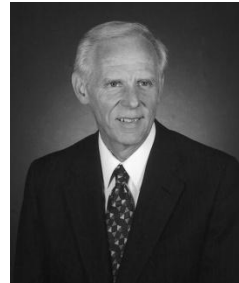

B. INSTRUCTIONS TO STUDENTS

Eligibility

The board serves only the persons who are properly enrolled. Enrollment is open only to local preachers, deacons-Christian education, deacons-compassionate ministries, deacons-music ministries, and prospective ministers of music who qualify according to the Manual, 410.

Courses

There are seven general courses administered by the Ministerial Studies Board; elders, deacon of administration, deacon of compassionate ministries, deacon of Christian education, deacon of music, deacon of youth, and lay minister (*Handbook of Ministerial Studies*).

Ministers, deacons and deaconesses will not be ordained without having completed their respective courses. An exception to this is provided for all commissioned song evangelists who held this status immediately prior to the 1986 assembly season. Those becoming commissioned song evangelists will complete the deacon track in music ministries. Those interested in commissioned or registered song evangelists' credentials should study carefully all requirements as listed in *Handbook on Ministerial Studies*, 446, "The Song Evangelist."

Modes of Study

The options for the course of study are listed below (by preference) as recommended and approved by the Illinois District Ministerial Studies Board.

1. A Nazarene university or an accredited university, pursuing a degree in a religious field of study.

2. Nazarene Theological Seminary.
3. Nazarene Bible College or NBC Ministry Preparation Program.
4. Northwest Nazarene University Online Module Courses
5. Nazarene Bible College: NBC Track.

The Course of Study is under the immediate supervision of the District Board of Ministerial Studies. Students are advised to pursue preparation or ordination by selecting one of the above-mentioned modes of study. Each student is assigned an advisor to work with in establishing a plan of study.

The courses required of college students are in the Manual, 424.3. The competency statements for ministerial education are listed in Manual, 424.3. All college and university programs must meet these competency statements for course of study.

C. REGULATIONS FOR MINISTERIAL COURSE OF STUDY

1. It is no longer necessary for students to purchase the *Sourcebook for Ministerial Development*. This information and more can now be found on the Clergy Education website (<http://nazarenepastor.org/clergyeducation/>) A Candidate Handbook can be downloaded for free from [http://www.nazarenepastor.org/Clergy Education/LinkClick.aspx?link=Resources%2fUSAHB.pdf&tabid=74&mid=501](http://www.nazarenepastor.org/ClergyEducation/LinkClick.aspx?link=Resources%2fUSAHB.pdf&tabid=74&mid=501).

2. Each student is encouraged to take four courses each year. The general church requires 2 courses per year to be passed, to allow a student to continue. After the district license is granted to the student, only ten years is allowed to complete the 24 required courses, Manual 427.4. At 2 per year, the student will not succeed. Thus, the Illinois District has chosen to encourage students to complete 4 courses per year. All course work must be completed by the end of the assembly year (April) in order for the student to receive credit for that assembly year. The only exception is for those students enrolled in an institution of higher learning in which the class may not conclude until the board meets in May.

3. A student is placed in a study level based on the number of courses completed regardless of the level of the courses. The only exception is that the course on the Manual of the Church of the Nazarene must be completed before level one is considered complete (unless the student is enrolled in a religion program at a Nazarene institution) and before the student is eligible for a district license.

4. The secretary may not enroll anyone except by written letter from the applicant to include the following information: name (first, middle and last); address; telephone number; e-mail address; course of study desired; church where current membership is held; letter of recommendation from the church pastor where membership is held; copy of local license granted by that church; and official transcripts from colleges or other schools beyond high school. It will be the obligation of the student to see that all the information is sent to the secretary. An application form will be made available for anyone expressing interest in enrolling with the Board of Ministerial Studies.

5. Prior to being issued a graduation certificate, all students must be reviewed by the Ministerial Studies Board. The only exceptions are Nazarene Bible College graduates of the Bible Studies Course who are immediately issued a graduation certificate. No student will be graduated from the course of study without completing an internship program.

6. When a student moves to another district, the secretary of the Ministerial Board should transfer the student's records to the new district by contacting the secretary of that district's Board of Ministerial Studies. Students are strongly advised to keep copies of course record sheets and final grades. The District is not responsible for loss of data when transferring to another district.

7. Candidates should be prepared to appear annually before the Board of Ministerial

Studies. These meetings will be scheduled by the district office and notification of the meetings will be sent to you.

8. Files for inactive students will be maintained by the Board of Ministerial Studies for no longer than 10 years.

9. Students are required to keep an active e-mail account while enrolled in the course of study.

College Students

College students are responsible to submit to the board documentary evidence of academic standing in harmony with *Manual*, 427.1, 427.4.

College students are reminded to plan their curriculum in harmony with *Manual*, 424.1 and 424.3. Yearly updates should be submitted to the secretary of the Board of Ministerial Studies. The Board of Ministerial Studies will evaluate the final transcript at graduation, and no requirements stated in the *Manual* will be waived.

D. CONTINUING EDUCATION

“Once a minister has fulfilled the expectations of the educational foundations for ministry, he or she will continue a pattern of lifelong learning to enhance the ministry of which God has called him or her. A minimum expectation is 20 contact hours each year (2 accredited continuing education units (CEU’s) (*Manual* 424.6).

In order to facilitate the fulfillment of this requirement, a number of qualified events will be promoted through the district and by other means. An individual may receive CEU’s by participating in a qualified event sponsored by the district, the general church, one of our colleges or universities or other approved method. When CEU’s are available for a sponsored event, notification of the same will be made at the event and the participants will have the opportunity to sign up for credits. Credits will be based upon the participant attending the entire event and fulfilling other requirements (if applicable) for the event (such as extra reading or writing when appropriate). In all cases, it is the individual participant’s responsibility to qualify him or herself for CEU credits.

The Board of Ministerial Studies appoints a continuing education director who shall be responsible to facilitate CEU qualified events and to resource individuals in obtaining CEU credits for events attended. Individuals may also contact the Department of Clergy Development directly with questions or for qualifying and awarding CEU credits for courses taken. All determination of CEU qualifications shall be made by the Office of Ministry. All records of CEU’s obtained shall be retained by the Department of Clergy Development and by the individual himself/herself. Courses taken for degree programs are not eligible for CEU credit.

Dr. Spruce welcomed the crowd to the first service of this convention and introduced guests: Dr. and Mrs. J.K. Warrick, Miss Sarah Spruce, Dr. John Bowling, Dr. Brian Allen, Tony Fightmaster and other guests to the congregation. Mrs. Warrick was presented a beautiful corsage.

Dr. Spruce gave special thanks to the District Staff, Rev. Douglas Haynes, Rev. Mark Copley and Mr. William Shotts for their work this past year. He thanked the District Advisory Board and gave special thanks to the Decatur First Church Staff and Rev. Tim Crump for all their work during this Campmeeting week.

Dr. Warrick called the 69th Annual Illinois District Assembly to order. The worship service began with more encouraging music from the Olivetians. Dr. Warrick recalled the excellent testimony from Dr. George Reader in the afternoon session of the combined NYI, NMI, SDMI this day. Dr. Reader is celebrating his 80 year of ordination as an Elder in the Church of the Nazarene and will celebrating his 106th birthday in the fall.

Dr. Warrick then introduced Dr. James Spruce to the convention for this 9th report to the Illinois District Church of the Nazarene. Dr. Spruce gave a challenging report which was received with a standing ovation. Mrs. Spruce was escorted to the platform. They were presented a check from the district by treasurer Mr. Bill Shotts and flowers were presented to Mrs. Spruce. Mrs. Spruce thanked the district for their love and support to them.

Rev. Greg Wooten gave announcements and took the evening offering. The evening session was closed in prayer.

Morning Session, July 12, 2012

The Olivetians opened the morning session with exciting music to set the tone for the day. Dr. Spruce opened the session with prayer.

Dr. Warrick brought greetings from Nazarenes all over the world and giving updates on current happenings in the general church: 400 people today will be converted. Using scripture Matthew 25:14-30 he talked about the kingdom of heaven is a kingdom of opportunity, a kingdom of responsibility and a kingdom of accountability.

Dr. Warrick then called to order the 69th Annual Illinois District Assembly.

Organization information was read by District Secretary Rev. Douglas Haynes as printed in the delegate handbook.

Dr. Warrick asked new delegates to stand and they were welcomed to the assembly.

The Ministerial Credentials Board Report #1, #2 and Final Report was read by Rev. Jay Shoff. After a motion and second, this report was adopted.

Those being ordained were asked to stand and were applauded.

The Nominating Committee report was called for and looked at. This report was accepted. Tellers were called to distribute the ballot for District Officers and ONU Trustees. This ballot was taken and ballots collected by tellers and Rev. John Connett, chairman.

The Nominating Ballot for Elder Delegates to the 2013 General Assembly was distributed and collected by tellers and Rev. David Sorensen, chairman.

The Nominating Ballot for Laymen Delegates to the 2013 General Assembly was distributed and collected by tellers and Rev. Tim Mundy, chairman.

After all ballots had been cast all tellers and chairmen were dismissed to tally ballots.

The Nazarene Foundation video was shown. Dr. Kenneth Roney, foundation president was welcomed and brought greetings and information.

Rev. Gary Clark, pastor and newly charter members for the newly established Harrisburg Oasis Church were welcomed and brought to the front of the sanctuary. A charter organization plaque was read by Dr. Spruce and Dr. Warrick presented it to Rev. Clark who told some inspiring stories about this new work. Dr. Warrick prayed for this new congregation.

Several Pastors that would be reporting were called to the front and gave inspiring updates from their congregations: Rev. Tim Young, Granite City CTM, Rev. Gary Clark, Harrisburg Oasis and Rev. Wayne Clevenger, Urbana Lighthouse. Rev. Craig Dillman, Belleville First and Rev. Fred Prince, Springfield First shared stories of their churches and the involvement in their communities with working in neighboring schools, summer lunch programs and mentoring programs. Rev. Wayne LaForce, reported for Quincy Emmanuel Church.

Ballot results for District Officers were read: 255 ballots cast. District Advisory Board – Ministers: Waldo Perek-Lopez 117, Lawrence Lacher 136. Laypersons: Fred Ruzich 113, Sandy Stickler 139. The chair declared the following elected: Lawrence Lacher and Sandy Stickler. Trustee to Olivet Nazarene University: Lead Pastor - Lawrence Lacher 107, Jim Frye 145. Layperson - Galen Scammahorn 134, Jim German 120. The chair declared the following elected: Jim Frye and Galen Scammahorn.

The Board of Ministerial Studies Report was looked at and was received.

The Christian Cultural Engagement Report was highlighted and this report was received

The Finance Committee Report was called for. Mr. William Shotts, chairman, highlighted this report which was in the delegate packet. This report was received by a lifting of hands

Mr. Shotts also highlighted the Treasurer's report which was printed in the delegate handout book. There was a motion to receive this report, a second and this report was received.

It was noted that the Audit Report was listed in the delegate handbook. This report was received.

The Ministerial Staff Report was highlighted and encouraged by Dr. Warrick for the delegates to read and follow these guidelines in their churches. Those willing to participate were asked to stand.

The Nominating Ballot results for Lay Delegates to the General Assembly were read:

255 ballots cast, 1 spoiled ballot. Nine to be elected for the elective ballot: Lynne Dillman 62, Bill Freesmeyer 54, Rachel Donoho 76, Becky Lonberger 130, Herman J. Wallace 49, Cindy Jess 63, Lisa Lacher 86, Pat Unger 75, Nina Haynes 181, William E. Shotts 155, Cindy Crump 151, Galen Scammahorn 125, Judi Roarick 149, Jim German 133, Debbie Brewer 117, Cleve Curry 62, Sandy Stickler 118, Cindy Frye 167, Laura Mondy 60, Lori Workman 116. The chair declared the following names to be on the Elective Ballot for Lay Delegates to General Assembly: Nina Haynes, Cindy Frye, William E. Shotts, Cindy Crump, Judi Roarick, Jim German, Becky Lonberger, Galen Scammahorn, and Sandy Stickler.

Dr. John Bowling, Dr. Brian Allen and Tony Fightmaster brought greetings from Olivet Nazarene University and reported for the college. The Olivetians after introducing themselves sang "Jesus Never Fails". After a standing ovation, Dr. Warrick requested several other songs as the delegation truly worshiped.

Ushers were placed at the doors of the sanctuary for a special offering to be given to the Olivetians as the delegates left for lunch. There was a prayer of dismissal.

Afternoon Session, July 12, 2012

The Olivetians brought the delegates back together after a lunch break with uplifting music.

The Nominating Ballot results were read for the top six for Ministerial Delegates to the General Assembly: Timothy Crump 55, Douglas Haynes 48, James Blue 41, David Sorensen 33, Jim Frye 33, Lawrence Lacher 29. (See the addendum at the end of this report for complete tally).

Election instructions were given for the next ballot for General Assembly delegates and alternates. Ministerial Delegates – electing two delegates. A motion was made and adopted that the alternates be declared from the remaining nominees in descending order. The ballot was distributed by tellers.

The next ballot for Lay Delegates to the General Assembly was distributed to the delegates. Lay Delegates -- electing three delegates. A motion was made and adopted that the alternates be declared from the remaining nominees in descending order. The ballots were collected and tellers were dismissed to tabulate the votes.

Several more pastors were called to report for their churches: Rev. Ed Heppe, Taylorville First, Rev. Steve Cecil, Decatur West Side and Rev. Gary Williamson, Paris First.

A Nazarene Publishing House Video was shown. Dr. Warrick shared about the process of a new president for NPH and special gifts were presented to all pastors present.

Rev. Kevin Pittman, pastor from Olney reported for his church.

Rev. Mark Copley, District Missionary, presented the Mission Strategy Report and his report as District Missionary. These reports were received by the delegation.

Every ordained minister was asked to stand. The district secretary reported that all ministers had reported to the district. The convention thanked them for their calling. All licensed ministers were asked to stand. The convention gave them a round of applause for their work and encouraged to take care of these ministers.

The Nazarene Compassionate Ministries - a child sponsorship video was shown and Dr. Warrick encouraged everyone to participate if possible.

Ballot results were read:

Ministerial Delegates to the General Assembly – 2 to be elected – plurality vote: Ballots cast 191, 2 spoiled ballots. Timothy Crump 84, Douglas Haynes 89, James Blue 62, David Sorensen 52, Jim Frye 52, Lawrence Lacher 35. The chair declared elected Timothy Crump, Douglas Haynes.

Lay Delegates to the General Assembly – 3 to be elected – plurality vote: Ballots cast 202, 1 spoiled ballot, Nina Haynes 82, Cindy Frye 69, William E. Shotts 77, Cindy Crump 75, Judi Roarick 72, Jim German 61, Becky Lonberger 51, Galen Scammahorn, Sandy Stickler 41. The chair declared elected Nina Haynes, William E. Shotts, Cindy Crump.

The District Advisory Board Church Board Report was called for and highlighted. This report was accepted.

There was a motion to let the district secretary edit and distribute the minutes as needed.

There was a motion to conclude the 69th Annual District Assembly for the Illinois District after the final prayer at the Ordination Service Thursday evening.

Dr. Warrick discussed the Pension and Benefits Program and its future. Retired ministers and spouses present were asked to stand and applauded for their dedication.

Announcements were given by Dr. Spruce. Rev. Douglas Haynes thanked those who had helped make this week possible.

The afternoon session concluded with a Memorial Service. The congregation sang "Great is Thy Faithfulness", Rev. Michael Flowers read scripture as the delegation reflected on those names listed in their bulletin who had gone to their eternal reward this past year. Ms. Joslyn Keathley sang an inspirational song and Rev. Flowers closed this session with prayer.

Thursday Evening, Ordination Service July 12, 2012

Pre-service music was provided by Mr. Randy Miller on the piano. Rev. Wayne LaForce welcomed everyone to this Ordination Service, gave announcements and offered the prayer for the offering.

Rev. Ron Black led the congregation in singing the hymn "The Church's One Foundation". Dr. Spruce read a challenge and introduced newly licensed ministers and their mentors to the congregation: Sharon Authenrieth and mentor Rev. Rita Briggs and Tim Mezera and mentor Rev. James Craig.

Dr. Spruce introduced retiring ministers and their spouses that were present to the congregation: Elders - Rev. K. Lyle and Dee Artman, Rev. Janice Forgach, Rev. Dennis and Jeanie Middleton and Deacon Rev. Doug and Jan Krassow. Dr. Warrick presented them with a plaque and Dr. Spruce presented them with a check from the district.

A Statement of Purpose was presented by Dr. Warrick. The congregation recited the Apostles' Creed led by Dr. Spruce.

Rev. Ron Black led the congregation in singing "Called Unto Holiness" as Rev. Douglas Haynes led the ordinands and their spouses into the sanctuary and presented them to Dr. Warrick: Enrique W. Riofrio, Matthew Ryan Soulia, Wade Alan Stine, Cory Allen Swinderman, Ronald M. Waltrip and Catherine Lee Woolaway.

Dr. Warrick received the ordinands and explained the process and examination for this evening service.

Rev. Rita Briggs read from the *Manual*, pertaining to ordination of persons for ministry. The Ministers choir sang "And Can It Be", directed by Rev. Ron Black. Scriptures were read by Rev. Carl Pinkston and Rev. Waldo Perez and Mrs. Cynthia Barker sang "I Will Not Forget Thee".

After an inspiring message by Dr. Warrick, he called the ordination candidates and their spouses to the platform for the ordination ceremony. The Ordained ministers surrounded these candidates as Dr. Warrick ordained them, followed by a prayer from a special ordained mentor they had chosen. Following the ordination ritual, each newly ordained minister was presented with their ordination certificate and a word of congratulations from Dr. Warrick.

Dr. and Mrs. J. K. Warrick, Dr. and Mrs. James Spruce and Rev. and Mrs. Douglas Haynes led the newly ordinands and elders out of the sanctuary to a reception line and reception for everyone present.

This concluded the 2012 Ordination service and adjourned the 2012 Annual Illinois Church of the Nazarene District Assembly.

V. Reports

A. DISTRICT OFFICERS

1. District Superintendent

Illinois District Superintendent's Report – 2012 "Creating a Culture of Discipleship"

We've had a little trouble with birds flying into our windows at home. Considering the number of birds that get knocked out it must be a shock to the system to be buzzing along at 15 miles per hour and suddenly collide with an unseen reality. The windows are mirrors which reflect the sky, and for a bird the sky is the limit. You'd think that birds would tell their frequent-flyer buddies to avoid Chatham because they might fly into something they just don't see.

People and birds only see a mirror image of themselves. A mirror is reality: a thief would see a thief and a bird, you'd think, would see himself coming. Thus, **to define reality** we look in a mirror because it tells the truth and to avoid the truth is make-believe. I want you to look at our district mirror. The first chart on the screen is a *decadal "plus" summary*, a fifteen year reality review of four major statistics. In 15 years the total raised in millions is up from \$8.2 to \$9.2 million, and membership is down nearly 800 to 8,400. Tragically, worship and Sunday School attendances are both down nearly 1,000 each in that same time period.

The second chart, *"Doing Church above the Mid-line – 2011"*, asks this question: "Was your 2011 worship attendance above, the same as or below your midline or decadal worship average?" It is an unsettling but necessary question as you will see:

- 27 churches (34%) had **more** in worship in 2011 than most years of the last decade
- 48 churches (61%) had **less** in worship in 2011 than most years of the last decade
- 4 churches (5%) had the **same** in worship in 2011 than most years of the last decade
- Churches with worship **loss** exceeded those with worship **gains** at a ratio of nearly 2:1

Other significant statistics reveal that

- 63% of our churches gained one or more new Nazarenes in 2011, and 54% in 2012
- 20% of our churches paid zero on one or more budgets in 2011, but this percent nearly doubled to 39% in 2012. 45 churches paid all budgets in full in 2012, up by one.
- Budget payments are District, 99%; WEF, 116%; Pensions, 110%; ONU, 106%.

Yes to **define** reality we look in a mirror. But to **change** reality we look in our heart and ask, "Is God satisfied with what we see in our church, and if not what are we willing to do about it?" Dad and I stood at the bedside of Mr. King in a nursing home. A stroke had come like a thief in the night and stolen his speech and left him paralyzed. Then we visited Mother Blair, a ninety year old home-bound widow. I was twelve. How could I – let alone my father – have known that I would spend a half-century at the bedsides of the infirm and dying? God was working through *Dad* by doing something formative within *me*, shaping my future one nursing home and house visit at a time.

Being with him, seeing his compassion made me wonder, "What matters to God, anyhow?"

Is it not some lost son or daughter, caught like a sparrow in a hurricane, perhaps bold enough to venture out yet afraid of being done in? Or is it some precious youth – fresh from camp – who has no role model at home? What are we, mature in faith, to make of our duty in making Christlike disciples in the nations – the nations that live right down the street or next door?

My appeal tonight is to consider and reconsider what faithful disciples do to change

reality.

1ST – Disciplers Pray

God responds to prayer – there was Hannah’s prayer for a son and Elijah’s prayer for a fire.

But badly needed today is a new hunger for God. He is desperate for us to lay aside our agenda and confess our indifference. I must ask God, “What breaks your heart Father that should also break mine?” Prayer begins with personal renewal as in the heart of this pastor: “I heard God ask me through Mark Murphy at the Pastor’s Retreat, ‘What do you want?’ I answered honestly, ‘If I could be really sold out to you, where you mattered most to me, I would not ask for anything else.’”

“I was as real as I knew how to be with God, but I left the service with no relief. I went back to my room and prayed until after midnight. I woke often in the night and I would get on my knees and pray that God would become greater and I would become lesser in my own eyes. The next morning I still felt no change in my heart or spirit, but during my devotions I realized that I was thanking God for what he had done for me. I knew above all else Jesus was the most important thing in my life. I was excited!”

But corporate prayer with fasting must occur in our churches, too. Before I went to grade school I remember fervent public praying at the altar of Kansas City’s Quindarro Boulevard Church. Later as a youth I remember the sheer volume of loud praying following the men’s fish dinners in Texarkana. My sister and I will never forget the thirty teens who prayed aloud together around the altar on Saturday nights in Canton.

True enough, we know that the value of corporate prayer is not in decibel or length but in the mutual expressions of intercession, praise and brokenness before God. Those who have attended the remarkable revivals with Dan Bohi realize that the revivals are not about Dan but about the work of God through prayer. Does *your* church have a time when people meet *only to pray*? No, we are not totally prayerless. But we are badly preoccupied.

You’ve heard about the District Prayer Encounter August 1 – 3 at Springfield First with Corey Jones and Maria Durso. But hearing about it is not the same thing as being there.

Despite your busyness why don’t you just come and see for yourself what God will do? Something happens in the water at baptism. Something happens in a group at prayer.

“Though we strive to be a praying church,” another pastor wrote, at times we still struggle for it to be the very center of all we do. We felt led to focus on making disciples who will make disciples, and we are experiencing some of the fruit of concentrated prayer and seeking God.

Sinners are being won to Christ, others are returning to God and renewing their commitments and people are excited to disciple others and be disciplined themselves.”

My paternal grandfather, thin as a rail, was a dairy farmer and a Methodist circuit rider in south Texas. Upon reading a book of Wesley’s sermons he found in a pulpit, he was sanctified and began preaching the sermons to his churches. When the bishop kicked him out he and his family discovered a church in San Antonio that was ardent about holiness – the Church of the Nazarene. For the next fifty years Grandfather gave his mind to Wesleyan theology and his heart to the new, passionate and emerging church that is now in your custody.

He was a man of few words except when he testified in church. Grandmother often pulled on his coat tail to encourage brevity but to little avail. Family devotions included scripture reading, exhortations and passionate praying before meals. His prayers were not for the food, which was cold before he finished, but for each of us by name – all twenty of us in the room. Grandfather was a discipler who prayed before any of us knew what a discipler was. Prayer was his legacy.

So **first, disciplers pray**, and they want their churches to become houses of prayer.

2ND – Disciplers Coach

Our two middle-school age grandsons CJ and Jacks follow the Pittsburgh Steelers and New York Jets. Being from Florida, Jacks especially admires Tim Tebow, an unshamed

Christian now Jets. Kids at that age have their heroes and heroes have their followers. Even non-churched people want *good examples* both on and off the field. The bar for what it takes to be a good example is refreshingly high among many not normally noted for their piety. A disciple is a faithful *follower* of Jesus Christ. It sounds counter-intuitive – against natural reason – but an authentic discipler leads or coaches by *following*. Any good quarterback *follows* the instruction of his coach, and in so doing becomes a *leader* on the field among his teammates – and a million youth who see him on TV and strive to copy him. Paul said, “Follow my example as I follow the example of Christ” (1Cor. 11:1).

“First of all,” he said, “be good men and women. We do not remember so much what you say as what you do. *You should say ‘follow me as I have followed Christ.’* I am interested in the work in which you are called; the church depends upon your ministry. People can become members of the Nazarene church whether they are sanctified or not, just so they believe in the second work of grace, but our preachers must be sanctified.” The words were spoken by Dr. J. B. Chapman at the Chicago Central District assembly in 1932. Indeed, it was part of the sermon Dr. Chapman preached at the ordination service in which one of the young ordinands was Rev. George H.D. Reader.

Tonight and tomorrow we celebrate the 69th Illinois District assembly, but it happens to be the 80th anniversary of the ordination of Rev. Reader who will be honored with a commemorative citation tomorrow. “*We do not remember so much what you say as what you do*” – prophetic words for a man of God who has mentored generations of preachers on our district. We salute you, Rev. Reader, for the example you are – at 106 this September. You are a testimony that we must first *be* disciples in order to *make* disciples. We cannot *do* unless we *are*. You’ve led us by your finest example – how you follow Christ. Robert Greenleaf wrote, “Everyone, at some time and in some areas, is a follower, and it is just as important to be discriminating in choosing who to follow as it is to prepare to lead.”

Pray for the four pastors who will soon travel to Cali, Colombia where they will learn by following the example of intercessory prayer that leads to evangelism, discipleship and the training of leaders in our church there. Twenty-five years ago a dozen people asked God how to reach their city that was under the dark shadow of drug cartels. The rest is history. Today 14,000 worship in eight Sunday services. So disciplers **pray** and **coach**; they lead by following Jesus.

3RD – Disciplers Connect

A few weeks ago at Salem Grace I saw about 70 teens in purple T-shirts sitting as a group in church. Something was up. They had spent the better part of a week doing volunteer work in homes in 100 degree weather. The videoed testimonies of people whose homes were repaired were compelling. It was Youth Invasion 2012 for Grace Church. For many years we said, “We are a holy people separate from this pagan world. Come and join us.” Wesley never intended that to be our style. He engaged with coal miners and the poor outside the walls of the church. He pondered, “How do I get my hands dirty in this world – my parish?” You’ll love the slogan at Salem: “Invading a neighborhood near you.”

Tomorrow we’ll celebrate reports from pastors including two that have established great relationships with public schools – imagine that – in a day when churches are often marginalized from the larger secular culture. Eleven district licensed ministers meet regularly with mentors who coach them. This new effort led by Larry Lacher and the Credential’s team is a fresh way of offering accountability, personal contact and prayer. Two classes annually are required for all seeking ordination and new beginning pastors.

For nearly a year DSs from many holiness denominations in Illinois and Missouri have met as part of the nationwide Wesleyan Holiness Consortium. We desire connectional relationship among all holiness pastors in an informal, conversational setting. Pastors are strongly urged to be present to hear George Barna and Kevin Mannoia on “Wesleyan Holiness Pastor’s Day” October 30 in St. Louis. You will connect with non-Nazarene holiness pastors. There really are such people! Your lunch will be free! Connection is important.

Tim Young's work at Granite City is all about connectional relationship. Over 30 unchurched but open-to-the-Gospel people are connected. They meet in restaurants; several new converts have been baptized. People in Nazarene organic churches all over the U.S. are giving money to missions, reading an average of twenty-five chapters of the Bible a week and submitting to questions in Life-Transformation Groups similar to Wesley's approach. Let us love, pray hard and trust in the new ways that God is at work in our day. And congratulations to Mark Copley who was selected as the new director of the Nazarene Organic Church Network following Darrell MacLearn in that position.

But Hance at Bethel began last year with three children in church. He writes, "In order for Bethel, being in the country, to reach children we must go to them and bring them in. My Mom and others began door-to-door calling on two to three homes a week. She took a loaf of banana bread and met parents face-to-face. We are now bringing in 35 – 40 children each Wednesday." Calling – how old is that? New faces – how good is *that!*

Tomorrow we will celebrate the official organization of Harrisburg Oasis Community with pastor Gary Clark and 40 new members. Gary and Oasis have labored four years in connectional relationship to this day.

The authenticity of connectional relationship is found in sacrifice, not fantasy. So it is that Sir Lancelot, Guinevere and the Knights of the Roundtable are not the *real* heroes. Instead, Rev. William Shotts, having recently joined the cloud of witnesses, and our retired ministers on their modest pension are the noble, the true, the brave. Yet due to severe economic shortfall, Pensions and Benefits USA has recently predicted an inability to fund retirees by 2023. Something would have to be done now to prepare for then.

The General Board asked Nazarene university presidents in USA/Canada, "Would you allow us to **reduce** the budget local churches give you by .25% so that we can **increase** the Pensions budget by .25% annually until 2023?" One-fourth of one percent may not sound like much to you, but to Olivet it amounts to about \$250,000 annually across the region and \$1.15 million annually when combined with all other economic downturns. The university presidents said, "Our colleges exist for the denomination we serve. Our retired pastors paid money to attend their church college when they were *young*. How can we as Nazarene universities *not* support them now that they're *old*? *We're all in this together.*"

Dr. Bowling said, "Our *retired* pastors matter to us. We're connected to them." Can the Illinois District team say, "Our *students* matter to us – we're connected to *them* even if they are not from our church!" You'll remember that your educational budget dollars go *only* to student tuition.

I have a question: "Should the sacrifice made by our university presidents to support our retired ministers in this terrible economy be at the expense of our youth who need to go to Olivet?"

In a small church in Nebraska years ago a board member said, "We don't pay our college budget because none of our students ever go to college." I asked, "Do you pay your pensions budget for your pastor? "O no," he said, "because none of our pastors ever live to retirement."

Reasoning that this was a conversation that was headed south, I figured it would be unwarranted on my part to ask about the longevity of superintendents. The logic that carries a church from lack of mission to indifference, is the same logic that carries them from ignorance to bliss. The redeeming virtue of any church is a mission that remembers others. Since we are *in this together* the District Advisory Board voted to keep the District Budget Multiplier at 5.65%, with .15% going to ONU, which will amount to \$12,000 annually from the Illinois District. Let us be connected by love, not mere obligation.

The "Bare Minimum Goals and Love Maximum Questions" in your delegate packet is a reminder that every church must live in connectional relationship with its community. The goals are according to church worship size; create your own if these don't fit. The questions are conversation starters about connecting with our culture. Smokey the Bear used to say, "Only you can prevent forest fires." Likewise, only you can vote in favor of your church's future.

I've had the honor of being in the homes of Rev. Reader and Rev. Shotts. Bro. Reader fell, hit his head and had to have surgery – when he was a young man of 104. And it was just a few weeks ago, on a good day for Bro. Shotts, when I sat in his living room and reminisced with him about the days of old when he labored so long and served so well.

Though little famed, these men will be remembered for deep personal piety and prayer. The difference they made was in what they left behind – commitment to scripture, passion for revival, unashamed loyalty to a church and her mission.

They preached out of a life as well as out of a text. You got the feeling, being around them, that if the Church of the Nazarene ever lost its grip on holy zeal then its days would be numbered. So there they were – Bro. Reader, hardly able to hear, and Bro. Shotts barely able to stand. And yet in their presence, almost like it was when I was a lad of twelve in Texarkana at the bedsides of Mr. King and Mother Blair, something transformational occurred in me.

For whether by the fresh face of youth in their dawn or through the eyes of old men who can see far down the mountain, let none of us be casual bystanders to opportunity. Instead let us be partners in sacrifice for young and old alike. Then with Zechariah we may affirm that it is not by might nor by power but by his Spirit that we please our God and disciple his people.

2. Mission Strategy Director

Members and friends of the District Assembly, it is my privilege to present to you my fifth report as Mission Strategy Director. I want to begin by expressing my gratitude to my partners in leadership: Thank you Dr. Spruce, for your support and wise counsel. Thank you Doug Haynes for your excellent work, and patience. Thanks especially to those who served with me on the District Mission Strategy Team with me this year: Philip Alvord, Kevin Donoho, Allen Ebblor, Les Wilhelm, Rita Briggs, James Craig, Will Haworth, Timothy Mondy, and Tim Young, Jr. Your passion, faithfulness, and wisdom amaze me.

I'd like to begin by restating our twofold commitment to church health, and church multiplication. Recently, the Mission Strategy Team met to reconsider our goals and strategy for accomplishing our mission *"To develop healthy, multiplying, holiness churches and pastors."* In regard to promoting church health, here's what we determined:

1. While there is great value in churches developing a "written strategic action plan," the process that we have called "Refocus" takes too long, is often too expensive, and too vague for many of our churches to consider. We propose a much more practical approach that focuses on church health, rather than long term planning.
2. We propose, instead *"To encourage every church toward church health one step at a time."*
3. This process would begin with administering the Church Health Survey, measuring the church's health using the eight key characteristics (*Empowering leadership, Gift-oriented ministry, Passionate spirituality, Functional structures, Inspiring worship service, Holistic small groups, Need-oriented evangelism, and Loving relationships*).
4. Our response then would be to follow up with training and coaching, aimed at strengthening the church's weakest area of health. The Mission Strategy Director, along with the members of the Mission Strategy Team, would serve as coaches and trainers to assist pastors as they work together to improve in their weakest characteristic.
5. The process would continue with each characteristic, in ascending order, and will be measured with periodic reevaluation using the survey.

We believe that this process offers a more practical, and timely solution to churches who want to assess their present health, and respond in ways that will promote health, growth, and ultimately multiplication. Churches would also have the option of a full church assessment should they want a more comprehensive picture.

We propose to resource this approach by offering assistance to make the Church Health Survey affordable for every church, and by providing training and coaching for little or no expense. Today you can sign up to begin this process at our table here at the Assembly.

Concerning, church multiplication and church planting; I'd like to remind you that we believe that it takes all kinds of churches to reach all kinds of people. The process of church planting is a difficult one, and those who are called to do so face many trials. The work is tedious, and the Lord often chooses to move much slower than we would like. But it is his church that he is building and not ours, and the timing is in his hands. Those who are planting or who have planted churches on our District are heroes: People like Brian Trambley, Tim Young, Jr., Bill Brandon, Willard Anderson, and Nick Briggs know what I'm talking about. There can be long seasons of sowing, and nurturing, and waiting for a harvest that seems afar off.

Two other heroes whose work I'd like to highlight include Gary Clark at Harrisburg Oasis, and Wayne Clevenger at Urbana Lighthouse. Neither of these churches has sprung up in a day. But I think that is what has added to their strength, because of their slow growing approach, they have formed deeper roots and fellowship, and proved their durability through many storms and trials, some of them literally.

The Urbana church started in 2005 when Wayne and Karen Clevenger made the decision to fully commit to God's call to plant there. Wayne quit his job and began devoting himself full time to the vision. For several years they met in a rented basement of an insurance office. Growth was slow, but steady, and by using Upward Basketball, they began to meet the needs of many children and families in the area. The basement was full. Pastor Wayne challenged church members to seek God, give, and believe for a facility that would allow further growth and expansion of ministries. This year, those prayers were answered as God miraculously provided such a space: Ten thousand, square feet (3x the size of the basement) but at the same rental price that they had been paying. Now, they have fellowship rooms, a huge nursery, and several rooms for Sunday school. Attendance now regularly averages in the 80s and new ministries are being created to meet the needs of their community there, not just on Sundays, but throughout the week.

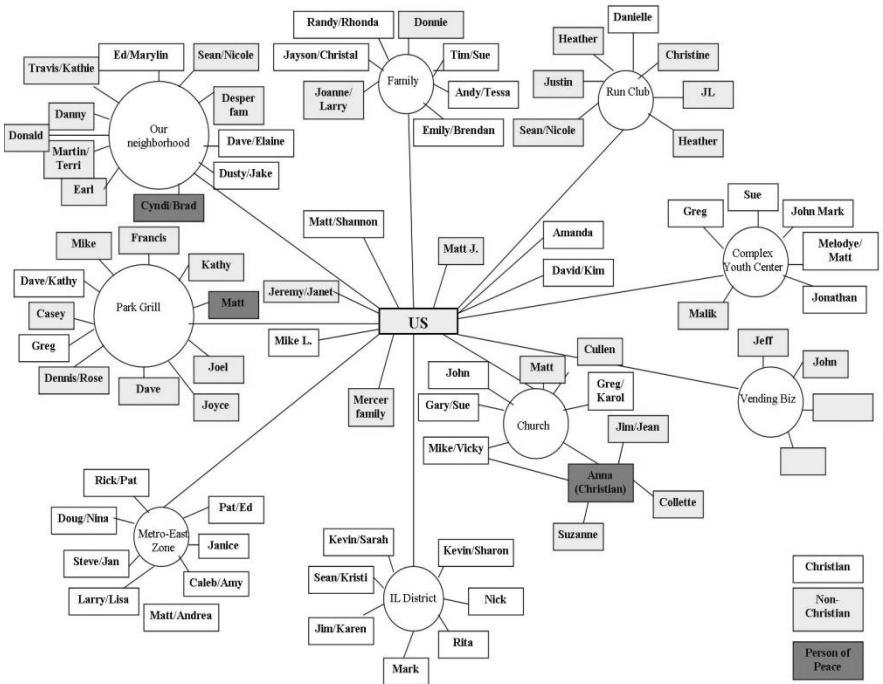
The congregation, we now call Harrisburg Oasis began meeting with Gary and Peggy Clark in a Seventh Day Adventist facility in Marion back in 2007. The district had recently closed the church in Harrisburg, leaving a building in disrepair, with water damage, and an unused, unfinished gymnasium. After several months of praying, Pastor Clark agreed to move the Marion congregation to Harrisburg to inhabit the old facility. Their first Sunday there was in June of 2010.

What has happened since then can only be described as a "resurrection story." The facilities, once damaged, have been healed, remodeled, and vastly improved. One would almost describe the results as a "Total Church Makeover". All the water damage has been repaired, new carpet and furniture now greets guests in the lobby, and the gym has been transformed into a beautiful sanctuary, seating over 300, with a state of the art sound system. New people are visiting the congregation regularly to worship and to find Christ. Some have found salvation or sanctification, been delivered from drugs, teenagers have been saved, marriages healed, and the word of God is spreading.

But the work of the Harrisburg church goes beyond the walls of their remodeled facility. As you know, on February 29th, the Harrisburg town was hit by a devastating tornado. Several lives were lost, and many homes were destroyed. Though neither the church building nor members of the congregation were directly affected, the people of the church sprang to action to serve their hurting neighbors.

Pastor Clark worked closely with Operation Blessing and other area churches to coordinate response efforts. Oasis Community hosted volunteers from several churches on our District. Church members from Decatur First, Decatur Parkway, Royalton, Marshall, Casey, and Salem were housed and/or fed by the church. Leaders from Operation Blessing, and four of the insurance adjusters (who used the church building for office space) worshiped with the congregation while they were there. The Oasis Community served as a witness to them all, and through their compassionate service, represented the "living water" of Christ, amidst the wilderness-like aftermath of the storm. They have lived up to their name, an Oasis indeed.

Our experiments with organic church planting are also encouraging. Nick Briggs continues to persevere in Vandalia, and we have the beginnings of a house church in the Casey area. Most notably, Tim Young, Jr. continues to build relationships and make disciples in Granite City. In this unconventional kind of church we struggle to define what success looks like. Once you stop counting the people who attend a building on Sunday morning, what do you count? We count discipling relationships. The chart below reflects the network of relationships that Tim and Andrea have formed in Granite City since moving here from Texas almost two years ago. Thirty-six of these relationships are with non-Christians, three of them involve those who have been baptized as new Christians during that time, and three of them are "persons of peace" – hosts who have opened their lives to the possibility of forming a new church. Please pray for Tim and Andrea, and the work of all of these church planters.



I also want to mention the work of Rita Briggs in forming a Task Force in Jacksonville, who are praying and asking God for a new church plant in Jacksonville. Rita has a strong vision and is willing to see her vision through with tireless work and prayers. Thanks to those who are helping her to do so. We pray that by next assembly, we will have news for you about a new church being established in Jacksonville.

I continue to pray and meet with others interested in a new church in Effingham. A local coffee shop has become our meeting place and our group has expanded to three. Together, we have conversations, share the scriptures, and look for Jesus in the faces of the folks there. Perhaps Christ will build his church among them.

I should also mention the excellent new compassionate ministries work, The Master's Hands, in Olney, led by Willard Anderson. This little building, just on the other side of the tracks, has become a place where folks are fed, encouraged, and taught about Jesus regularly. It joins our Washington Park, and Decatur ministries as excellent examples of being the hands and feet of Jesus in needy communities on our District.

What about you, your church, and your part in the mission of the District? How can you become part of a church planting movement in Illinois? Could your church start a new congregation, or a house church in a needy neighborhood? How can you expand outreach in the community you serve, to make more and better disciples from those who are far from God? May Christ the Good Shepherd send us out across our District to do so in the coming year.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT – 2012

Delegates, Council Members, Zone Leaders, Dr. Spruce, Martha Bean, Pastors, honored guests and friends: Greetings in the precious name of our Lord & Savior, Jesus Christ! This is my sixth such report to the Illinois District NMI Convention. This is also our second combined Convention with NYI and SDMI. Though we lose a lot in our past traditional Convention format we gain so much more in saving time and money for so many people beyond NMI. We also get to experience the other Conventions that some of us would have to miss due to time or financial constraints. In these changing times, we are all experiencing changes in our lifestyles and the way we do business. The combined conventions are a way to help us be better stewards of our resources. By being better stewards, we are able to put more time and resources into bringing more of the lost into the Kingdom of God. As we look around, we can see in Matthew 24:32, as Jesus talks about the fig tree, we can see summer is almost here. We do not have much time to save the lost.

Our NMI Quadrennial Theme this year is "To make Christlike disciples in the Nations (globally)". Are we doing that on the Illinois District? I must answer, from where I set, yes, we are doing that. Some of us have been able to travel and minister in other lands and communities. Most of us do that by faithfully supporting the World Evangelism Fund. WEF now supports 737 missionaries in 159 world areas. We are involved with 212 different languages and have literature in 90 of them. We have 33 medical clinics and hospitals and also 183 Compassionate Ministry Centers and 101 Child Development Centers. Thank you so much for your faithful and sacrificial giving to WEF.

This year, the Illinois District raised \$467,111.05 for WEF. The District also raised \$208,403.54 for Mission Specials. Good job Illinois District!

This year, as last year, we have had a glitch in the electronic reporting of the Churches to me for NMI stats. We have 31 Churches reporting qualified to receive the Mission Priority One Award. I know there will be more and I will be issuing certificates to the Churches that fell through the cracks after Convention. This is one category that is only reported to me. Other categories I can get the information by cross reference through other databases especially with the help of our District Secretary Rev. Doug Haynes. That is the case of the Church of Excellence award. We have 38 Churches qualifying for the award. A Church of Excellence is a church that gives at least 5.7% or \$1,500 above 5.5% of current income for WEF.

It is a very unique position to be the NMI district President. If all goes well, no one pays you much attention. If things are not going well, you get a lot of attention. I did not seek this position, but once in it, I have really enjoyed being in a position where you know what is going on. I have been able to network with so many people in the organization, that if something is going on I can make a few phone calls and be brought up to speed and to be in a position to mobilize our resources to take care of or assist in whatever the problem is. You are either part of the solution or part of the problem. It is one of my duties to see that the Illinois District NMI is part of the solution, which we have been and is our intent to continue. This cannot be done by me alone. I do a lot of work but I also do a lot of facilitating and delegating. First and foremost, I could not even begin to do this task without the assistance of my wife Debbie, who I know God providentially put us together over thirty-nine years ago. Though I am the spiritual leader of our family, she has been my mentor, guide and rock especially in the early days and now in these days when clouds are all around us and our whole life style will be changing. She exudes missions, trusts the Lord and loves Him with all of her heart. She does all that while putting up with me. I receive wise council and support from our District Superintendent Dr. Jim Spruce and his wife Karen. I could not put this Convention together without the able assistance, counsel and

support of our District Administrative Assistant Rev. Doug Haynes. Our District Treasurer Bill Shotts, Chris Shotts and their staff are always ready to serve. Our NMI Secretary, Judi Roarick is always poking me with a stick and helps keep my feet to the fire. She does so much behind the scenes work and always with a good spirit and a smile. I am always getting good feed back from missionaries about the Illinois District LINKS and what a good job is being done. Norma Shotts has kept that flowing like a well oiled machine until she retired last year and now her daughter, Pam Stevens has taken over and is continuing the tradition. Pam also serves as our NMI Vice President. This year, we recently lost Rev. Bill Shotts as he went home to be with the Lord. Bill was always a strong supporter of the NMI and was one of the behind the scene forces that was always helping out. Though we know he is celebrating with our Lord, he is missed by all of us and especially his wife Norma, and family. I must say through this trying time, those family members connected with NMI, Pam Stevens and Bill Shotts, have continued doing there NMI duties. Thank you so much. Having lost my father, I know the hole that is in your heart when you cannot pick up the phone and hear his voice. Sandy Stickler is our deputation coordinator and does an excellent job. Her husband, Allen, is always helping NMI. Cindy Frye has done an excellent job as mission call coordinator and has recently became our children and youth coordinator giving the mission call job to Becky Loneberger who is another person on the Council that works tirelessly. Andy Breeden is a full time student at Olivet yet still is on our Council. It is good to have Cathy Haworth on our Council as she has a unique perspective having been a missionary. Our zone coordinators are always pulling their load. My thanks goes out to Becky Loneberger, Debbie Turner, Carlette Wankel, Sandy Stickler, Stu Leach, Delores Barker, Laura Mondy, Jackie Harris, Marylou Reader, Barbara Marshal and Tonya Deal for their work as zone coordinators. Rev. Jim Frye, Cindy's husband, also works tirelessly assisting NMI. Our Global Council Representative, Martha Bean is always just an e-mail or phone call away as is our Global NMI Director Dr. Daniel Ketchum and the staff at NMI Headquarters. Dr. Ketchum and his wife Carol, just called me a couple of days ago checking on me and the status of this Convention. He was leaving for Nairobi to be with our youth at ANU, yet he and Carol took time to call and pray with me.

This year, our Fall Deputation Rally was a great success. Our speaker, Steve Heap, who is serving in Brazil, did a great job. One of the perks of being your DP was to have Steve in our house for a few days. He and his wife Brenda were our missionary hosts on one of the Work & Witness trips I was fortunate to go on several years ago in Brazil. It was so good to catch up with him on everything that has gone on in his area and to find out the work we did is still impacting people for the Lord.

Do you realize decisions we make impact people? This Spring for our Deputation Rally, we had David and Marquita Mosher from Malawi as our speakers. I had never met them before but they have turned into friends that you feel like you have known all of your life. Speaking of impacting others, did you know that Dr. Larry Lacher, pastor at our Roxana Church, after meeting I was fortunate to go on several years ago in Brazil. It was so good to catch up with him on everything that has gone on in his area and to find out the work we did is still impacting people for the Lord.

We have had some setbacks this year. We were not able to pull off the Work & Witness trip planned for APNTS in the Philippines. Rev. Ivan Jess put in many hours of planning and recruiting but we were not able to do it. My thanks to my fellow W&W brother Ivan for the work he did. When I have been the W&W coordinator for the District, I have had trips planned and teams recruited and then something comes up you have to cancel. I know the disappointment Ivan felt.

Speaking of trips, I was allowed to go on a life changing trip with the NMI recently. The

NMI office sent a team to Sri Lanka and India on a Prayer Vision Tour. We flew to Colombo, Sri Lanka on March 7, 2012. Sri Lanka is a large island off the Southeast coast of India. Sri Lanka is a major supplier of tea and cinnamon for the world. After spending a day or two in Colombo touring medical and child development centers, we took a third world train ride of about five hours up into the mountains to Hatton where we stayed on a tea plantation at a Compassionate Ministry Center. While at the center, we were able to watch the men as they take care of the fields and tea bushes while the women spend long hours harvesting the tea.

On the evening of the 12th, after touring a child development center, our group went up a neighboring mountain with a Jesus Film team to a village to show the film. It looked like it was going to rain. We in the group were praying the rain would hold off as we thought if it rained the people would leave the showing as it was in the open air. We also did not want to get wet as most of us were not prepared for the rain. The screen had been set up between an electrical pole and a large bamboo rod in the village square. The projector was covered with a small tarp. When the movie started, more people came out of the houses to see what the sound was. As the movie was playing a light rain started. By the time Jesus was put on the cross, it was a steady heavy "farmers soaker" rain. I did not see anyone leave. The film was in the Tamil language. As Jesus was on the cross, we heard one of the local ladies say something to the crowd that we did not find out what she said until later. After the movie ended, about seventy-six people came forward to the front. Unknown to us, this village had not had rain for over three months. The film was being shown in the shadows of the local temple. The local priests and followers of the traditional religion had been praying, making sacrifices, wailing and crying out for rain the last several weeks. What the village lady had said was "It is the healing rain from Jesus!" I reflected back that we were praying for the rain to hold off until after the film so no one would leave and we would not get wet. I didn't see one person leave and we dried pretty quickly. I imagine God smiled at our prayer knowing what He had planned was much better than what we thought we wanted. God is so good! God can use what we see as adversity for His good. I am seeing that in my personal life. I personally have been holding on to Psalm 112:7 "He will have no fear of bad news; his heart is steadfast, trusting in the Lord."

We had local pastors and others with us on this trip. We were told the local people really like to be with us as they have very little meat in their diets and when they are with us they get meat twice a day. Most people do not own personal motorized transportation. If they do it is usually a small motorcycle or scooter. It is normal to see a man on a small motorcycle with a small child in front of him, a small child behind him, a woman sidesaddle wearing a dress behind that child and holding an infant tightly with one arm. One pastor was showing me his motorcycle of which he was very proud. I told him I had not seen a motorcycle over 250cc since I arrived in Lanka. He informed me the national law limited motorcycles to 250cc. He told me his was a 150 cc. He asked me if I rode a motorcycle and I told him I did. He asked me how many cc's my bike was. When I told him 1832cc he went from a smile to astonishment. He then said, "It must be enormous!" I told him his bike was perfect for the roads and conditions in his area as the big bikes would be hard to operate in his area.

After spending time in Hatton, we took the train back to Colombo and stayed at a CDC until we flew to Chennai, India, and then on to Kolkata (Calcutta). In Kolkata we stayed at the Seva Kendra Calcutta Training Centre which is a religious conference center started by Mother Teresa. The bus ride to the Centre is an eye opener as we see a very modern city intermixed with disrepair and ghetto appearances. Obviously homeless people are everywhere ranging in age from the very young to the very old. Filth, trash, crowds and congested traffic are everywhere.

Our rooms at the Centre are very nice but very spartan. Each room has a private bath. We find out most of the local people do not have running water and if they do it is unusual for them to have hot water. The private bath has a shower with hot water and no mixer so the water is scalding hot. The Centre is very proud of the hot water. We find out you run the

hot water from the shower into a wash tub and then pour in cold water with another bucket from a different faucet until you get the desired temperature. You then use a pitcher to pour the water on you. Works really good, once you get the hang of it.

While in Calcutta, we visited two of Mother Teresa's orphanages, the Mother House and her tomb. While there, we speak to some of the Sisters who actually worked with Mother Teresa. Mother Teresa is someone that impacted people for the Lord. Who knows, maybe someone we impact for the Lord will become the next Mother Teresa or Billy Graham. God knows. He does not call us to be successful. He calls us to be faithful and obedient. If we are then, no matter what people say, we are successful.

Marji Lonberger left December 8, 2011 to teach English at Korea Nazarene University. She is the daughter of Rev. Carlos and Becky Lonberger. We have watched Marji grow up. When the Convention was at Nazarene Acres, she spent many hours assisting NMI with her father operating the computer and electronic systems. Someone certainly impacted her and now she is impacting others in Korea. Good job Illinois District!

This has been a very interesting year. May 8th, I was diagnosed with having a broken pelvis. This started a whole series of medical tests that ended with a diagnosis on June 20th. Dr. Greenberg informed me I had Chondrosarcoma bone cancer in the pelvis. It has progressed to the point the left half of my pelvis will have to be removed. My left leg will not be weight bearing after the surgery. I am already impacting others with this diagnosis. The doctor and medical staff have told me I am not reacting as most people do. Since I belong totally to the Lord I am holding on to Jeremiah 29:11 "For I know the plans I have for you, declares the Lord, plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future." Surgery is scheduled for August 7th. Although, I am not looking forward to this surgery and the life changing results, I am very excited to see how the Lord is going to use me in ministry. I am used to leading the charge and standing in the gap. After surgery, I will have to step back and let someone else be in front, but it is my intent that I will allow myself to be used by the Lord however He sees fit to impact others for Him. Matthew 9:37 tells us, "The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few." I intend to remain as one of His workers.

As I conclude this report, I must tell you I still consider it an honor to serve the Illinois District as the Missionary President. Please remember that the missionary field is not only in other countries, it is right here with us and we must be impacting others for Him.

Never give up, never surrender (except to the Lord)!

4. District SDMI Chairman

Dr. J.K. Warrick, General Superintendent; Dr. Jim Spruce, District Superintendent; Pastors, District SDMI board members, SDMI Chairpersons, teachers, delegates and friends. Over the past 6 months it has been both my privilege and a challenge to serve as the SDMI Chairperson for the Great Illinois District Church of the Nazarene.

The privilege has been serving with great district leadership, a wonderful board, faithful pastors and congregations. The district leaders have given much encouragement and shown great patience both in answering questions and being more than forgiving when I have been late with a report or in getting back to them with needed information. Your SDMI council has been very patient, helpful, and encouraging while working with me and my limited knowledge of this position.

The challenge has been following in the footsteps of Pastor Jim Blue and Pastor Tim Crump. As we know, Pastor Blue decided it was time for a change after many years in the position. Pastor Tim was led to use his talents and wisdom to serve our district in other capacities, so stepped down from this position. Further, while I have been associated with and participated in Sunday school (as student, teacher and "Superintendent") in the Church of the Nazarene for 50 years, there is a great deal I did not know and much I still don't know about the operation at this level. This presents a greater challenge in learning "on the job". This has been made easier with all the support, help and encouragement.

Part of my job as SDMI Chairperson is to report our monthly averages to the Global Ministry Center. Based on what I saw we had 21 more churches reporting this year than last. You may say, what is so important about "statistics"? To quote something I have heard Pastor Jim Blue say "there are souls in those goals".

Manual chapter 145.2 tells us our purpose in SDMI is:

- To reach the largest number of un-churched people for Christ and the Church.
- Bring them into fellowship
- Teaching the word of God effectively and encompassing their salvation
- Teaching the doctrines of the Christian faith and
- Developing Christlike character, attitudes, and habits
- Helping to establish Christian homes
- Preparing believers for membership in the church and
- Equipping them for appropriate Christian ministries.

I was not raised in a Christian home. My journey with Jesus began when a group of people called Nazarenes took in a smartalec teenager and loved him to the Lord. My family and I had moved to the east side of Des Moines, Iowa, in the summer of 1962; I was 14 years old. Shortly after we had moved I was out walking my dog when a man dressed in one of those green work uniforms and wearing old paint-covered wingtip shoes introduced himself as Gene Phillips, pastor of the East Side Church of the Nazarene and invited my family and me to Sunday school. (Reaching unchurched people.) We went the next Sunday morning. Before I got out of the Sunday school area Donna (Toigo) Bennett invited me back to NYPS that evening. The people there did their best to get my family and me involved. (Bringing them into the fellowship) Pastor Gene preached the word undergirded by prayer and fueled by the power of the Holy Spirit. In the fall of that year I came to know the mercy and saving Grace of our Lord Jesus Christ. Mom and my little sister soon followed. Dad got in 20 years later. (Teaching the word of God effectively, and encompassing their salvation.) In the senior high Sunday school class Pat Phillips and Eldred Toigo were faithful to teach biblical truths "line upon line and precept upon precept" (Teaching the doctrines of the Christian faith, developing Christlike character, attitudes and habits) without apology or watering them down. Now, 50 years later mom and dad are in heaven; my sister and her husband are pastoring Alvin Texas First Church of the Nazarene. My wife and I have been married 42 years this December; as lay people we have both served in various capacities in the four Churches of the Nazarene in which we have been members.

Friends, we have been given the charge to win people to Jesus and make Christlike disciples. That charge seems to be more and more difficult to fulfill as our world becomes more antagonistic toward the Christian faith both in word and action. As we have heard so many times, the methods may change but our message never changes. Pastors, you may disciple with traditional Sunday school or do Sunday school on Sunday night. We may minister through small group Bible studies or some other alternative outreach, but, if we don't do it the work won't get done. Nor can we do it in our own strength. We must be people of consistent, fervent prayer. That means all of us: the board members, the teachers, the students, the ushers, the greeters, and, the preachers. Lay people, we need to hold our pastors up in prayer, praying the Lord will keep evil far from them, that they will

have the Holy Spirit's power, wisdom and courage to preach the truth every time they step into the pulpit. We need to pray for each other, our teachers and lay leaders; not just for wisdom but that we will be filled and led by the Holy Spirit. 1. Advisory Board and Church Properties Board

The District Advisory Board met four times during the year and conducted additional business via an on-line video conference. Additionally, much of the board business was conducted via numerous e-mail votes throughout the 2011-2012 year.

The following credentials were received by transfer: Elders – Norman Wayne LaForce from Kansas City, Paul Womack from Joplin, Kevin Pittman from Joplin, Gary Williamson from Southwest Indiana, Deborah J. Benson from Upstate New York, Stephen D. Cecil from Southern Florida; Licensed Minister - Michael A. Flowers from Chicago Central, Thomas

Higgins from Chicago Central, Benjamin Jason Thelander from Kansas.

The following credentials were transferred out: Elders – Leon L. Adams to Chicago Central, Robert R. Baker to Northeastern Indiana; Licensed Ministers – James Thomas High, Jr. to North Florida, Aaron Timothy Horton to Southwestern Ohio.

The board recommended the following for renewal of District Minister's License: Dwayne Keith Anderson, Joseph Carter, Michael Flowers, Ralph W. Foreman, Enrique Wilfrido Riofrio Zumba, Timothy Paul Young, Jr., Ronald Waltrip.

The board recommended the following for District Minister's License: Timothy Mezera.

The board granted retired status to: Ordained Deacon: Douglas Marvin Krassow; Ordained Elders: K. Lyle Artman, Janice Kay Forgach, Dennis D. Middleton, Sumner L. Morrison.

The board voted to reinstate the filed credential of Stanley R. Cooley to Elder's Status and return his credential.

On December 2, 2011 we recommended duplicate credentials be issued to Stanley R. Cooley. The recommendation was approved and the duplicate credentials were issued.

The board approved pastoral appointments made by the District Superintendent.

The board voted to give Dr. Spruce a \$1,000 love offering at the 2011 District Assembly.

The board voted to give Rita Briggs a gift of \$1,000.

The board approved the purchase of a parsonage by the Olney Church for \$135,000.

The board approved the Olney Church to borrow \$90,000 on a 15 year mortgage at 4.25% for 3 years; then the interest rate is to be adjusted.

The board voted to pay the mortgage payment for the Mt. Carmel church in the month of January in the amount of \$1,168.37.

The board voted to approve an increase in the amount of the capital improvement loan by the Bethel Church from \$30,000 to \$40,000. The board approved securing the loan via a mortgage on the parsonage.

The board granted \$600 to assist with Matt Soulia's expenses to attend the Global Youth Summit in Bangkok, Thailand.

The board granted \$3,410 to the Beardstown Liberty Hispanic Church to defray costs involved in requesting U.S. residency for Pastor Riofrio.

The board voted to grant \$4,340 for remodeling the bathroom at the Granite City CTM.

The board voted to grant a loan of \$1,000, interest free, to the Mt. Carmel Church for their mortgage.

The board approved appointments of board members and treasurer for the Virden Church.

The board approved an interest-free loan of \$3,000 to the Virden Church for a period of six months.

The board voted to grant \$6,000 to replace the Clevenger's HVAC system.

The board approved the relocation of the Urbana Lighthouse Church to 1808 S. Philo Rd., Urbana.

The board voted to give the Carlinville Church \$1,000 towards remodeling the parsonage bathroom – and to loan an additional \$1,700 to the Carlinville Church to complete this project.

The board granted \$2,200 to the Carlinville Church for repairs to their air conditioner and van.

The board voted to include Dr. Spruce's \$7,000 bonus check on his 2011 W-2 Form.

The board voted to renew contracts of District Employees with a 3.5% increase.

The board voted to reduce the number of contracted days for Mark Copley to 100 days.

The board voted to approve a three-year contract with Shotts, Merryman & Co.

The board voted to reduce the asking price for Nazarene Acres (Contents are not included.) If it does not sell, it is to be put up for auction.

The board voted to grant \$55 per camper and counselor for Children's Camp and Youth Camp – and that the funds come from SDMI and NYI budgets in the 2012 - 2013 year.

The board voted to cover added bus and fuel expense of \$3,280 for Youth Camp.

The board voted to loan \$10,000 to the Harrisburg Church to finish their kitchen.

The board voted to loan the Godfrey Church \$3,900.

The board voted to grant \$4,202 to the Arcola Spanish Church for roof repairs.

The board voted to authorize Douglas Haynes to modify the BOOSTER at his discretion.

The board voted to approve Phase I of the remodeling plan for Champaign First Church at an approximate cost of \$90,000.

The board voted to allot \$10,000 as seed money for assisting pastors to attend the Master's Plan Convention in Cali, Colombia, in the fall of 2012.

The board voted to cover the expenses of Dr. and Mrs. Hancock and Mrs. Dace to attend the Fellowship of Retired Superintendents' Meeting.

The board voted to set the Retired D.S. Retreat as a line item in the District Budget.

The board appointed Ronald Black as Chairman of the Board of Little Lambs Daycare in Oakwood.

The board voted to give Jim German a stipend of \$250 in appreciation of his service at Little Lambs Daycare, as Board Chairman.

The board voted to send \$125 per week for six months to the Virden Church to help provide a livable salary to the new pastor.

The board approved the District Nominating Committee.

The board voted to grant \$500 to Jon Garlock in appreciation for his work on the District website.

The board voted to set April 30 as the fiscal year end for all budget payments.

The board voted to authorize Bill Shotts to purchase needed hardware etc. in order for his office to host our District website securely.

The board voted to keep the District Budget Multiplier at 5.65, with the .15 going to ONU.

The board voted to approve the Mansfield Church to borrow an additional \$16,000 for roof repairs.

4. Mission Strategy Team Report

Members and friends of the assembly, it is my privilege to present to you my fifth report as chairman of the District Mission Strategy Team. The Mission Strategy Team this year included the following members: Dr. James R. Spruce (chairman, ex-officio); Mark Copley, District Mission Strategy Director; Philip Alvord, Kevin Donoho, Allen Ebbler, Les Wilhelm, Rita Briggs, James Craig, Will Haworth, Timothy Mondy, and Tim Young, Jr.. We want to especially acknowledge the work of our NewStart pastors and their sponsoring congregations: Bill Brandon at Highland; Nick Briggs at Vandalia; Gary Clark at Harrisburg Oasis Community; Wayne Clevenger at Urbana Lighthouse; Tim Young, Jr. at Granite City;

and Rita Briggs, who's leading the effort to plant a new church in Jacksonville.

The Mission Strategy Team distributed \$12,000 in grants this year. With those grants we provided coaching, ministry materials, property improvements, and pastoral support to our church-type missions, compassionate ministries, and church planters.

This year, the Mission Strategy Team planned and presented two Team Days. The first, in February, was held at the Sherman Church, and the second, in March, at Salem Grace. Approximately 100 attended the Sherman event and 131 attended at Salem. That means over 200 pastors and laypeople received encouragement, training, and support in these two events. Thanks to Pastors Haworth and Donoho and to our host churches for making these venues available. Darrell MacLearn challenged us all to live missionally among our neighbors, and all our presenters provided such excellent workshops. Special thanks to Professors David Wine, and Dr. Mark Quanstrom from ONU. Finally, thanks to Lara Mondy who did the work of planning again this year. We hope that many churches will continue to benefit from these events. Our Mission IS Possible!

Recently, we met to reconsider our goals and strategy for accomplishing our mission. In regard to promoting church health, here's what we determined:

1. While there is great value in churches developing a "written strategic action plan," the process that we have called "Refocus" takes too long, is often too expensive, and too vague for many of our churches to consider. We propose a much more practical approach that focuses on church health, rather than long term planning.
2. We propose, instead "*To encourage every church toward church health one step at a time.*"
3. This process would begin with administering the Church Health Survey, measuring the church's health using the eight key characteristics (*Empowering leadership, Gift-oriented ministry, Passionate spirituality, Functional structures, Inspiring worship service, Holistic small groups, Need-oriented evangelism, and Loving relationships*).
4. Our response then would be to follow up with training and coaching, aimed at strengthening the church's weakest area of health. The Mission Strategy Director, along with the members of the Mission Strategy Team, would serve as coaches and trainers to assist pastors as they work together to improve in their weakest characteristic.
5. The process would continue with each characteristic, in ascending order, and will be measured with periodic reevaluation using the survey.

We believe that this process offers a more practical, and timely solution to churches who want to assess their present health, and respond in ways that will promote health, growth, and ultimately multiplication. Churches would also have the option of a full church assessment should they want a more comprehensive picture. We propose to resource this approach by offering assistance to make the Church Health Survey affordable for every church, and by providing training and coaching for little or no expense. We are offering an opportunity to sign up to begin this process here at the Assembly.

Much thanks to all of those who have served on or with the Mission Strategy Team this year. Together, we are stewards of the mission of our district: "**To develop healthy, multiplying, holiness churches and pastors.**" Our vision for a new passion, for a new people, and a new Illinois remains to be seen. Let's pursue it together in Christ!

1. Finance Committee

Finance Committee

We, your Finance Committee, recommend the following:

1. In accordance with the General Church of the Nazarene Global Ministry Center that all budget payments be based on Church Income. Church Income (Qualified Income for Illinois District purposes) is defined as all income eligible under IRS guidelines for a tax deduction, reduced by payments made to the World Evangelism Fund, payments made for approved 10% specials, deductions for rare circumstances, phase in adjustments, and any other deduction allowed by the General Church of the Nazarene Global Ministry Center.
2. That the Illinois District Budget be a unified budget with a single budget payment to include district administration and operations, NMI, NYI, and SDMI. All budget payments to be allocated to each department based on their pro-rata portion of budget receipts. Budget payments should be sent to William E. Shotts unified district treasurer.
3. That the World Evangelism Fund be 5.5 percent of Church Income, Pensions and Benefits Fund be 2.25 percent, the Olivet Nazarene University Fund be 2.25 percent, and the Unified District Fund be 5.65 percent.
4. That every church endeavor to be 10 percent for world missions as based on an amount equal to or greater than 10% of Church Income, less amount paid for World Evangelism Fund and approved specials (missions giving).
5. That the Unified District Funds be allocated as follows:

Unified District	81.61 %
NMI	1.46 %
NYI	7.72 %
SDMI	6.55 %
ONU	2.66 %
6. That all Funds (World Evangelism, Unified District, Olivet Nazarene University, and Pensions and Benefits) be calculated and paid weekly beginning in May.
7. That only churches which have paid in full the Unified District Fund, the Olivet Nazarene University Fund, the Pensions and Benefits Fund, and the World Evangelism Fund, be permitted to report all funds paid in full.
8. That no congregation be granted permission to go in debt for any building or improvement program, or the hiring of any staff or assistants, until it has shown the ability to pay all of its obligations, including funds paid in full for two years preceding the request, debt under consideration and/or the additional salary, and that the amount of the indebtedness and terms of payment not jeopardize the spiritual life of the church. Exceptions may be granted by the District Superintendent only with the unanimous approval of the District Advisory Board. (Manual, par. 235.4).
9. That every church prepares and adopts an annual operating budget for the church in accordance with (Manual, par. 129.6 & 129.7). Should assistance be requested for the preparation of a budget, the district will be happy to provide such assistance to the church.

10. That every church adopts a written "Designated Gift Policy". Should assistance be requested for the preparation of a designated gift policy, the district will be happy to provide such assistance to the church.
11. That October 7, 2012, be designated as Nazarene Bible College Sunday in our local churches and that a special offering be received and forwarded to the Bible College immediately.
12. That December 2, 2012, be designated as American Bible Society Sunday in our local churches, and that an offering be received and sent to the General Treasurer in Kansas City immediately.
13. That January 13, 2013, be designated as Nazarene Theological Seminary Sunday in our local churches, and that an offering be received and sent to the Seminary in Kansas City immediately.
14. That April 21, 2013, be designated as Olivet Nazarene University Sunday in our local churches, and that an offering be received and sent to our District Treasurer for Olivet.
15. That the salary of the district superintendent be \$58,799.59 annually, plus \$9,594.45 annually be invested for him in a tax-sheltered annuity, SE payments of \$11,406.37 and \$3,000.00 annually for reimbursable expenses and that he be given five weeks vacation with pay at a time convenient for him.
16. That the salary of the Administrative Assistant be \$39,656.79 annually, plus \$3,198.15 annually be invested for him in a tax-sheltered annuity, Housing allowance of \$13,400.30, SE payments of \$8,045.27, and \$3,500.00 annually for reimbursable expenses and that he be given vacation in accordance with manual guidelines with pay at a time convenient for him.
17. That the salary of the District Missionary be \$21,318.87 and SE payments of \$3,261.79 annually.
18. That the District advisory Board be authorized to provide a district-owned vehicle, plus travel and expenses, for the district superintendent.
19. That the District advisory Board be authorized to provide a district owned vehicle, plus travel and expenses, for the travel and expenses, for the administrative assistant.
20. That the District Advisory Board be authorized to provide a district-owned vehicle, plus travel and expenses, for the District Missionary.
21. That the district boards' committees', and councils' travel reimbursement be at the current IRS rate and that actual meals and lodging expenses away from home be reimbursed. These expenses to be paid from appropriate operating fund.
22. That the honorarium for the district secretary be \$4,010.20 per year, and that expenses for clerical help be allowed.
23. That the professional fees to be paid for accounting and bookkeeping services for the district including the medical fund be \$38,820.00 per year.
24. That a recommended rate of \$8.25 per hour be paid for temporary secretarial services provided for district departments such as Board of Ministerial Studies, School of Ministry and any other services required during the year.

25. That the local churches pay the health insurance plan for pastors and dependents, and for associate pastors and dependents; and that the district pay \$2,000 per year for the cost of the health plan premium for full-time commissioned evangelists and their families, and that the local church (where evangelist holds membership) pay the balance of the premium.
26. That our people be encouraged in the stewardship of possessions as related to wills, annuities, and the life loans for the local church, district home missions, world missions, our colleges and seminary. That the Department of Stewardship regional representative, Rev. Larry Hindmand, 9625 Mason, Oak Lawn, IL 60453 (708-857-4770) be contracted by local churches for counseling service in life income wills and bequests.
27. That the local church boards strictly adhere to the provisions of the Manual, Pars. 129.21, 129.22, 129.23, concerning the counting and the accounting for all monies received and disbursed, and an annual audit of the financial records.
28. That each local church treasurer use printed forms for reporting all monies received and disbursed each month, and that the pastor and church board be provided a copy or copies of the monthly treasurer's report (Manual, par. 135.4).

7. Christian Cultural Engagement

A. WHEREAS, in times when our culture desperately needs the Church to be a living example of Christ-like holiness and love, we strongly urge:

1. All our sisters and brothers in Christ to remember that we are called to be the Body of Christ in our world being empowered by the Holy Spirit to the glory of God the Father. As a result, we urge our brothers and sisters to remember the importance of corporate Christian worship, the receiving of the Sacraments and the practice of spiritual disciplines within the family and individually, believing that these are primary Means of Grace by which the Holy Spirit shapes us into a holy people.
2. That pastors, evangelists, and leaders live and teach the scriptural doctrines of the new birth and entire sanctification, believing that the Holy Spirit bears witness to both works of grace through the infilling of His Spirit, and that the one biblical evidence of the latter is the cleansing of the heart by faith from original sin manifested by the fruit of the Spirit in Christian service: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control (Gal 5:22-24).
3. That the church manual be made available to all in the church who desire it and the Articles of Faith (Manual, Part II, para 1-22, pgs. 28-37) and the Covenant of Christian Character (Manual, Part II, Articles 27-27.3, pgs. 38-40) be read, or printed, and distributed to the church body at least once a year admonishing each Nazarene to diligently pursue a lifestyle that honors God, the church and one another.
4. That new converts be lovingly nourished and instructed in the way of holiness.

5. That all of our people, "in putting off the old to put on the new and holy way of life as well as the mind of Christ" (Eph 4:17-24), take to heart The Covenant of Christian Conduct of our church which gives guidance in areas of Christian Ethics, Entertainment, Marriage & Divorce, Abortion, Human Sexuality, Christian Stewardship, etc. (Manual, Part III, para 33-41, pgs 46-60).

B. WHEREAS, ethics and values are constantly being questioned and changed by our society, the church must strengthen itself in its commitment and conduct. Therefore, this committee felt it vitally important to not only reaffirm our belief in Scripture and our Wesleyan guidelines, but to also provide useful information in this document to resource both laity and clergy to make the church both a beacon of hope and a model of holiness to our families, community and world. (Matthew 5:10-17; Ephesians 5:1-2,8-14; I Peter 1:13-17).

Believing that Christ-like service is one of the most meaningful ways to engage our culture for Christ, we encourage our people to seek out opportunities for service within their local church and the larger community. We **also** encourage our people to work with and in public institutions as a means of Christ-like engagement with our culture on the local, State, National, and Global levels.

1. Each local church should strive to provide opportunities for Christ-like service such as:
 - a) Ministries to the vulnerable, marginalized, and hurting within one's own congregation, believing that Christian love demonstrated toward those within our own fellowship is one way that Christ's love is made evident to the culture around us.
 - b) Consider initiating special ministries that reach out to the needy in the community.

 - c) Habitat for Humanity
 - d) Credible Christian Counseling Centers
 - e) Food & Clothing Pantries such as Hopeful Hearts Ministries in Decatur, the Good Samaritan Ministries Center in the Metro-East and The Master's Hand in Olney along with multiple food pantries in local churches throughout the district.
 - f) Nursing Homes; Senior Adult Organizations
 - g) Appropriate Parent/Teacher Organizations

4. That each local church provides its members with ample opportunities to see beyond our own borders and mature into "global" Christians by staying informed about world events (both natural and political) and the persecution of fellow believers that we might pray for "the increase of His government and peace" on the earth. In addition, we urge the promotion of sacrificial giving for the cause of world evangelism and personally participating in Work and Witness when and where possible.

8. Church Growth

We, your Committee on Church Growth, make the following recommendations to the district assembly for consideration:

Commission

We recommend that every church emphasize the Great Commission (Matthew 28:16-20) in every facet of their ministry. We are reminded that the Bible should always be our main

source of **instruction** and that the Great Commission remains as our primary motivation for church growth.

Prayer

Remember that prayer should be the foundation for all church growth, and that without prayer; little of lasting value will be accomplished. We also recommend that the church provide opportunities for concentrated prayer and fasting during the church year. We encourage the support of the District sponsored Prayer Summits.

Mission/Vision/Purpose

We encourage every church to develop a mission statement, a vision statement, and a clear statement of purpose. These three key elements will ensure that we stay focused on God's plan for the local church. There are numerous books and other resources available to assist the church with this task. Any church needing assistance should contact the district superintendent and/or the district missionary.

Responsibility List

That every church maintain an accurate, up-to-date list that includes the name, current address, and telephone number for every person on their responsibility list. This will allow for better, more consistent follow-up and accountability.

Calling

That absentees be contacted through a regular, systematic approach. This is not solely the responsibility of the pastor, but should be a shared ministry within the church among the laity.

Discipleship

Emphasis should be given not only to evangelism, but also the discipleship. The new Christian should be encouraged to seek the experience of Heart Holiness which leads to a growing and productive Christian as a way to fulfill the Great Commission (Matthew 28:20).

Lay Ministry

We encourage our churches to develop a partnership between the pastor and the laity, which provides for every member to be involved in church ministry (discipleship/ evangelism).

Education

That pastors and laymen take full advantage of educational and CEU opportunities, including seminars, workshops, videos, books, and especially the quality CLT programs that our denomination offers.

Evangelism

That new and innovative methods of outreach and evangelism be explored. Consider how the resources of the local church, human and financial, can be utilized most effectively to see souls saved.

New Church Starts

We believe every church on the Illinois District can and should become involved in prayer, creating or supporting new church starts. Churches can provide funding and or personal involvement of the local church body in calling, canvassing, etc.

Personal Evangelism

It is the privilege and duty of every Christian to share their faith with others. We encourage all churches to provide specialized training for various types of personal evangelism. Personal responsibility for evangelism should be emphasized.

Revivals

We encourage our churches to give top priority to annual revival campaigns. We strongly urge the use of full-time evangelists in the Church of the Nazarene. We also encourage

the use of all media possibilities (TV, radio, etc.) to potentially reach as many as possible with the gospel.

Servant Evangelism

That methods of servant evangelism be employed in churches of all sizes and in all areas. Jesus Himself came to serve and to give, not to be served or become successful. Let us willingly choose to follow Christ's example as we minister to others. Such acts of kindness can serve to bridge the gap between the church and the world.

Finances

Set aside a portion of the annual church budget for purposes of outreach and evangelism. The Bible says, "Where your treasure is, there your heart will be also."

Evangelism Committee

We encourage each church to review and implement the guidelines for a local Evangelism and Church Membership Committee as stated in the 2009-2013 *Manual*, page 71, and section 110-110.8.

Global Church Growth Award

It should be the goal of every church to introduce each new convert into the membership of the Church of the Nazarene.

The purpose of the General Superintendents' Growth Award (GSGA) is to give prominence to those practices that are central to the local and worldwide advancement of the church; specifically, new Nazarenes, significant involvement in sponsoring a new church, and 100% participation in fund allocations.

- Churches that win people to Christ are healthy.
 - Starting new churches is the most effective means of evangelism known to the church.
 - Fund allocations are essential to the cooperative ministries of the Church of the Nazarene.
- I. New Nazarenes requirements are based on 10% of attendance for the current year.
 - II. The meaning of "significant involvement in sponsoring a new church" is very specific and is spelled out in the Sponsorship Criteria Worksheet. This worksheet is available online.
 - III. Full participation in fund allocations includes district assignment, educational support, pensions (applicable to US only), and World Evangelism Fund.
 - The requirements for receiving this award are intentionally high—it is special recognition by the Board of General Superintendents.
 - It is not based on attendance or membership.
 - This award is not intended to replace all awards.

This award is given in recognition of outstanding accomplishment in essential practices of the expansion of the kingdom of God through the Church of the Nazarene. The presentation of this award is intended to say "Thank You" to the receiving pastor and church, and to elevate in the consciousness of our people the compelling importance of winning people to Christ, starting new churches, and supporting the organizational structures that make possible evangelism around the world.

9. Ministerial Staff Support

We, your Committee on Ministerial Staff Support, submit the following in order to care for the welfare of our spiritual leaders and encourage their commitment to our spiritual guidance.

The district office and the Pastoral Support Committee want to assist pastors and church boards in understanding their roles in providing adequate compensation for its pastors and staffs. Support of the pastor by the church is an expression of the belief in the call of God on the life of the pastor rather than a job where monies are paid for services rendered. Adequate compensation enables a pastor to fulfill his or her calling.

Pastoral support extends beyond the compensation and benefits for the pastor and staff and includes those expenses incurred by pastoral staff which is necessary to conduct the business of the church. Each church pays a sum to a pastor's ministry, which is divided into several categories: compensation, benefits and expenses. The sum of these categories is considered the cost of ministry to the local church, not all of which is to be considered the income of the pastor.

The district Pastoral Support Committee has developed guidelines for local pastoral support committees to evaluate their commitment to the ministry of the pastor. Anyone wanting further assistance in assessing or planning adequate compensation may contact the district office. In addition to consideration for the local pastors, churches should also establish a remuneration policy for pulpit supply, including travel expenses.

Senior Pastor

The senior pastor is the leader of the church and a leader in the local community.

Bi-vocational Pastor

A bi-vocational pastor supplements income by means other than church compensation. Churches should view the circumstances that cause the pastor to supplement income as a temporary situation to be resolved as soon as possible. The goal is to remove as many worldly concerns from the pastor as possible, so that the pastor may attend more intently on his or her life's calling. Recognizing that small and young churches may have difficulty in providing adequately for their pastor and family, we urge such churches to use what they are able to provide to the best advantage of their pastor and to strive toward the goal of full support.

Associate Pastor and Staff

An associate pastor is defined as a partner in ministry, on staff, whether receiving compensation or not. The church is to work toward a similar benefit package for the full-time associate as for the senior pastor (guideline to the church: an amount equal to 70 to 80 percent of the senior pastor's compensation package). Associate pastor and staff salaries should be negotiated in accordance with the recommendations of the senior pastor.

Retired Pastor

A retired pastor is a minister with retirement status. We recommend that retired pastors be employed for pulpit supply as frequently as possible. Retired pastors usually live on meager retirement benefits and may welcome the opportunity to provide for pulpit supply. Retired pastors are a source of experience and expertise that is available to the local church.

Evangelist

Often, the evangelist's only source of income is from meetings held at various local churches. We recommend that a full-time evangelist's minimum remuneration for such a meeting be an amount equal to twice the local senior pastor's weekly cash salary for each full Sunday in the special meeting (as recommended by the Evangelism Ministries of

the Division of Local Church Growth). The local senior pastor's weekly cash salary and prorated insurance and Social Security benefits should all be included in the compensation. Additional compensation for housing and travel-related expenses should be paid in a separate check, allowing for maximum tax benefit for the evangelist.

I. For the Pastor

A. Concerning Salary:

1. That for all full-time pastors, every church provides a minimum of \$450 per week salary. By definition, salary should not be deemed to include reimbursements and cost of ministry expenses listed below in Section B, Paragraph 1. The Advisory Board is to make the distinction between full-time and bi-vocational pastors. That churches which are legitimately unable to provide for such remuneration recognize that their pastor is bi-vocational and, therefore, able and obligated to supplement his or her income. We recommend that the district superintendent or designated personnel monitor the suggested minimum weekly salary on the basis of the materials provided by the general church's worksheet and, when necessary, give strong counsel to church boards to provide the above-stated minimum salary and benefits.
2. That the church place, as an employee benefit, an amount equal to 10 percent of the ministerial staff's monthly salary in a tax-sheltered annuity each month for his/her retirement. This is the third leg of the retirement tier recommended by the Pensions and Benefits office of the general Church of the Nazarene.
3. That the church review the ministerial staff salary at least annually and that increases reflect at least cost-of-living increases. That a letter be sent once a year from the district superintendent to the local church board secretary reminding the board of its responsibility in this area, and that a written summation of the board's action shall be returned to the district superintendent within 30 days of the local board meeting.
4. That any significant increase in the annual amount raised for all purposes by the church during a pastor's tenure be taken into consideration at the time salary and benefits are reviewed.

B. Concerning Reimbursements:

1. That the church pays reimbursements for all church-related expenses, and that among these are standard mileage reimbursement at the recommended IRS rate for personally-owned automobiles. To avoid additional financial burden on the pastor and staff during these days of rapidly increasing gasoline prices, the church board is strongly encouraged to monitor and comply with any increases the IRS may possibly make on its recommended mileage rate during the calendar year. Entertainment expenses, office supplies, continuing education expenses (books, tuition, conferences, etc.), gifts and all other reimbursable expenses deemed appropriate by the IRS should also be included.
2. Church-related expenses of pastoral staff should be qualified on the basis of material from General Headquarters, as well as the Internal Revenue Service. Every church should provide adequately to prevent financial strain to the parsonage family, and that every church provides 100 percent Social Security and full family hospitalization. That churches be allowed to maintain their present insurance program, and if churches propose a change, the change should be approved by the district superintendent and the District Advisory Board.
3. That the church provides the ministerial staff expense to all church-related functions, including the district and general assemblies. Lodging, meals and transportation shall be a part of this expense.

4. That the churches encourage and financially support its ministerial staff to continuing education through school, seminars and conferences.
5. That each local church board provides funds for the purpose of sending its ministerial staff to the general assembly.

C. Concerning Housing:

1. That the church provides housing and utilities and/or adequate housing allowance.
2. That the church equips the parsonage with a stove, refrigerator, air conditioning, washer, dryer, draperies, curtains and carpeting.
3. That a minister could request the church board to adjust his/her compensation for any year in which it is anticipated that the minister will purchase major appliances and/or furniture.
4. That the fair-rental value and the designated additional parsonage allowance should be entered into church board records at the beginning of each calendar year. When a housing allowance is established in lieu of a parsonage, a review of the allowance should be made annually regarding payment, taxes, utilities and repairs.
5. That the Board of Trustees of the local church inspect the parsonage once each year in order to continue to provide for quality living conditions. No parsonage family should be expected to live in substandard housing. This inspection should be scheduled with the pastor and spouse and be done in their presence. Any necessary changes seen at this inspection should be completed as soon as possible.
6. That the local church board makes all necessary arrangements for the ministerial staff's moving expenses.

D. Concerning the Ministerial Staff's General Emotional and Spiritual Welfare:

1. That the church continually lifts the parsonage families in prayer.
2. That the church remembers the ministerial staff's family with suitable gifts at appropriate times during the year and consider a gift of no less than one week's salary at Christmas.
3. That the church provide for vacation and time off according to the following scale (this schedule refers to total years in ministry):
 - a. One year in the ministry: two weeks vacation
 - b. Two to ten years in the ministry: three weeks vacation
 - c. Ten to twenty years in the ministry: four weeks vacation
 - d. Twenty or more years in the ministry: five weeks vacation(District Assembly, Family Camp, ministerial retreats and seminars, and working in Teen or Children's Camps are not to be considered as part of this vacation time allowance.)
4. In order to benefit the church and the health of the pastor, the church should encourage the pastoral staff to take a minimum of one day per week for family time.
5. That the church allow the senior pastor the privilege of holding a full week revival or speaking engagement of one or more days, not to exceed seven days per

year, with the church to be responsible for pulpit supply without loss of salary to the pastor.

6. That the local church offer the pastor/staff two mental health days each month to be taken at the pastor's discretion, to be used at a time when workload or individual stress is overwhelming.
7. That the local church make available to its pastor a one month sabbatical at the end of each five years of uninterrupted ministry to that same church.

II. For All Full-time Evangelists (Song and Otherwise)

A. Concerning Salary:

1. That evangelists be paid at least an amount equal to twice the pastor's salary or a minimum of \$500 for each Sunday of the meeting.
2. That, in addition, Social Security on the amount of salary be summarily paid.
3. That evangelists be notified in writing at the time the meeting is scheduled of the minimum remuneration they can expect to receive from the local church.
4. That local churches avoid canceling previously scheduled revivals.
5. That a local church canceling a revival without notifying the evangelist at least 30 days in advance be obligated to pay the minimum remuneration in full, unless the evangelist is able to reschedule the same date.

B. Concerning Reimbursements and Housing

1. That churches provide for all travel expenses, lodging and food during the meeting.
2. That local churches having full-time evangelists as members pay one-half the cost of the district hospitalization insurance.
3. That local churches having full-time evangelists as members provide for their expenses to general and district gatherings.

C. Concerning the Evangelist's General Emotional and Spiritual Welfare:

1. That finances for revivals be raised in advance of the scheduled meeting.
2. That the local church sends a Christmas gift to all evangelists who have served the church during that calendar year.
3. That local churches having full-time evangelists as members provide encouragement and support for their ministry through prayer and such tangible ways as love offerings and remembering them on their birthdays and anniversaries.

III. For Retired Ministerial Staff

A. Concerning Reimbursements:

1. That local churches having retired ministers as members provide for their expenses to general and district gatherings they wish to attend.

B. Concerning Their General Emotional and Spiritual Welfare

1. That local churches having retired ministers as members remember them often, such as at birthdays, anniversaries and Christmas, with gifts of gratitude for their years of faithful service in the Kingdom.

2. That the Illinois District gives a one-time love gift to all elders upon their retirement. We recommend a minimum of \$1,000.

We ask that each local church board secretary and pastor receive a copy of this report from the district superintendent and that the same shall be read or distributed by the church board secretary to the church board as a reminder of their responsibilities. The church board secretary shall notify the district superintendent in writing concerning the fulfillment of this policy.

COMBINED CONVENTIONS -- NMI, NYI, SDMI
Decatur First Church of the Nazarene
July 11, 2012

Proceedings

D.S. Dr. James R. Spruce brought enthusiastic greetings to the assemblage, and NMI information and order forms were distributed to the NMI delegation. An NPH video highlighting NMI resources and ordering was presented. Ushers collected completed forms for processing.

Dr. Spruce called to order the second annual combined convention of the Illinois District NMI, NYI, and SDMI.

The first ballot presented was the green NYI ballot for the NYI District Council. A motion was made, seconded, and carried to adopt the ballot. Election secretaries and tellers for NYI were appointed. NYI Board of Tellers #1 was called. A motion to reduce the number on the nominating ballot to twice the number to be elected was made, seconded, and carried. Ballots were distributed and cast. Tellers were excused.

The NYI electing ballot for delegates to the General NYI Convention was presented. A motion to adopt the ballot was made, seconded, and carried. Ballots were distributed and cast. Tellers were excused.

Dr. Spruce presented the first pink ballot for the District NMI Council. A motion was made, seconded, and carried to adopt the ballot. NMI board of tellers #1 was appointed. They came forward to distribute the ballot. Ballots were cast and collected; tellers were excused.

Dr. Spruce presented the ballot for delegates and alternates to the General NMI Convention. A motion to adopt the ballot was made, seconded, and carried.

NMI board of tellers #2 was appointed. The tellers distributed the ballot for General Convention delegates; the ballots were cast. Tellers were excused.

Dr. Spruce presented a blue ballot for election of the District SDMI Board. A motion to adopt the ballot was made, seconded, and carried. An SDMI board of tellers was appointed. The ballot was cast; tellers were excused.

District Treasurer Bill Shotts presented a concise combined report of the finances of the NMI, NYI, and SDMI. He noted that we, again this year, received a clean report from the auditors. He further noted that the District Advisory Board and leaders of the NMI, NYI, and SDMI have all made an effort to curtail expenses, where possible. A motion to accept the treasurer's report was made, seconded, and carried by an unanimous vote of ayes.

NYI President Jay Bush came to preside over the NYI Moments. He introduced his NYI Council. Council members then presented their reports. Matt Soulia reported that the Spiritual Life Retreat in Greenville was a great time of varied activities, learning opportunities, and spiritual growth. He announced the Retreat for the coming year – January 19-20, 2013, at Greenville.

Tim Cox presented information regarding application for the NYI \$250 ONU

scholarships.

Russ Burch and a group of teen quizzing "pros" and adult volunteers (who were gracious losers) presented a quick expo of teen Bible quizzing. Julie Marler presented information for churches interested in starting a teen quizzing program.

Sean Asbeck reported that the "Radiate E. St. Louis" group has been active at our E. St. Louis Compassionate Ministries site, transforming lives through serving others. Information is forthcoming regarding the next opportunity to serve with "Radiate" on October 12-13, 2012. He noted that adults are welcome.

An ONU VIDEO was shown. Notable statements from the video: "ONU was listed by U.S. News and World Reports as one of the best universities in the Midwest!" "At ONU students learn how to make a living and how to live."

Jen Kershaw, new ONU counselor for the Illinois District, brought greetings and an update on happenings at Olivet. She stated, "God is still changing lives at Olivet every single day!" She announced a t-shirt drawing, happening at the ONU table.

Jay Bush announced that Matt Soulia is leaving to serve in Michigan. Matt Soulia added that he will be working in a mission camp in the inner city of Flint, Michigan. Jay Bush presented a gift to Matt. The NYI Council encircled Matt and laid hands on him as Jay Bush led in a prayer for Matt and his new ministry endeavors.

Jay Bush brought his fourth report as NYI President, stating that NYI exists to serve. God is moving through NYI as they work to lead young people to a life-long relationship with Jesus Christ – and to facilitate discipleship. He noted: NYI has outgrown its "Spiritual Life Retreat" location. Our quizzing program excels! Our camp program is great! We have a great reputation of service! District NMI Council – vote for three for two-year terms – plurality vote: Debbie Turner, 76; Jodie George, 52; Lori Walle, 48; Hilda Craig, 85; Ivan Jess, 64; Mary Lou Kroeze, 74; Becky Lonberger, 110; Sandy Stickler, 116; Pam Stevens, 81.

Dr. Spruce DECLARED ELECTED: Sandy Stickler, Becky Lonberger, and Hilda Craig.

Dr. Spruce announced that early in the afternoon session we will be honoring Rev. George H. D. Reader; age almost 106, for eighty years service as an ordained elder in the Church of the Nazarene.

NMI President Bill Brandon came to preside over "NMI Moments," stating, "I write my schedule in pencil and depend on God to erase it."

Dr. Ketchum presented greetings via a video presentation – and presented pertinent NMI facts. He stated, "NMI loves the lost and mobilizes and educates for the mission."

Bill Brandon announced that NMI orders are filled and ready for pick-up. Certificates earned by local churches are also ready for pickup today.

Lay – majority vote – vote for two – Jamie Toolen, 97; Julie Bott, 56; Stephanie Hinkle, 50; Tim Sprinkle, 94; Julie Marler, 32; Athena Smith, 23. DECLARED ELECTED: Jamie Toolen, Tim Sprinkle.

Youth – majority vote – vote for two – Isaac Dillman, 53; Easton Bush, 71; Sarah Alvord, 66; Jennifer Smith, 42; Kaleb Heppe, 76; Supriyah Autenrieth, 43 - NO ELECTION.

Ballot #2 for election of NYI ministerial and youth delegates to the General NYI Convention was distributed. Ballots were cast; tellers were excused.

College Rep – vote for two - Bradley Deal, 130; Dan Flynn, 56; Clara Stone, 74; Kyle Shaghnessy, 76 – DECLARED ELECTED: Bradley Deal.

Northeast Sectional Representative - vote for one – majority vote – Julie Marler, 41; Wayne Clevenger, 80; Anita Breeden 65 - NO ELECTION.

Northwest Sectional Representative - Yes or No vote – 2/3 majority to elect - Chris Bott, Yes, 167; No, 8. DECLARED ELECTED: Chris Bott.

Southwest Sectional Representative – Yes or No vote – 2/3 majority to elect - Tim Sprinkle Yes, 150; No, 20. DECLARED ELECTED: Tim Sprinkle.

Southeast Sectional Representative – Yes or No vote – 2/3 majority to elect - Tim Sorensen Yes, 168; No, 5. DECLARED ELECTED: Tim Sorensen.

Ballot #2 for election of High School Representatives, College representative, and Northeast Sectional Representative Ballots were cast and tellers excused.

LINKS Secretary Pam Stevens presented new LINKS missionaries for the district: Tim and Lydia Lee, serving in the Philippines, and retired missionary Frances Vine, who also served in the Philippines. Pam encouraged all churches to continue to support our missionaries with prayer, giving, and special gifts.

Pastor Jim Blue read scripture and led in prayer in memory of those on the Memorial Roll, who have “gone on.” Memorial Roll names were read as they scrolled on the screen. Jim Blue shared how the Olivet Church uses Memorial Roll to bring in many family members to the church – to share the hope we have in Jesus.

Names of Distinguished Service Award recipients, Mission Priority One Churches, and Churches of Excellence were displayed on the screen.

Pictures and videos from his recent Prayer/Vision trip to Sri Lanka and India were shown as Bill Brandon presented his sixth report as District NMI President. Bill stated, “Winter is almost here; we don’t have much time to save the lost!” Bill expressed thanks to his wife, Debbie, Dr. Spruce, Doug Haynes, Treasurer Bill Shotts, and his Council for their faithful support. NMI honors earned by churches were scrolled on the screen. Bill Brandon said he is leaning on Psalm 112:7 and Jeremiah 29:12, as he faces radical surgery for bone cancer on August 7.

The Olivetians were used to bless hearts as they presented a spirited medley of worship songs.

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INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Board of Directors
Illinois District Church of the Nazarene

We have audited the accompanying statement of assets, liabilities and net assets – modified cash basis of the Administration, Home Mission, Camp Ground, District Reserve, Medical, Nazarene Missions International, Church New Start, Sunday School and Discipleship Ministries International and Nazarene Youth International funds of the Illinois District Church of the Nazarene as of April 30, 2012, and the related statements of support, revenue and expenses and cash flows – modified cash basis for the fiscal year then ended. These financial statements are the responsibility of the Illinois District Church of the Nazarene's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

Except as explained in the following paragraphs, we conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall financial statement presentation. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.

As described in Note 1, these financial statements were prepared on a modified cash basis, which is a comprehensive basis of accounting other than generally accepted accounting principles.

As more fully described in Note 1 to the financial statements, the modified cash basis of accounting requires fixed assets be stated at cost, net of accumulated depreciation. Management has informed us that the District has stated its properties at estimated costs and appraised values versus historical costs as required by the modified cash basis of accounting. In addition, no depreciation expense has been recorded in the financial statements. The effect of this departure on the financial statements has not been determined.

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above (except for the effects of valuing fixed assets at estimated costs and appraised values) present fairly, in all material respects, the assets, liabilities, and net assets of the Administration, Home Mission, Camp Ground, District Reserve, Medical, Nazarene Missions International, Church New Start, Sunday School and Discipleship Ministries International and Nazarene Youth International funds of the Illinois District Church of the Nazarene as of April 30, 2012, and its support, revenue and expenses and cash flows for the year then ended, on the basis of accounting described in Note 1.

Our audit was made for the purpose of forming an opinion on the statement of assets, liabilities and net assets – modified cash basis and the related statements of support, revenue and expenses and cash flows – modified cash basis. The accompanying supplementary information contained on pages 11 through 26 is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain other procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. In our opinion, the information is fairly stated in all material respects in relation to the financial statements taken as a whole.

NOTE 1 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Nature of Activities

Illinois District Church of the Nazarene is a not-for-profit corporation organized under the laws of the State of Illinois. Its purpose is to provide administrative and financial assistance to the local Nazarene churches in the District. The organization is supported primarily through budget receipts from the local churches.

Description of Programs

Illinois District Church of the Nazarene offers the following programs:

- Home Mission – This program was established to assist churches in need.
- Camp Ground – This program was established to minister to various individuals and groups by providing a place for recreational activity, as well as providing a place to minister to the attendees / users.
- Medical – This program was established for the purpose of facilitating the receipt and payment of health and life insurance premiums for ministers, and to make partial reimbursements to retired ministers for their medical expenses.
- Nazarene Missions International – This program was established to provide support for Missionaries approved by the General Church of the Nazarene and to support local churches in NMI programs.
- Church New Start – This program was established to provide assistance to new church start-ups.
- Sunday School and Discipleship Ministries International – This program provides spiritual, recreational activities, and camps for youth participation (elementary level) and to support local churches with their Sunday School programs.
- Nazarene Youth International – This program provides spiritual, recreational activities, and trips for youth participation (junior high and senior high level) and to support local churches in their NYI programs.

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements are presented using a modified cash basis of accounting. This basis of accounting recognizes assets, liabilities, net assets, revenues, and expenses when they result from cash transactions. This basis is a comprehensive basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

As a result of the use of this modified cash basis of accounting, certain assets and their related revenues (such as accounts receivable) and certain liabilities and their related expenses (such as accounts payable) *are not recorded* in these financial statements.

NOTE 1 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)

Cash and Cash Equivalents

The District considers all highly liquid investment instruments available for current use with an initial maturity of three months or less to be cash equivalents.

Investments

Investments in mutual funds with readily determinable fair values are reported at their fair values in the Statement of Assets, Liabilities and Net Assets – Modified Cash Basis. The District carries investments in marketable securities with readily determinable fair values in the Statement of Assets, Liabilities and Net Assets – Modified Cash Basis. Unrealized gains and losses are included in the change in net assets in the accompanying Statement of Support, Revenues and Expenses – Modified Cash Basis.

Property and Equipment

The District has recorded its property and equipment at appraised and estimated values, which is not in conformity with the modified cash basis of accounting. Depreciation has not been computed on fixed assets.

Income Taxes

The District is exempt from Federal income taxes under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. In addition, the District has been determined by the Internal Revenue Service not to be a private foundation within the meaning of Section 509(a) of the code.

Estimates

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with the modified cash basis of accounting requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Loans Receivable and Payable and Transfers between Program Accounts

Loans between programs have a zero net effect on the Statement of Assets, Liabilities and Net Assets – Modified Cash Basis and have been eliminated. In addition, transfers between programs have a zero net effect on the Statement of Support, Revenue and Expenses – Modified Cash Basis and have been eliminated.

NOTE 2 – CONCENTRATION OF CREDIT RISK

The District maintains multiple accounts at various financial institutions. Accounts at these institutions are insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC). As of April

30, 2012, total cash at one institution exceeded FDIC limits in the amount of \$1,975.72.

NOTE 3 – INVESTMENTS

Investments are stated at fair value and consist of mutual funds. Fair values as of April 30, 2012 are summarized as follows:
