination offers.

*Evangelism*

That new and innovative methods of outreach and evangelism be explored. Consider how the resources of the local church, human and financial, can be utilized most effectively to see souls saved.

*New-Start / Restart*

We believe every church on the Illinois District can and should become involved in prayer, creating or supporting new church starts. Churches can provide funding and or personal involvement of the local church body in calling, canvassing, etc.

*Refocus*

That churches be encouraged to be involved in determining their church life cycle and whether or not they need to enter into a refocusing process such as the New Church Specialties. Contact the district missionary for more information.

*Personal Evangelism*

It is the privilege and duty of every Christian to share their faith with others. We encourage all churches to provide specialized training for various types of personal evangelism. Personal responsibility for evangelism should be emphasized.

*Revivals*

We encourage our churches to give top priority to annual revival campaigns. We strongly urge the use of full-time evangelists in the Church of the Nazarene. We also encourage the use of all media possibilities (TV, radio, etc.) to potentially reach as many as possible with the gospel.

*Servant Evangelism*

That methods of servant evangelism be employed in churches of all sizes and in all areas. Jesus Himself came to serve and to give, not to be served or become successful. Let us willingly choose to follow Christ's example as we minister to others. Such acts of kindness can serve to bridge the gap between the church and the world.

*Finances*

Set aside a portion of the annual church budget for purposes of outreach and evangelism. The Bible says, "Where your treasure is, there your heart will be also."

*Evangelism Committee*

We encourage each church to review and implement the guidelines for a local Evangelism **and Church Membership** Committee as stated in the **2009-2013 Manual**, page **71**, and section 110-110.8.

*Global Church Growth Award*

It should be the goal of every church to introduce each new convert into the membership of the Church of the Nazarene.

We challenge every church to establish minimum goals according to the following guidelines.

Category	<i>Morning Worship Attendance</i>	<i>Number of New Nazarenes</i>
Category 1	0-49	6 new Nazarenes
Category 2	50-79	9 new Nazarenes
Category 3	80-99	12 new Nazarenes

Category 4	100-399	The lesser of 12 percent of previous year's worship attendance or 43 new Nazarenes
Category 5	400-899	11 percent of previous years worship attendance
Category 6	900 and up	100 new Nazarenes

Churches will be grouped according to size to compensate for variation in ability. Morning worship attendance will be used to determine the size categories.

This award will be based on achievement in three areas:

1. New Nazarenes
2. Significant involvement in sponsoring a new church,
3. Payment of all budgets (including district and educational).

### **9. Ministerial Staff Support**

We, your Committee on Ministerial Staff Support, submit the following in order to care for the welfare of our spiritual leaders and encourage their commitment to our spiritual guidance.

The district office and the Pastoral Support Committee want to assist pastors and church boards in understanding their roles in providing adequate compensation for its pastors and staffs. Support of the pastor by the church is an expression of the belief in the call of God on the life of the pastor rather than a job where monies are paid for services rendered. Adequate compensation enables a pastor to fulfill his or her calling.

Pastoral support extends beyond the compensation and benefits for the pastor and staff and includes those expenses incurred by pastoral staff which is necessary to conduct the business of the church. Each church pays a sum to a pastor's ministry, which is divided into several categories: compensation, benefits and expenses. The sum of these categories is considered the cost of ministry to the local church, not all of which is to be considered the income of the pastor.

The district Pastoral Support Committee has developed guidelines for local pastoral support committees to evaluate their commitment to the ministry of the pastor. Anyone wanting further assistance in assessing or planning adequate compensation may contact the district office. In addition to consideration for the local pastors, churches should also establish a remuneration policy for pulpit supply, including travel expenses.

#### *Senior Pastor*

The senior pastor is the leader of the church and a leader in the local community.

#### *Bi-vocational Pastor*

A bi-vocational pastor supplements income by means other than church compensation. Churches should view the circumstances that cause the pastor to supplement income as a temporary situation to be resolved as soon as possible. The goal is to remove as many worldly concerns from the pastor as possible, so that the pastor may attend more intently on his or her life's calling. Recognizing that small and young churches may have difficulty in providing adequately for their pastor and family, we urge such churches to use what they are able to provide to the best advantage of their pastor and to

strive toward the goal of full support.

#### *Associate Pastor and Staff*

An associate pastor is defined as a partner in ministry, on staff, whether receiving compensation or not. The church is to work toward a similar benefit package for the full-time associate as for the senior pastor (guideline to the church: an amount equal to 70 to 80 percent of the senior pastor's compensation package). Associate pastor and staff salaries should be negotiated in accordance with the recommendations of the senior pastor.

#### *Retired Pastor*

A retired pastor is a minister with retirement status. We recommend that retired pastors be employed for pulpit supply as frequently as possible. Retired pastors usually live on meager retirement benefits and may welcome the opportunity to provide for pulpit supply. Retired pastors are a source of experience and expertise that is available to the local church.

#### *Evangelist*

Often, the evangelist's only source of income is from meetings held at various local churches. We recommend that a full-time evangelist's minimum remuneration for such a meeting be an amount equal to twice the local senior pastor's weekly cash salary for each full Sunday in the special meeting (as recommended by the Evangelism Ministries of the Division of Local Church Growth). The local senior pastor's weekly cash salary and prorated insurance and Social Security benefits should all be included in the compensation. Additional compensation for housing and travel-related expenses should be paid in a separate check, allowing for maximum tax benefit for the evangelist.

#### *I. For the Pastor*

##### A. Concerning Salary:

1. That for all full-time pastors, every church provides a minimum of \$450 per week salary. By definition, salary should not be deemed to include reimbursements and cost of ministry expenses listed below in Section B, Paragraph 1. The Advisory Board is to make the distinction between full-time and bi-vocational pastors. That churches which are legitimately unable to provide for such remuneration recognize that their pastor is bi-vocational and, therefore, able and obligated to supplement his or her income. We recommend that the district superintendent or designated personnel monitor the suggested minimum weekly salary on the basis of the materials provided by the general church's worksheet and, when necessary, give strong counsel to church boards to provide the above-stated minimum salary and benefits.
2. That the church place, as an employee benefit, an amount equal to 10 percent of the ministerial staff's monthly salary in a tax-sheltered annuity each month for his/her retirement. This is the third leg of the retirement tier recommended by the Pensions and Benefits office of the general Church of the Nazarene.
3. That the church review the ministerial staff salary at least annually and that increases reflect at least cost-of-living increases. That a letter be sent once a year from the district superintendent to the local church board secretary reminding the board of its responsibility in this area, and that a written summation of the board's action shall be returned to the district superintendent within 30 days of the local board meeting.
4. That any significant increase in the annual amount raised for all purposes by the church during a pastor's tenure be taken into consideration at the time salary and benefits are reviewed.

B. Concerning Reimbursements:

1. That the church pays reimbursements for all church-related expenses, and that among these are standard mileage reimbursement at the recommended IRS rate for personally-owned automobiles. To avoid additional financial burden on the pastor and staff during these days of rapidly increasing gasoline prices, the church board is strongly encouraged to monitor and comply with any increases the IRS may possibly make on its recommended mileage rate during the calendar year. Entertainment expenses, office supplies, continuing education expenses (books, tuition, conferences, etc.), gifts and all other reimbursable expenses deemed appropriate by the IRS should also be included.
2. Church-related expenses of pastoral staff should be qualified on the basis of material from General Headquarters, as well as the Internal Revenue Service. Every church should provide adequately to prevent financial strain to the parsonage family, and that every church provides 100 percent Social Security and full family hospitalization. That churches be allowed to maintain their present insurance program, and if churches propose a change, the change should be approved by the district superintendent and the District Advisory Board.
3. That the church provides the ministerial staff expense to all church-related functions, including the district and general assemblies. Lodging, meals and transportation shall be a part of this expense.
4. That the churches encourage and financially support its ministerial staff to continuing education through school, seminars and conferences.
5. That each local church board provides funds for the purpose of sending its ministerial staff to the general assembly.

C. Concerning Housing:

1. That the church provides housing and utilities and/or adequate housing allowance.
2. That the church equips the parsonage with a stove, refrigerator, air conditioning, washer, dryer, draperies, curtains and carpeting.
3. That a minister could request the church board to adjust his/her compensation for any year in which it is anticipated that the minister will purchase major appliances and/or furniture.
4. That the fair-rental value and the designated additional parsonage allowance should be entered into church board records at the beginning of each calendar year. When a housing allowance is established in lieu of a parsonage, a review of the allowance should be made annually regarding payment, taxes, utilities and repairs.
5. That the Board of Trustees of the local church inspect the parsonage once each year in order to continue to provide for quality living conditions. No parsonage family should be expected to live in substandard housing. This inspection should be scheduled with the pastor and spouse and be done in their presence. Any necessary changes seen at this inspection should be completed as soon as possible.
6. That the local church board makes all necessary arrangements for the ministerial staff's moving expenses.

D. Concerning the Ministerial Staff's General Emotional and Spiritual Welfare:

1. That the church continually lifts the parsonage families in prayer.

2. That the church remembers the ministerial staff's family with suitable gifts at appropriate times during the year and consider a gift of no less than one week's salary at Christmas.
3. That the church provide for vacation and time off according to the following scale (this schedule refers to total years in ministry):
  - a. One year in the ministry: two weeks vacation
  - b. Two to ten years in the ministry: three weeks vacation
  - c. Ten to twenty years in the ministry: four weeks vacation
  - d. Twenty or more years in the ministry: five weeks vacation
 (District Assembly, Family Camp, ministerial retreats and seminars, and working in Teen or Children's Camps are not to be considered as part of this vacation time allowance.)
4. In order to benefit the church and the health of the pastor, the church should encourage the pastoral staff to take a minimum of one day per week for family time.
5. That the church allow the senior pastor the privilege of holding a full week revival or speaking engagement of one or more days, not to exceed seven days per year, with the church to be responsible for pulpit supply without loss of salary to the pastor.
6. That the local church offer the pastor/staff two mental health days each month to be taken at the pastor's discretion, to be used at a time when workload or individual stress is overwhelming.
7. That the local church make available to its pastor a one month sabbatical at the end of each five years of uninterrupted ministry to that same church.

*II. For All Full-time Evangelists (Song and Otherwise)*

A. Concerning Salary:

1. That evangelists be paid at least an amount equal to twice the pastor's salary or a minimum of \$500 for each Sunday of the meeting.
2. That, in addition, Social Security on the amount of salary be summarily paid.
3. That evangelists be notified in writing at the time the meeting is scheduled of the minimum remuneration they can expect to receive from the local church.
4. That local churches avoid canceling previously scheduled revivals.
5. That a local church canceling a revival without notifying the evangelist at least 30 days in advance be obligated to pay the minimum remuneration in full, unless the evangelist is able to reschedule the same date.

B. Concerning Reimbursements and Housing

1. That churches provide for all travel expenses, lodging and food during the meeting.
2. That local churches having full-time evangelists as members pay one-half the cost of the district hospitalization insurance.
3. That local churches having full-time evangelists as members provide for their expenses to general and district gatherings.



C. Concerning the Evangelist's General Emotional and Spiritual Welfare:

1. That finances for revivals be raised in advance of the scheduled meeting.
2. That the local church sends a Christmas gift to all evangelists who have served the church during that calendar year.
3. That local churches having full-time evangelists as members provide encouragement and support for their ministry through prayer and such tangible ways as love offerings and remembering them on their birthdays and anniversaries.

*III. For Retired Ministerial Staff*

A. Concerning Reimbursements:

1. That local churches having retired ministers as members provide for their expenses to general and district gatherings they wish to attend.

B. Concerning Their General Emotional and Spiritual Welfare

1. That local churches having retired ministers as members remember them often, such as at birthdays, anniversaries and Christmas, with gifts of gratitude for their years of faithful service in the Kingdom.
2. That the Illinois District gives a one-time love gift to all elders upon their retirement. We recommend a minimum of \$1,000.

We ask that each local church board secretary and pastor receive a copy of this report from the district superintendent and that the same shall be read or distributed by the church board secretary to the church board as a reminder of their responsibilities. The church board secretary shall notify the district superintendent in writing concerning the fulfillment of this policy.

**COMBINED CONVENTIONS – NMI, NYI, AND SDMI**

**Decatur First Church of the Nazarene, Decatur, IL**

**July 13, 2011  
Morning Session**

It concluded as Dr. Spruce entered, displaying a huge card reading, "ILLINI."

A video clip from the NPH followed, giving information and instructions for ordering NMI materials for the new year. Bill Brandon announced that order forms should be completed and passed to the aisles.

Dr. Spruce explained the green NYI ballot. He announced the voting bar to be inside the sanctuary and any delegates working in other parts of the building. A motion was made and seconded to adopt the NYI Ballot number one for NYI President, Vice President, and

Ivan Jess presented the Work and Witness trip to APNTS in the Philippines – October 10 – 19, 2011. Information is available on the District Website or at the NMI table at the Convention.

Bill Brandon presented his 5<sup>th</sup> report as District NMI President, depicting our quadrennial theme, "Making Christlike Disciples in our Samaria." We are now serving 156 world areas.

The World Evangelism Fund is vital. Our WEF goal was \$458,670. We paid \$480,803 - overpayment of \$23,733! But this is considerably less than the \$615,600 we paid last year.

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## INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Board of Directors  
Illinois District Church of the Nazarene

We have audited the accompanying statement of assets, liabilities and net assets – modified cash basis of the Administration, Home Mission, Camp Ground, District Reserve, Medical, Nazarene Missions International, Church New Start, Camp Meeting, Sunday School and Discipleship Ministries International and Nazarene Youth International funds of the Illinois District Church of the Nazarene as of April 30, 2011, and the related statements of support, revenue and expenses and cash flows – modified cash basis for the fiscal year then ended. These financial statements are the responsibility of the Illinois District Church of the Nazarene's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

Except as explained in the following paragraphs, we conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall financial statement presentation. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.

As described in Note 1, these financial statements were prepared on a modified cash basis, which is a comprehensive basis of accounting other than generally accepted accounting principles.

As more fully described in Note 1 to the financial statements, the modified cash basis of accounting requires fixed assets be stated at cost, net of accumulated depreciation. Management has informed us that the District has stated its properties at estimated costs and appraised values versus historical costs as required by the modified cash basis of accounting. In addition, no depreciation expense has been recorded in the financial statements. The effect of this departure on the financial statements has not been determined.

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above (except for the effects of valuing fixed assets at estimated costs and appraised values) present fairly, in all material respects, the assets, liabilities, and net assets of the Administration, Home Mission, Camp Ground, District Reserve, Medical, Nazarene Missions International, Church New Start, Camp Meeting, Sunday School and Discipleship Ministries International and Nazarene Youth International funds of the Illinois District Church of the Nazarene as of April 30, 2011, and its support, revenue and expenses and cash flows for the year then ended, on the basis of accounting described in Note 1.

Our audit was made for the purpose of forming an opinion on the statement of assets, liabilities and net assets – modified cash basis and the related statements of support, revenue and expenses and cash flows – modified cash basis. The accompanying supplementary information contained on pages 11 through 27 is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the



financial statements and certain other procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. In our opinion, the information is fairly stated in all material respects in relation to the financial statements taken as a whole.

## NOTE 1 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

### Nature of Activities

Illinois District Church of the Nazarene is a not-for-profit corporation organized under the laws of the State of Illinois. Its purpose is to provide administrative and financial assistance to the local Nazarene churches in the District. The organization is supported primarily through budget receipts from the local churches.

### Description of Programs

Illinois District Church of the Nazarene offers the following programs:

- Home Mission – This program was established to assist churches in need.
- Camp Ground – This program was established to minister to various individuals and groups by providing a place for recreational activity, as well as providing a place to minister to the attendees / users.
- Medical – This program was established for the purpose of facilitating the receipt and payment of health and life insurance premiums for ministers, and to make partial reimbursements to retired ministers for their medical expenses.
- Nazarene Missions International – This program was established to provide support for Missionaries approved by the General Church of the Nazarene and to support local churches in NMI programs.
- Church New Start – This program was established to provide assistance to new church start-ups.
- Camp Meeting – This program was established to collect revenues and pay expenses for District week held annually at Nazarene Acres.
- Sunday School and Discipleship Ministries International – This program provides spiritual, recreational activities, and camps for youth participation (elementary level) and to support local churches with their Sunday School programs.
- Nazarene Youth International – This program provides spiritual, recreational activities, and trips for youth participation (junior high and senior high level) and to support local churches in their NYI programs.

### Basis of Accounting

The financial statements are presented using a modified cash basis of accounting. This basis of accounting recognizes assets, liabilities, net assets, revenues, and expenses when they result from cash transactions. This basis is a comprehensive basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

As a result of the use of this modified cash basis of accounting, certain assets and their related revenues (such as accounts receivable) and certain liabilities and their related expenses (such as accounts payable) *are not recorded* in these financial statements.



NOTE 1 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)

Cash and Cash Equivalents

The District considers all highly liquid investment instruments available for current use with an initial maturity of three months or less to be cash equivalents.

Investments

Investments in mutual funds with readily determinable fair values are reported at their fair values in the Statement of Assets, Liabilities and Net Assets – Modified Cash Basis. The District carries investments in marketable securities with readily determinable fair values in the Statement of Assets, Liabilities and Net Assets – Modified Cash Basis. Unrealized gains and losses are included in the change in net assets in the accompanying Statement of Support, Revenues and Expenses – Modified Cash Basis.

Property and Equipment

The District has recorded its property and equipment at appraised and estimated values, which is not in conformity with the modified cash basis of accounting. Depreciation has not been computed on fixed assets.

Income Taxes

The District is exempt from Federal income taxes under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. In addition, the District has been determined by the Internal Revenue Service not to be a private foundation within the meaning of Section 509(a) of the code.

Estimates

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with the modified cash basis of accounting requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Loans Receivable and Payable and Transfers between Program Accounts

Loans between programs have a zero net effect on the Statement of Assets, Liabilities and Net Assets – Modified Cash Basis and have been eliminated. In addition, transfers between programs have a zero net effect on the Statement of Support, Revenue and Expenses – Modified Cash Basis and have been eliminated.

NOTE 2 – CONCENTRATION OF CREDIT RISK

The District maintains multiple accounts at various financial institutions. Accounts at these institutions are insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC). As of April 30, 2011, total cash at one institution exceeded FDIC limits in the amount of \$2,123.96.

NOTE 3 – INVESTMENTS

Investments are stated at fair value and consist of mutual funds. Fair values as of April 30, 2011 are summarized as follows:
