Toler recently was given an honorary Doctorate of Divinity from Southern Nazarene University.

He and his wife, Linda, an educator, have two married sons, Seth (Marcy) and Adam (Amanda), and one grandson Rhett.









- We are "Baptizing" This past church year saw many come to express their faith in Christ through baptism. In total, 18 people were baptized in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit this year!
- We are "Teaching" We are hearing and obeying Christ in several ways: Our revival last year with Dan Bohi was a high point as many confessed sins, found grace, and were set free to follow Christ fervently. We are also learning through our "SEE 2015" (ReFocus) efforts. Through this process, our hearts are being turned inside out in the hopes of becoming a "missional church" that seeks more than attracting people to us, but sending each of our people out to impact those people within their circles of influence.
- We are "Sending" This past year we have sent our people out to learn, to serve, and to make disciples. We sent several of our students on mission trips. Two have been serving for several weeks outside the US this summer. Our teens regularly serve others in Jesus name on similar trips and projects closer to home. Finally, through sacrificial giving and service, we sent our Kid's Choir to sing and experience General Assembly in Orlando last year. What a joy it was to see and hear them singing with hundreds of other children there!
- We are "Giving" What a year of giving this has been for our church! While the world around us was crying recession and many were hanging on to every dollar in fear, we were giving in faith! All of our assigned "Giving for Others" was completed a week before the year ended. Our Faith Promise pledges totaled over \$33,000 and we are faithfully fulfilling them. Hospitality and Compassionate Ministries are serving others regularly. As God faithfully provides, we are faithfully giving to meet the needs of others.

So you see, the picture of Casey First Church of the Nazarene is much bigger than the attendance numbers suggest. After all, we've done all of this with less people! If God is with us, who can be against us!

It is with joy that I bring my 10th report for the Centralia Church of the Nazarene. This has been the best year, of my pastorate in Centralia, to date; however, I believe it has been a year which has taught us some things to help move forward in years to come with even greater strides.

For Team Day 2009, we took 14 people to learn how to be more effective in ministry. One of the key lessons we learned was that we needed to be more intentional in our approach. Setting goals and making plans to try to achieve distinct outcomes. We took the information we learned at Team Day and put it into motion beginning with VBS. Counting students and workers; we had 118 enrolled for VBS 2009. As a follow-up for VBS, we planned a concert, tie-dye party, and ice cream party. Adults and children attended the concert, and then tie-dyed shirts after eating their ice cream. The shirts had to be processed overnight, so everyone had to return the next morning to get their shirt. The event had nearly 130 people in attendance, with 109 returning for morning worship the next day. We had purposely planned an event where adults and children could come together for fun, yet required them to interact with one another. As a result, everyone got a free shirt they could proudly wear telling everyone they had made it themselves.

As a result of that event, we were able to glean an important principle. We need to be developing more activities and ministries where children and adults, specifically their parents/guardians, interact in a fun environment. On Saturday night before Valentine's Day, the church hosted a banquet for the adults and asked a \$5 donation for the meal. The money that was raised was donated to the local Pregnancy Care Center, a \$250 donation being made possible, and during the meal, the adults were asked to write Valentine's Day cards to the children. The next day in children's church, the children were given their cards, and asked to make cards for all of the adults in service that morning. It was wonderful to see the children rushing around after the morning service making sure every adult received cards.

This approach to being more intentional has led to an increase in worship attendance of nearly 10% from last year's attendance. More importantly, there are nearly a dozen people who did not attend church last year who are now attending because they were drawn in through these types of activities. We returned to Team Day 2010, this time with 17 people. More insight was gained, and as the new church year begins, we are planning ways we can use this new information to build upon our existing knowledge base. I look forward to what God has in store for Centralia, and I truly believe our best days lie in front of us rather than behind us.

This past year has been another in a long line of transitions for New Day and for me as a Pastor. I have completed my 5th year of full-time bi-vocational ministry and as a Church we have made another significant transition. As many of you know we sold our property three years ago and have been leasing our old building from the new owners. This year we had an option of renewing the lease at \$1000 a month, plus all Utilities, Insurance, upkeep etc. etc. As we looked at that prospect, we began to pray about a more affective usage of our finances - so we began looking at buildings to rent and found absolutely none within our price range. So, we decided that it was time for us to Re-Think how we do Church. We looked at Schools, Motels and Banquet Halls and finally decided to rent two rooms from The Refinery on John Street in Champaign. The cost of renting the rooms is less than what we would pay to just heat our old building during the winter months - so that was a plus. We would only need to Insure our belongings and not the building itself - another plus. They do all of the upkeep and pay the utilities - an even bigger plus. They even set up the platform, tables and chairs in the two rooms that we rent. In addition to the stewardship factors of renting the rooms - The Refinery is a very attractive building, with allot of apartments surrounding it. The Refinery has built in foot traffic, because of the many people who are in the building on a daily basis to use the facilities, including the state of the art Exercise Club. It has "curb appeal" because of its appearance and location. When we added all of that up - it became a "win - win" for us and for them.

We have had to make major adjustments to how we do Church and I believe God is helping us to finally be in a position to accomplish the mission we believe He has for New Day Community Church.

Collinsville Good Samaritan

When's the last time you took a good, hard look in the mirror? This is what the great people of Good Samaritan Church of the Nazarene have spent the better part of this past year doing. Employing the help of New Church Specialties, the congregation went through a lengthy period of detailed assessment. Self-assessment takes courage, especially if change is required. But with the goal of continued transformation increasingly into the likeness of Christ, our congregation courageously took a long, hard look in the mirror.... Here's just a little of what we discovered.

1. We have some significant assets upon which to build...

The congregation expressed a deep, passionate desire to grow not only numerically, but spiritually. No signs of apathy here. Rather, there's a craving for spiritual deepening among us. Building upon this foundation, a monthly "Concert of Prayer" prayer meeting took root. God's people came together to call upon Him in true worship.

The Good Samaritan Ministries Center, an outreach initiated by the people of Good Samaritan Church within the heart of urban Washington Park, continues to offer hope and healing in an area of much despair and brokenness. Seeking to care for the bodies and souls of our neighbors in that area, much has been invested there by our people.

2. We also discovered several key areas for improvement...

We long to become an indispensible resource to our local community in Collinsville, yet our presence currently seems little known. Pastor Sean Asbeck and our teens have led the way in response through the "Adopt-A-Block" initiative taking place all this summer. "Financial Peace University" was also offered, with more than half the class coming from the broader community. We plan to continue to network with community leaders, seeking to listen and mobilize to respond to the true needs among us.

Intentional leadership development is also needed if our congregation is to embrace God's mission for us. There is a need for unity both in spirit and focus. Our lay leaders are hungry to both envision and lead together as God guides.

Looking in the mirror, we have much reason for Hope as we increasingly take on the character of the Christ who is among us, seeking to be the Light of Christ to our world.

Decatur First

The Decatur First Church of the Nazarene has been faithful to the mission of "leading people to a Christ-like life." We continue to reap the benefits from our Vision 2009-2010 which laid the groundwork for action steps and strategies focused on prayer, first impressions, outreach, evangelism, worship, mission & compassion ministries, discipleship, service, fellowship, and growth.

As a result of God's faithfulness and our obedience, we had an increase of 44 in Morning Worship attendance. Combined with last year's growth, we had an increase of 90 people in worship and 39 in Sunday School in a two-year period. We also had an increase in giving of \$26,973 which came as our people gave sacrificially during a difficult financial environment.

One of the major steps of faith we took this year was the hiring of Justin Neufeld as our part-time Community Life Outreach Director. Through sports and recreation, he has opened a new door for those in our community to hear the gospel. We began an Upwards basketball program in January and had 98 children participate. We are looking to expand this ministry to flag football & soccer in the coming year. Justin also started a number of programs including: dodge ball, flag football, Zumba, cardio kids, a golf league, volleyball, and much more. These programs have allowed people in our community to enter our church in a non-threatening way as we seek to lead them to a Christ-like life.

In the mission and compassion arenas, we have continued our emphasis of "Here, There, & Anywhere". We had 25 people go to Orlando for the One Heart, Many Hands Endeavor and have a large group heading to Columbus, Ohio, this summer for the One Heart, Many Hands Work and Witness trip. We raised over \$6,500 for the Haiti relief project, gave Jared Bouton \$2,500 for his mission work in Ecuador, and worked with the City of Decatur to help winterize a number of homes for those less fortunate. Our Helping Hands ministry fed and clothed a few thousand families throughout the year, and we hope to help the Oak Grove church re-roof their parsonage.

We installed a sand volleyball court and poured a 70 x 110 parking lot to assist our growing congregation. We are presently working with the city of Decatur to further develop our property as we seek to add soccer fields, a second softball field, an additional sand volleyball court, a picnic shelter and grills near our pond, a tennis court, a walking path, playground miniature golf course, and another gym/banquet facility which could house a swimming pool.

We continue to provide a variety of outreach events such as our Family Fun Fest, Harvest Party, Crosswalk, Passion Play, and new this new year was a Christmas drama. Our Creative Kids Day Care & Learning Center has expanded to be able to minister to approximately 148 children and their families many of which we see join us on Sunday.

In February we had a Marriage emphasis: "A Marriage That Goes The Distance" which led to a special day in which we renewed the wedding vows of a large number of our people and actually held a wedding during our Sunday service. 

An outreach strategy that we implemented this year was our monthly movie night at the church. We showed Christian movies at the church one Friday evening a month. The movie was provided free of charge.



Flora


It is a privilege to share my sixth report as senior pastor of the Flora church. Over the past year, the Flora congregation has been living out Paul's instructions in Romans 12:13, to "share with God's people who are in need. Practice hospitality." Despite the current economic slow-down the church paid all its ministry fund allocations in full, including the highest mission giving in Flora church history. In a special Haiti relief offering, the congregation gave well beyond expectations, receiving \$2,300 to help the earthquake victims. We also lent a helping hand by providing several hundred dollars in support of a new district pastor and his family.

In our own community, sharing with those in need included spear-heading a community benefit that raised over \$6,000 to help a local cancer victim with medical expenses. In addition, we provided several smaller gifts to help local families through the economic downturn.

A couple of years ago, in response to a community children's outreach, a Japanese family started attending the church, the father part of the management team of a Japanese owned manufacturing plant in Flora. Buddhist in background, they were looking for a place where their children could learn about God. Since there was no Buddhist temple, they decided to give the Flora Church of the Nazarene a try. Flora is not a very diverse community and I wondered how the congregation would respond. My fears sub-sided when I saw a lady get up from her seat during a Wednesday night Bible study to sit with Waka in order to show her how to look up Scripture references. Waka was soon involved in one-on-one Bible study with another lady in the church, joined the choir, and attended Sunday School regularly with her children. Before the family left Flora to return to Japan this past April, Waka expressed her belief in the Risen Christ. expressed their desire to find a church home in Japan where they could continue to grow in relationship to Jesus Christ. Please pray for Waka and her family that the seeds that have been planted will continue to grow.

Lincoln First

It started so innocently. A well-meaning group of men from a sister church visiting our area for a men's retreat wanted to volunteer a day of labor. So, we started looking for enough work to keep a dozen or so guys busy for about six hours. The upstairs bathrooms had not been painted for quite awhile and the carpet in the foyer, office, and hallway was ready to be retired and we had plenty left over from the garden level renovations earlier in the year. There you have it. A few simple, quick and relatively inexpensive improvements. Or so we thought . . .

When the church board agreed on this plan someone added a harmless suggestion: "While we're at it, could we do something with the countertop in the women's restroom?" The snowflake had fallen that would trigger the avalanche. I mean, if you're going to replace the counter, it really needs a new sink. If you replace the sink, you might as well change the faucet. And then there's the flooring. "That vinyl is looking shabby." "You know, we really need to consider the Americans with Disabilities accessibility standards when we do this." That means checking heights of counters, toilets, and mirrors, adding grab bars and making sure the doors swing the right way and having proper amounts of floor clearance. Then there's the issue of storage. "We've never had a place to keep cleaning supplies upstairs." And don't forget lighting and decorating. Before you know it, a heartfelt gesture of caring assistance from a bunch of willing handymen has cost an arm and a leg. Some paint and carpet has turned into a major overhaul. Six hours of volunteer labor has mushroomed into about 60 more, all because somebody wanted to be a blessing.

The moral of the story could be misconstrued as, "Watch out when someone offers to do something nice for you." I see our tale instead as a powerful reminder that each part affects all the other parts. For better or worse, every member, every ministry, everything that is done (or not done) in Jesus' name changes who we are. Improve the room and you've improved the house, but neglect or trash the room and you've devalued the home.

It's my privilege to share that around our "house," some areas are being improved. Within the walls, we've received 4 members this year – two new Nazarenes and two transfers, all our allocations have been overpaid, and the building itself is undergoing substantial changes. After flooding several times last spring a pump was installed to dry us out. New carpet followed and a vision to transform our garden level into a children's ministry area dubbed, "Faith Park" got underway. Now the office, foyer and bathrooms are being updated. Beyond the brick and mortar, our Angel Food ministry has been a witness to many in the community. Outside our doors we once again joined with 15 other churches in Lincoln last fall to serve the community in a day of improvement projects. We've been able to support other ministries including our local Christian radio station, Living Alternatives PRC, and the Salvation Army of Logan County. Additionally, we've been able to assist several persons in need. God has blessed and we, in turn, have tried to share His generosity.

Still, I can't help but feel that there are many areas that need improvement. We need to do a better job of reaching out to children and teens. We need seek out inactive members and invite them to come home. We all need to be more willing to surrender our preferences for the sake of the people were trying to reach. I'm praying the Lord will continue to bless us, improve us and make us into a beautiful home for Him!

The 2009-2010 Assembly Year has been extremely difficult in a variety of ways. Family tragedy that basically "blindsided" us even contributed to a physical health crisis. This was a time during which the congregation ministered to the pastor and family in a memorable way. That attitude and relationship virtually continued throughout the entire year as a seemingly endless "string" of circumstances unfolded.

With that as a backdrop, we saw God make His presence and help known. Concern mounted over the need of a new roof on the church. Our congregation gave sacrificially, but the total raised was slightly less than half of what was needed. We ultimately discovered that, thanks to excellent insurance coverage, we were eligible to make a claim that brought in almost all of the remaining funds we needed.

We had a team of fifteen adults and youth who traveled to the state of Kansas to work for a solid week to help two of our Hispanic churches. All who saw our efforts left amazed at both the volume and quality of work our crew accomplished. Now we are looking forward to a team composed predominantly of youth who will be traveling to the Columbus, Ohio, area for the "Work & Witness" project associated with "One Heart, Many Hands." Our entire congregation is excitedly supporting our young people in this venture. Those youngsters got "pumped up" this spring with the "Radiate" project in Decatur, and work in Columbus has brought an even greater degree of enthusiasm.

There are both highlights and lowlights that could be shared about this church year, but one of the most significant high moments came last fall in our revival with Mark Murphy. Our altar services had been wonderful throughout, but Mark was led to preach on the closing night that giving even 99 percent to the Lord wasn't enough. Nick bowed at an altar of prayer and arose to testify, "I've been satisfied to give God 99 percent, but no more. He has 100 of me from now on. Nick is now sharing that witness with our youth group which he and his wife are now heading up.

Yes, there have been difficult, even heartbreaking, times this year; but our God is a God of definite victory.


We have had an opportunity to disciple one on one, and we just completed a series on End Times.





Omaha

Members and Friends of this Assembly:

This is my fourth report for Omaha. This year we had three revivals with many finding help. We continue in prayer with fasting and prayer the first Saturday of each month, and open prayer time every Sunday from 12:30 - 4:00.

We are a community oriented Church working with the community and the other Churches in Omaha.

This year our Churches food pantry gave enough food to make 10,000 meals ministering to almost 350 families in six Illinois counties, one Kentucky county and one Indiana County. We also continued our blanket ministry this year giving blankets to families that need them. We gave 20 blankets this winter. We also continue our personal hygiene ministry giving out soap, shampoo, toothbrushes, toothpaste and other personal hygiene products that cannot be bought with food stamps.

This year at Christmas our Church "adopted" 11 families that would not have had any gifts or food. In these 11 families, 36 were Children and 18 Adults. We presented each person with 3 gifts, enough food to feed the entire family for 3 days and a Family Bible. The total cost of these compassionate ministries was just over \$2000.

We are down in numbers, this year however through the Churches ministries 16 people came to know Jesus Christ as personal savior, and 6 were baptized.

We had a Great Bible School this year with 34 Children plus 6 Adults and 2 Teen helpers. At Our Bible School program we had 86 people present which is 35% of the population of Omaha

I ask that you keep us in your prayers as God grows his Church. Remember "I will build my Church and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it." Matthew 16:18b. It is God that builds the Church we are the tools and material that he uses. We must be a holy useful people that God can use. I Praise Him for what He has done, what He is doing and what He will Do!!! AMEN!

Financially, it has been a banner year, through faithful tithing, mission-mindedness and sacrificial giving.



This past year has been a challenging year for me personally and for the ministry of Roxana Church of the Nazarene. Dr. Spruce likes to ask a question of churches and church boards. The question is simply, "What year is this?" Of course it is 2010. We all know that. The second question might be more difficult. "What year is it in your church?"

And, we would agree that the church is not supposed to be shaped by the world, but is called to shape its world. I also understand, however, that we have to speak in a language that people understand if the gospel is going to be communicated. This principle was established when God became flesh and incarnated the Living Word in a particular time, place, language, and culture in order to communicate His love to fallen humanity. This principle is further illustrated on Pentecost when God revealed that His Word needed to be understood in every language, culture, race, and gender, by offering it in every tongue present. So, the question that I have to keep asking myself is, "Are we still communicating the unchanging Word effectively to the culture in which we live and serve?" In order to do so better, here are some things that we are or should be thinking about.

I think we need to find ways to go digital. In the coming year, I want to increase our presence on the web. I would also like to create a presence on Facebook and to develop some form of blogging-- about the sermon or just about God-stuff in general. This current generation is much more comfortable "talking" about things in the virtual world than they are in the real world. I think the opportunities online are unlimited. I have also been exploring ways to create an organic church community using web resources to distribute the message and Sunday School content.

I am still wondering what opportunities we have to expand our physical presence in this community. Certainly, I think that we have to think about alternate services in terms of time, format, location, and culture. I do not want to be in the position where we simply say to the world around us, "If you can't meet Jesus in a church building at 10 a.m. on Sunday then you can just go to ..." well, you know what I am saying. Please pray with me that we might see where the harvest is ripe and be willing to step out into those fields.

Dear Dr. Toler, Dr. Spruce and delegates to the assembly.



Springfield First

Dr. Toler, Dr. Spruce, Members and Friends of the Assembly,

This is my 28th pastor's report for the Church of the Nazarene, and my sixth report for Springfield First Church of the Nazarene. This year we celebrated our 90th Anniversary as a church. We realized the great sacrifices of those who went before us, and understood the solid foundation, which was laid by others, has made it possible for us to have a vibrant and alive church today. We celebrate the rich heritage we have.

We did a number of things to recognize our ninety years of impacting our community, our world, and the individual lives of people for Christ. We became involved in Angel Food Ministry, and bought 90 boxes of Thanksgiving Boxes, which were donated to the Inner City Mission of Springfield. We received 342 \$90 gifts to help us once again meet our World Evangelism Fund obligation. We started a ministry to Lee Elementary School, in Springfield, where 90% of the students come from low-income families. We bought winter coats, provided school supplies, and have had dozens of volunteers give hundred of hours of time as mentors and classroom aides.

Momentum, a Friday night outreach ministry to teens, continues to impact the lives of teens and their families. Each Friday evening around 200 teens fill up our building, for sports, video games, food, and hanging out. At each Half Time a message is presented and two different times the teens were given a chance to respond to the Gospel presentation and we saw dozens of teens become Christ-followers as they asked Him into their lives.

We have purposely taken the church outside the four walls of the building to let our community know the difference Christ can make. So, our teens once a month have been involved in service projects around our community. Twice a year we have a "Coffeehouse Comedy" where our community is invited to a night of laughter and great desserts. We also have sponsored "The Neighborhood Connection," a giant block party with live music, games, food, and a 5K Walk/Run all for the benefit of Hope Institute, a school that ministers to the special needs of children with autism. We continue to provide monthly meals for Helping Hands of Springfield, and the Ronald McDonald House.


We have also ministered to the needs of those within the church by strengthening our Small Group Ministry; and we received our first ever "White Bucket Offering," which is set aside to assist those within the Body of Christ who are facing financial difficulties. Our Women Ministries also began a once a month "Craft Connection" where women have come together not only to make crafts, but to also build relationships.

Through serving and loving our world, and loving those within the community of Christ, we have also focused on deepening our love for God. Our worship team has led us in vibrant worship experiences, our Wednesday evening Prayer Gatherings have taught us to rely more on the Lord, and our eight-week study called "The Pursuit," really focused the entire church on the importance of pursing the heart of God in all things, at all times, and in all relationships.

90 years has not nearly been long enough to make the impact we want to for Christ; and so as a church we are committed to following the directive Paul gave the people of the Colossian church, "And whatever you do, whether in word or deed, do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through Him." (Colossians 3:17 NIV)

Good Samaritan Ministries

What started as a small ministry from a tiny home in the Washington Park Community has grown into a large-scale outreach program with a fully functioning ministry center. The newly opened Good Samaritan Ministry (GSM) Center is a 6,000 square foot facility complete with fully functioning kitchen, resource room, nursery, restroom and shower facilities, a free laundry facility, and a worship center for the Washington Park community.

Good Samaritan Ministries of the Metro East is a Nazarene Compassionate Ministry Center and is registered with the IRS as a 501(c) 3 organization, supported by generous gifts from local organizations, churches, and individuals. Without volunteers and the donation of their time, talent and treasury, GSM could not function.

Our mission is simple: to provide help to those in need by befriending them and pointing them to their true hope in Christ Jesus. To that end, we provide physical, emotional, and spiritual nourishment through a wide variety of ministry opportunities, and purposely target individuals and families that are experiencing difficulties making ends meet. Our main emphasis is to provide a hand up, not just a hand out and help people get their "feet back under them".

To meet material needs, we provide canned goods, non-perishable items, and clothing to those in need. The GSM facility provides free shower and laundry facilities. We also provide up to 3 grants (monthly) of \$250.00 for families needing help with house payments, utilities, medical bills, or other emergency needs.

Through GSM we are able to offer free counseling and job search services to those needing assistance and are open 4 days a week, including Bible study and Discipleship. The highlight of GSM is the Saturday worship service at the center. Here, people from the Washington Park community, volunteer workers, and many others gather together to worship our Lord. These powerful services are the catalyst for what God is doing in the lives of people through GSM.

With the beginning of the new Church year comes renewal of operating expenses such as liability insurance and other annual expenditures. As our ministry grows, so do operational costs. We are seeing more and more new families come to our center for assistance. If the recession has affected you in any way, just imagine how much further behind it has put the low income families that we have been assisting through this ministry.

God has been truly blessing this ministry and has been making it pretty clear that it's time to take it to the next level. Please pray for us for wisdom and guidance as we seek his direction. District Missionary's Report to the District Assembly 2009-2010

Members and friends of the District Assembly, it is a joy to present to you my third report as District Missionary. Let me begin by thanking my partners in leadership: thanks to Dr. Spruce and those who have served on the Mission Strategy Team this year: Philip Alvord, Kevin Donoho, Allen Ebbler, Randy Miller, Greg Breeden, Jerry Gravatt, Bruce McEwen, Timothy Mondy, and Bob Turner. You have served so faithfully this year! Thanks also to our NewStart pastors, who serve on the frontline of our mission: Bill Brandon, Highland; Gary Clark, Marion Oasis Community; Wayne Clevenger, Urbana Lighthouse; Jerry Gravatt, and his recent successors, Nick Briggs and Lila Chapman, at Vandalia.

Our District continues to show their support for our mission. The Mission Strategy Team has distributed over \$21,000 in grants this year. With those grants we provided assessments, ministry materials, property improvements, and pastoral support for NewStart pastors. We also funded Church Assessments and Church Health Surveys for several of our Refocusing churches.

We sponsored and enjoyed two District Team Days this year. The first, in February, was held at Decatur First Church, and the second, in March, at Salem Grace. Approximately 220 attended the Decatur event and 100 attended at Salem. That means over 300 pastors and leaders received encouragement, training, and support in these events. Thanks to Pastor Tim Crump and Kevin Donoho and to our host churches for making these venues available. And to all our presenters who provided such excellent workshops. Thanks to Allen Ebbler, our pastor at Pana, and Lara Mondy from Centralia, who did most of the work and planning this year. These events continue to be an annual highlight on our District.

I have personally worked with eleven churches this year making ReFocus presentations and coaching with their pastors. We have worked with New Church Specialties and her representatives to provide training opportunities for our pastors and leaders: the Organic Church workshop last fall with Darrell McLearn and our on-site New Church University with Lonnie Bullock and Tim Gates this past Spring. Each brought challenging information and inspiration to our pastors and leaders. Seeds for church health and discipleship were planted that will no doubt bear fruit in the years to come.

I worked with the PALCON planning committee to put together a day of training for bi-vocational pastors this year. There we met and heard Dr. Dennis Bickers who we will be hosting here in September (11th) for our own seminar on small church health and bi-vocational ministry. We also plan to have another training opportunity in the Spring.

The future finds us continuing to work toward a ReStart at Granite City with the hopes of replanting a missional church in that area. We continue to pray about a NewStart in Effingham, where we envision a new congregation launched as a cooperative effort between several surrounding churches. We are seeking a church planter who will help us. Would you join us in praying for the Lord to send laborers into this harvest field?

New funding is in place this year to support church planters. In order to help us in cultivating church planters among us, we will be working with the Exponential Church Planting Network to provide materials for our pastors and

churches in the hopes of awakening those in our congregations whom Christ may be calling.

Our stated goals remain: That every church should take the church health survey, develop a written church action plan, and target new communities for NewStarts. Our pastors also need to be involved in a coaching relationship to provide accountability and encouragement.

Finally, and primarily, I am trusting God to do a new work in our District. That work is nothing that I can accomplish on my own, but indeed is something that must first begin in my own heart and in my own church at Casey. I am leading our own ReFocusing effort there and learning firsthand how God revives a church around a new vision. I am praying for our pastors and churches across our District to do the same.

Each of us has a responsibility, pastors and leaders alike to become Christ focused and mission driven. The one place that we can begin is in our own hearts. Your own renewal is the key to your church's renewal, and your church's renewal is the key to our District's renewal. Let us draw near to God, in the hopes that he will draw near to us, and fulfill His mission through: *To develop healthy, multiplying, holiness churches and pastors with a new passion, for new people, and a new Illinois!*

It continues to be a blessing to be able to work with Dr. Jim Spruce and learn from him.

The privilege has been mine to work with Rev. Mark Copley, District Missionary, the District Advisory Board, various other district boards and committees along with local churches as the opportunity has been afforded to me.

Nina and I thank you for allowing us to be a part of the administrative team that serves this great district.

This is my sixth report to you as your Administrative Associate, and my 37th year as a minister of which 29 of those have been on the Illinois District.

I preach quite often concerning Martha and the indictment that is made about her in Luke 10:40 that she was distracted. Every time I read that scripture I ask God to examine my life to see if the legitimate things of life are distracting me from doing the most important and keeping first things first. In the day we live in it is easy to become distracted doing legitimate "church" things and lose sight of the most important.

It reminds me of the following story The Lifesaving Station by Theodore Wedel.

"On a dangerous seacoast where shipwrecks often occur, there was once a crude little lifesaving station. The building was no more than a hut, and there was only one boat; but the few devoted members kept a constant watch over the sea. With no thought for themselves, they went out day and night, tirelessly searching

for the lost. Some of those who were saved, and various others in the surrounding area, wanted to be associated with the station and give their time, money, and effort to support the work. New boats were bought and new crews trained. The little lifesaving station grew.

Some of these new members of the lifesaving station were unhappy that the building was so crude and poorly equipped. They felt that a more comfortable place should be provided as the first refuge of those who were saved from the sea. They replaced the emergency cots with beds and put better furniture in the enlarged building. Now the lifesaving station became a popular gathering place for its members, and they decorated it beautifully and furnished it exquisitely because they used it as sort of a club. Fewer members were not interested in going to sea on lifesaving missions, so they hired lifeboat crews to do this work. The lifesaving motif still prevailed in this club's decoration, and there was a memorial lifeboat in the room where the club initiations were held.

About this time a large ship was wrecked off the coast, and the hired crews brought in boatloads of cold, wet, half-drowned people. They were dirty and sick, and some of them were foreigners. The beautiful new club was in chaos. Immediately, the property committee hired someone to rig up a shower house outside the club, where victims of shipwrecks could be cleaned up before coming inside.

At the next meeting, there was a split in the club membership. Most of the members wanted to stop the club's lifesaving activities because they felt they were unpleasant and a hindrance to the normal social life of the club. A small number of members insisted upon lifesaving as their primary purpose and pointed out that they were still called a lifesaving station. The small group's members were voted down and told that if they wanted to save lives, they could begin their own lifesaving station down the coast.

They did and as the years went by, however, the new station experienced the same changes that had occurred in the old station. It evolved into a club, and yet another lifesaving station was founded. History continued to repeat itself, and if you visit that seacoast today, you will find a number of exclusive clubs along that shore.

Shipwrecks are frequent in those waters, but most of the passengers drown."

As Disciples of Jesus, our primary task is to go and make disciples. "18 Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. 19 Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, 20 and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."" Matt 28:18-20 (NIV) To put it another way, we are to go and save lives. Unfortunately, we sometimes lose sight of our purpose and get distracted. We need to recover our passion for lifesaving. We need to be doers of the Word and not hearers only. "22 Do not merely listen to the word, and so deceive yourselves. Do what it says." James 1:22 (NIV)

Let's not become distracted but keep the first things first and our eyes upon Jesus as we go about making disciples.

NOTE: New text is <u>underlined</u>; brackets [] indicate text to be deleted.

RESOLVED that *Manual* paragraph 31.2 be amended as follows:

31.2. Election of Delegates. At a district assembly within 16 months of the meeting of the General Assembly or within 24 months in areas where travel visas or other unusual preparations are necessary, an equal number of ministerial and lay delegates to the General Assembly shall be [chosen as may be provided by the General Assembly, and] elected by plurality vote, provided that the ministerial delegates shall be assigned ordained ministers of the Church of the Nazarene. Each Phase 3 assembly district shall be entitled to at least one ministerial and one lay delegate, and such additional delegates as its membership may warrant on the basis of representation fixed by the General Assembly. Each assembly district shall elect alternate delegates not exceeding twice the number of its delegates. In situations where travel visas are problematic, a district assembly may authorize the district advisory board to select additional alternates. (203.23, 301-1.1)

B. INSTRUCTIONS TO STUDENTS

Eligibility

The board serves only the persons who are properly enrolled. Enrollment is open only to local preachers, deacons-Christian education, deacons-compassionate ministries, deacons-music ministries, and prospective ministers of music who qualify according to the Manual, 410.

Courses

There are seven general courses administered by the Ministerial Studies Board; elders, deacon of administration, deacon of compassionate ministries, deacon of Christian education, deacon of music, deacon of youth, and lay minister (Handbook of Ministerial Studies).

Ministers, deacons and deaconesses will not be ordained without having completed their respective courses. An exception to this is provided for all commissioned song evangelists who held this status immediately prior to the 1986 assembly season. Those becoming commissioned song evangelists will complete the deacon track in music ministries. Those interested in commissioned or registered song evangelists' credentials should study carefully all requirements as listed in *Handbook on Ministerial Studies*, 446, "The Song Evangelist."

Modes of Study

The options for the course of study are listed below (by preference) as recommended and approved by the Illinois District Ministerial Studies Board.

- 1. A Nazarene university or an accredited university, pursuing a degree in a religious field of study.
- 2. Nazarene Theological Seminary.
- 3. Nazarene Bible College or NBC Ministry Preparation Program.
- 4. Northwest Nazarene University Online Module Courses
- 5. Nazarene Bible College: NBC Track.

The Course of Study is under the immediate supervision of the District Board of Ministerial Studies. Students are advised to pursue preparation or ordination by

selecting one of the above-mentioned modes of study. Each student is assigned an advisor to work with in establishing a plan of study.

The courses required of college students are in the Manual, 424.3. The competency statements for ministerial education are listed in Manual, 424.3. All college and university programs must meet these competency statements for course of study.

C. REGULATIONS FOR MINISTERIAL COURSE OF STUDY

- 1. It is no longer necessary for students to purchase the *Sourcebook for Ministerial Development*. - 2. Each student is encouraged to take four courses each year. The general church requires 2 courses per year to be passed, to allow a student to continue. After the district license is granted to the student, only ten years is allowed to complete the 24 required courses, Manual 427.4. At 2 per year, the student will not succeed. Thus, the Illinois District has chosen to encourage students to complete 4 courses per year. All course work must be completed by the end of the assembly year (April) in order for the student to receive credit for that assembly year. The only exception is for those students enrolled in an institution of higher learning in which the class may not conclude until the board meets in May.
- 3. A student is placed in a study level based on the number of courses completed regardless of the level of the courses. The only exception is that the course on the Manual of the Church of the Nazarene must be completed before level one is considered complete (unless the student is enrolled in a religion program at a Nazarene institution) and before the student is eligible for a district license.
- 4. The secretary may not enroll anyone except by written letter from the applicant to include the following information: name (first, middle and last); address; telephone number; e-mail address; course of study desired; church where current membership is held; letter of recommendation from the church pastor where membership is held; copy of local license granted by that church; and official transcripts from colleges or other schools beyond high school. It will be the obligation of the student to see that all the information is sent to the secretary. An application form will be made available for anyone expressing interest in enrolling with the Board of Ministerial Studies.
- 5. Prior to being issued a graduation certificate, all students must be reviewed by the Ministerial Studies Board. The only exceptions are Nazarene Bible College graduates of the Bible Studies Course who are immediately issued a graduation certificate. No student will be graduated from the course of study without completing an internship program.

- 6. When a student moves to another district, the secretary of the Ministerial Board should transfer the student's records to the new district by contacting the secretary of that district's Board of Ministerial Studies. Students are strongly advised to keep copies of course record sheets and final grades. The District is not responsible for loss of data when transferring to another district.
- 7. Candidates should be prepared to appear annually before the Board of Ministerial Studies. These meetings will be scheduled by the district office and notification of the meetings will be sent to you.
- 8. Files for inactive students will be maintained by the Board of Ministerial Studies for no longer than 10 years.
- Students are required to keep an active e-mail account while enrolled in the course of study.

College Students

College students are responsible to submit to the board documentary evidence of academic standing in harmony with *Manual*, 427.1, 427.4.

College students are reminded to plan their curriculum in harmony with *Manual*, 424.1 and 424.3. Yearly updates should be submitted to the secretary of the Board of Ministerial Studies. The Board of Ministerial Studies will evaluate the final transcript at graduation, and no requirements stated in the Manual will be waived.

D. CONTINUING EDUCATION

"Once a minister has fulfilled the expectations of the educational foundations for ministry, he or she will continue a pattern of lifelong learning to enhance the ministry of which God has called him or her. A minimum expectation is 20 contact hours each year (2 accredited continuing education units (CEU's) (*Manual* 424.6).

In order to facilitate the fulfillment of this requirement, a number of qualified events will be promoted through the district and by other means. An individual may receive CEU's by participating in a qualified event sponsored by the district, the general church, one of our colleges or universities or other approved method. When CEU's are available for a sponsored event, notification of the same will be made at the event and the participants will have the opportunity to sign up for credits. Credits will be based upon the participant attending the entire event and fulfilling other requirements (if applicable) for the event (such as extra reading or writing when appropriate). In all cases, it is the individual participant's responsibility to qualify him or herself for CEU credits.

The Board of Ministerial Studies appoints a continuing education director who shall be responsible to facilitate CEU qualified events and to resource individuals in obtaining CEU credits for events attended. Individuals may also contact the Department of Clergy Development directly with questions or for qualifying and awarding CEU credits for courses taken. All determination of CEU qualifications

shall be made by the Office of Ministry. All records of CEU's obtained shall be retained by the Department of Clergy Development and by the individual himself/herself. Courses taken for degree programs are not eligible for CEU credit.

Mission Strategy Team to the District Assembly 2009-2010

Members and friends of the assembly, it is my privilege to present to you my third report as chairman of the District Mission Strategy Team. The Mission Strategy Team this year included the following members: Dr. James R. Spruce (chairman, ex-officio); Mark Copley, District Missionary; Philip Alvord, Kevin Donoho, Allen Ebbler, Randy Miller, Greg Breeden, Jerry Gravatt, Bruce McEwen, Timothy Mondy, Bob Turner. We want to especially acknowledge the frontline work of our NewStart pastors and their sponsoring congregations: Jerry Gravatt (Vandalia – sponsored by Pana, and supported by Shelbyville); Wayne Clevenger (Urbana Lighthouse – supported by Ogden); Gary Clark (Marion-Harrisburg Oasis Community); and Bill Brandon (Highland).

The Mission Strategy Team distributed over \$21,000 in grants this year. With those grants we provided assessment, coaching, ministry materials,

property improvements, and pastoral support to our NewStart churches. We also funded Church Assessments and Church Health Surveys. And, we paid for every willing pastor and his leaders to attend New Church University. Nearly thirty did so.

This year, the Mission Strategy Team planned and presented two Team Days. The first, in February, was held at Decatur First Church, and the second, in March, at Salem Grace. Approximately 220 attended the Decatur event and 100 attended at Salem. That means 320 pastors and laypeople received encouragement, training, and support in these two events. Thanks to Pastor Crump and Donoho and to our host churches for making these venues available, and to all our presenters who provided such excellent workshops. Thanks to MST member Allen Ebbler, and Laura Mondy, pastor's wife at Centralia who did much of the work of planning this year. We hope that many churches will attend these events again this year.

Our shared vision includes: new church plants, reaching various people groups, stronger zone leadership and cooperation, and using new methods and means to reach new people. These aims are in line with our goals, listed here, which remain unchanged:

- 1. The churches of the Illinois District shall have a written strategic plan for reaching the lost and church growth.
- 2. The pastors of the Illinois District shall be involved in a coaching movement and maintain coaching relationships.
- 3. The churches of the Illinois District shall strive for church health using the church health survey and the Natural Church Development process (or the Nazarene Missional Church Survey).
- 4. The churches of the Illinois District shall have a clearly stated target area and plan for involvement in a NewStart project.

Our proposed budget reflects this vision with increased funding for church planters, NewStarts and ReFocusing churches.

Much thanks to all of those who have served on the Mission Strategy Team this year. Together, we are stewards of the mission of our district: *To develop healthy, multiplying, holiness churches and pastors.* Our vision for a new passion, for a new people, and a new Illinois remains to be seen. Let's pursue it together in Christ!

DISTRICT MISSION STRATEGY TEAM

Finance Committee

We, your Finance Committee, recommend the following:

- 1. In accordance with the General Church of the Nazarene Global Ministry Center that all budget payments be based on Church Income. Church Income (Qualified Income for Illinois District purposes) is defined as all income eligible under IRS guidelines for a tax deduction, reduced by payments made to the World Evangelism Fund, payments made for approved 10% specials, deductions for rare circumstances, phase in adjustments, and any other deduction allowed by the General Church of the Nazarene Global Ministry Center.
- That the Illinois District Budget be a unified budget with a single budget
 payment to include district administration and operations, NMI, NYI, and
 SDMI. All budget payments to be allocated to each department based on
 their pro-rata portion of budget receipts. Budget payments should be sent
 to William E. Shotts unified district treasurer.
- 3. That the World Evangelism Fund be 5.5 percent of Church Income, Pensions and Benefits Fund be 2 percent, the Olivet Nazarene University Fund be 2.5 percent, and the Unified District Fund be 5.58 percent.
- That every church endeavor to be 10 percent for world missions as based on an amount equal to or greater than 10% of Church Income, less amount paid for World Evangelism Fund and approved specials (missions giving).
- 5. That the Unified District Funds be allocated as follows:

Unified District	85.85%
NMI	5.56%
NYI	4.84%
SDMI	3.75%

- That all Funds (World Evangelism, Unified District, Olivet Nazarene
 University, and Pensions and Benefits) be calculated and paid weekly
 beginning in May.
- That only churches which have paid in full the Unified District Fund, the Olivet Nazarene University Fund, the Pensions and Benefits Fund, and the World Evangelism Fund, be permitted to report all funds paid in full.
- 8. That no congregation be granted permission to go in debt for any building or improvement program, or the hiring of any staff or assistants, until it has

shown the ability to pay all of its obligations, including funds paid in full for two years preceding the request, debt under consideration and/or the additional salary, and that the amount of the indebtedness and terms of payment not jeopardize the spiritual life of the church. Exceptions may be granted by the District Superintendent only with the unanimous approval of the District Advisory Board. (*Manual*, par. 235.4)

- 9. That every church prepare and adopt an annual operating budget for the church in accordance with (*Manual*, par. 129.6 & 129.7). Should assistance be requested for the preparation of a budget, the district will be happy to provide such assistance to the church.
- 10. That every church adopt a written "Designated Gift Policy". Should assistance be requested for the preparation of a designated gift policy, the district will be happy to provide such assistance to the church.
- That October 3, 2010, be designated as Nazarene Bible College Sunday in our local churches and that a special offering be received and forwarded to the Bible College immediately.
- 12. That **December 5, 2010**, be designated as American Bible Society Sunday in our local churches, and that an offering be received and sent to the General Treasurer in Kansas City immediately.
- 13. That **January 16**, **2011**, be designated as Nazarene Theological Seminary Sunday in our local churches, and that an offering be received and sent to the Seminary in Kansas City immediately.
- That April 24, 2011, be designated as Olivet Nazarene University Sunday in our local churches, and that an offering be received and sent to our District Treasurer for Olivet.
- 15. That the salary of the district superintendent be \$55,156.50 annually, plus \$9,000.00 annually be invested for him in a tax-sheltered annuity, and \$3,000.00 annually for reimbursable expenses and that he be given five weeks vacation with pay at a time convenient for him.
- 16. That the salary of the Administrative Assistant be \$37,199.75 annually, plus \$3,000.00 annually be invested for him in a tax-sheltered annuity, and \$13,400.30 annually for housing allowance, and \$3,000.00 annually for reimbursable expenses and that he be given vacation in accordance with *Ministerial Staff Support* guidelines for the pastor with pay at a time convenient for him.

- 17. That the District advisory Board be authorized to provide a district-owned vehicle, plus travel and expenses, for the district superintendent.
- 18. That the District advisory Board be authorized to provide travel and expenses, for the administrative assistant.
- 19. That the district boards' committees', and councils' travel reimbursement be at the current IRS rate and that actual meals and lodging expenses away from home be reimbursed. These expenses to be paid from appropriate operating fund.
- 20. That the honorarium for the district secretary be **\$3,893.40** per year, and that expenses for clerical help be allowed.
- That the professional fees to be paid for accounting and bookkeeping services for the district including the medical fund be \$35,000.00 per year.
- 22. That a recommended rate of \$8.25 per hour be paid for temporary secretarial services provided for district departments such as Board of Ministerial Studies, School of Ministry and any other services required during the year.
- 23. That the local churches pay the health insurance plan for pastors and dependents, and for associate pastors and dependents; and that the district pay \$2,000 per year for the cost of the health plan premium for full-time commissioned evangelists and their families, and that the local church (where evangelist holds membership) pay the balance of the premium.
- 24. That our people be encouraged in the stewardship of possessions as related to wills, annuities, and the life loans for the local church, district home missions, world missions, our colleges and seminary. That the Department of Stewardship regional representative, Rev. Larry Hindmand, 9625 Mason, Oak Lawn, IL 60453 (708-857-4770) be contracted by local churches for counseling service in life income wills and bequests.
- 25. That the local church boards strictly adhere to the provisions of the Manual, Pars. 129.21, 129.22, 129.23, concerning the counting and the accounting for all monies received and disbursed, and an annual audit of the financial records.
- 26. That each local church treasurer use printed forms for reporting all monies received and disbursed each month, and that the pastor and church board

be provided a copy or copies of the monthly treasurer's report (Manual, par. 135.4).

Christian Cultural Engagement

- A. WHEREAS, in times when our culture desperately needs the Church to be a living example of Christ-like holiness and love, we strongly urge:
 - All our sisters and brothers in Christ to remember that we are called to be the Body of Christ in our world being empowered by the Holy Spirit to the glory of God the Father. As a result, we urge our brothers and sisters to remember the importance of corporate Christian worship and the practice of spiritual disciplines within the family and individually, believing that these are important ways by which the Holy Spirit shapes us into a holy people.
 - 2. That pastors, evangelists, and leaders live and teach the scriptural doctrines of the new birth and entire sanctification, believing that the Holy Spirit bears witness to both works of grace through the infilling of His Spirit, and that the one biblical evidence of the latter is the cleansing of the heart by faith from original sin manifested by the fruit of the Spirit in Christian service: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control (Gal 5:22-24).
 - 3. That the church manual be made available to all in the church who desire it and the Articles of Faith (<u>Manual</u>, Part II, para 1-22, pgs. 28-37) and the Covenant of Christian Character (<u>Manual</u>, Part II, Articles 27-27.3, pgs. 38-40) be read, or printed, and distributed to the church body at least once a year admonishing each Nazarene to diligently pursue a lifestyle that honors God, the church and one another.
 - That new converts be lovingly nourished and instructed in the way of holiness.
 - 5. That all of our people, "in putting off the old to put on the new and holy way of life as well as the mind of Christ" (Eph 4:17-24), take to heart The Covenant of Christian Conduct of our church which gives guidance in areas of Christian Ethics, Entertainment, Marriage & Divorce, Abortion, Human Sexuality, Christian Stewardship, etc. (Manual, Part III, para 33-41, pgs 46-60).
 - B. WHEREAS, ethics and values are constantly being questioned and changed by our society, the church must strengthen itself in its commitment and conduct. Therefore, this committee felt it vitally important to not only reaffirm our belief in Scripture and our Wesleyan guidelines, but to also provide useful information in this document to resource both laity and clergy to make the church both a beacon of hope and a model of holiness to our families, community and world. (Matthew 5:10-17; Ephesians 5:1-2,8-14; I Peter 1:13-17).

We encourage our people to work with and in public institutions as a means of Christ-like engagement with our culture on the local, State, National, and Global levels.

- 1. Each local church should strive to provide educational and equipping opportunities such as:
 - a) Special Christian Speakers & professionals,
 - In-service topical seminars and open forum discussions, and
 - Consider initiating special ministries that reach out to the needy in the congregation and community.

- 2. Our people should show Christian stewardship by becoming involved in civic, community and school functions and cooperating with other churches and civic agencies who share our ministry objectives. Our pastors, youth workers and parents should maintain an awareness of the activities and promotions of organizations within the local school system and unite in an effort to oppose activities that do not comply with New Testament moral standards. Examples of civic organizations to offer aid and service to:
 - a) Pregnancy Resource Centers
 - b) Homeless Shelters
 - c) Habitat for Humanity
 - d) Credible Christian Counseling Centers
 - e) Food & Clothing Pantries
 - f) Nursing Homes; Senior Adult Organizations
 - g) Appropriate Parent/Teacher Organizations

3. We should actively monitor our State and Federal Legislature on issues which pertain to, and affect our church and community and express appreciation to individuals/organizations that promote legislature and programs which edify. We urge church leaders to make available the names and addresses of government officials and stress the importance of voting in local, state and national elections to ensure that issues pertaining to the biblical ideals of faith, family, and social justice are addressed. We encourage the

above while being simultaneously mindful that our commitment to Christ our Lord must always be far greater than our commitment to any political party, agenda, or association. That each local church provides its members with ample opportunities to see beyond our own borders and mature into "global" Christians by staying informed about world events (both natural and political) and the persecution of fellow believers that we might pray for "the increase of His government and peace" on the earth. In addition, we urge the promotion of sacrificial giving for the cause of world evangelism and personally participating in Work and Witness when and where possible. C. This report is a re-affirmation of our ethical and moral standards, as set forth by the General Assembly of the Church of the Nazarene. It is the prayer of this committee that these suggestions and resources will benefit individuals and churches committed to fulfilling the Great Commission. For only through personal involvement can we go into the "fields white unto harvest" (John 4:37). LET US GO!

Church Growth

We, your Committee on Church Growth, make the following recommendations to the district assembly for consideration:

Commission

We recommend that every church emphasize the Great Commission (Matthew 28:16-20) in every facet of their ministry. We are reminded that the Bible should always be our main source and that the Great Commission remains as our primary motivation for church growth.

Prayer

Remember that prayer should be the foundation for all church growth, and that without prayer; little of lasting value will be accomplished. We also recommend that the church provide opportunities for concentrated prayer and fasting during the church year.

Mission/Vision/Purpose

We encourage every church to develop a mission statement, a vision statement, and a clear statement of purpose. These three key elements will ensure that we stay focused on God's plan for the local church. There are numerous books and other resources available to assist the church with this task. Any church needing assistance should contact the district superintendent and/or the district missionary.

Responsibility List

That every church maintain an accurate, up-to-date list that includes the name, current address, and telephone number for every person on their responsibility list. This will allow for better, more consistent follow-up and accountability.

Calling

That absentees be contacted through a regular, systematic approach. This is not solely the responsibility of the pastor, but should be a shared ministry within the church among the laity.

Discipleship

Emphasis should be given not only to evangelism, but also the discipleship. The new Christian should be encouraged to seek the experience of Heart Holiness which leads to a growing and productive Christian as a way to fulfill the Great Commission (Matthew 28:20).

Lay Ministry

We encourage our churches to develop a partnership between the pastor and the laity, which provides for every member to be involved in church ministry (discipleship/ evangelism).

Education

That pastors and laymen take full advantage of educational and CEU opportunities, including seminars, workshops, videos, books, and especially the quality CLT programs that our denomination offers.

Evangelism

That new and innovative methods of outreach and evangelism be explored. Consider how the resources of the local church, human and financial, can be utilized most effectively to see souls saved.

New-Start / Restart

We believe every church on the Illinois District can and should become involved in prayer, creating or supporting new church starts. Churches can provide funding and or personal involvement of the local church body in calling, canvassing, etc.

Refocus

That churches be encouraged to be involved in determining their church life cycle and whether or not they need to enter into a refocusing process such as the New Church Specialties. Contact the district missionary for more information.

Personal Evangelism

It is the privilege and duty of every Christian to share their faith with others. We encourage all churches to provide specialized training for various types of personal evangelism. Personal responsibility for evangelism should be emphasized.

Revivals

We encourage our churches to give top priority to annual revival campaigns. We strongly urge the use of full-time evangelists in the Church of the Nazarene. We also encourage the use of all media possibilities (TV, radio, etc.) to potentially reach as many as possible with the gospel.

Servant Evangelism

That methods of servant evangelism be employed in churches of all sizes and in all areas. Jesus Himself came to serve and to give, not to be served or become successful. Let us willingly choose to follow Christ's example as we minister to others. Such acts of kindness can serve to bridge the gap between the church and the world.

Finances

Set aside a portion of the annual church budget for purposes of outreach and evangelism. The Bible says, "Where your treasure is, there your heart will be also."

Evangelism Committee

We encourage each church to review and implement the guidelines for a local Evangelism Committee as stated in the 2005-2009 *Manual*, pages 70-71, and section 110-110.8.

Global Church Growth Award

It should be the goal of every church to introduce each new convert into the membership of the Church of the Nazarene.

We challenge every church to establish minimum goals according to the following guidelines.

Churches will be grouped according to size to compensate for variation in ability. Morning worship attendance will be used to determine the size categories.

This award will be based on achievement in three areas:

- New Nazarenes
- 2. Significant involvement in sponsoring a new church,
- 3. Payment of all budgets (including district and educational).

Ministerial Staff Support

We, your Committee on Ministerial Staff Support, submit the following in order to care for the welfare of our spiritual leaders and encourage their commitment to our spiritual guidance.

The district office and the Pastoral Support Committee want to assist pastors and church boards in understanding their roles in providing adequate compensation for its pastors and staffs. Support of the pastor by the church is an expression of the belief in the call of God on the life of the pastor rather than a job where monies are paid for services rendered. Adequate compensation enables a pastor to fulfill his or her calling.

Pastoral support extends beyond the compensation and benefits for the pastor and staff and includes those expenses incurred by pastoral staff which is necessary to conduct the business of the church. Each church pays a sum to a pastor's ministry, which is divided into several categories: compensation, benefits and expenses. The sum of these categories is considered the cost of ministry to the local church, not all of which is to be considered the income of the pastor.

The district Pastoral Support Committee has developed guidelines for local pastoral support committees to evaluate their commitment to the ministry of the pastor. Anyone wanting further assistance in assessing or planning adequate compensation may contact the district office. In addition to consideration for the local pastors, churches should also establish a remuneration policy for pulpit supply, including travel expenses.

Senior Pastor

The senior pastor is the leader of the church and a leader in the local community.

Bi-vocational Pastor

A bi-vocational pastor supplements income by means other than church compensation. Churches should view the circumstances that cause the pastor to supplement income as a temporary situation to be resolved as soon as possible. The goal is to remove as many worldly concerns from the pastor as possible, so that the pastor may attend more intently on his or her life's calling. Recognizing that small and young churches may have difficulty in providing adequately for their pastor and family, we urge such churches to use what they are able to provide to the best advantage of their pastor and to strive toward the goal of full support.

Associate Pastor and Staff

An associate pastor is defined as a partner in ministry, on staff, whether receiving compensation or not. The church is to work toward a similar benefit package for the full-time associate as for the senior pastor (guideline to the church: an amount equal to 70 to 80 percent of the senior pastor's compensation package). Associate pastor and staff salaries should be negotiated in accordance with the recommendations of the senior pastor.

Retired Pastor

A retired pastor is a minister with retirement status. We recommend that retired pastors be employed for pulpit supply as frequently as possible. Retired pastors usually live on meager retirement benefits and may welcome the opportunity to provide for pulpit supply. Retired pastors are a source of experience and expertise that is available to the local church.

Evangelist

Often, the evangelist's only source of income is from meetings held at various local churches. We recommend that a full-time evangelist's minimum remuneration for such a meeting be an amount equal to twice the local senior pastor's weekly cash salary for each full Sunday in the special meeting (as recommended by the Evangelism Ministries of the Division of Local Church Growth). The local senior pastor's weekly cash salary and prorated insurance and

Social Security benefits should all be included in the compensation. Additional compensation for housing and travel-related expenses should be paid in a separate check, allowing for maximum tax benefit for the evangelist.

I. For the Pastor

A. Concerning Salary:

- 1. That for all full-time pastors, every church provides a minimum of \$450 per week salary. By definition, salary should not be deemed to include reimbursements and cost of ministry expenses listed below in Section B, Paragraph 1. The Advisory Board is to make the distinction between full-time and bi-vocational pastors. That churches which are legitimately unable to provide for such remuneration recognize that their pastor is bi-vocational and, therefore, able and obligated to supplement his or her income. We recommend that the district superintendent or designated personnel monitor the suggested minimum weekly salary on the basis of the materials provided by the general church's worksheet and, when necessary, give strong counsel to church boards to provide the above-stated minimum salary and benefits.
- That the church place, as an employee benefit, an amount equal to 10 percent of the ministerial staff's monthly salary in a tax-sheltered annuity each month for his/her retirement. This is the third leg of the retirement tier recommended by the Pensions and Benefits office of the general Church of the Nazarene.
- 3. That the church review the ministerial staff salary at least annually and that increases reflect at least cost-of-living increases. That a letter be sent once a year from the district superintendent to the local church board secretary reminding the board of its responsibility in this area, and that a written summation of the board's action shall be returned to the district superintendent within 30 days of the local board meeting.
- 4. That any significant increase in the annual amount raised for all purposes by the church during a pastor's tenure be taken into consideration at the time salary and benefits are reviewed.

B. Concerning Reimbursements:

- 1. That the church pays reimbursements for all church-related expenses, and that among these are standard mileage reimbursement at the recommended IRS rate for personally-owned automobiles. To avoid additional financial burden on the pastor and staff during these days of rapidly increasing gasoline prices, the church board is strongly encouraged to monitor and comply with any increases the IRS may possibly make on its recommended mileage rate during the calendar year. Entertainment expenses, office supplies, continuing education expenses (books, tuition, conferences, etc.), gifts and all other reimbursable expenses deemed appropriate by the IRS should also be included.
 - 2. Church-related expenses of pastoral staff should be qualified on the basis of material from General Headquarters, as well as the Internal Revenue Service. Every church should provide adequately to prevent financial strain to the parsonage family, and that every church provides 100 percent Social Security and full family hospitalization. That churches be allowed to maintain their present insurance program, and if churches propose a change, the change should be approved by the district superintendent and the District Advisory Board.
- 3. That the church provides the ministerial staff expense to all church-related functions, including the district and general assemblies. Lodging, meals and transportation shall be a part of this expense.
- 4. That the churches encourage and financially support its ministerial staff to continuing education through school, seminars and conferences.
- 5. That each local church board provides funds for the purpose of sending its ministerial staff to the general assembly.

C. Concerning Housing:

- That the church provides housing and utilities and/or adequate housing allowance.
- 2. That the church equips the parsonage with a stove, refrigerator, air conditioning, washer, dryer, draperies, curtains and carpeting.
- That a minister could request the church board to adjust his/her compensation for any year in which it is anticipated that the minister will purchase major appliances and/or furniture.
- 4. That the fair-rental value and the designated additional parsonage allowance should be entered into church board records at the beginning of each calendar year. When a housing allowance is established in lieu of a parsonage, a review of the allowance should be made annually regarding payment, taxes, utilities and repairs.

- 5. That the Board of Trustees of the local church inspect the parsonage once each year in order to continue to provide for quality living conditions. No parsonage family should be expected to live in substandard housing. This inspection should be scheduled with the pastor and spouse and be done in their presence. Any necessary changes seen at this inspection should be completed as soon as possible.
- 6. That the local church board makes all necessary arrangements for the ministerial staff's moving expenses.
- D. Concerning the Ministerial Staff's General Emotional and Spiritual Welfare:
 - 1. That the church continually lifts the parsonage families in prayer.
 - That the church remembers the ministerial staff's family with suitable gifts at appropriate times during the year and consider a gift of no less than one week's salary at Christmas.
 - 3. That the church provide for vacation and time off according to the following scale (this schedule refers to total years in ministry):
 - a. One year in the ministry: two weeks vacation
 - b. Two to ten years in the ministry: three weeks vacation
 - c. Ten to twenty years in the ministry: four weeks vacation
 - d. Twenty or more years in the ministry: five weeks vacation (District Assembly, Family Camp, ministerial retreats and seminars, and working in Teen or Children's Camps are not to be considered as part of this vacation time allowance.)
 - 4. In order to benefit the church and the health of the pastor, the church should encourage the pastoral staff to take a minimum of one day per week for family time.
 - 5. That the church allow the senior pastor the privilege of holding a full week revival or speaking engagement of one or more days, not to exceed seven days per year, with the church to be responsible for pulpit supply without loss of salary to the pastor.
 - 6. That the local church offer the pastor/staff two mental health days each month to be taken at the pastor's discretion, to be used at a time when workload or individual stress is overwhelming.
 - 7. That the local church make available to its pastor a one month sabbatical at the end of each five years of uninterrupted ministry to that same church.
 - II. For All Full-time Evangelists (Song and Otherwise)

A. Concerning Salary:

1. That evangelists be paid at least an amount equal to twice the

pastor's salary or a minimum of \$500 for each Sunday of the meeting.

- 2. That, in addition, Social Security on the amount of salary be summarily paid.
- 3. That evangelists be notified in writing at the time the meeting is scheduled of the minimum remuneration they can expect to receive from the local church.
- 4. That local churches avoid canceling previously scheduled revivals.
- 5. That a local church canceling a revival without notifying the evangelist at least 30 days in advance be obligated to pay the minimum remuneration in full, unless the evangelist is able to reschedule the same date.

B. Concerning Reimbursements and Housing

- 1. That churches provide for all travel expenses, lodging and food during the meeting.
- 2. That local churches having full-time evangelists as members pay one-half the cost of the district hospitalization insurance.
- 3. That local churches having full-time evangelists as members provide for their expenses to general and district gatherings.

C. Concerning the Evangelist's General Emotional and Spiritual Welfare:

- 1. That finances for revivals be raised in advance of the scheduled meeting.
- 2. That the local church sends a Christmas gift to all evangelists who have served the church during that calendar year.
- 3. That local churches having full-time evangelists as members provide encouragement and support for their ministry through prayer and such tangible ways as love offerings and remembering them on their birthdays and anniversaries.

III. For Retired Ministerial Staff

A. Concerning Reimbursements:

 That local churches having retired ministers as members provide for their expenses to general and district gatherings they wish to attend.

B. Concerning Their General Emotional and Spiritual Welfare

1. That local churches having retired ministers as members remember them often, such as at birthdays, anniversaries and Christmas, with gifts of gratitude for their years of faithful service in the Kingdom.

2. That the Illinois District gives a one-time love gift to all elders upon their retirement. We recommend a minimum of \$1,000.

We ask that each local church board secretary and pastor receive a copy of this report from the district superintendent and that the same shall be read or distributed by the church board secretary to the church board as a reminder of their responsibilities. The church board secretary shall notify the district superintendent in writing concerning the fulfillment of this policy.

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INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Board of Directors
Illinois District Church of the Nazarene

We have audited the accompanying statement of assets, liabilities and net assets – modified cash basis of the Administration, Home Mission, Camp Ground, District Reserve, Olivet Nazarene University, Medical, Nazarene Missions International, Church New Start, Camp Meeting, Sunday School and Discipleship Ministries International and Nazarene Youth International funds of the Illinois District Church of the Nazarene as of April 30, 2010, and the related statements of support, revenue and expenses and cash flows – modified cash basis for the fiscal year then ended. These financial statements are the responsibility of the District's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

Except as explained in the following paragraphs, we conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall financial statement presentation. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.

As described in Note 1, these financial statements were prepared on a modified cash basis, which is a comprehensive basis of accounting other than generally accepted accounting principles.

As more fully described in Note 1 to the financial statements, the modified cash basis of accounting requires fixed assets be stated at cost, net of accumulated depreciation. Management has informed us that the District has stated its properties at estimated costs and appraised values versus historical costs as required by the modified cash basis of accounting. In addition, no depreciation expense has been recorded in the financial statements. The effect of this departure on the financial statements has not been determined.

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above (except for the effects of valuing fixed assets at estimated costs and appraised values) present fairly, in all material respects, the assets, liabilities, and net assets of the Administration, Home Mission, Camp Ground, District Reserve, Olivet Nazarene University, Medical, Nazarene Missions International, Church New Start, Camp Meeting, Sunday School and Discipleship Ministries International and Nazarene Youth International funds of the Illinois District Church of the Nazarene as of April 30, 2010, and its support, revenue and expenses and cash flows for the year then ended, on the basis of accounting described in Note 1.

Our audit was made for the purpose of forming an opinion on the statement of assets, liabilities and net assets – modified cash basis and the related statements of support, revenue and expenses and cash flows – modified cash basis. The accompanying supplementary information contained on pages 11 through 26 is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements. Such information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements referred to above and, in our opinion, the information is fairly presented in all material respects in relation to the financial statements taken as a whole.

NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Organization

Illinois District Church of the Nazarene is a not-for-profit corporation organized under the laws of the State of Illinois. Its purpose is to provide administrative and financial assistance to the local Nazarene churches in the District. The organization is supported primarily through budget receipts from the local churches.

Description of Programs

Illinois District Church of the Nazarene offers the following programs:

- Home Missions This program was established to assist churches in need.
- Camp Ground This program was established to minister to various individuals and groups by providing a place for recreational activity, as well as providing a place to minister to the attendees / users.
- Olivet Nazarene University This program was established to provide Olivet Nazarene University with assistance in the collection of budgeted funds from local churches.
- School of Ministry This program was established to facilitate in the training of ministers.
- Medical This program was established for the purpose of facilitating the receipt and payment of health and life insurance premiums for ministers, and to make partial reimbursements to retired ministers for their medical expenses.
- Nazarene Missions International This program was established to provide support for Missionaries approved by the General Church of the Nazarene and to support local churches in NMI programs.
- Church New Start This program was established to provide assistance to new church start-ups.
- Camp Meeting This program was established to collect revenues and pay expenses for District week held annually at Nazarene Acres.
- Sunday School and Discipleship Ministries International This

- program provides spiritual, recreational activities, and camps for youth participation (elementary level) and to support local churches with their Sunday School programs.
- Nazarene Youth International This program provides spiritual, recreational activities, and trips for youth participation (junior high and senior high level) and to support local churches in their NYI programs.

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements are presented using a modified cash basis of accounting. This basis of accounting recognizes assets, liabilities, net assets, revenues, and expenses when they result from cash transactions. This basis is a comprehensive basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

As a result of the use of this modified cash basis of accounting, certain assets and their related revenues (such as accounts receivable) and certain liabilities and their related expenses (such as accounts payable) are not recorded in these financial statements.

NOTE 1 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)

Basis of Presentation

Financial statement presentation follows the requirements of the Financial Accounting Standards Board in its Statement of Financial Accounting Standards (SFAS) No. 117, Financial Statements of Not-For-Profit Organizations. Under SFAS No. 117, the District is required to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets: unrestricted net assets, temporarily restricted net assets, and permanently restricted net assets. The District has no restricted net assets.

Property and Equipment

The District has recorded its property and equipment at appraised and estimated values, which is not in conformity with the modified cash basis of accounting. Depreciation has not been computed on fixed assets.

Income Taxes

The District is exempt from Federal income taxes under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. In addition, the District has been determined by the Internal Revenue Service not to be a private foundation within the meaning of Section 509(a) of the code.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

The District considers all highly liquid investment instruments with maturities of

three months or less to be cash equivalents.

Investments

The District has adopted SFAS No. 124, "Accounting for Certain Investments Held by Not-for-Profit Associations." Under SFAS No. 124, investments in mutual funds with readily determinable fair values are reported at their fair values in the Statement of Assets, Liabilities and Net Assets – Modified Cash Basis. The District carries investments in marketable securities with readily determinable fair values in the Statement of Assets, Liabilities and Net Assets – Modified Cash Basis. Unrealized gains and losses are included in the change in net assets in the accompanying Statement of Support, Revenues and Expenses – Modified Cash Basis.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of the financial statements requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Loans Receivable and Payable and Transfers between Program Accounts

Loans between programs have a zero net effect on the Statement of Assets, Liabilities and Net Assets – Modified Cash Basis and have been eliminated. In addition, transfers between programs have a zero net effect on the Statement of Support, Revenue and Expenses – Modified Cash Basis and have been eliminated

NOTE 2 – CONCENTRATION OF CREDIT RISK

The District maintains a material amount of its cash and cash equivalents at one financial institution. Accounts at this institution are insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC). The total cash at this institution exceeds FDIC limits. There was no excess of the FDIC limit as of April 30, 2010.

NOTE 3 - INVESTMENTS

Investments are stated at fair value and consist of mutual funds. Fair values as of April 30, 2010 are summarized as follows:
